## Brewster offers weekly work packets

BREWSTER — The Brewster School District is offering weekly work packets to students on a weekly basis during the coronavirus closure.

March 23 marked the beginning of remote learning.

Packets can be picked up from 9:30-11 a.m. Mondays in the middle school parking lot. The previous week's packets can be turned in at that time.

Teachers will check in with students weekly via email, text, phone call Skype, school visit or home visit.

March 23 to April 3 will be makeup work to improve grades. April 6-10 is spring break. Grade level learning packets will be given out for the weeks of April 13-17 and April 20-24, with the anticipated return to school on April 28. Staff will work April 27.

"This is what our current schedule has. We are trying to stay consistent with the published school calendar and meet state requirements," said a district announcement. "If we find that, based on this current situation, we do not have to use that day as staff only, a decision may be made to
