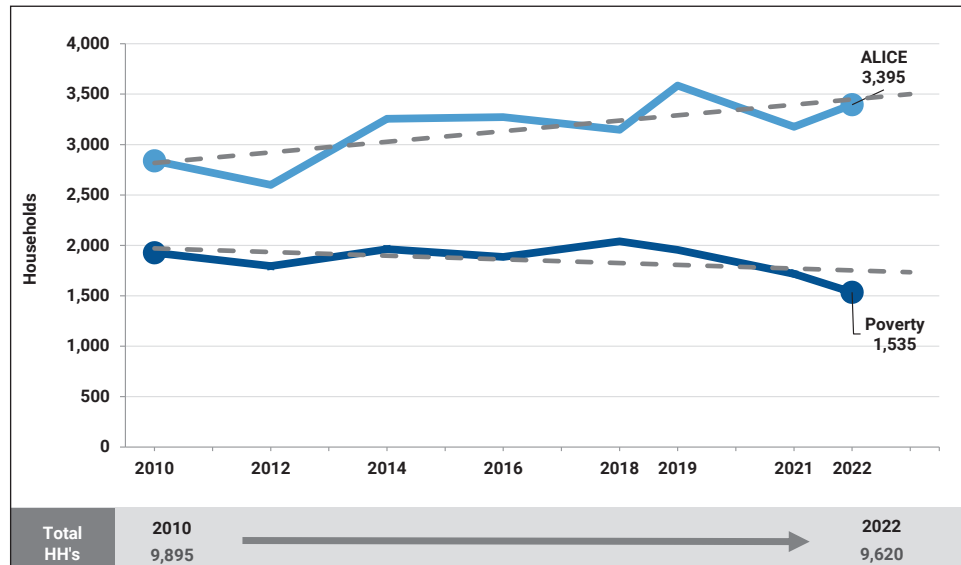

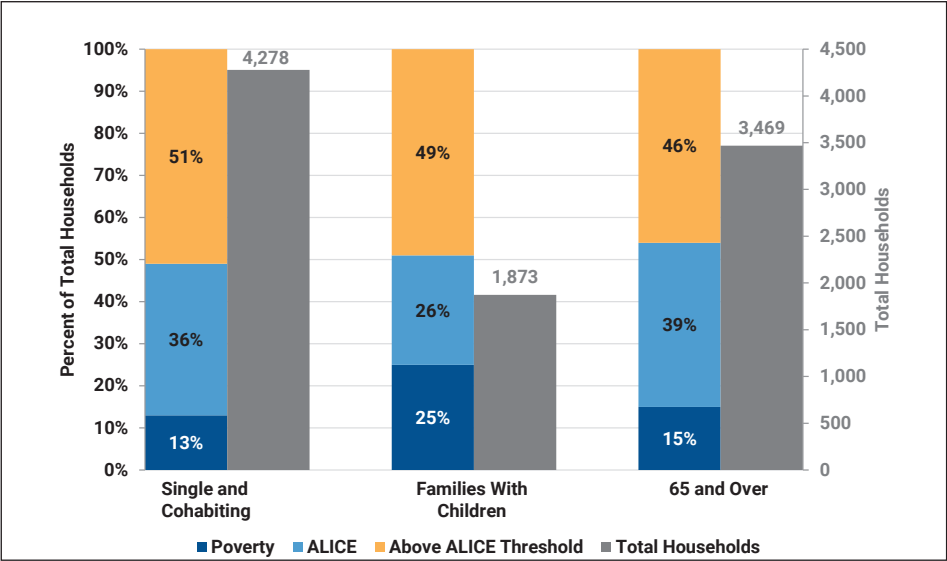

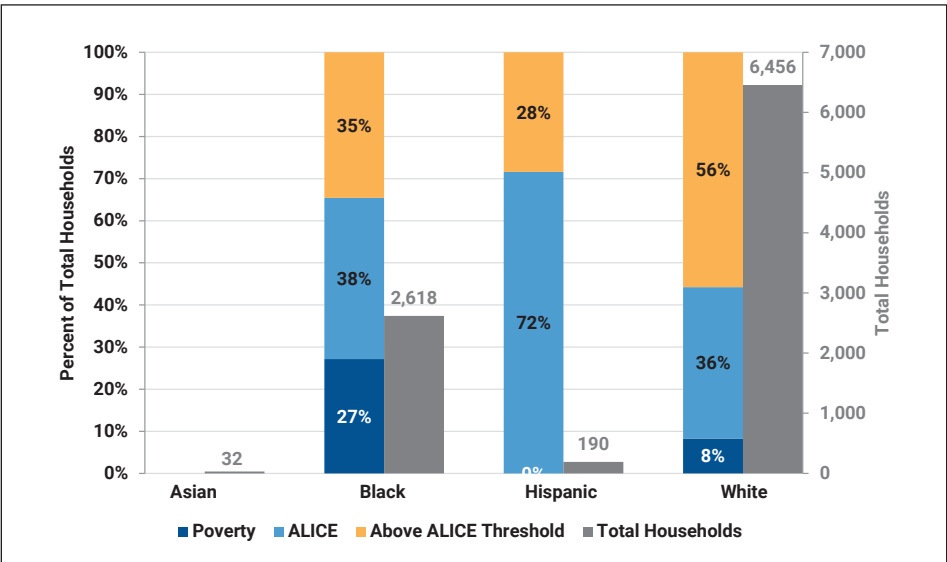

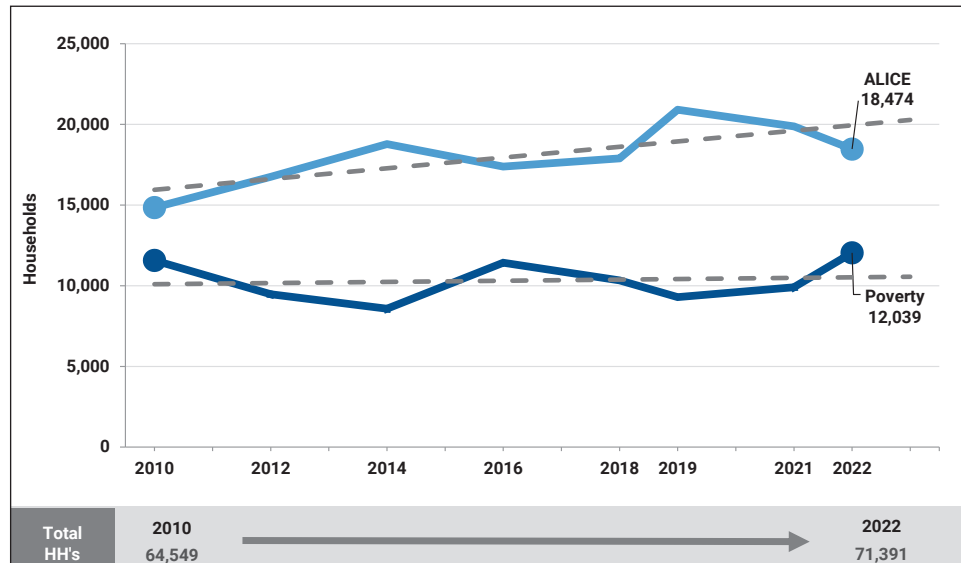

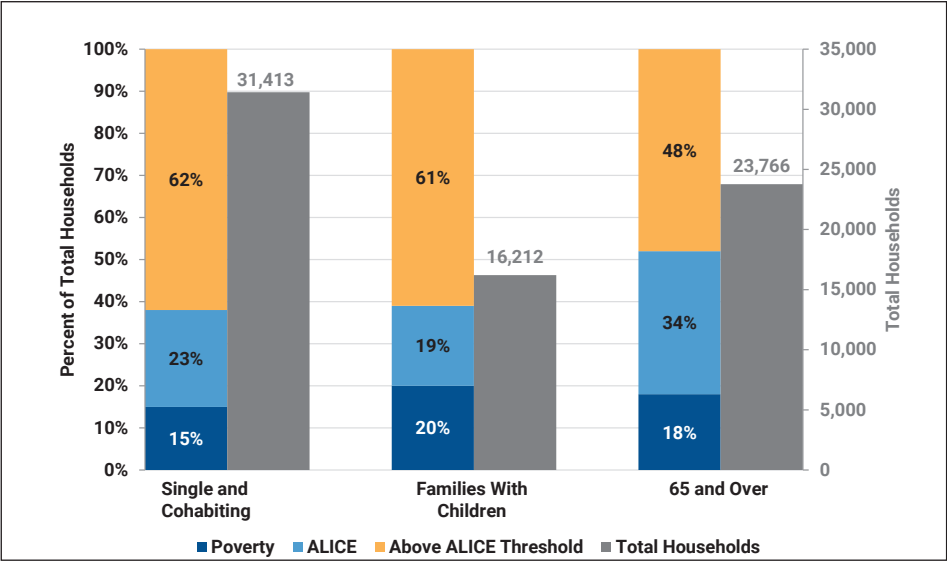

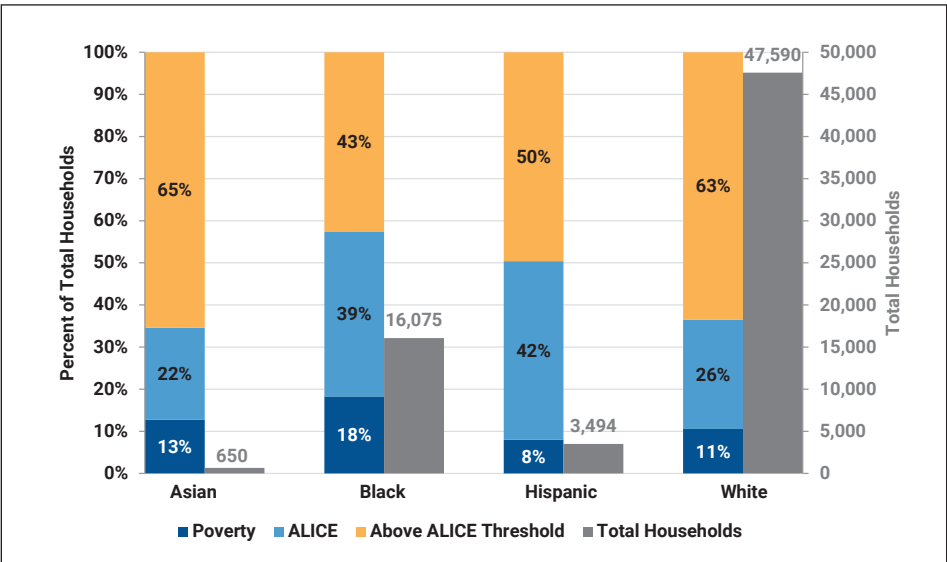

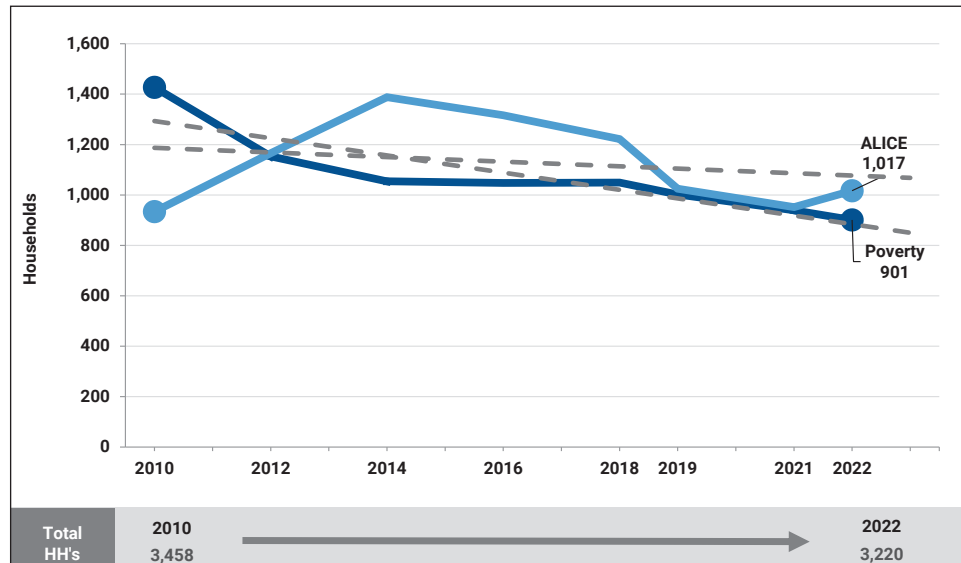

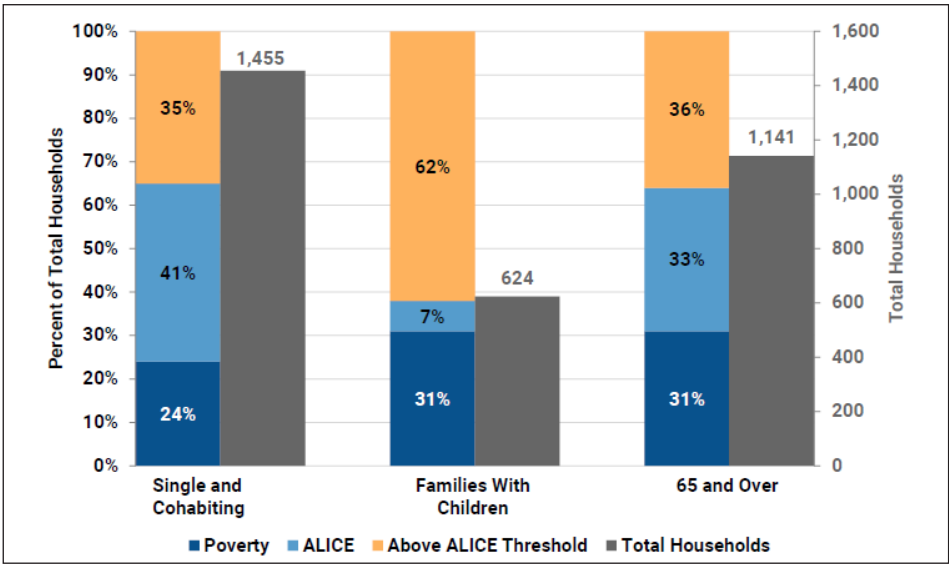

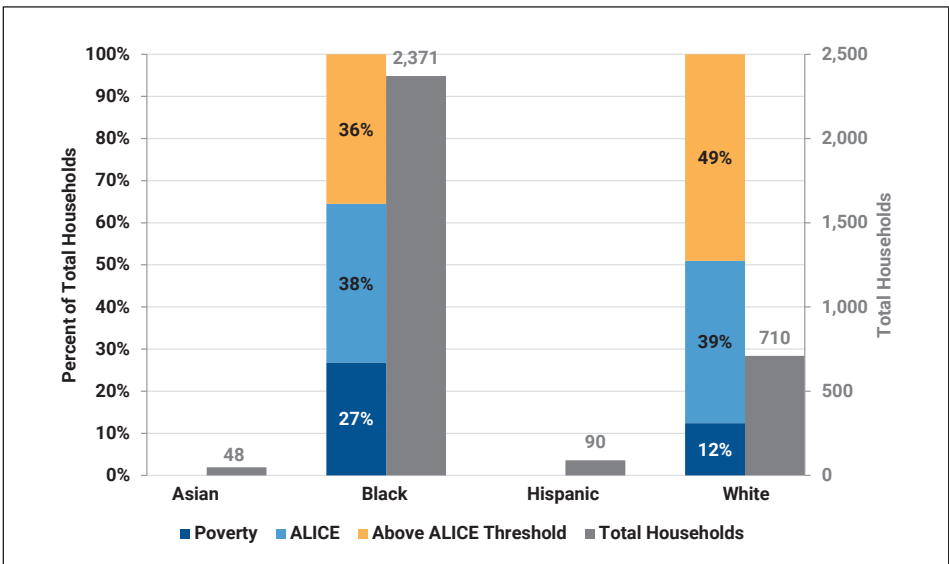
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Household Financial Status by Household Type, Allendale County, 2022

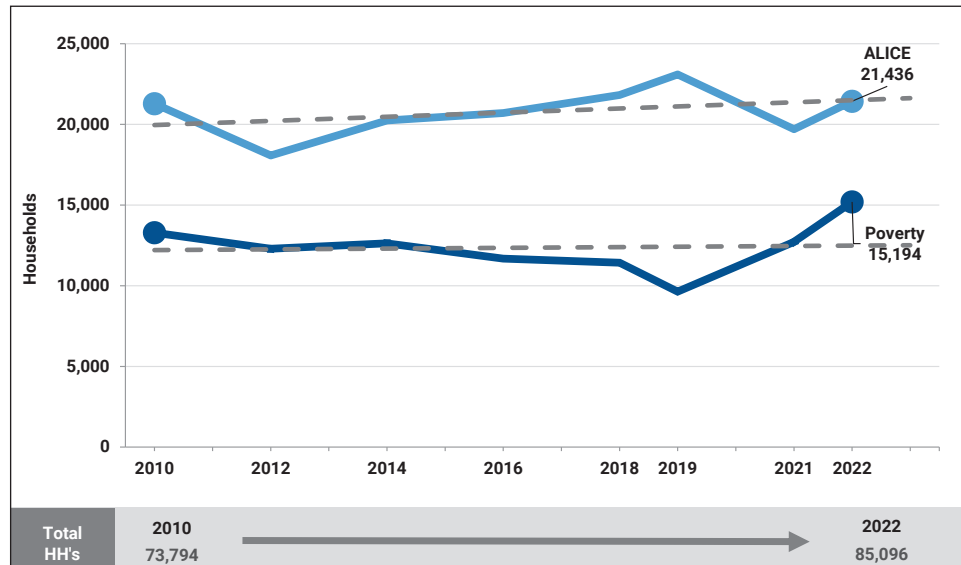

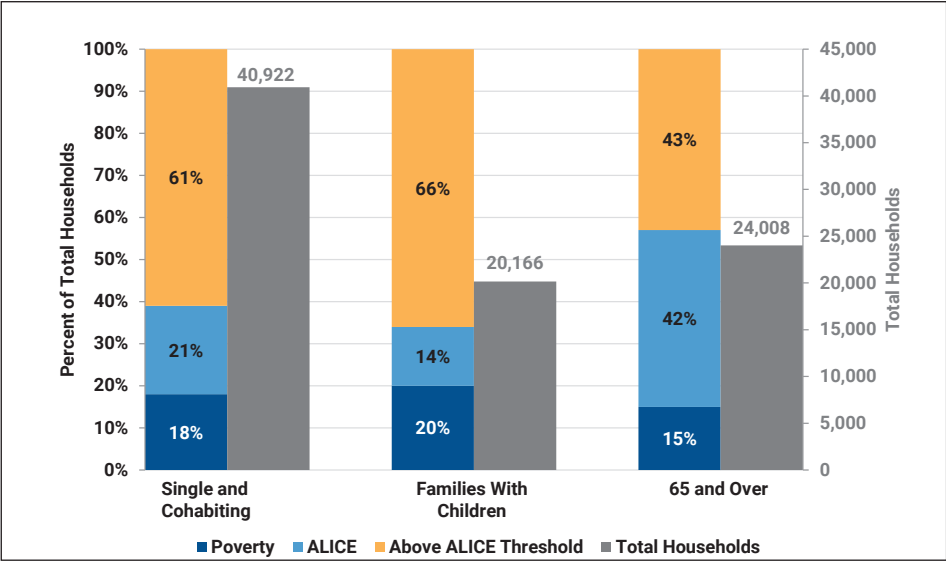

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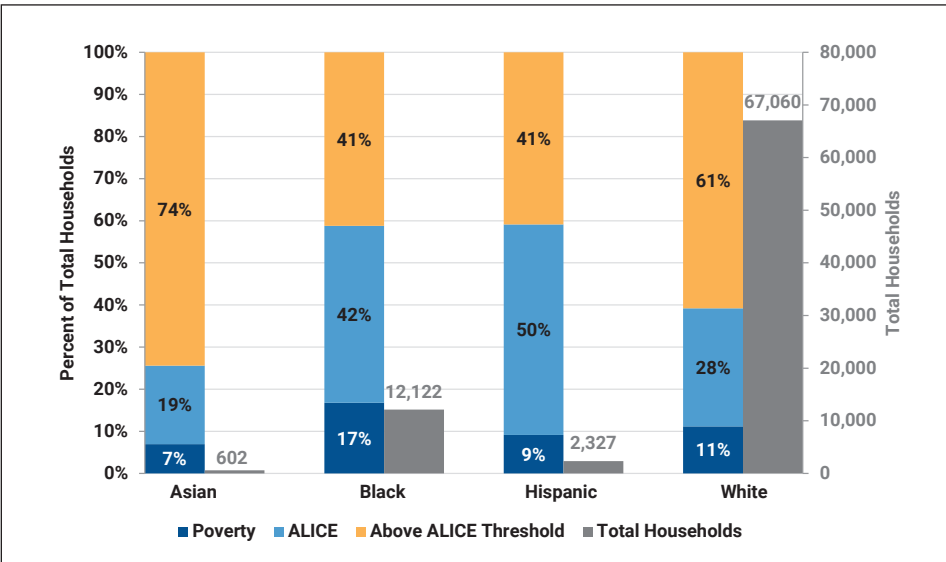
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Household Financial Status by Household Type, Anderson County, 2022

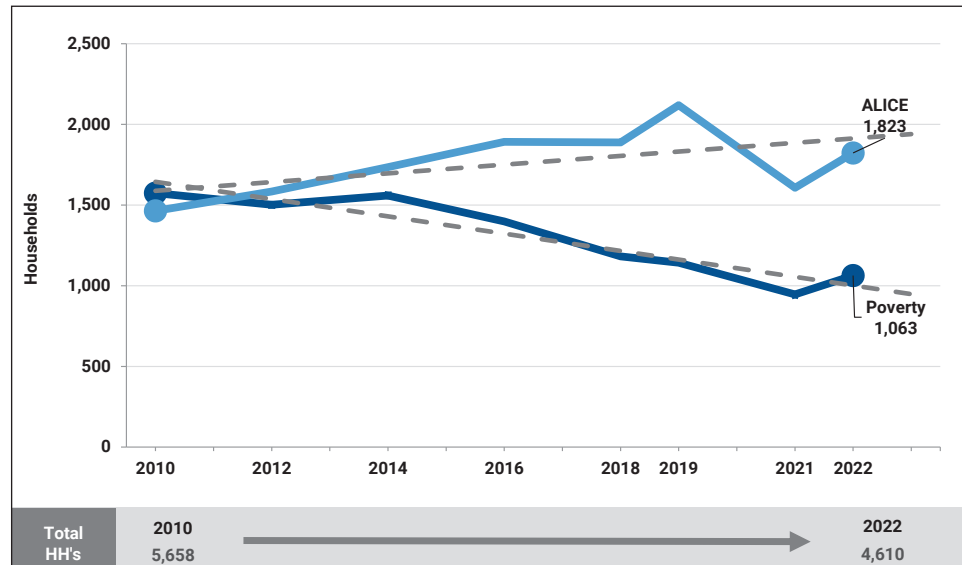

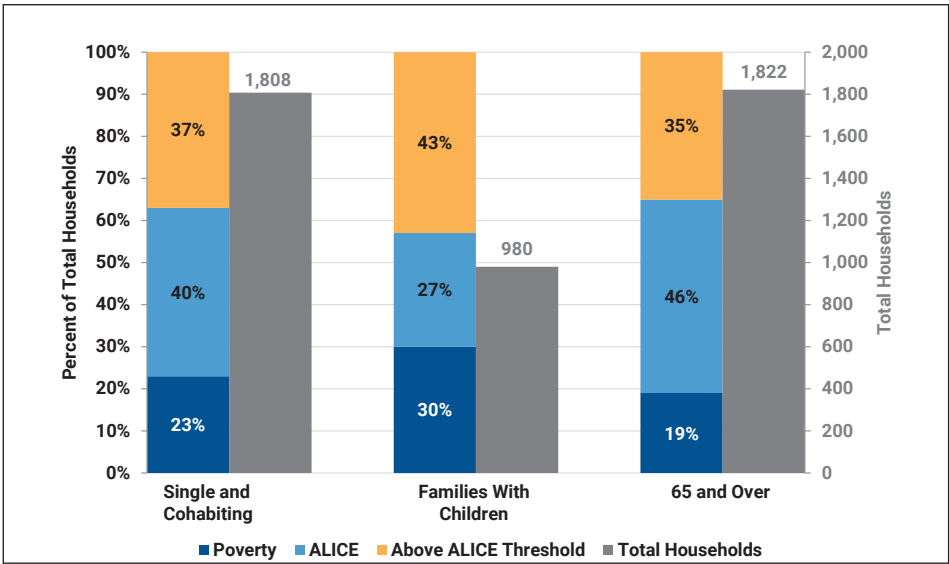

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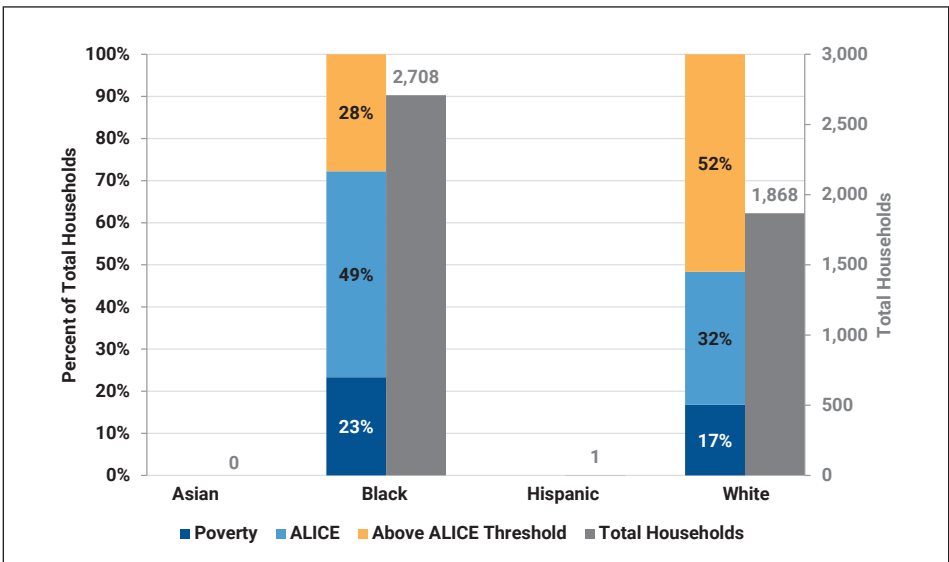
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Household Financial Status by Household Type, Bamberg County, 2022

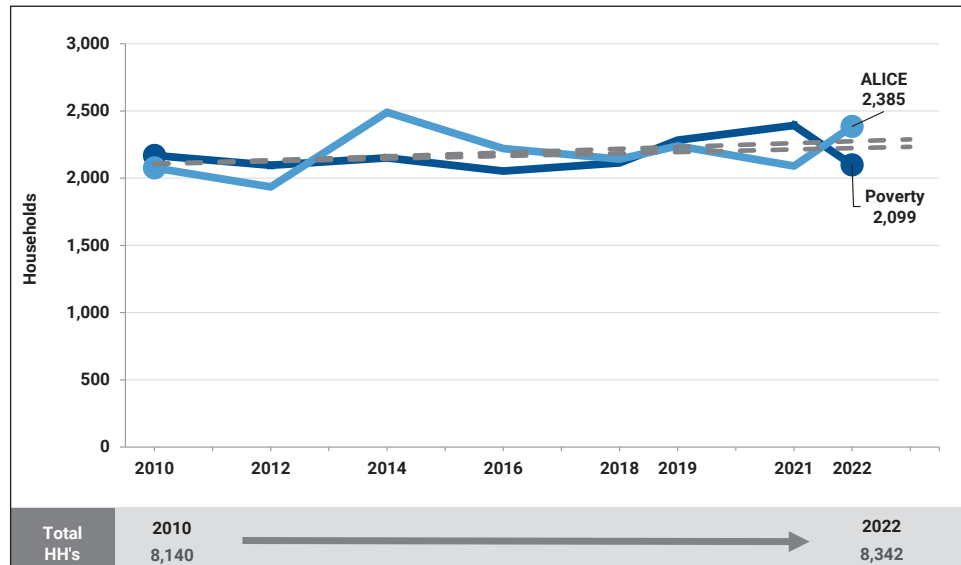

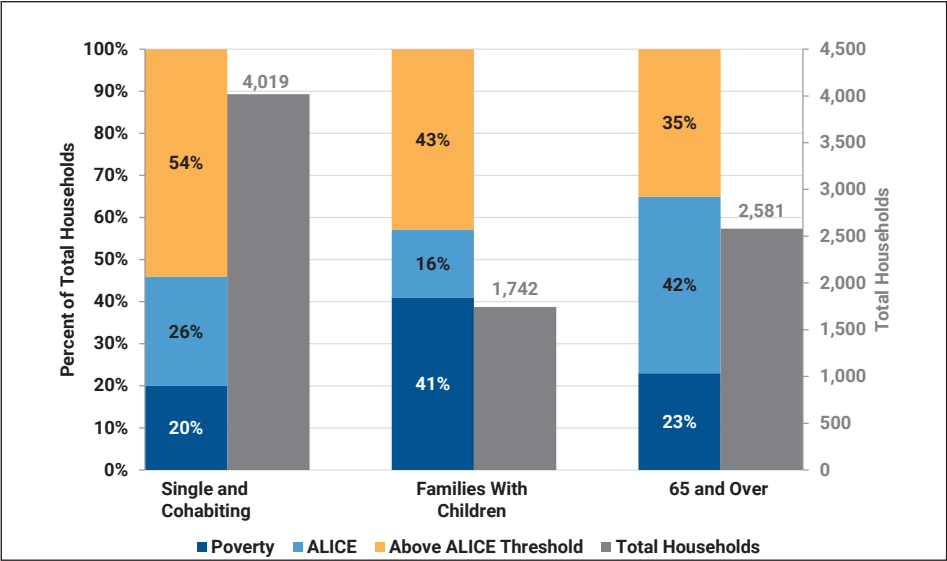
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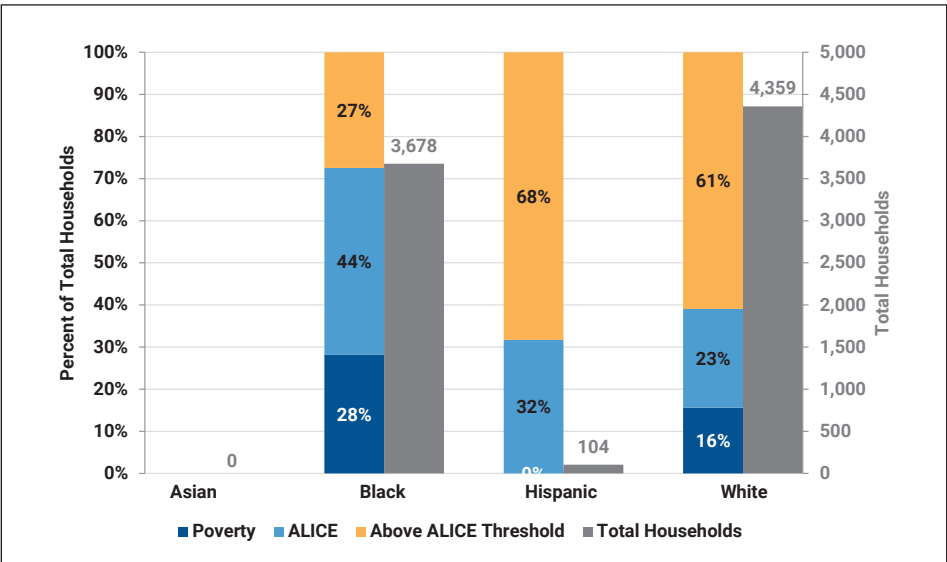
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Household Financial Status by Household Type, Barnwell County, 2022

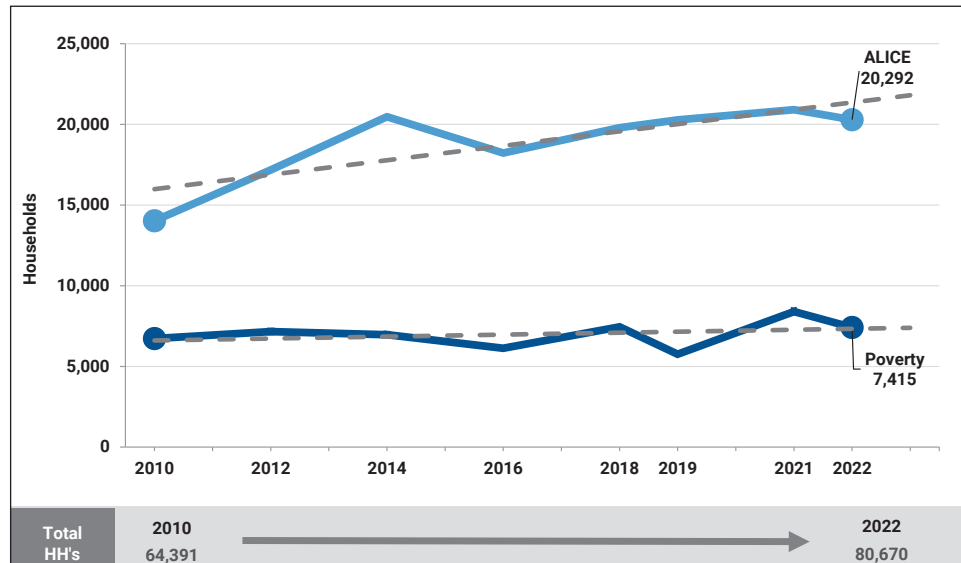

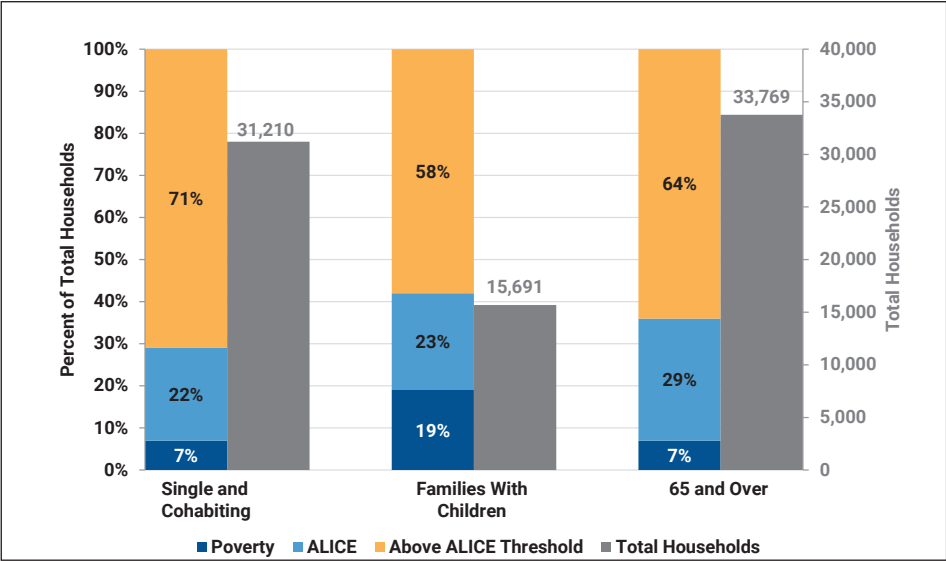

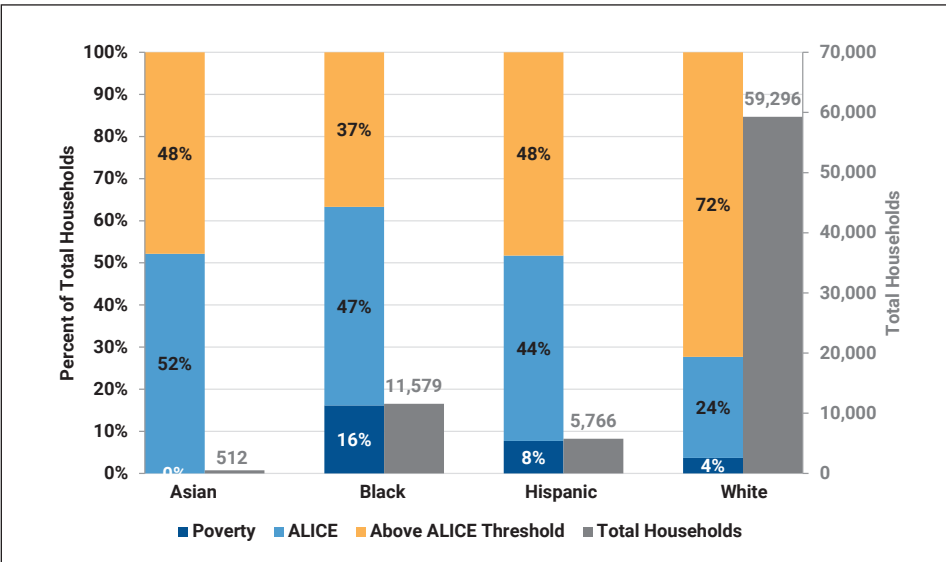

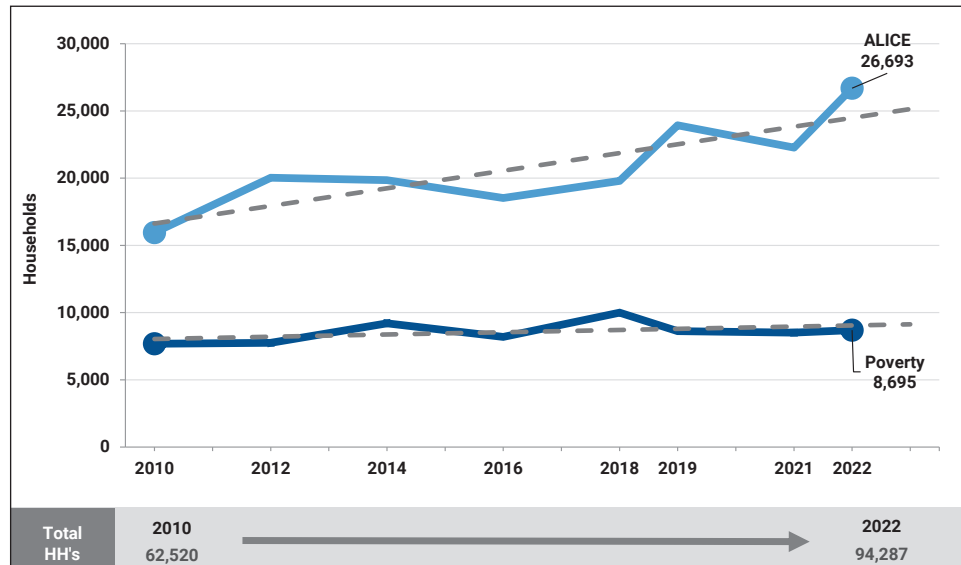

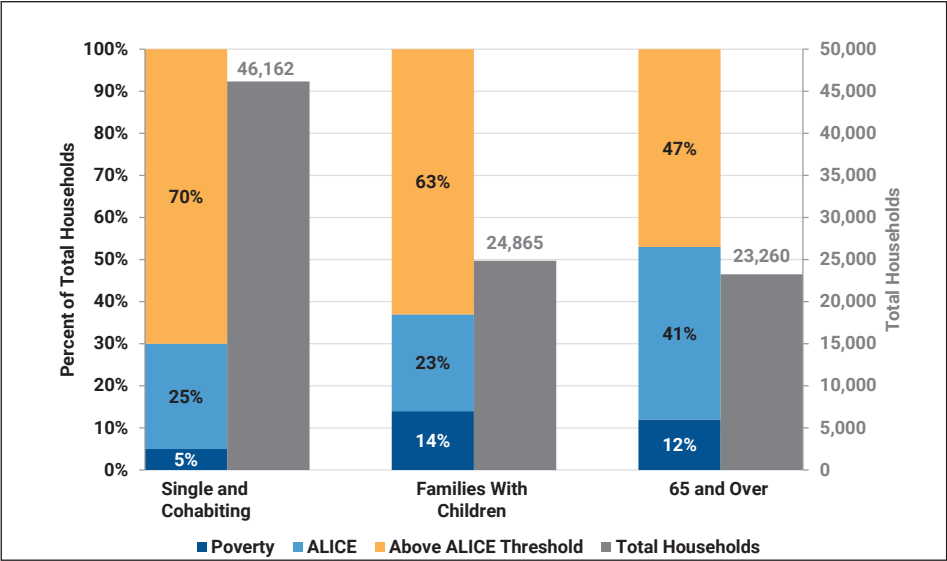

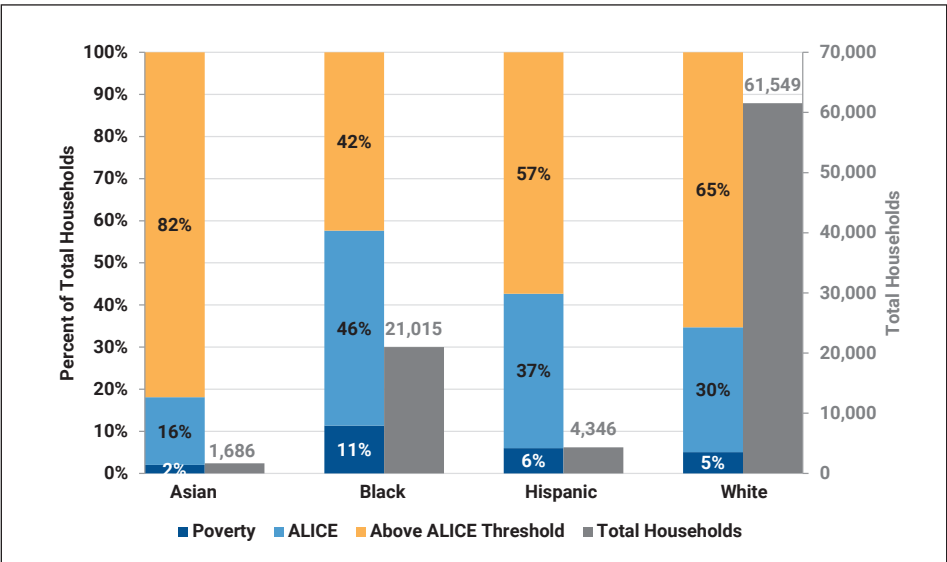

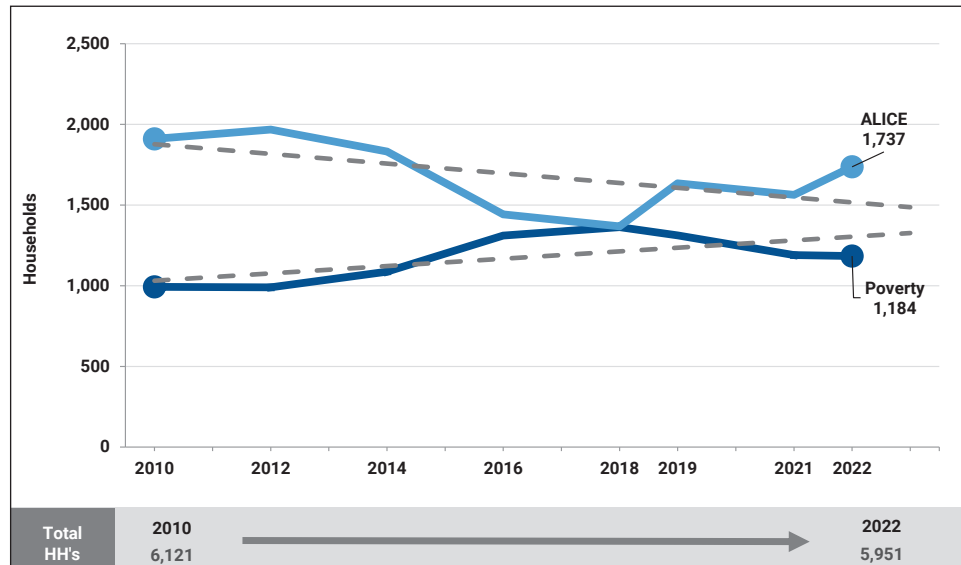

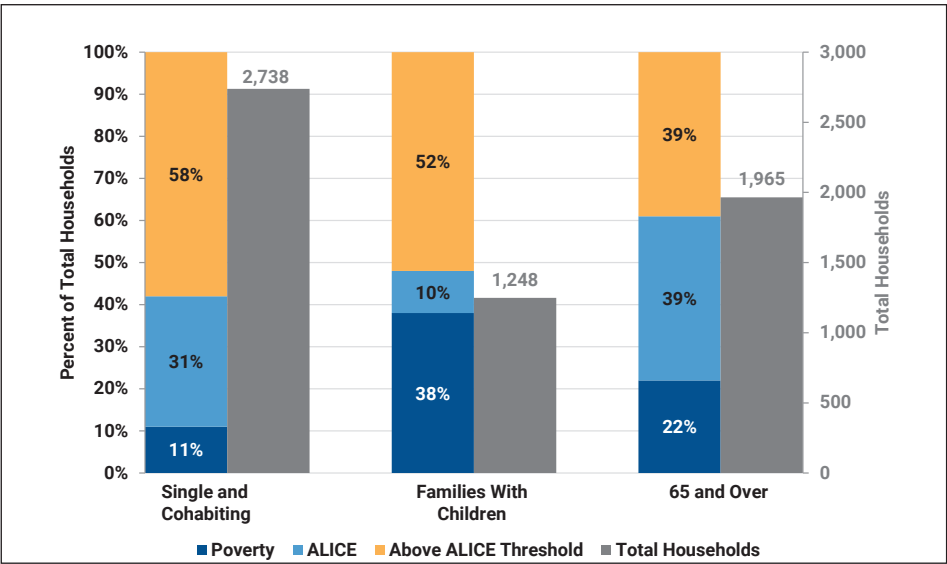

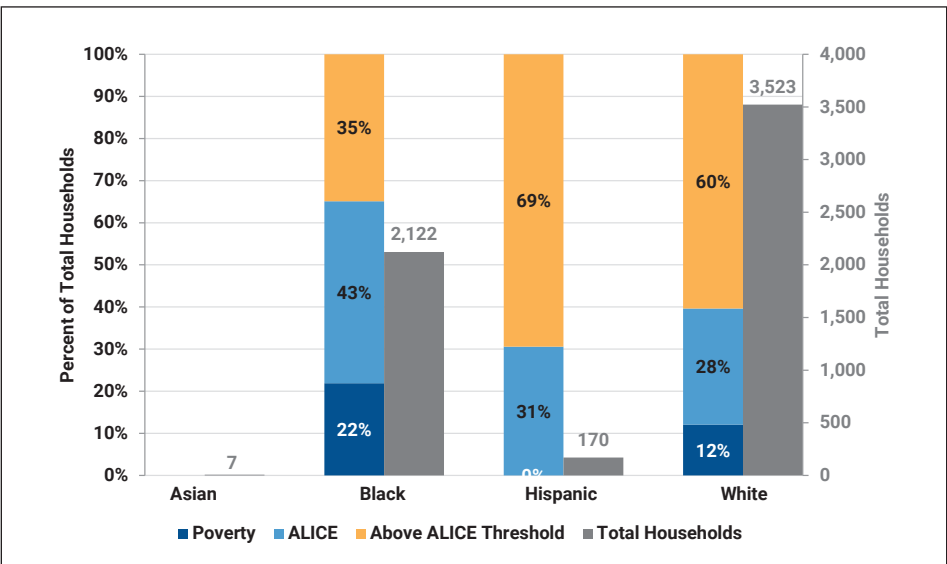

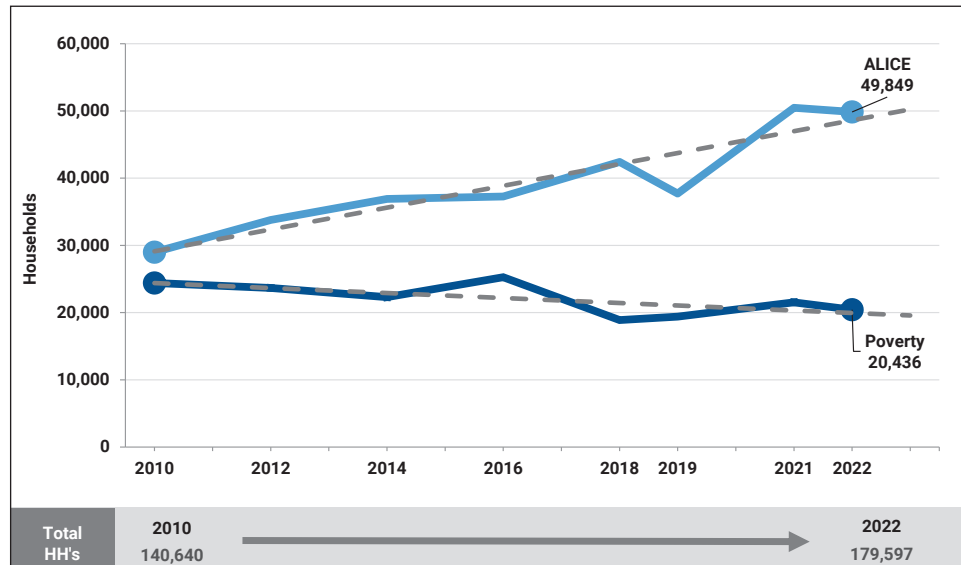

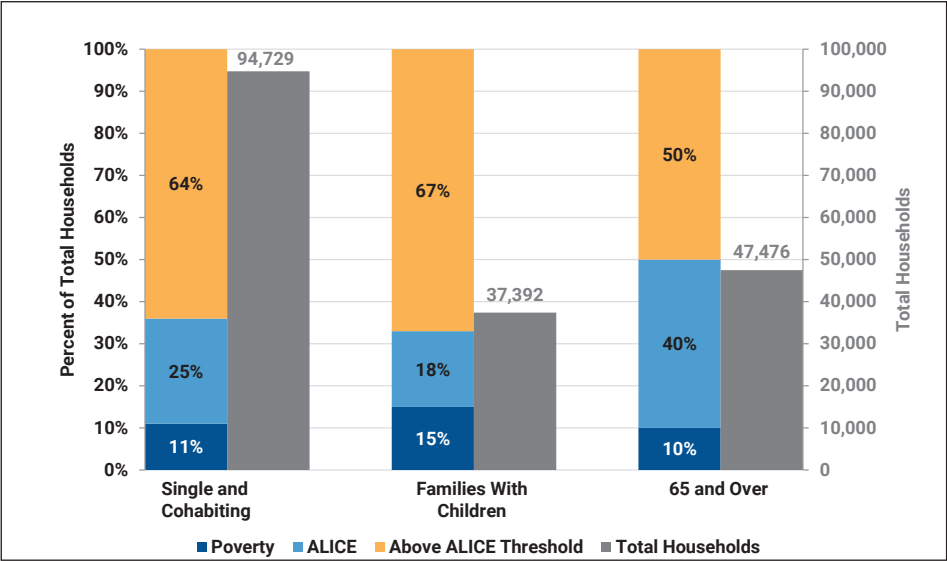

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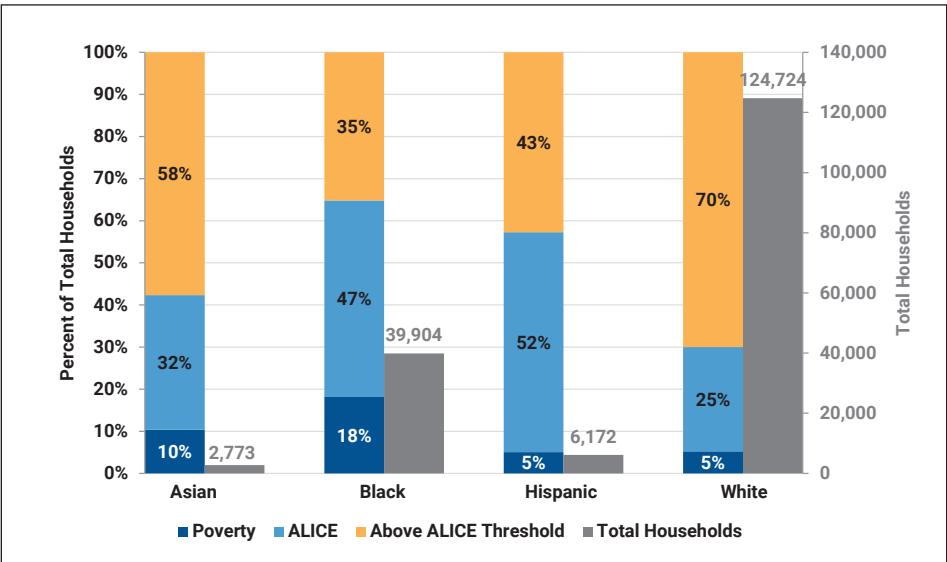

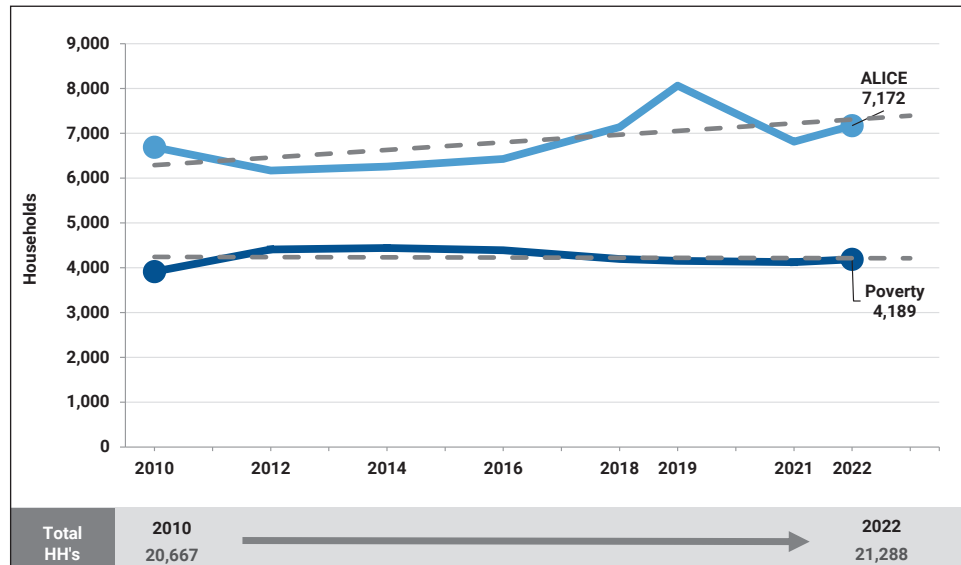

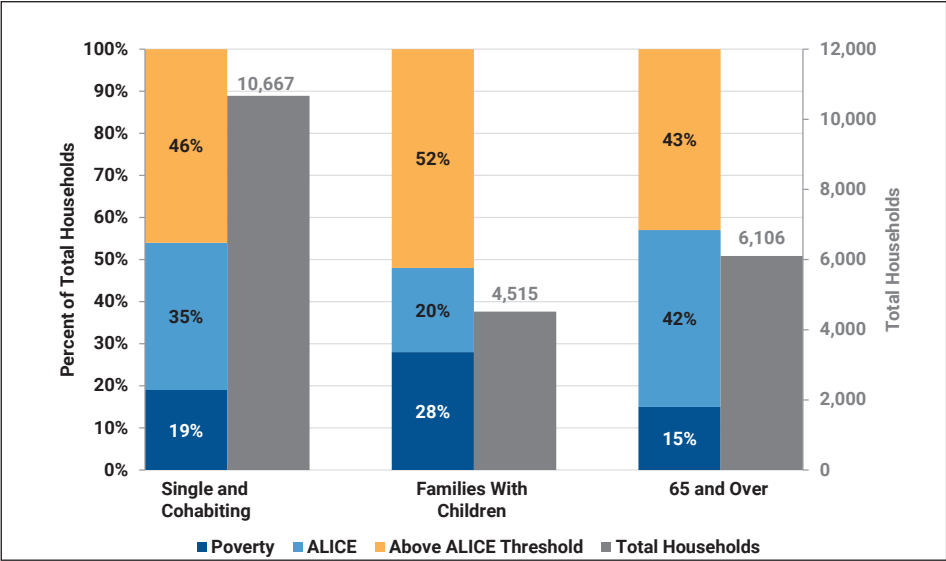

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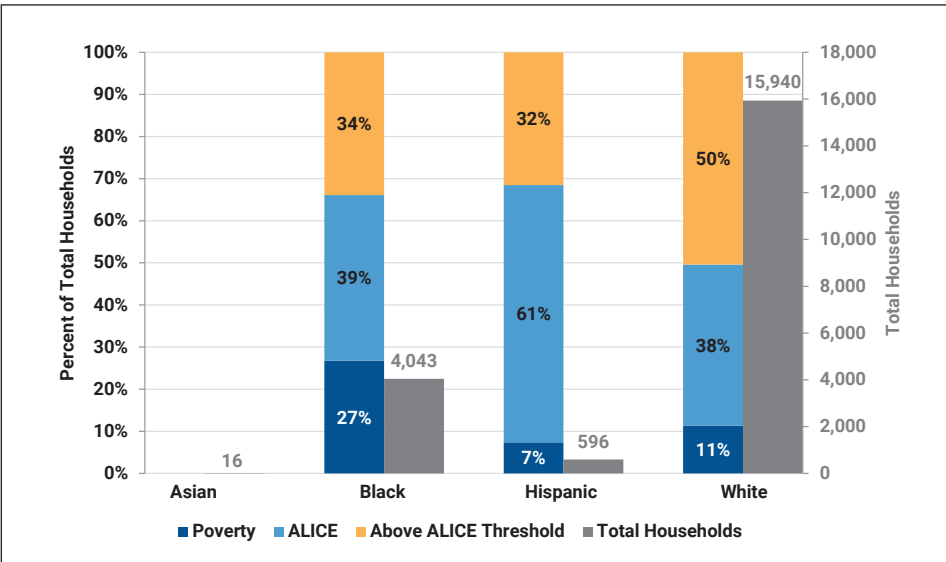

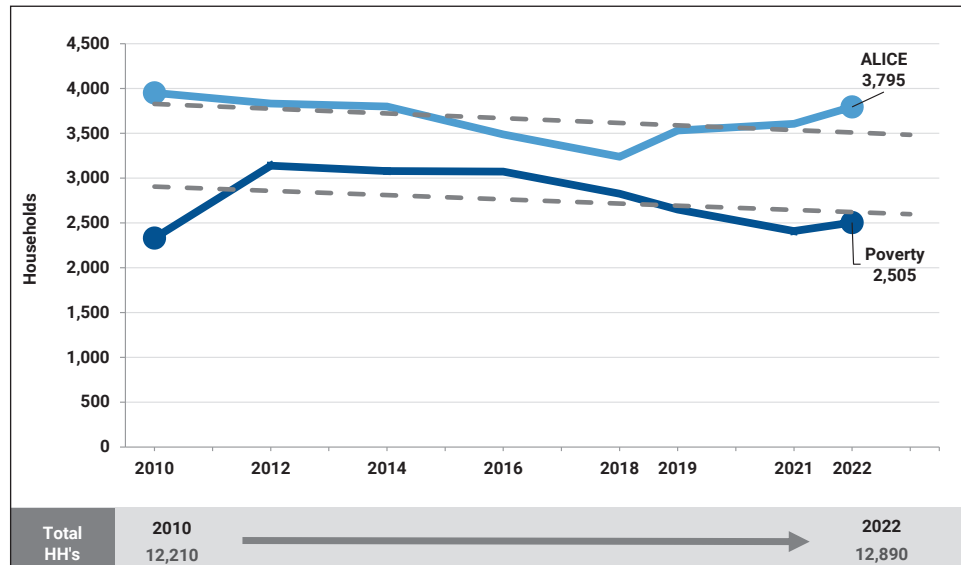

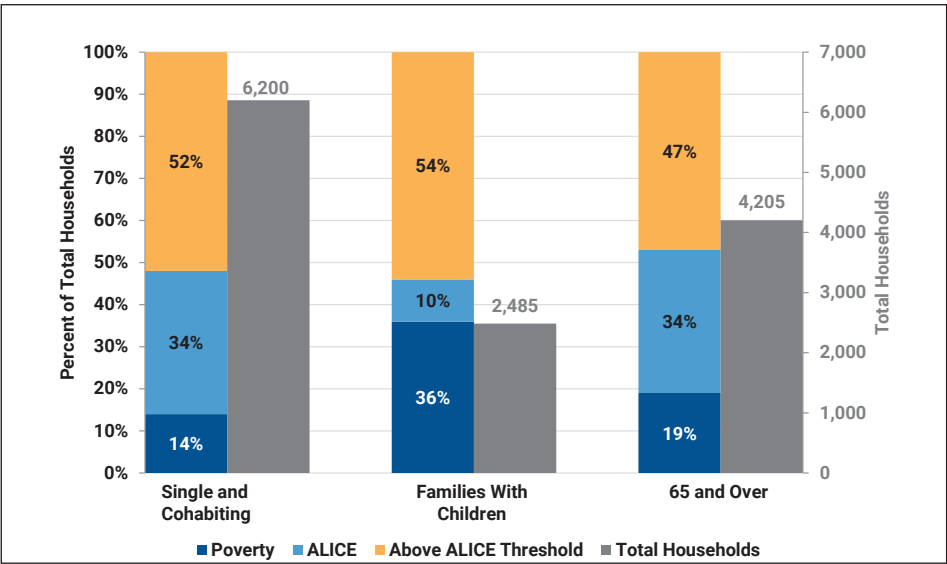

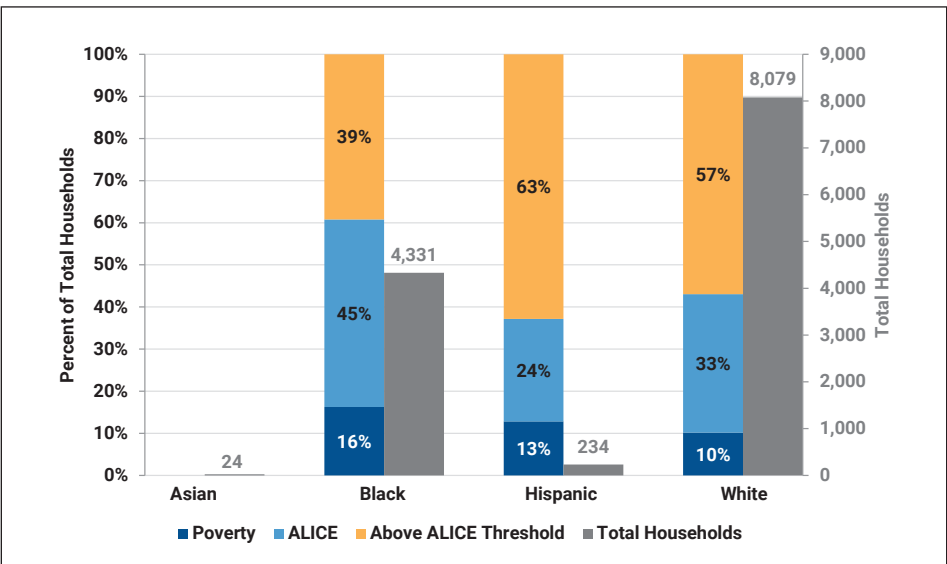

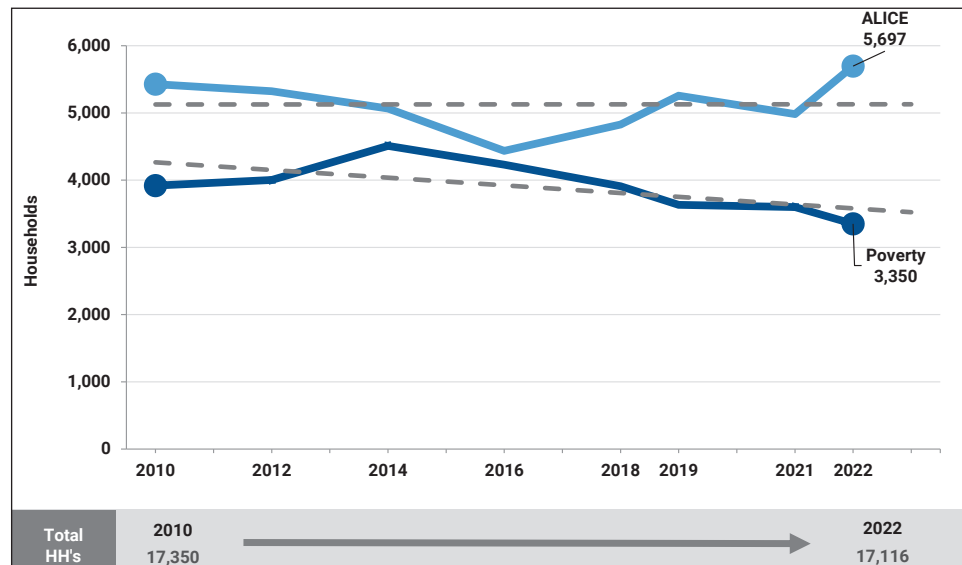

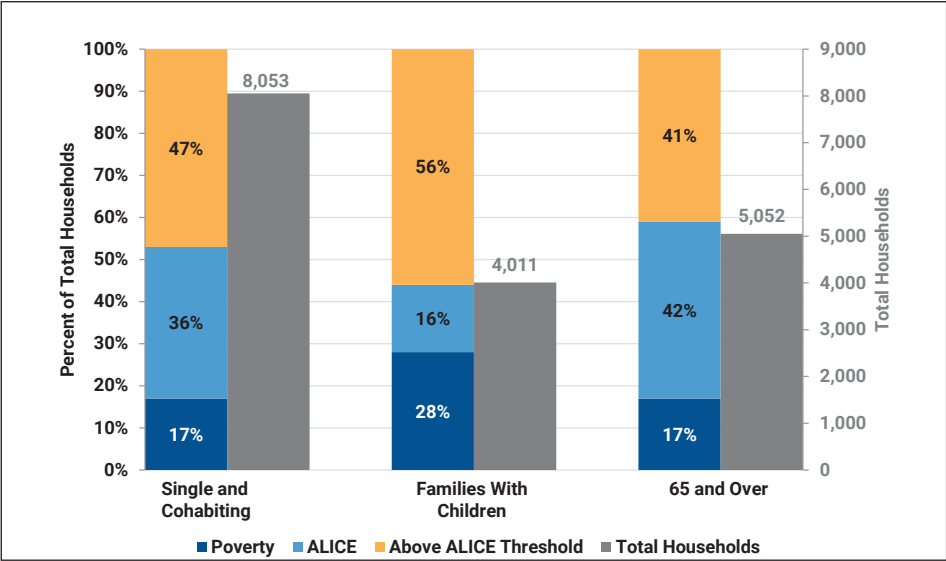

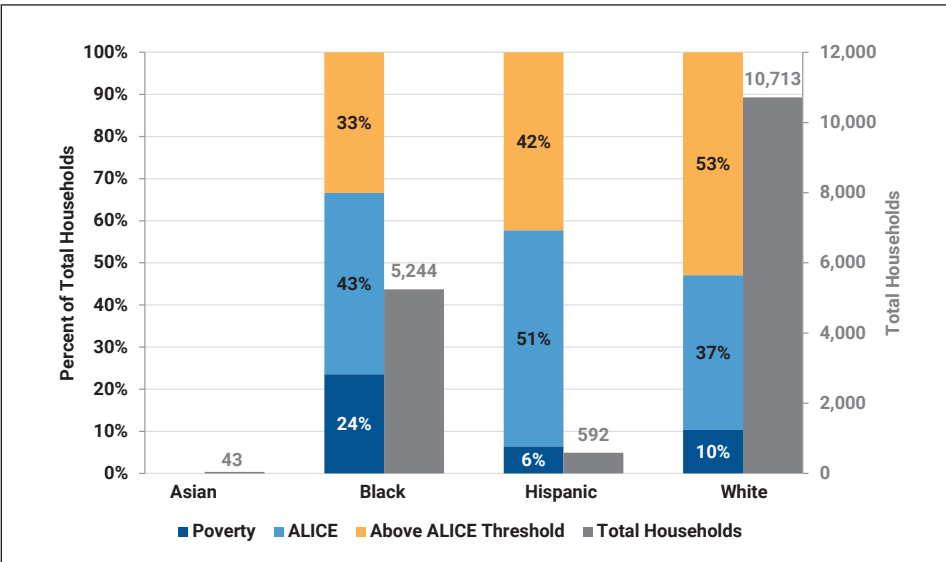

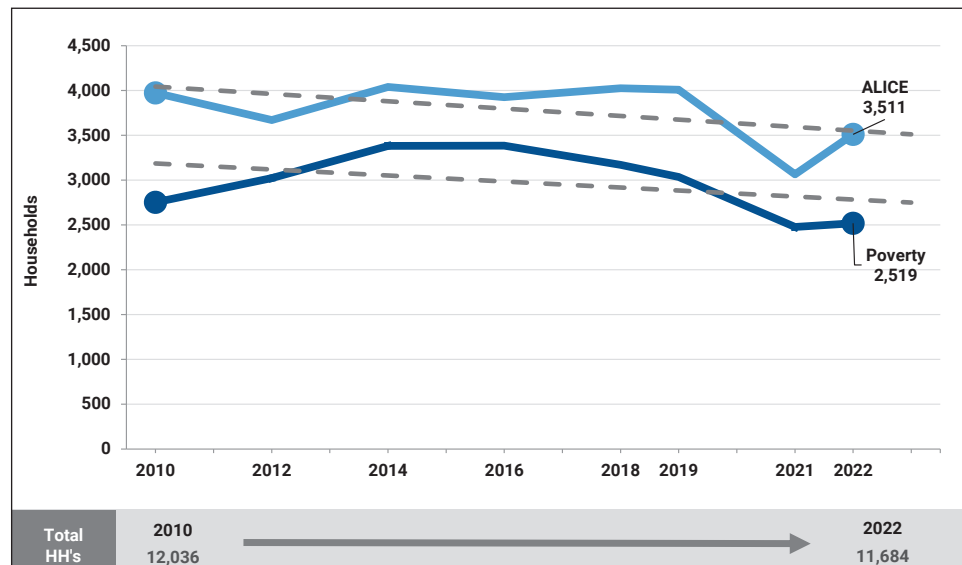

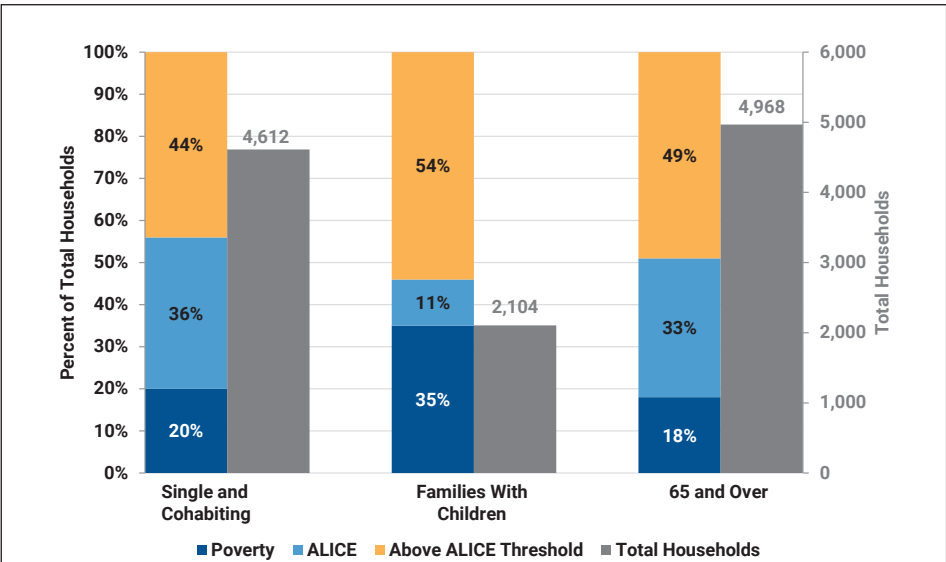

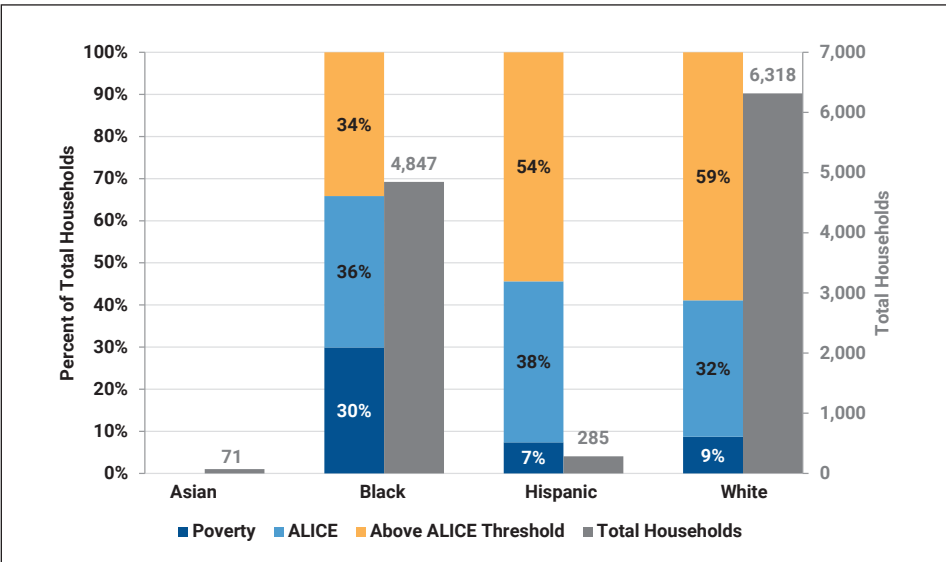

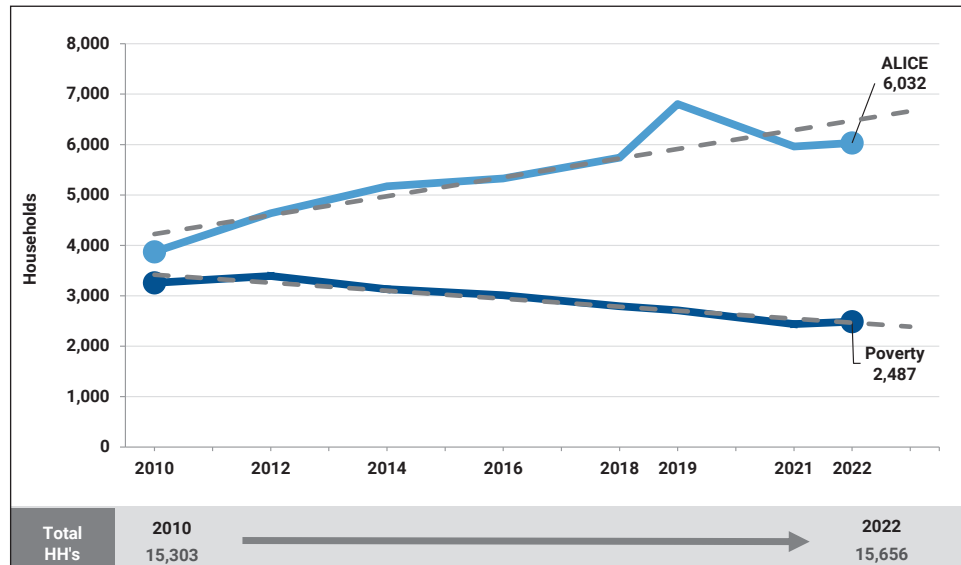

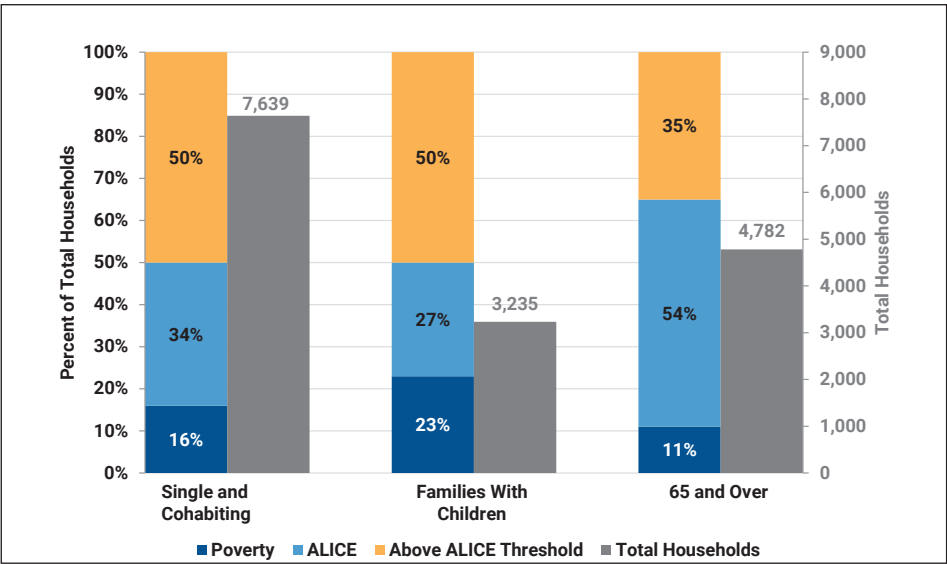

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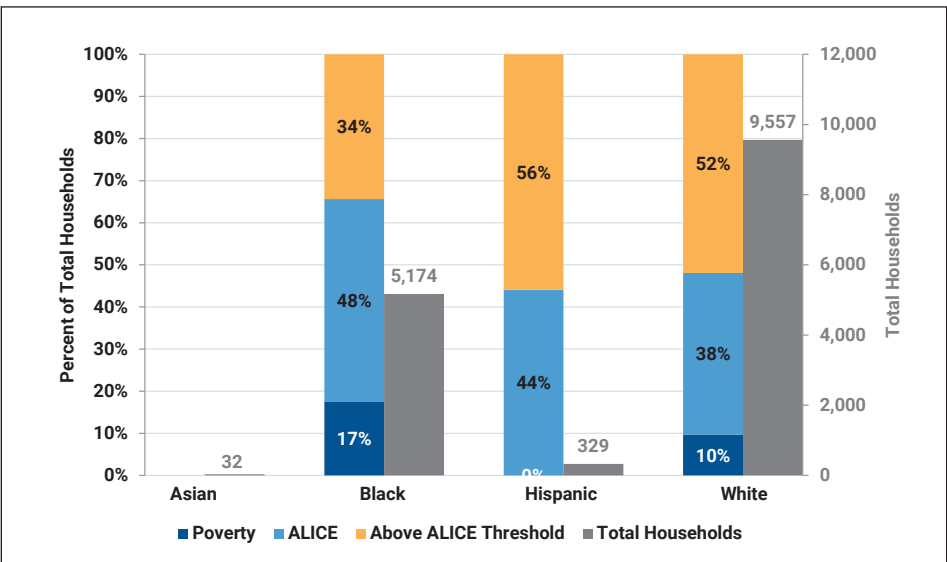

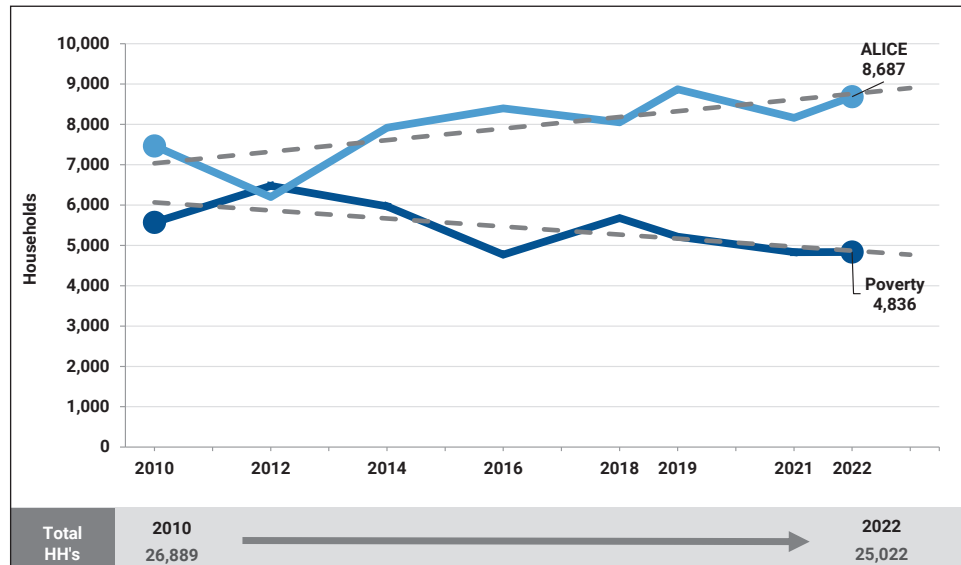

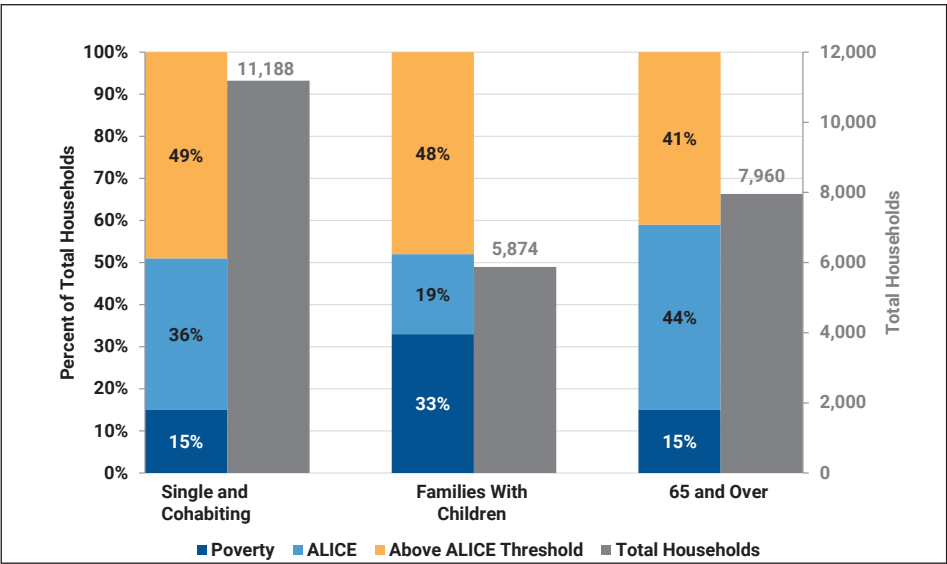

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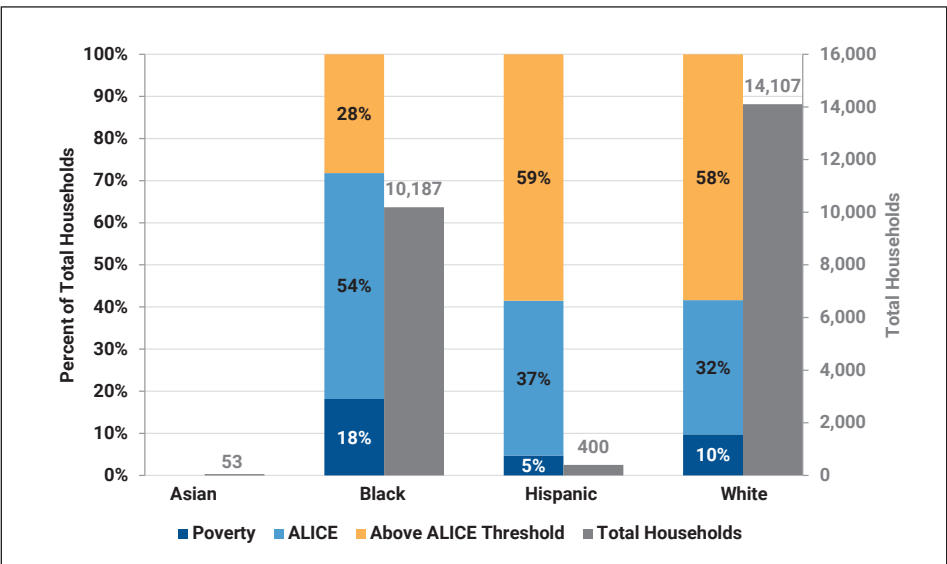
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Household Financial Status by Household Type, Darlington County, 2022

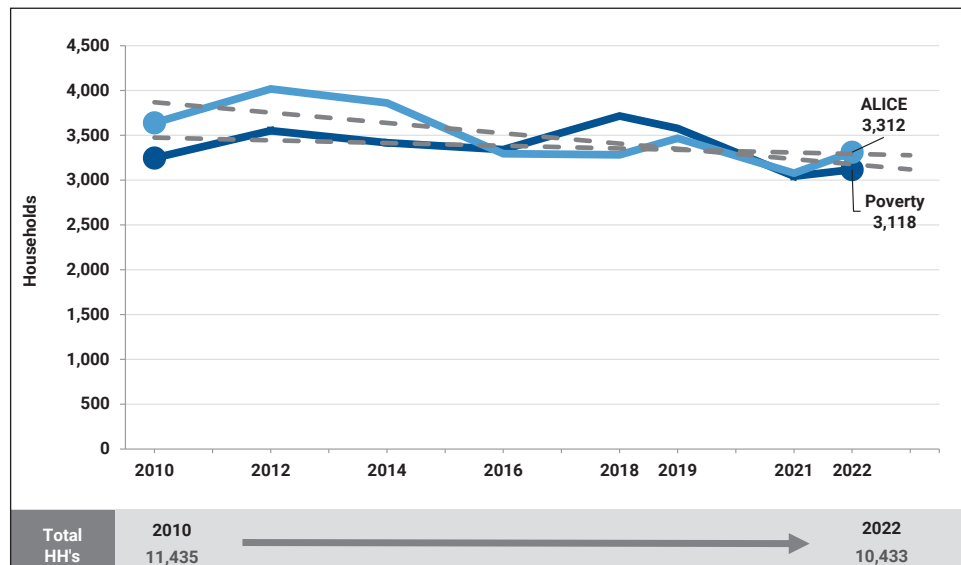

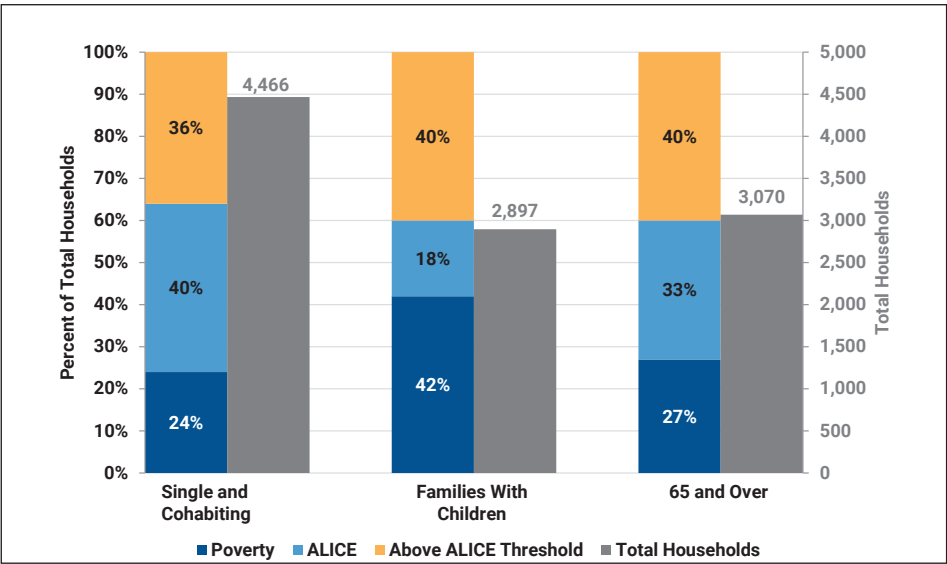
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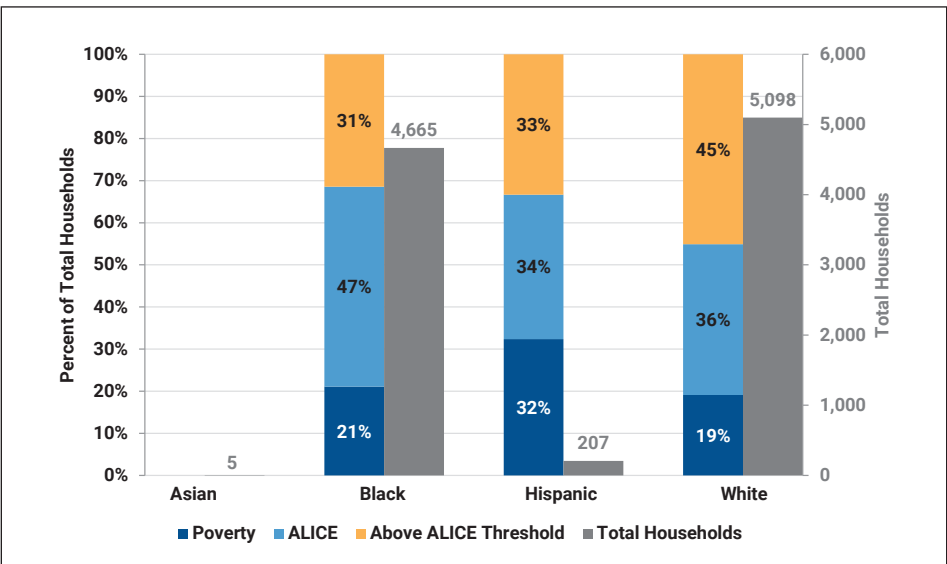
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Household Financial Status by Household Type, Dillon County, 2022

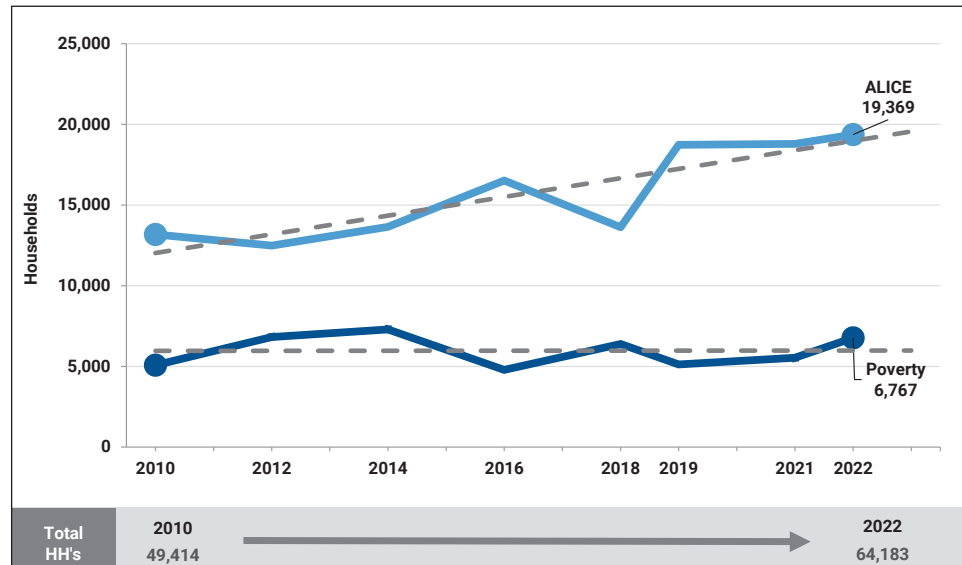

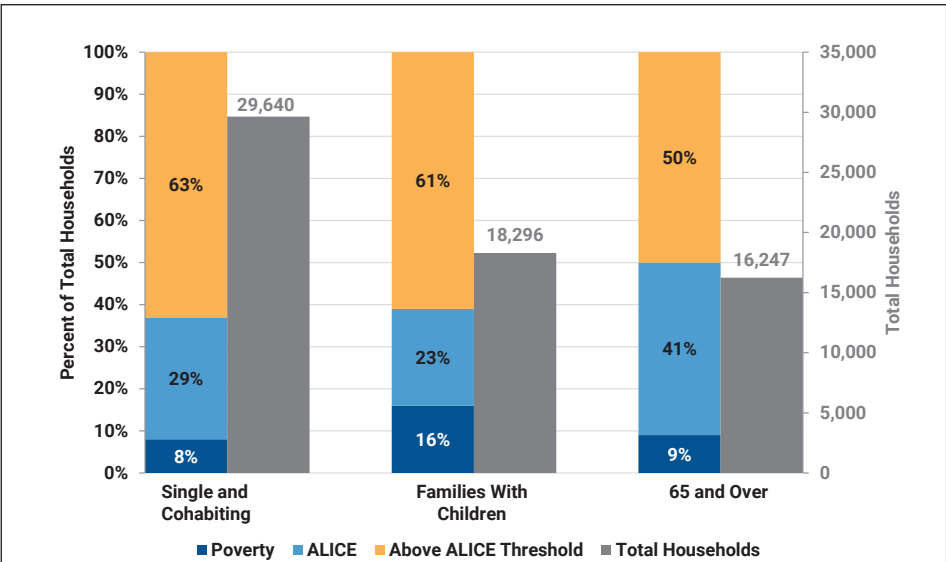

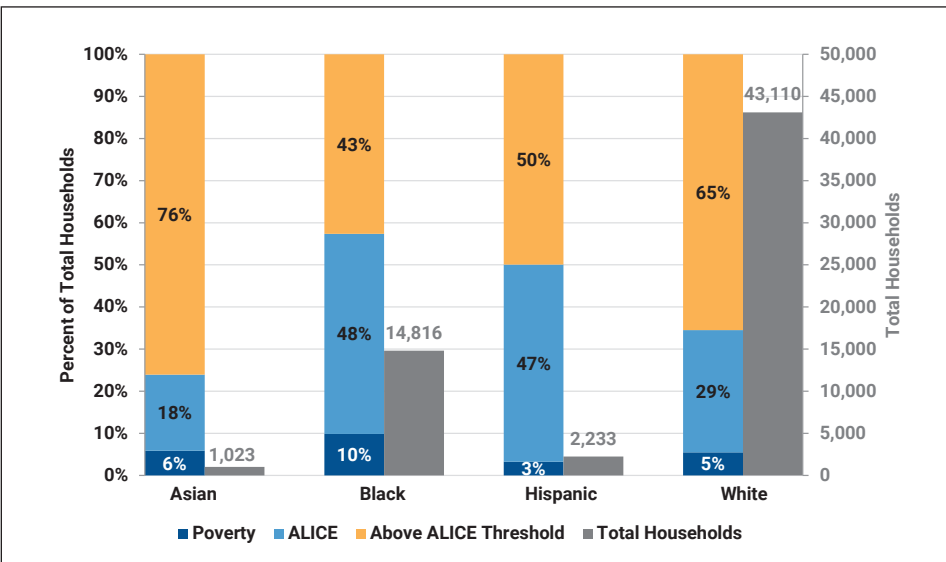

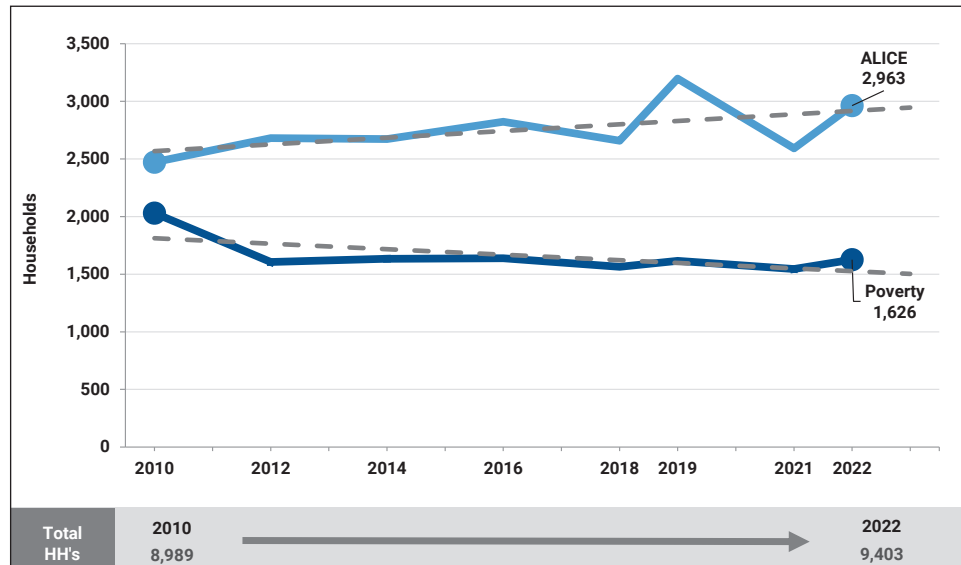

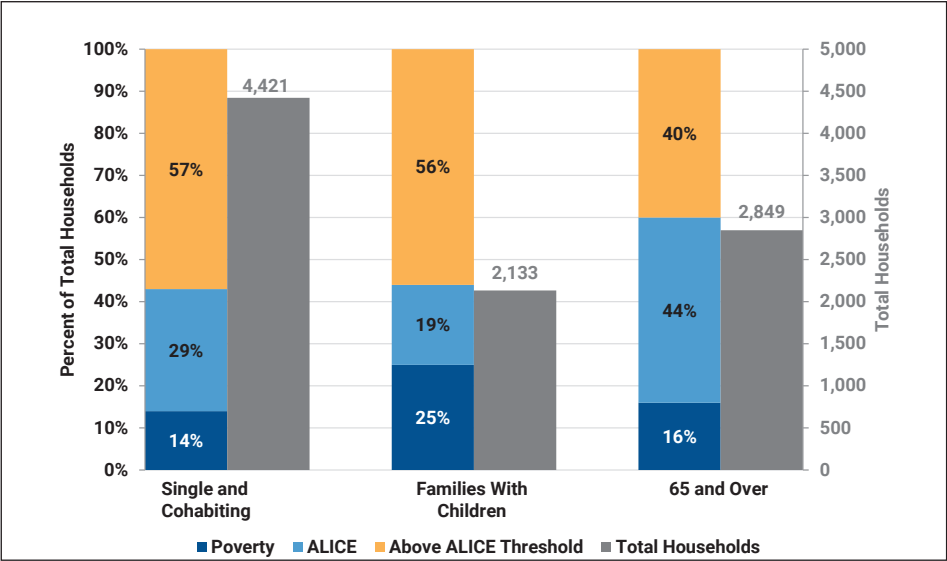

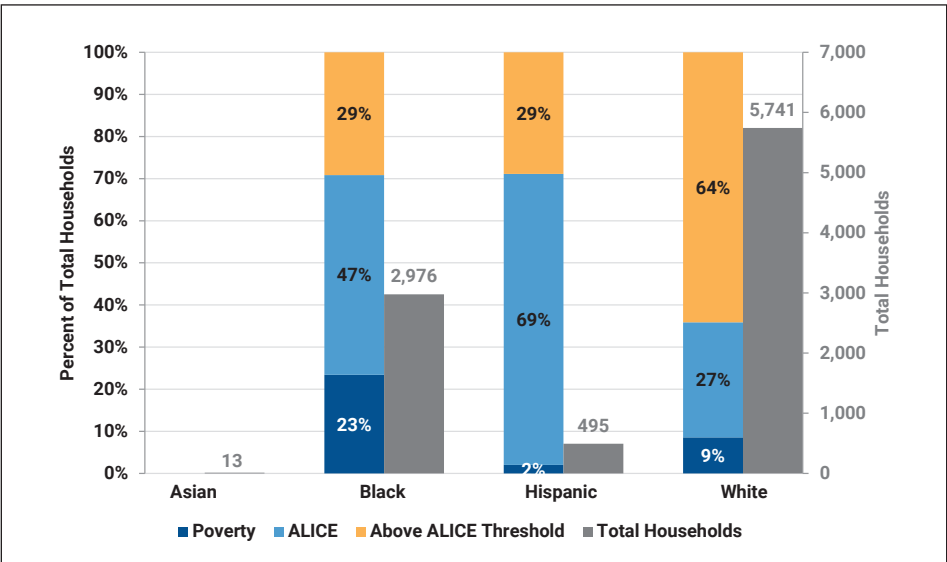

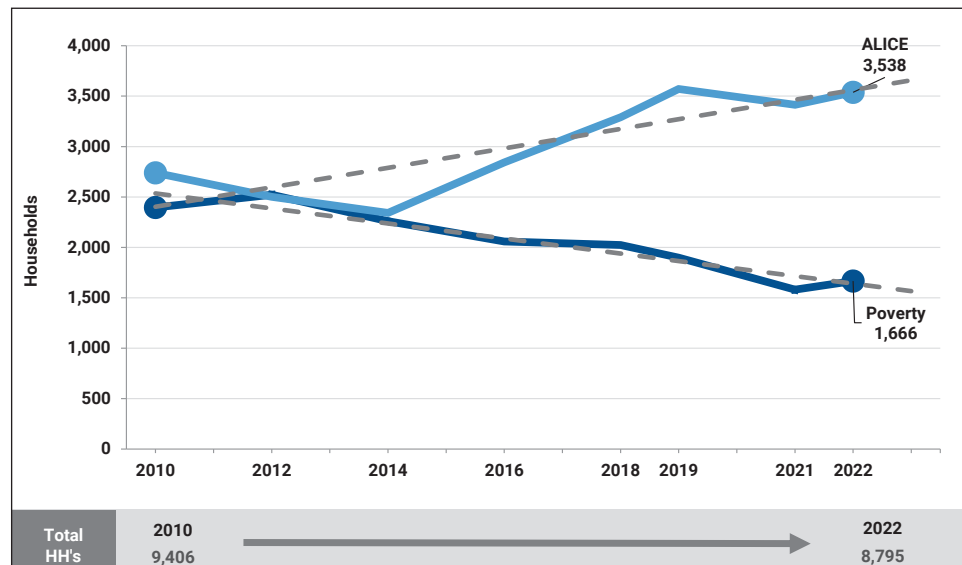

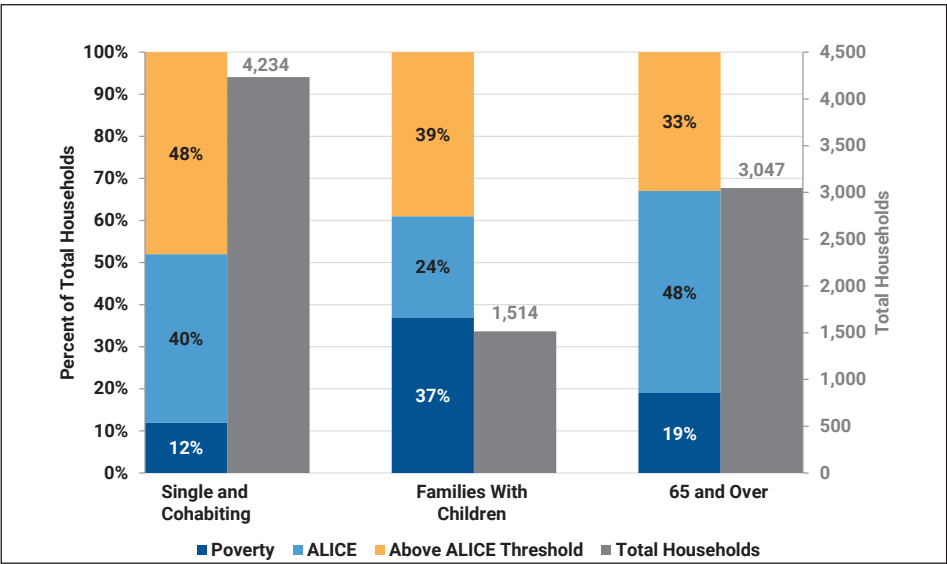

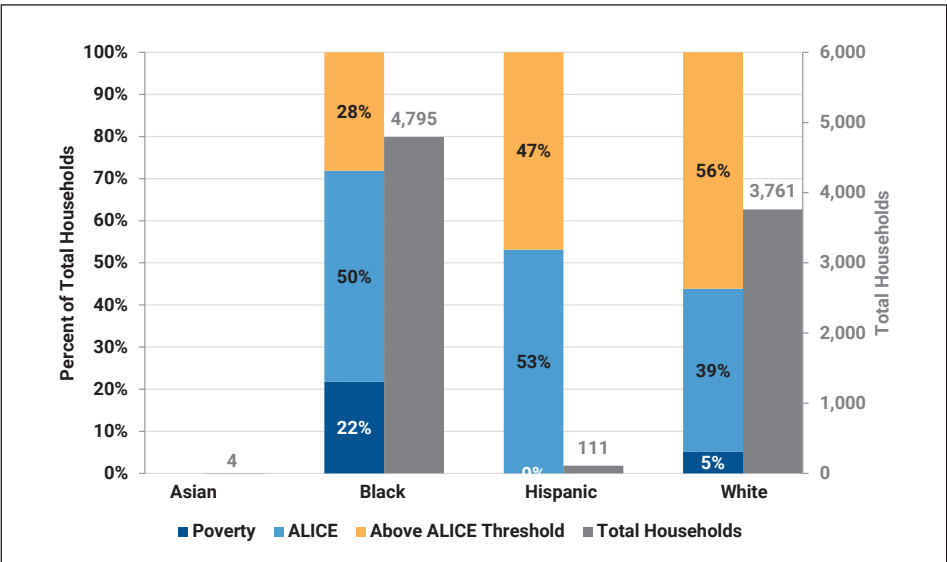

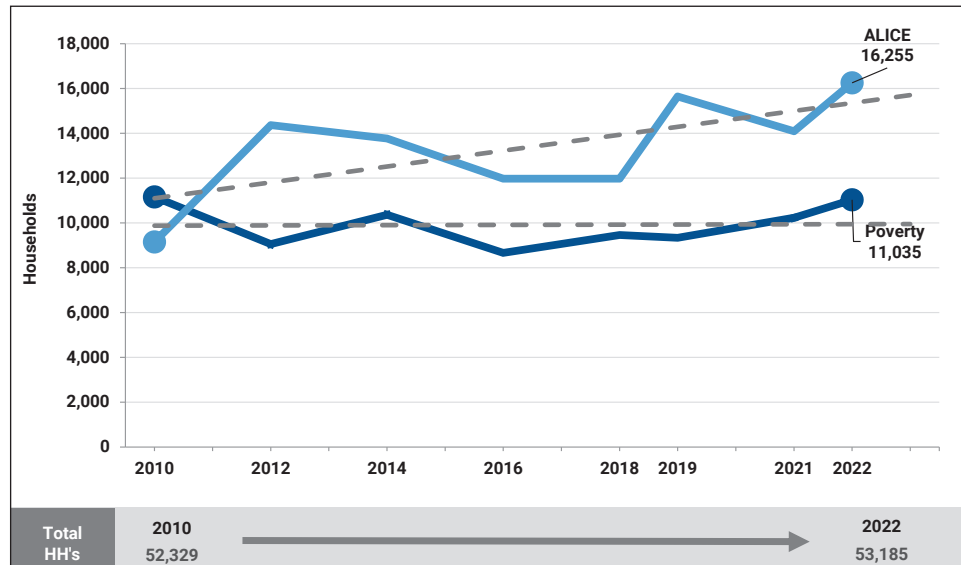

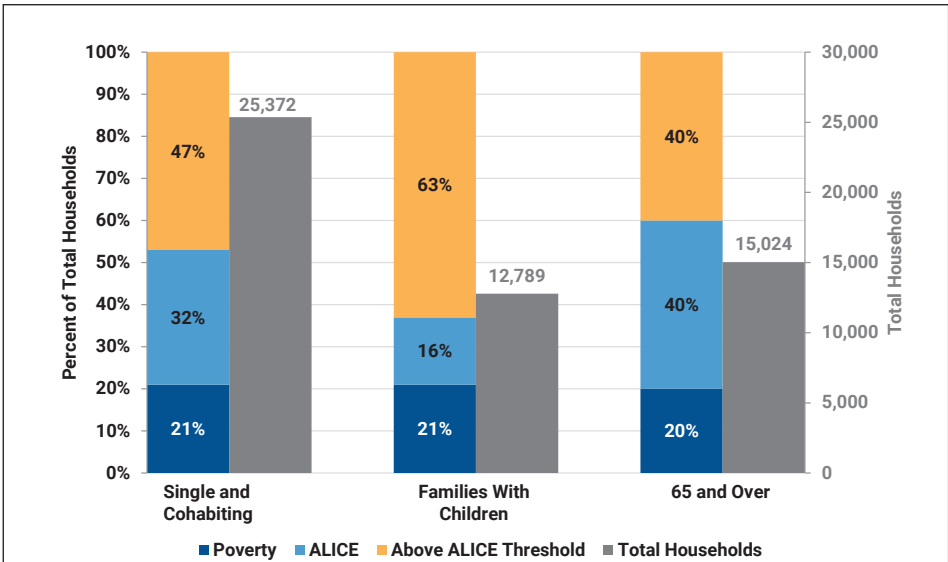

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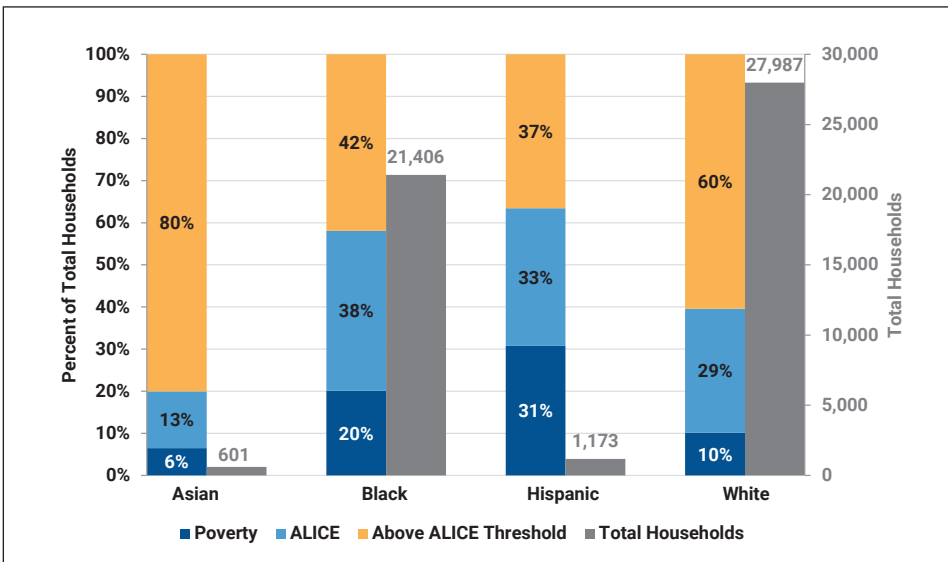

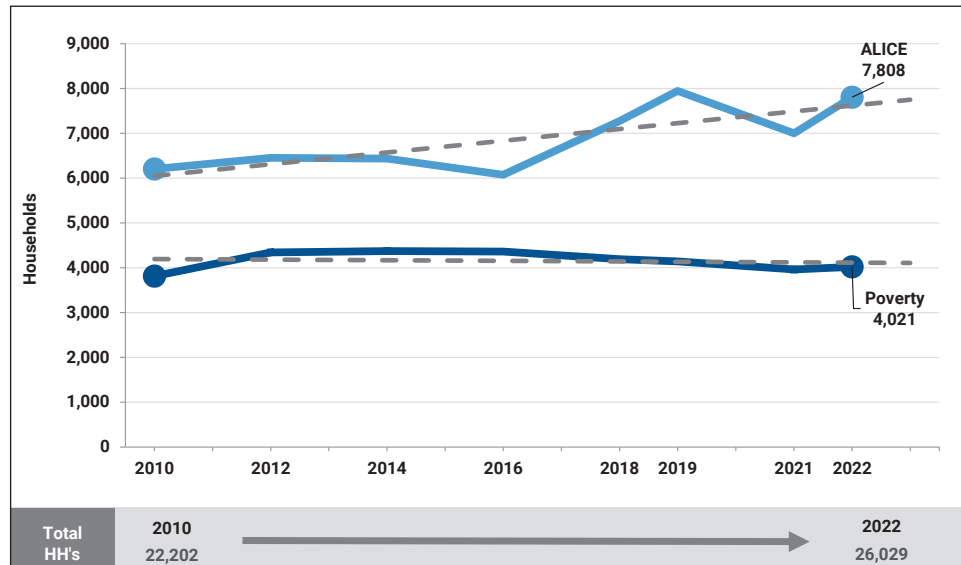

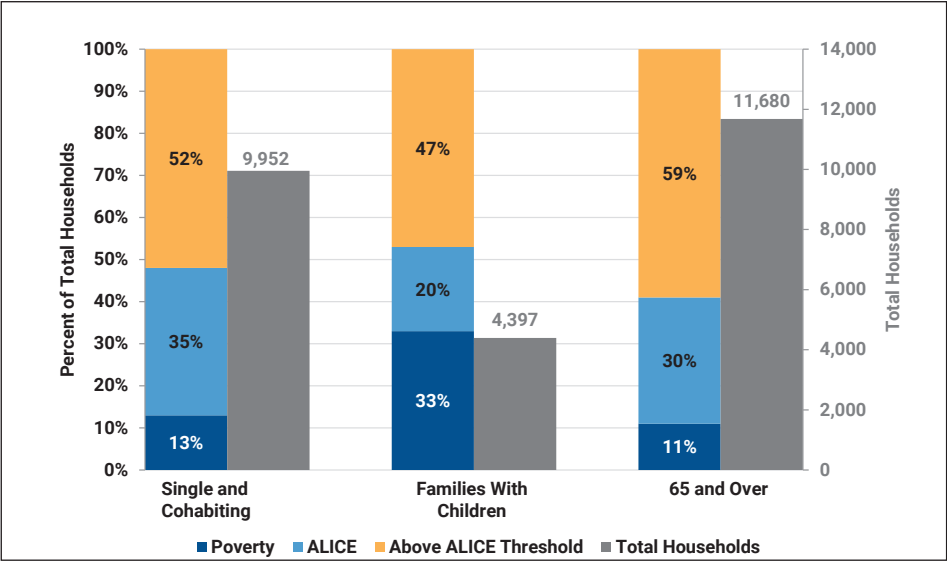

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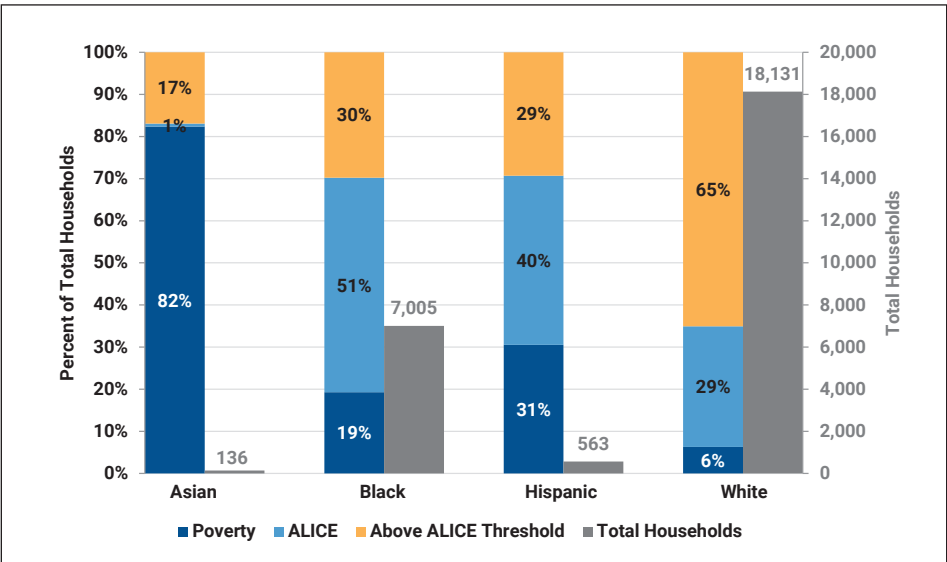
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Household Financial Status by Household Type, Georgetown County, 2022

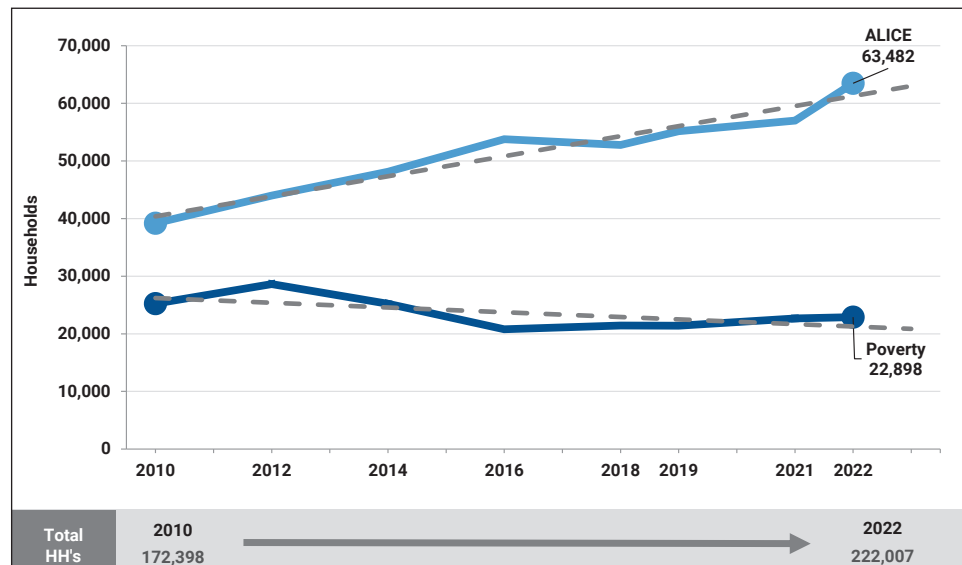

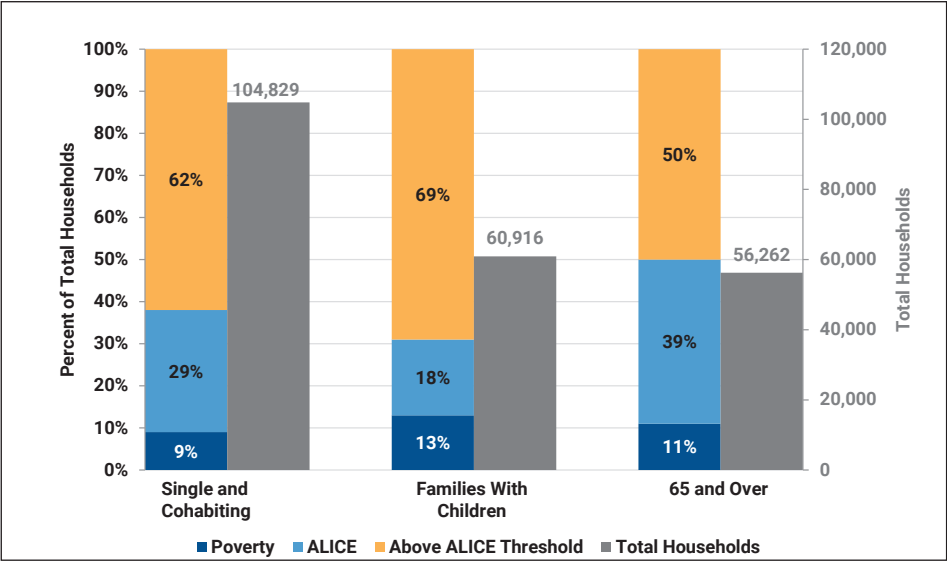

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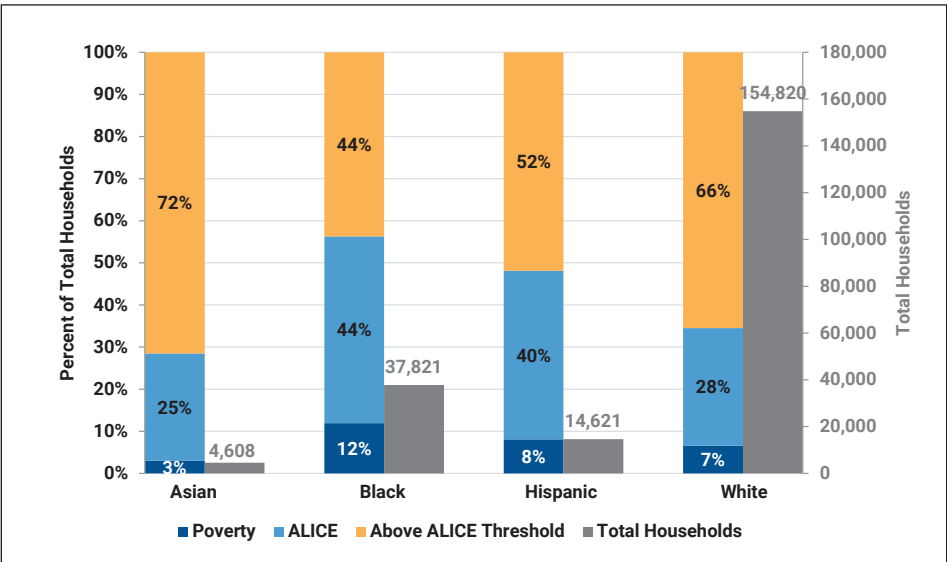
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Household Financial Status by Household Type, Greenville County, 2022

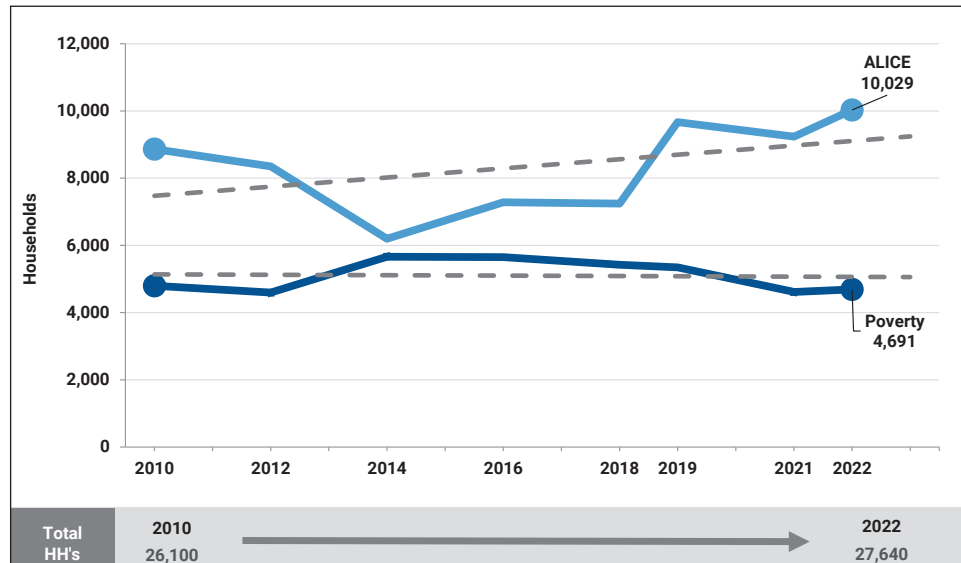

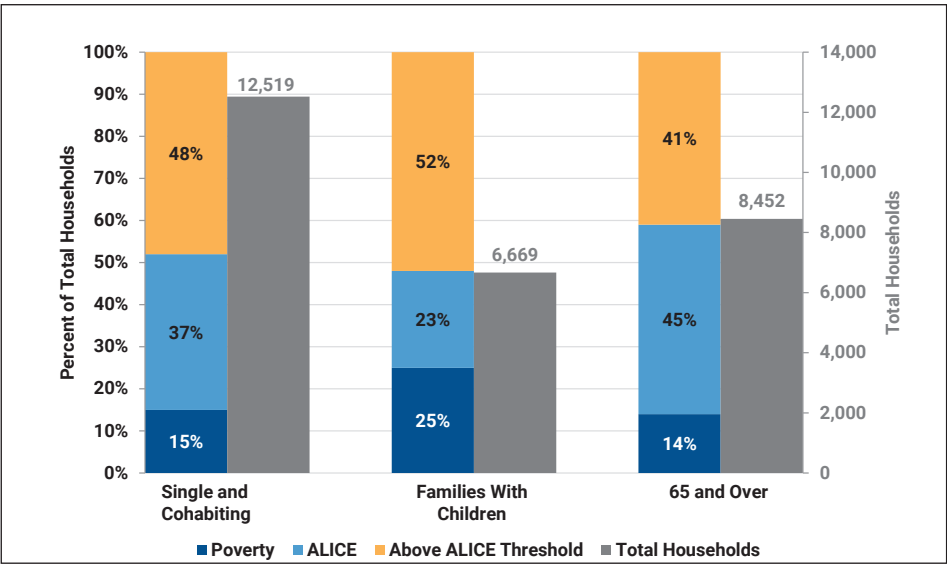

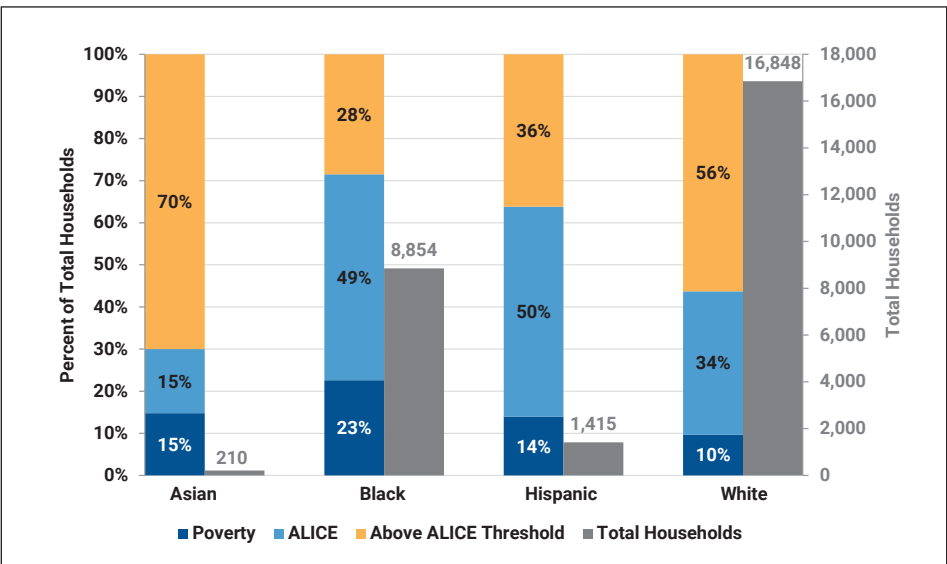

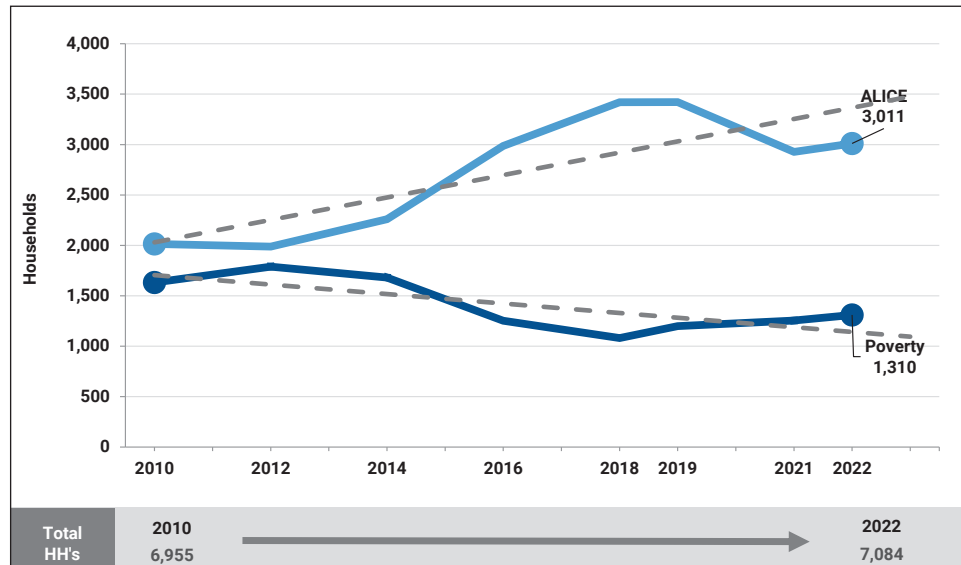

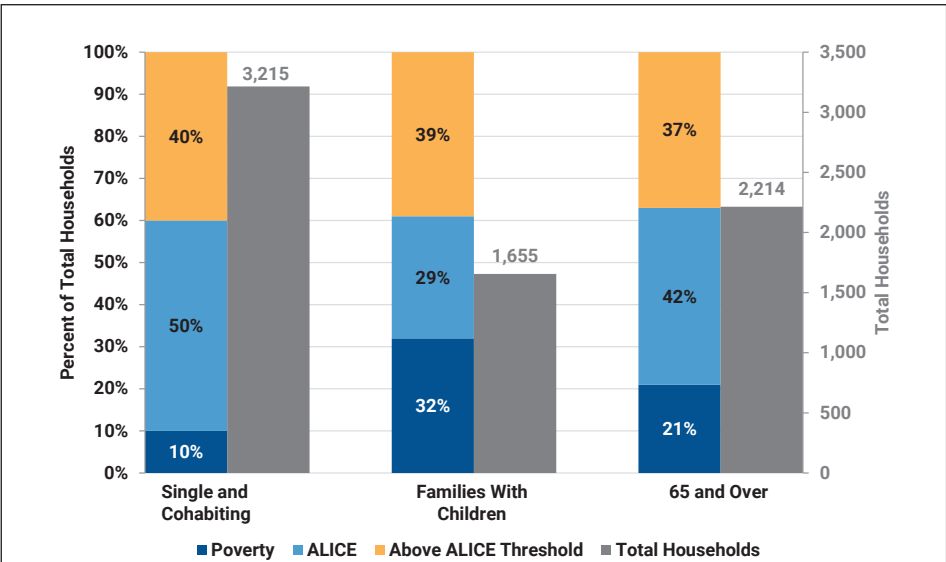

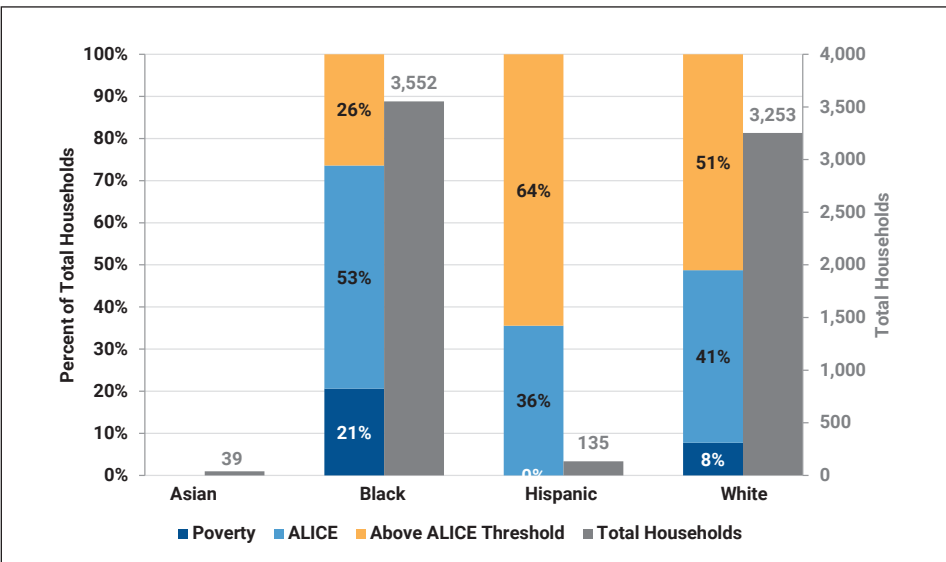

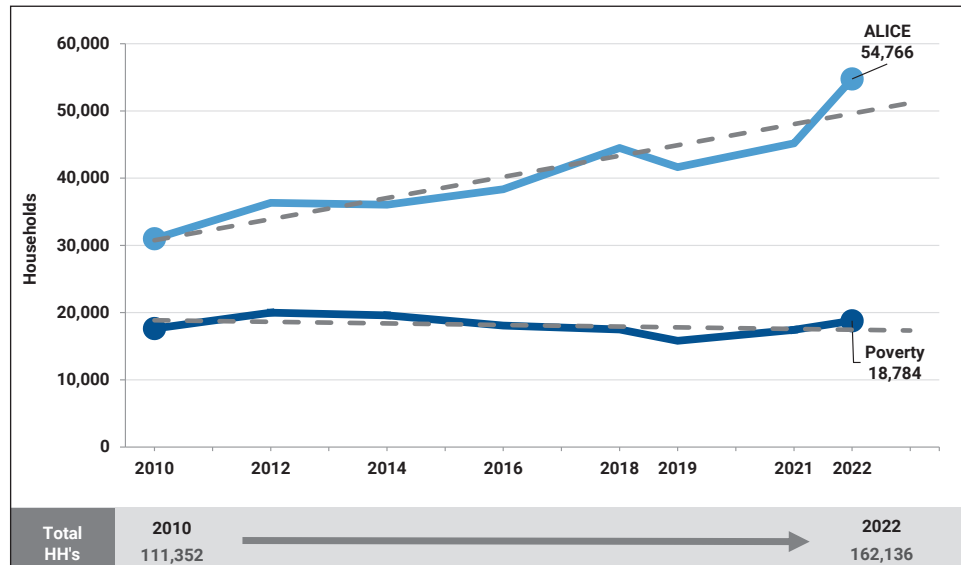

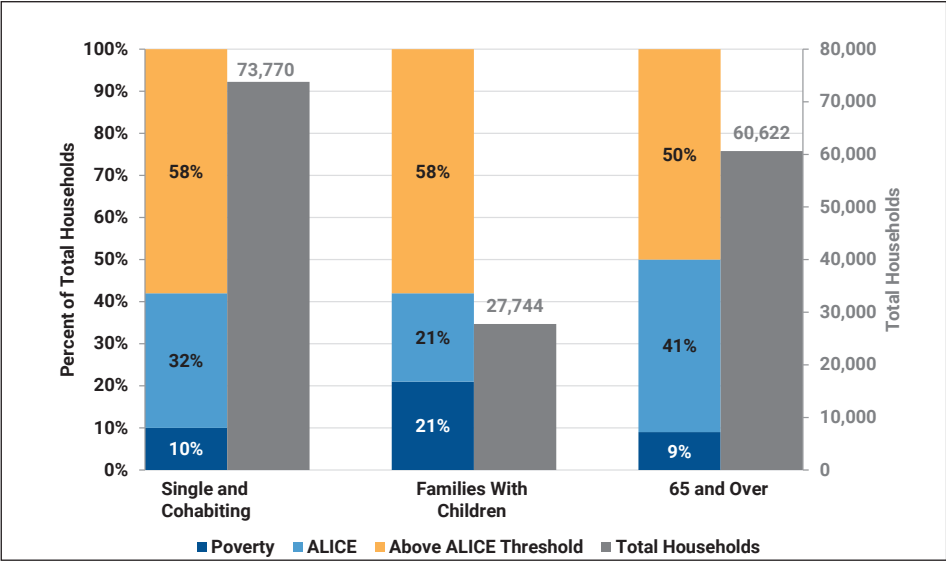

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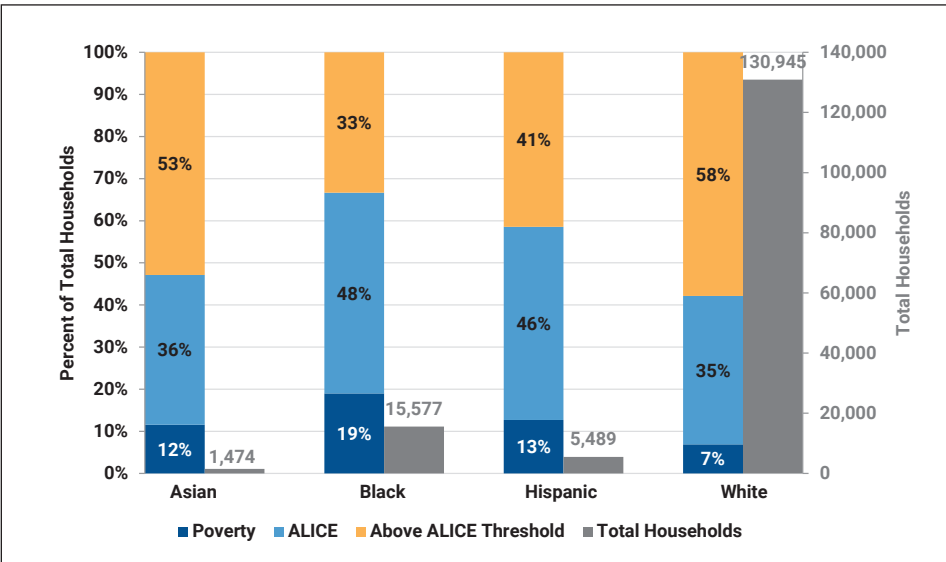

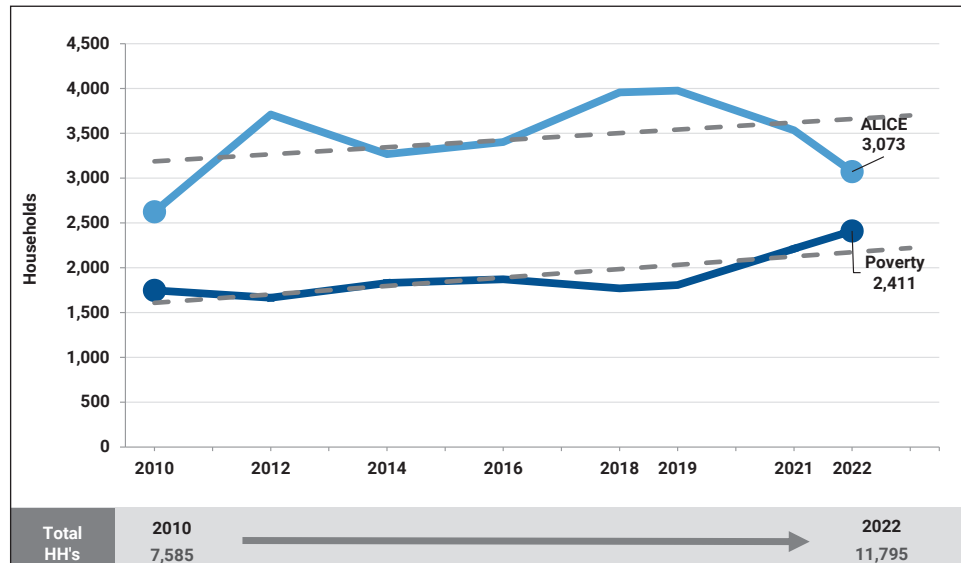

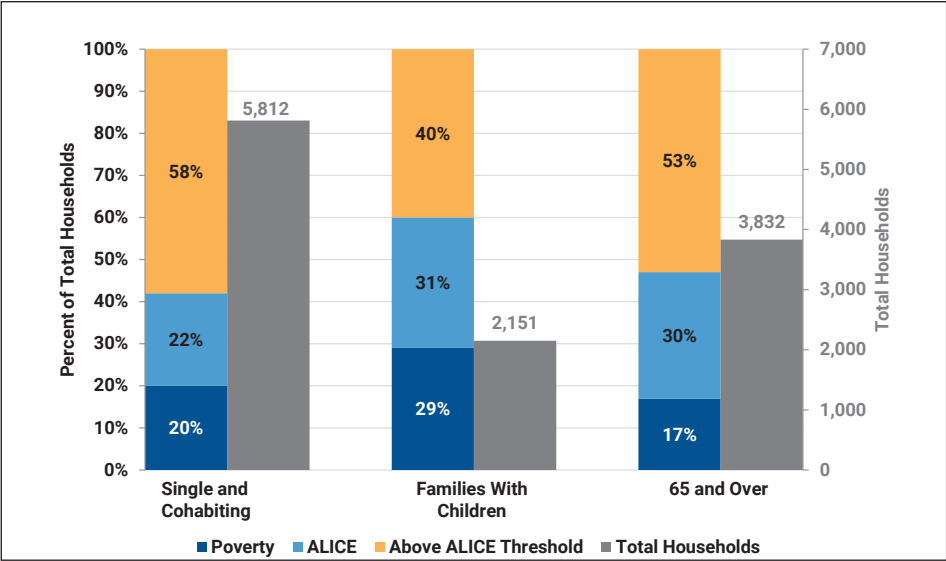

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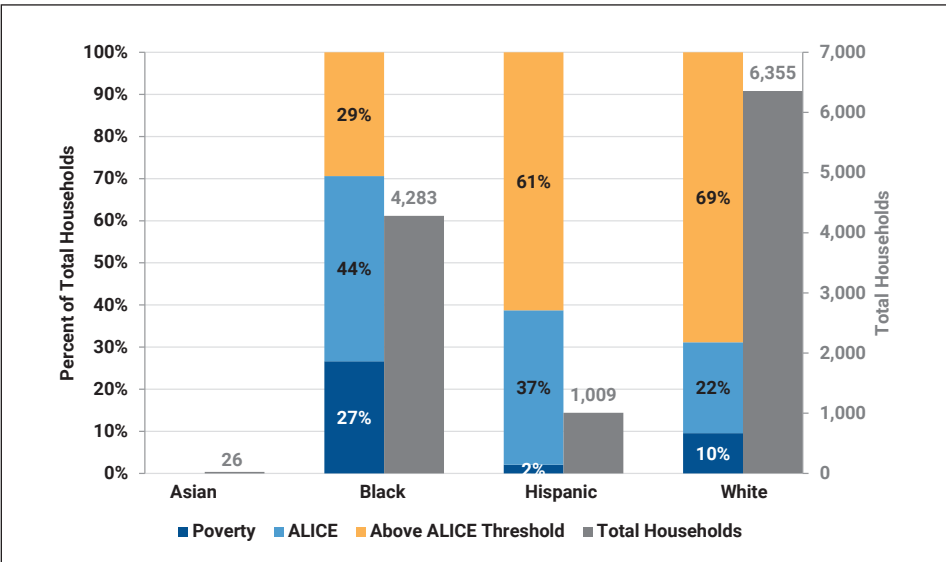
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Household Financial Status by Household Type, Jasper County, 2022

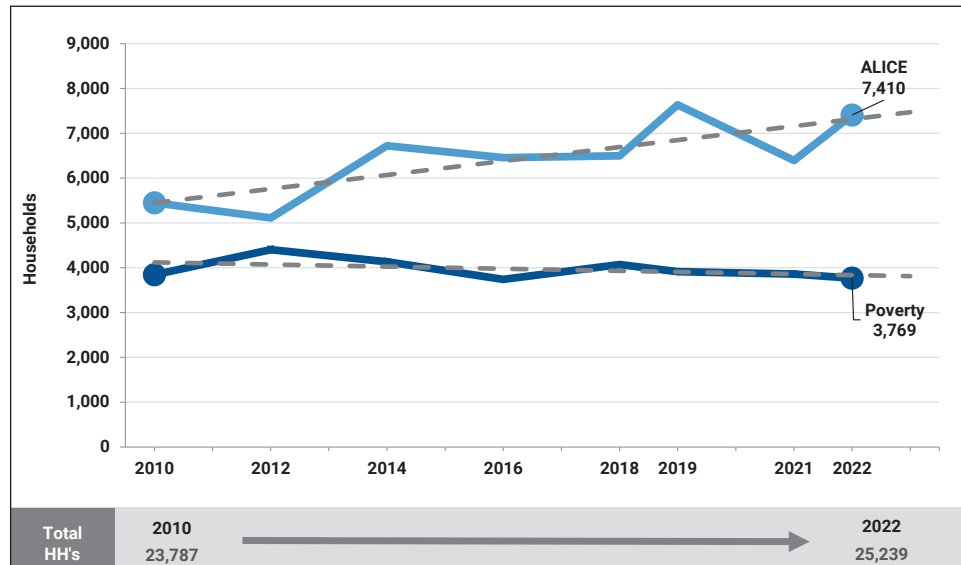

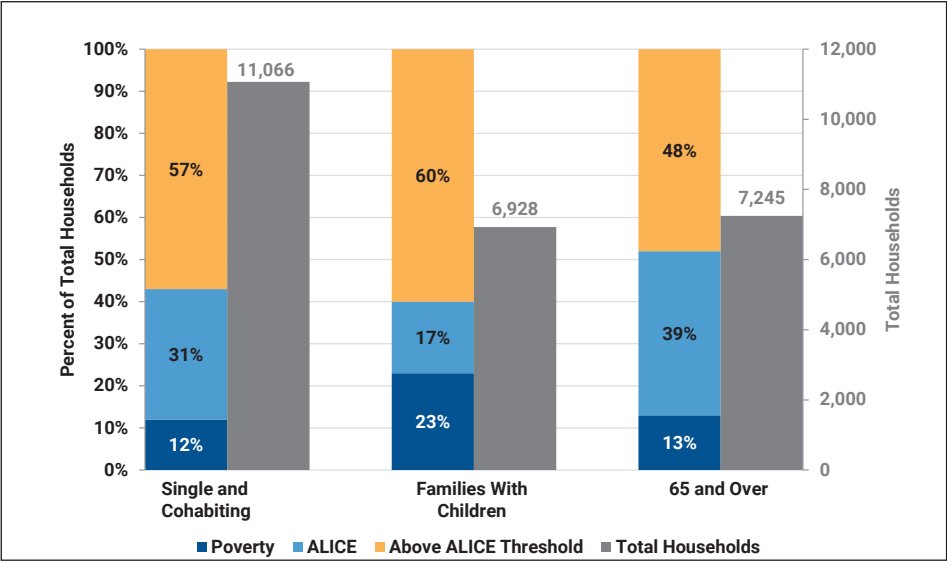

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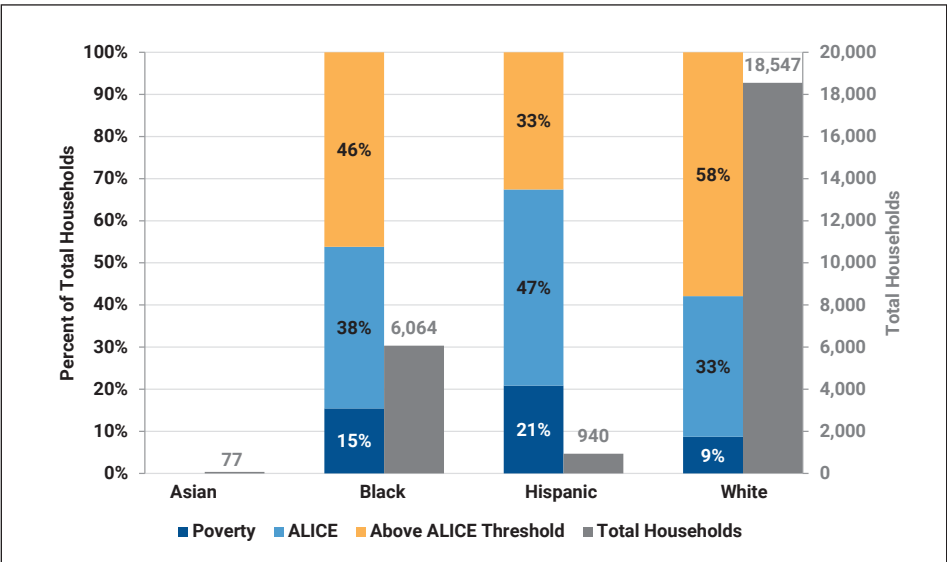

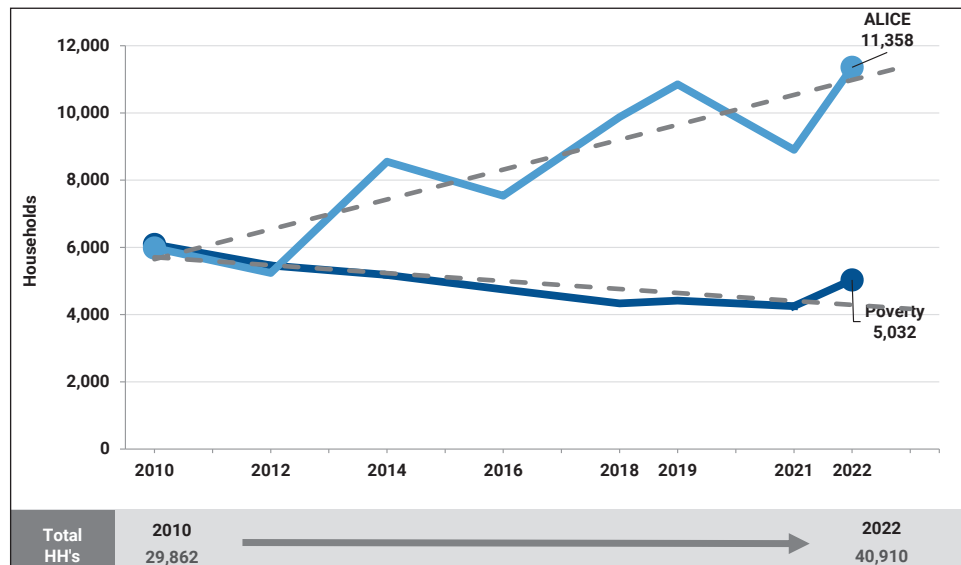

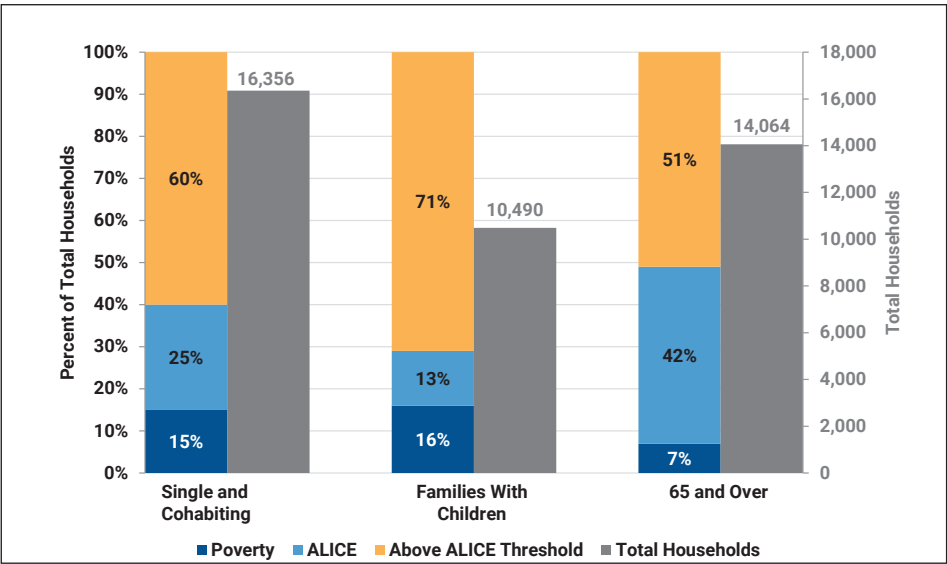
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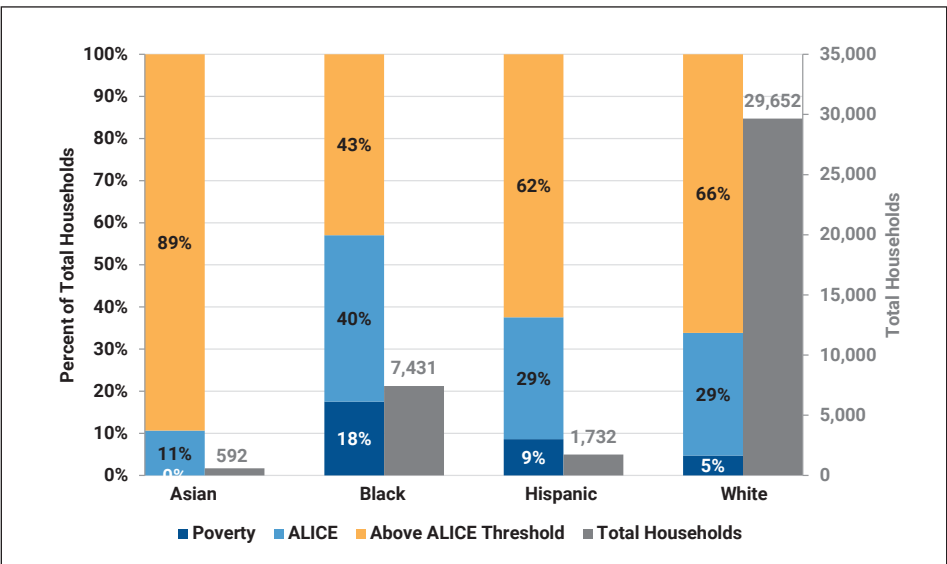
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Household Financial Status by Household Type, Lancaster County, 2022

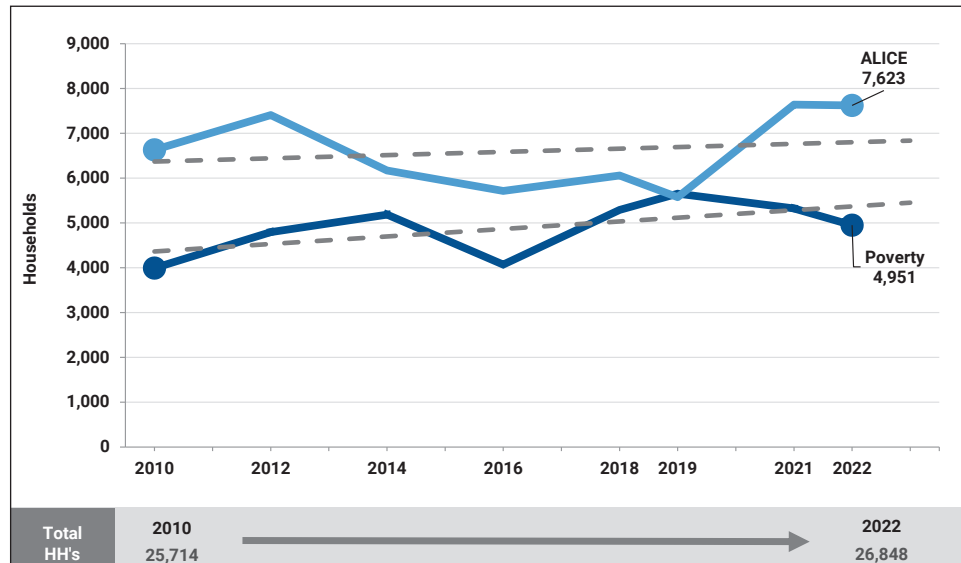

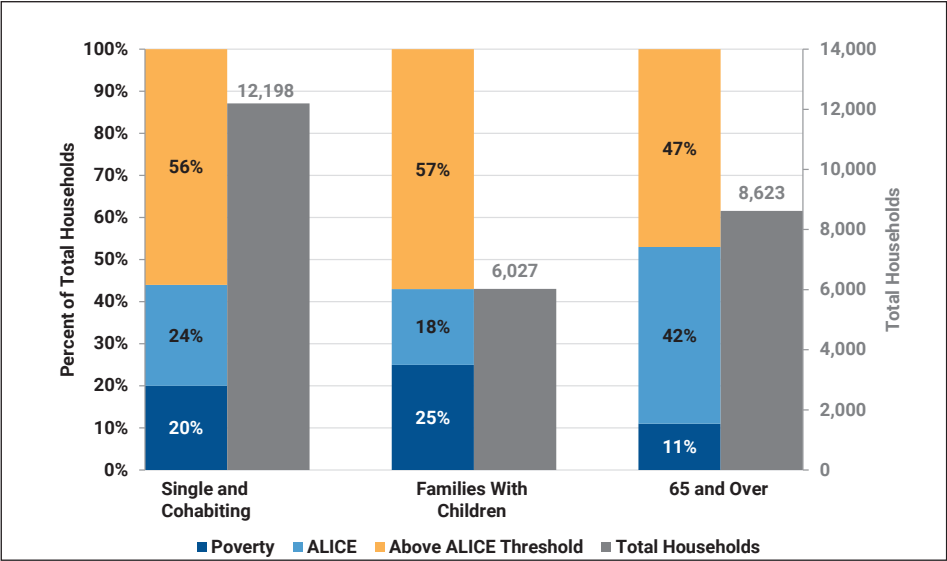

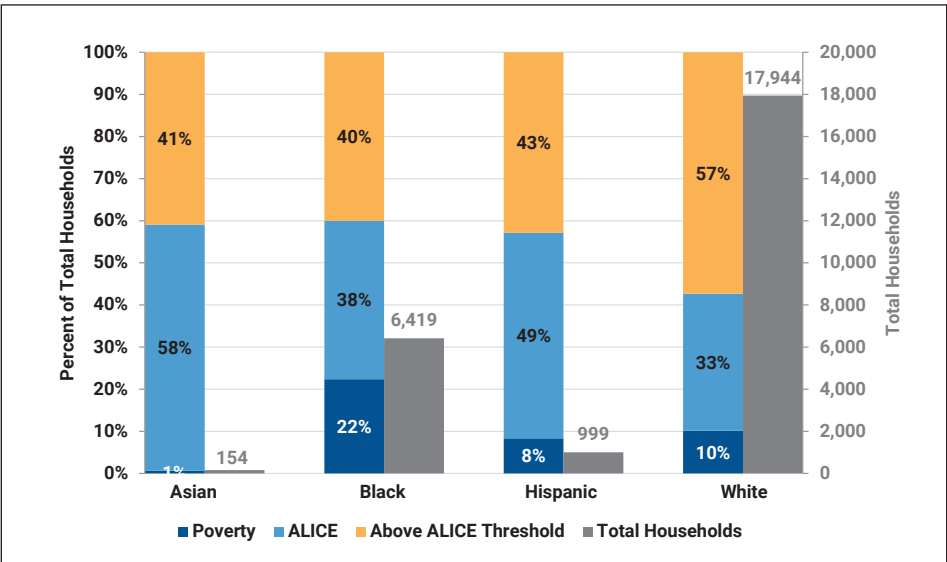

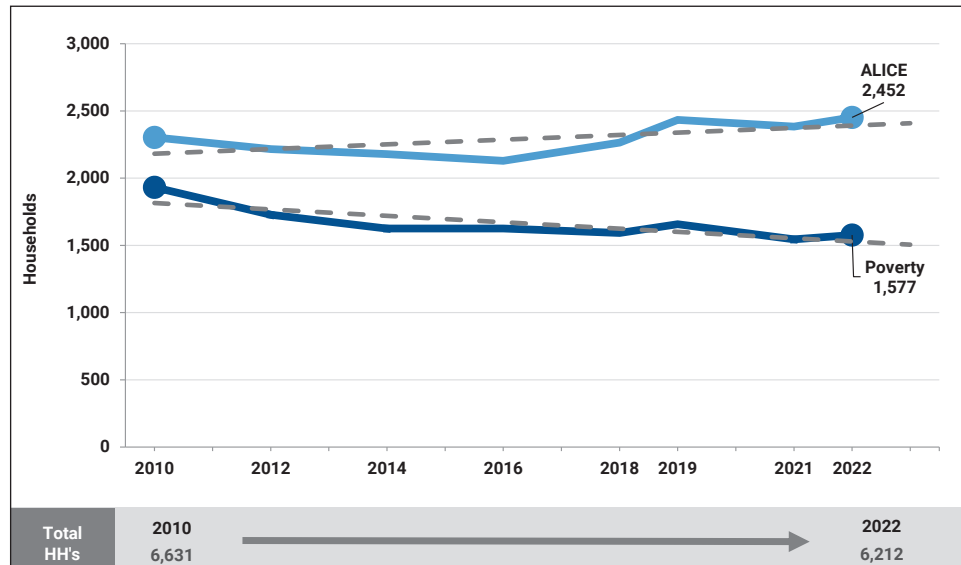

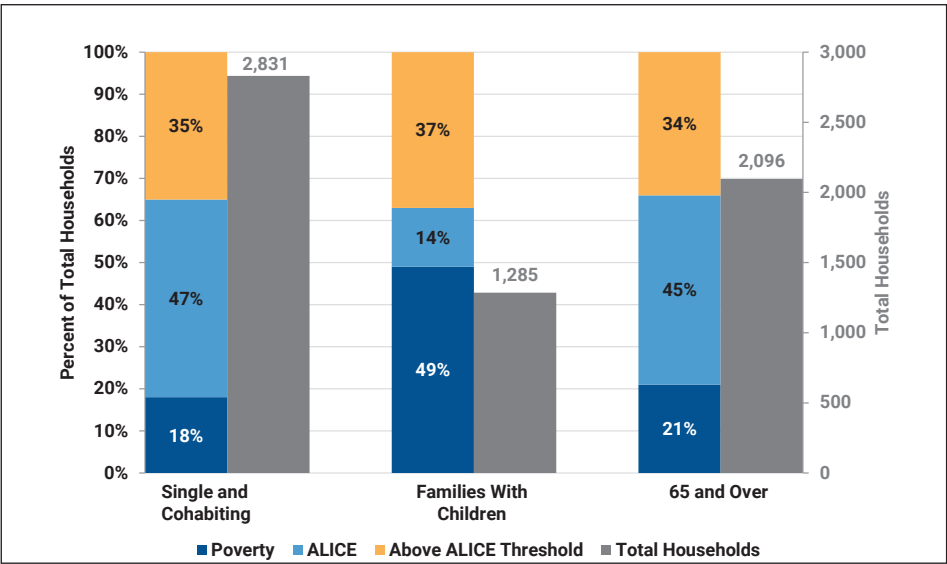

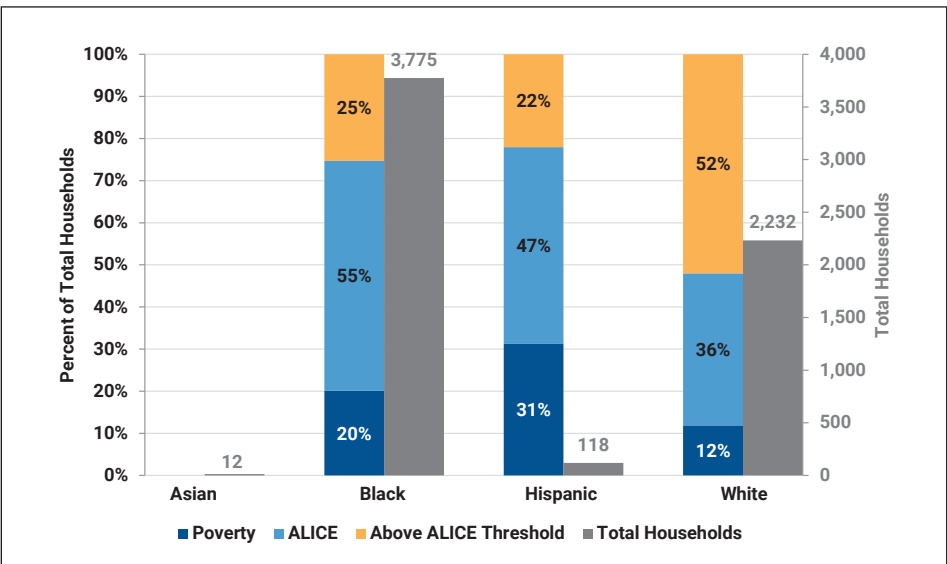

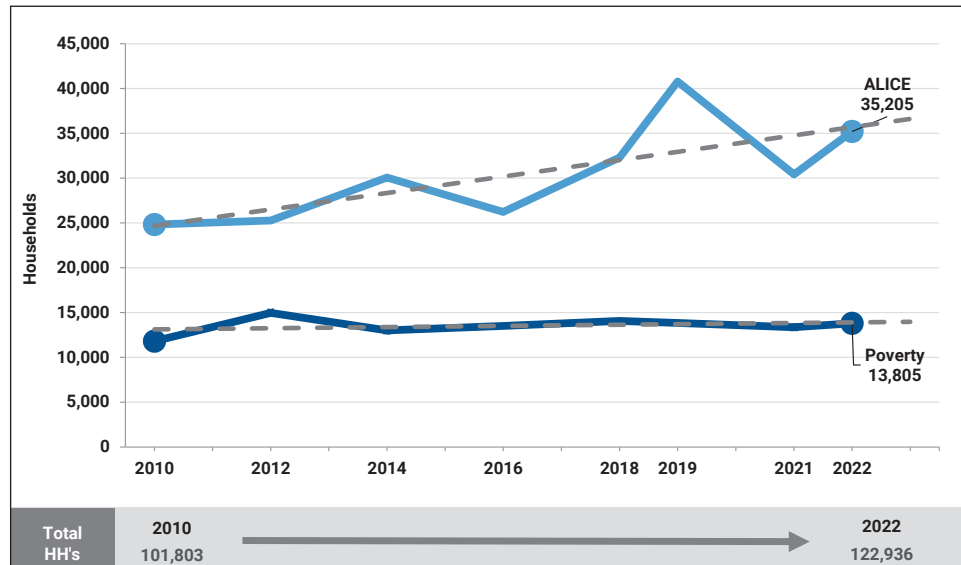

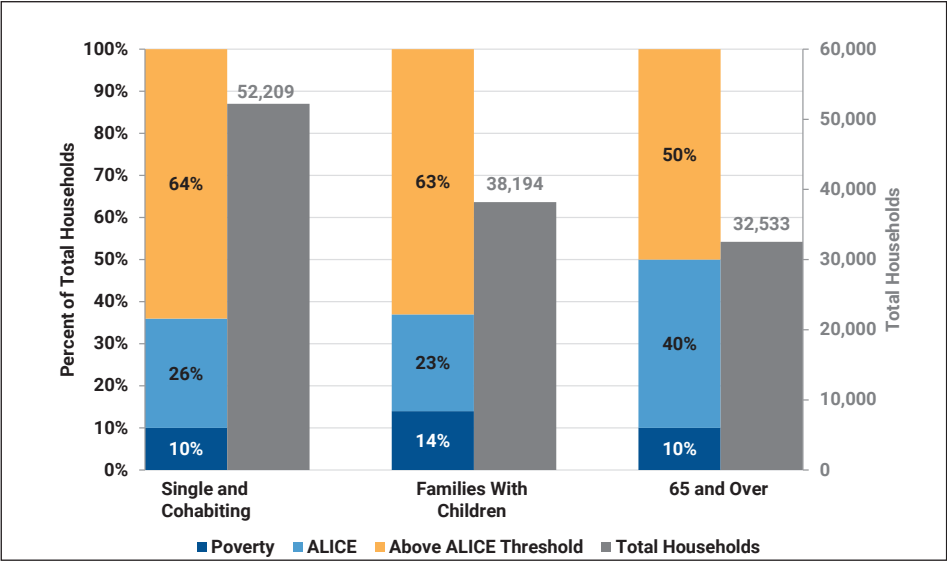

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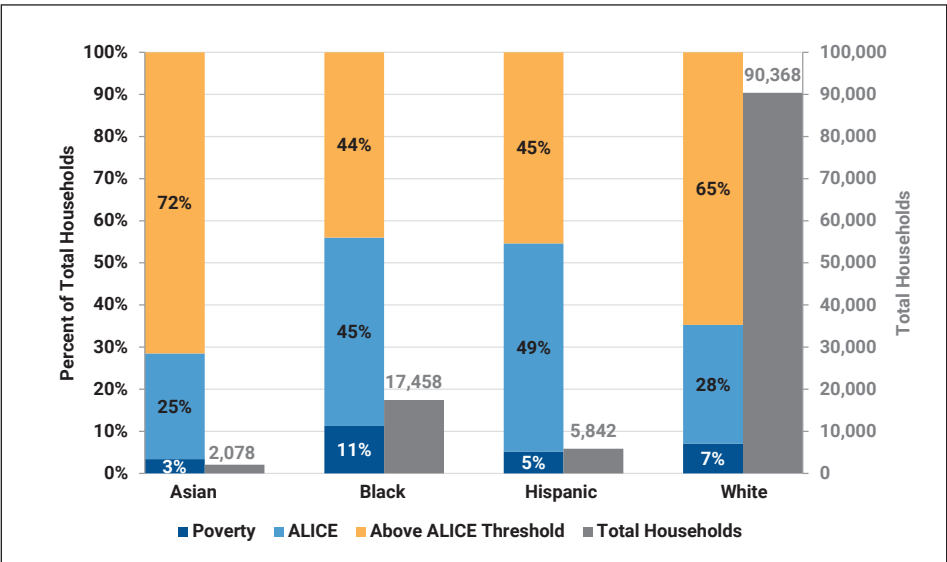

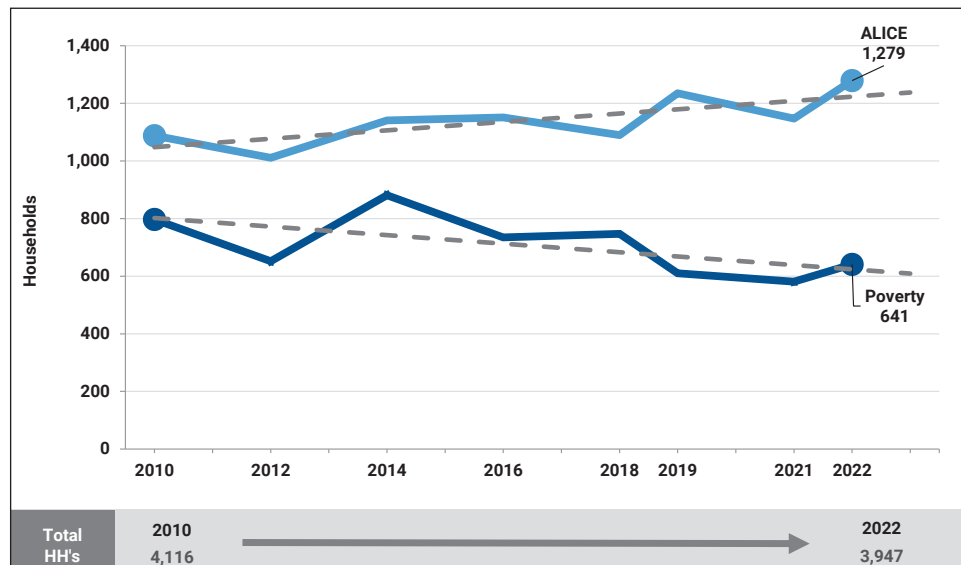

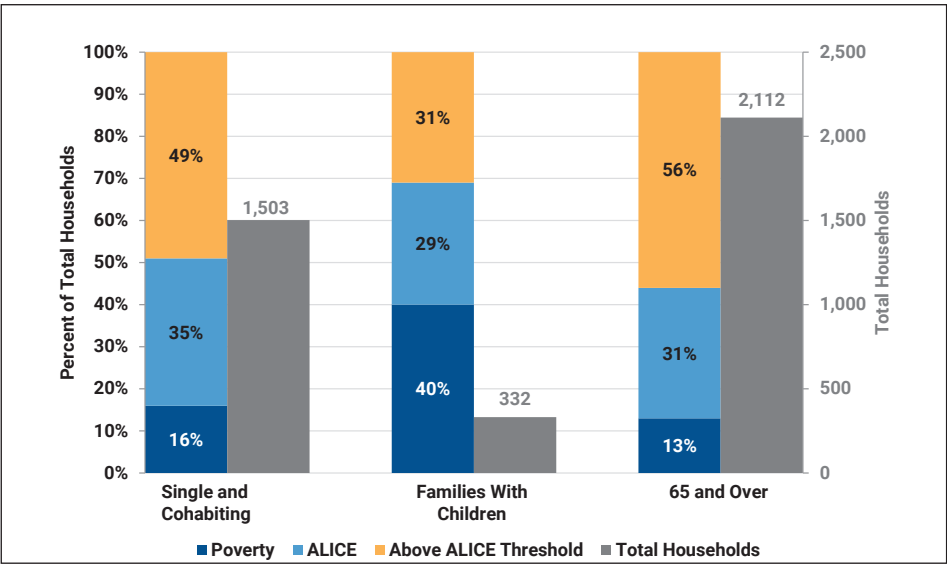

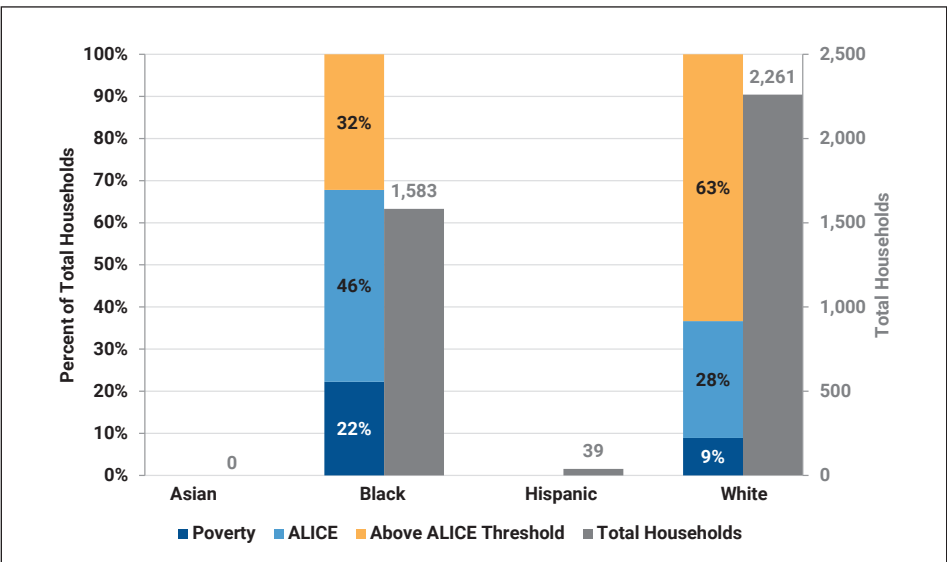
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Household Financial Status by Household Type, McCormick County, 2022

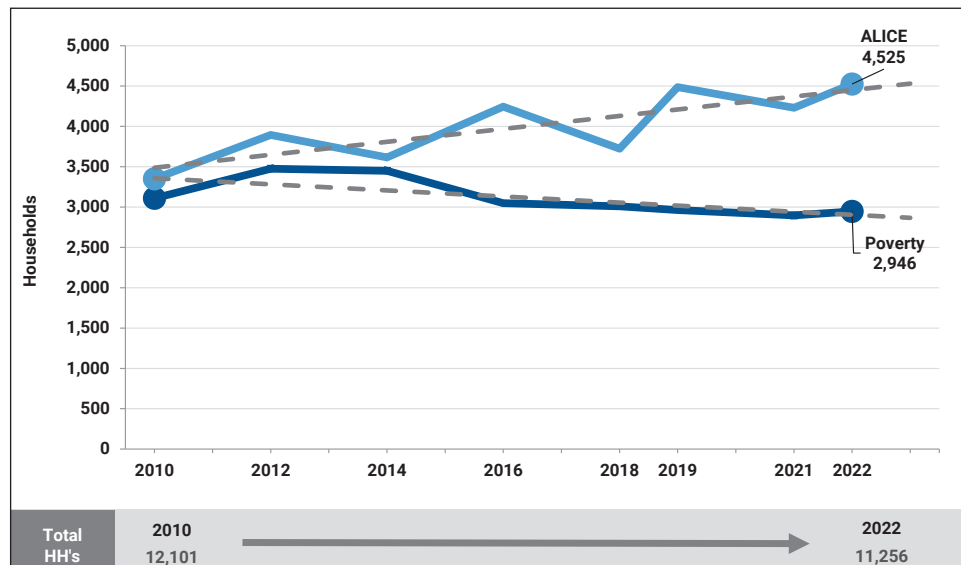

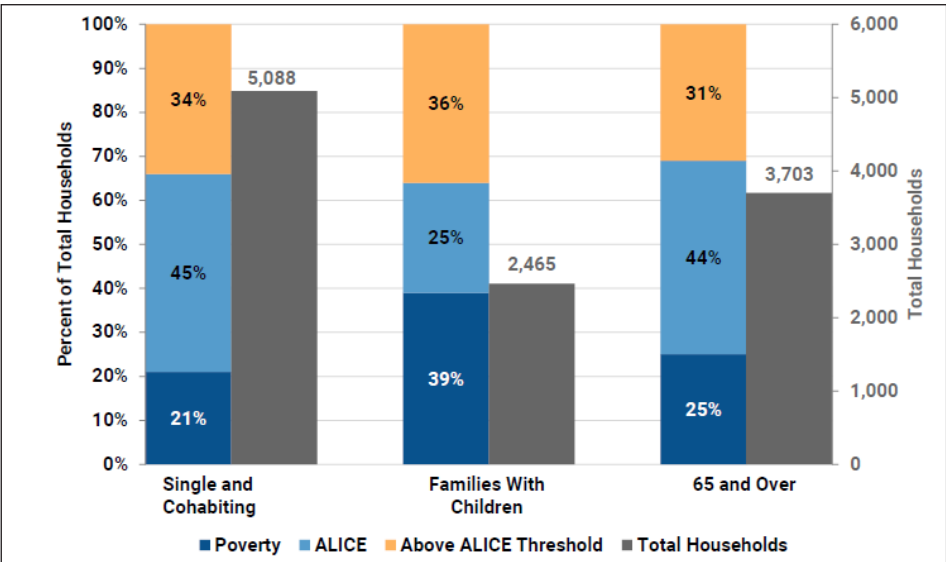

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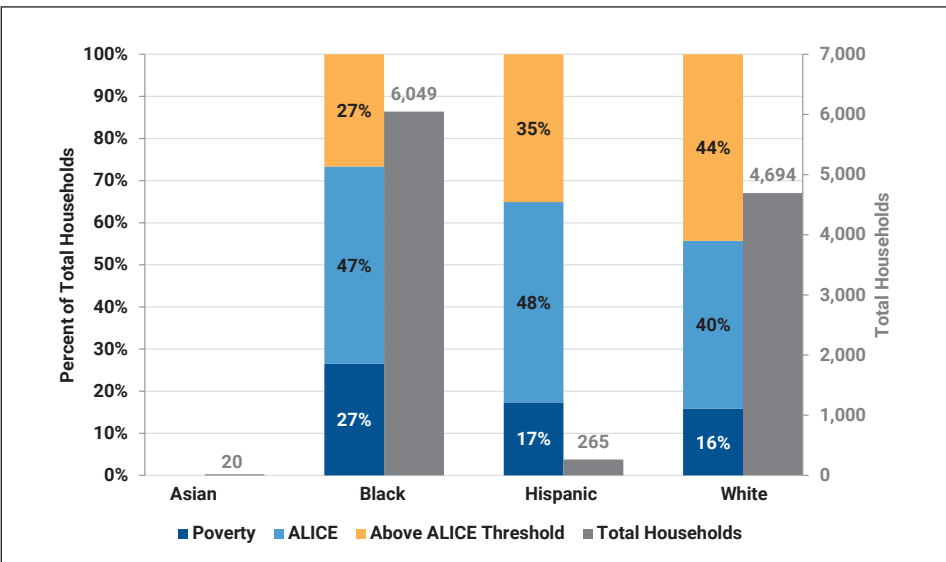
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Household Financial Status by Household Type, Marion County, 2022

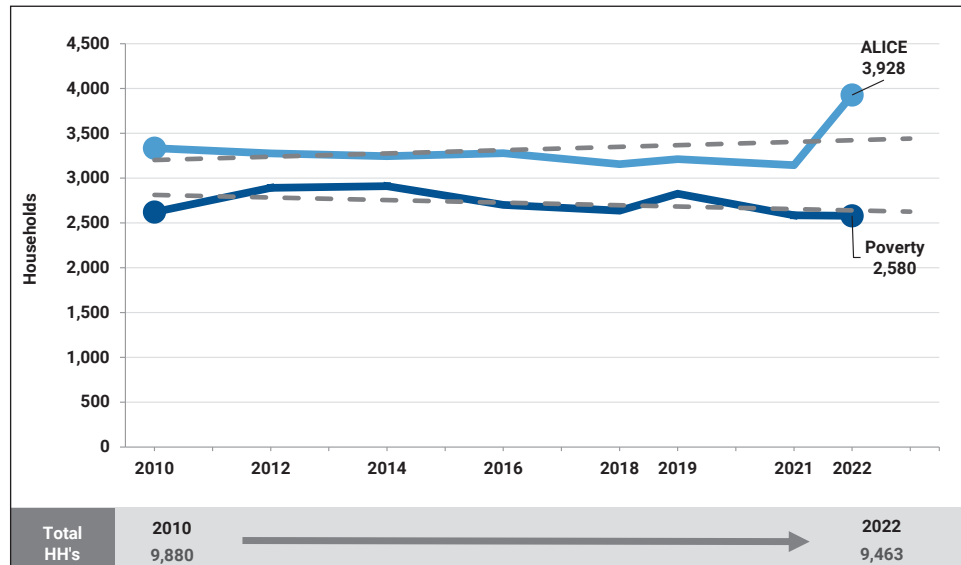

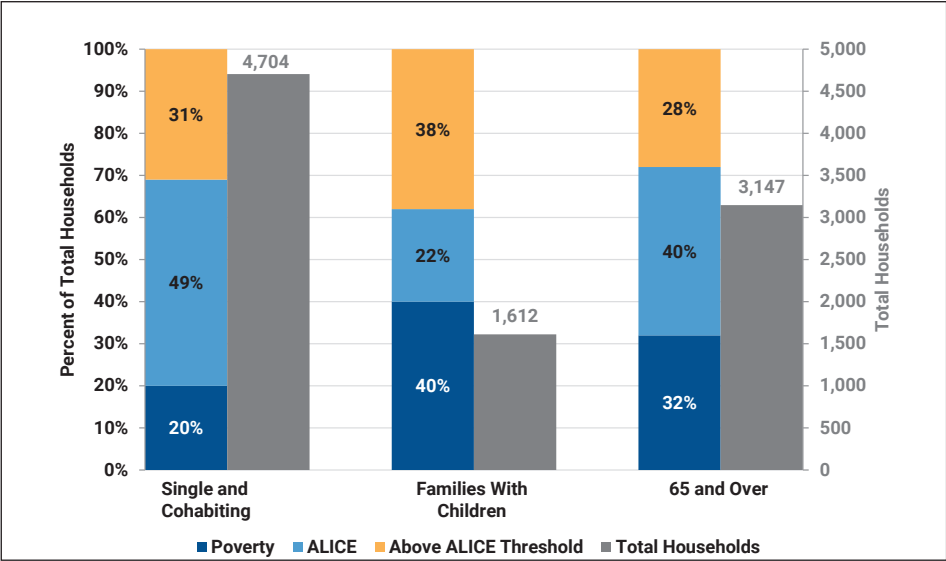

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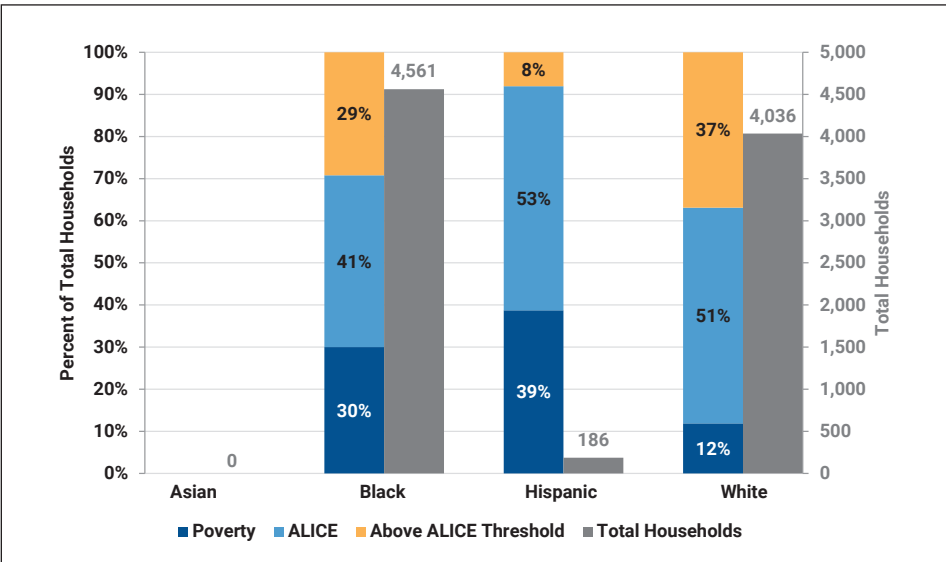
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Household Financial Status by Household Type, Marlboro County, 2022

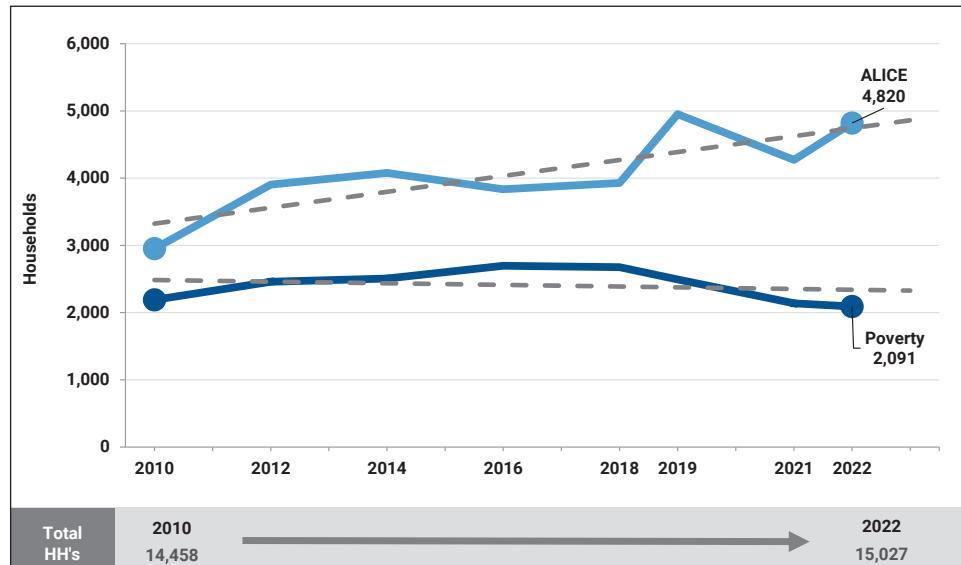

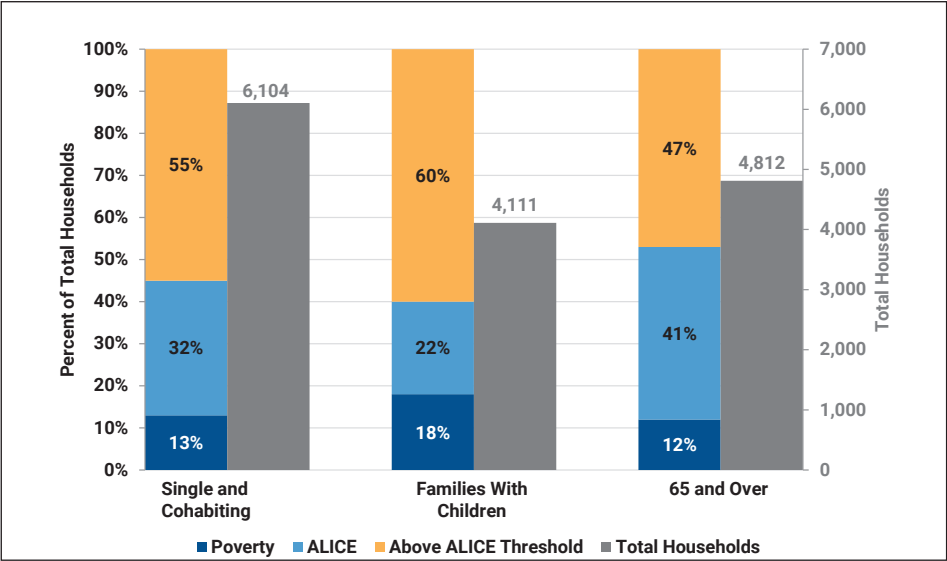

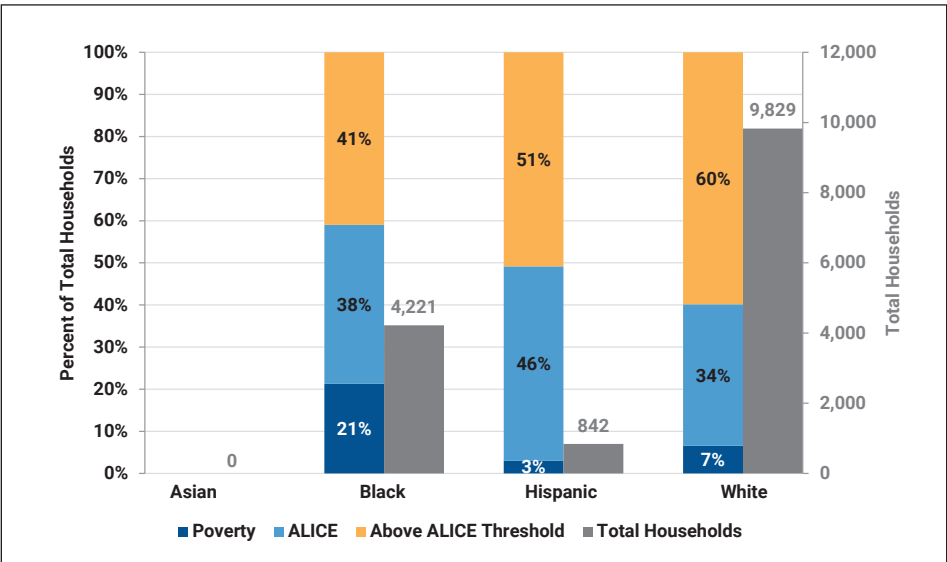

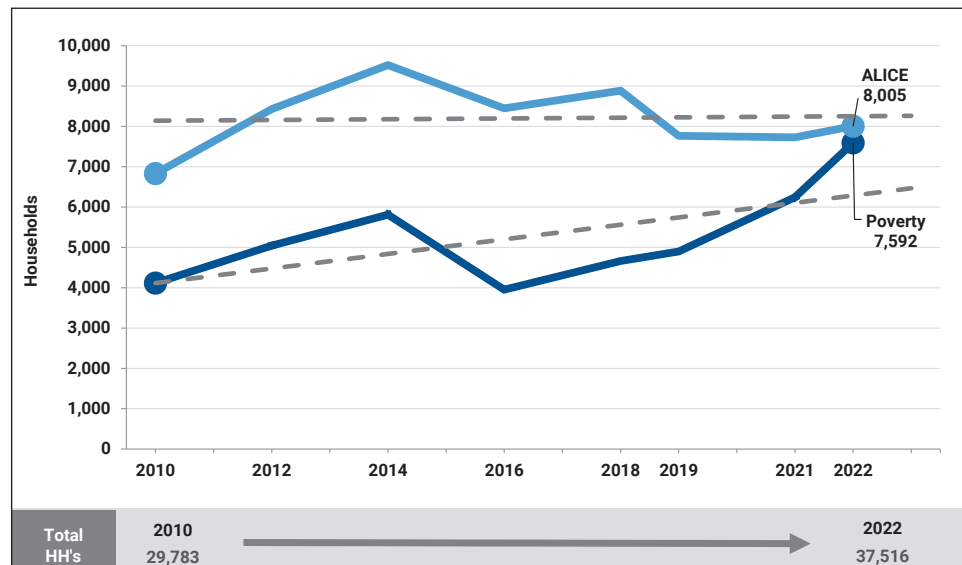

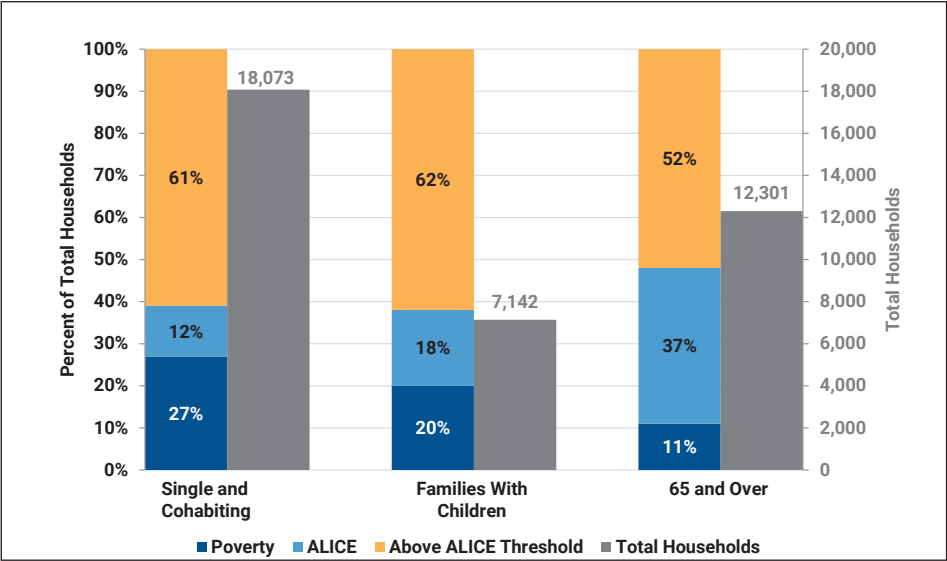

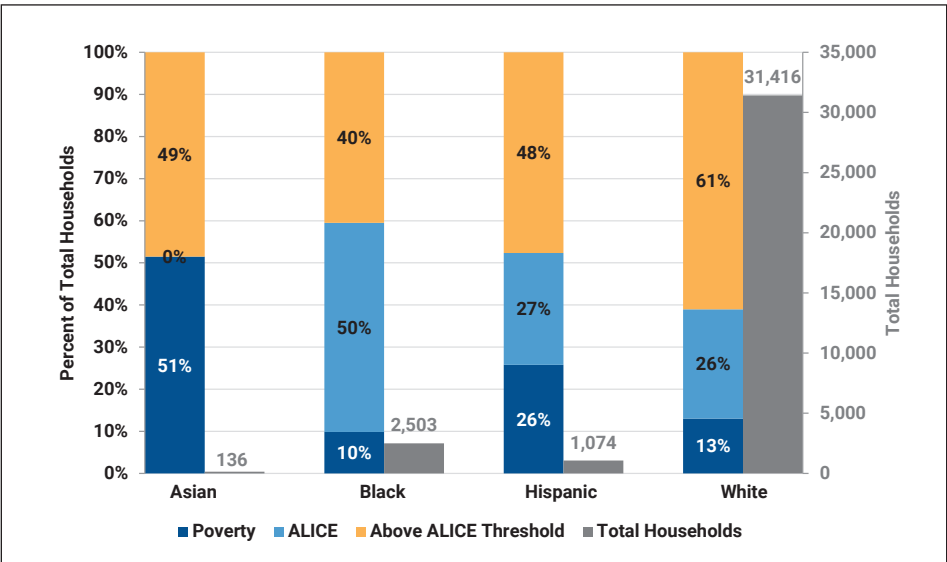

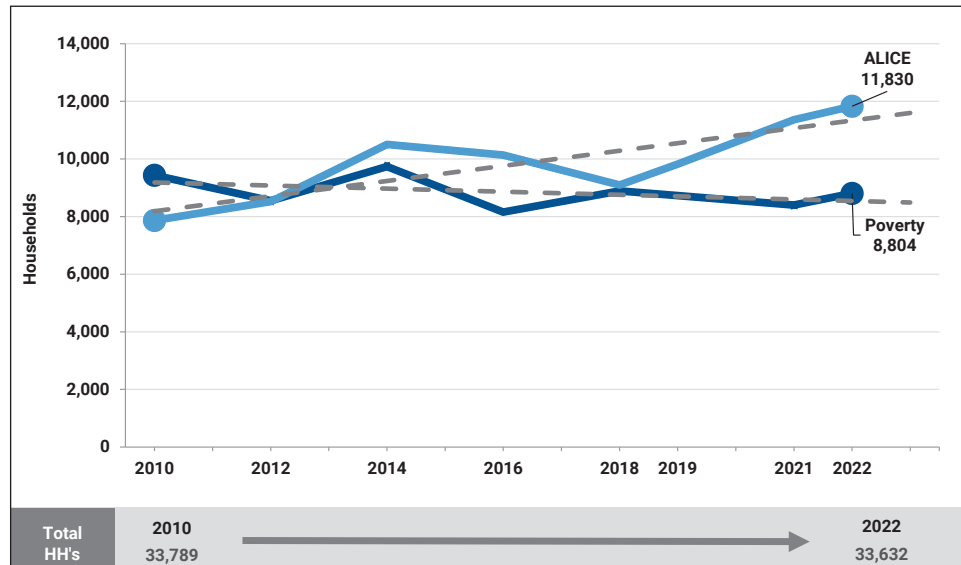

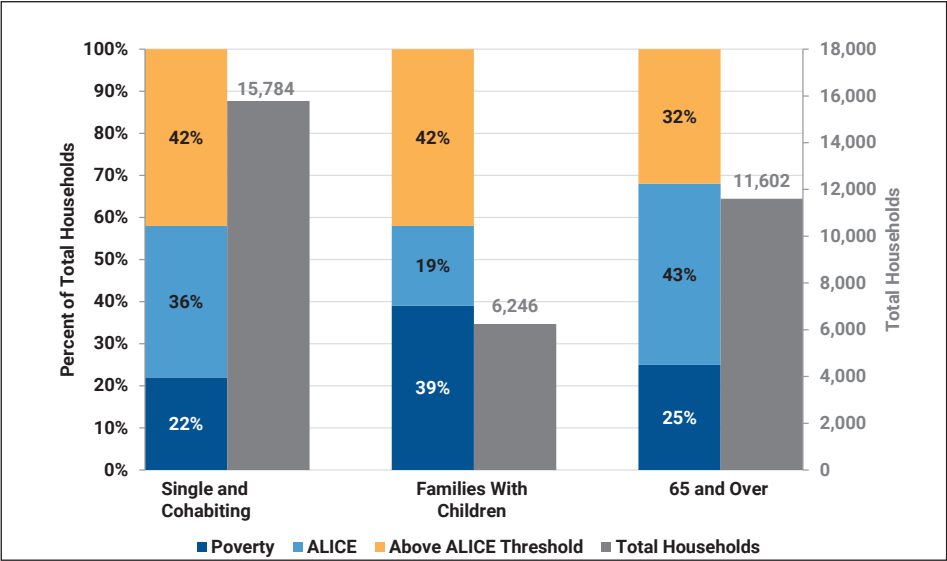

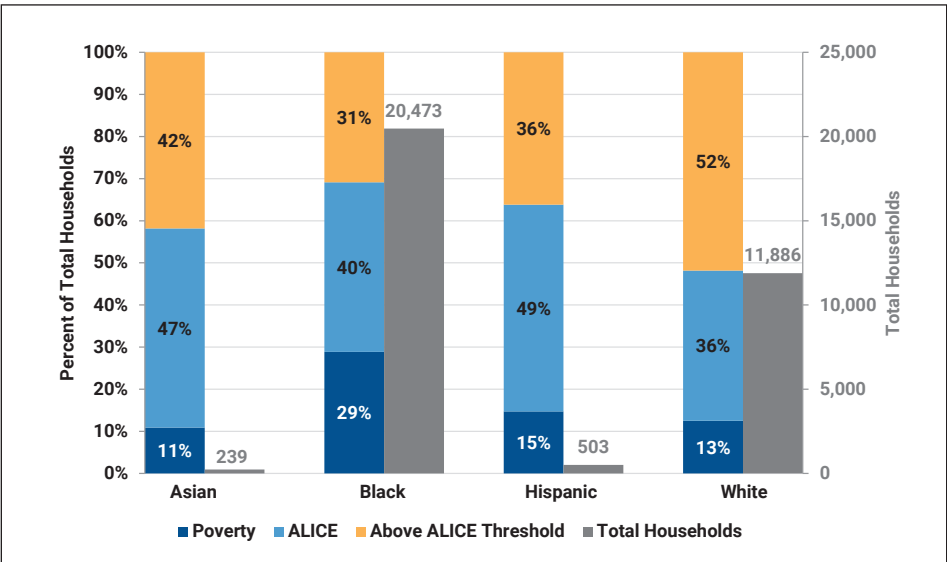

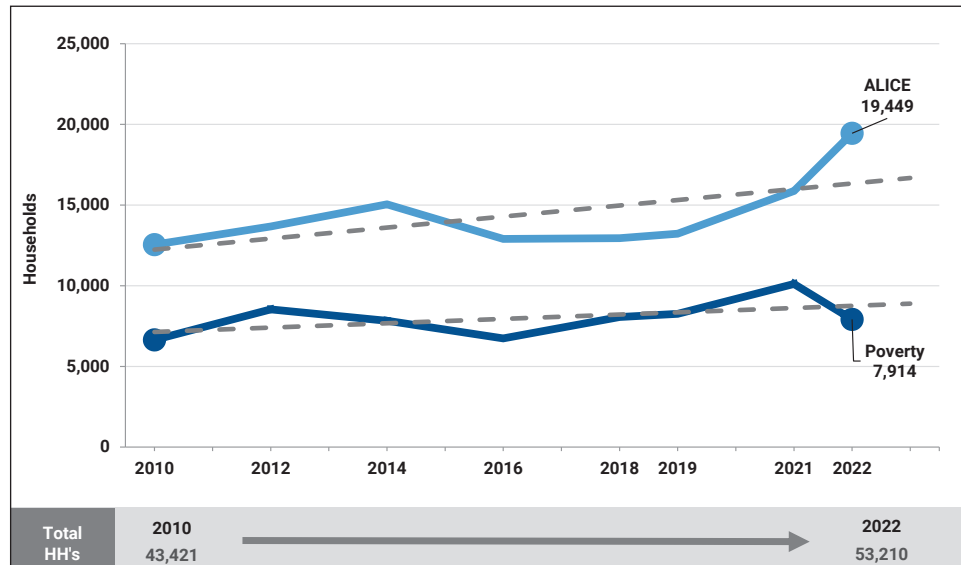

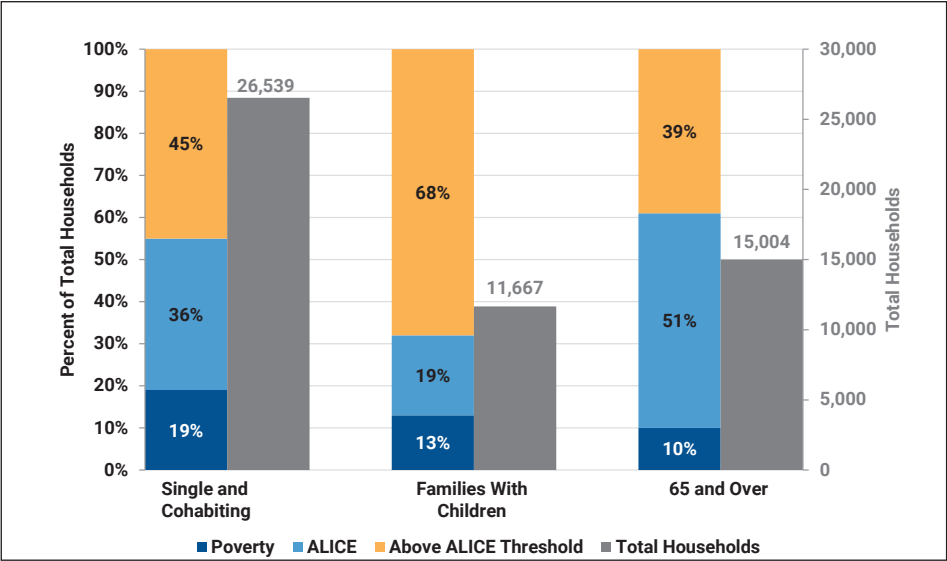

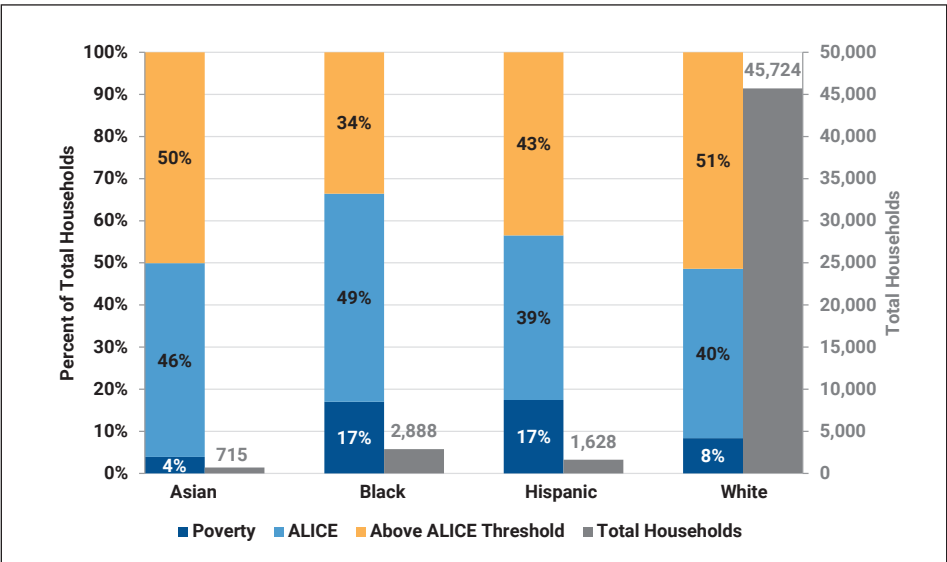
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Household Financial Status by Household Type, Pickens County, 2022

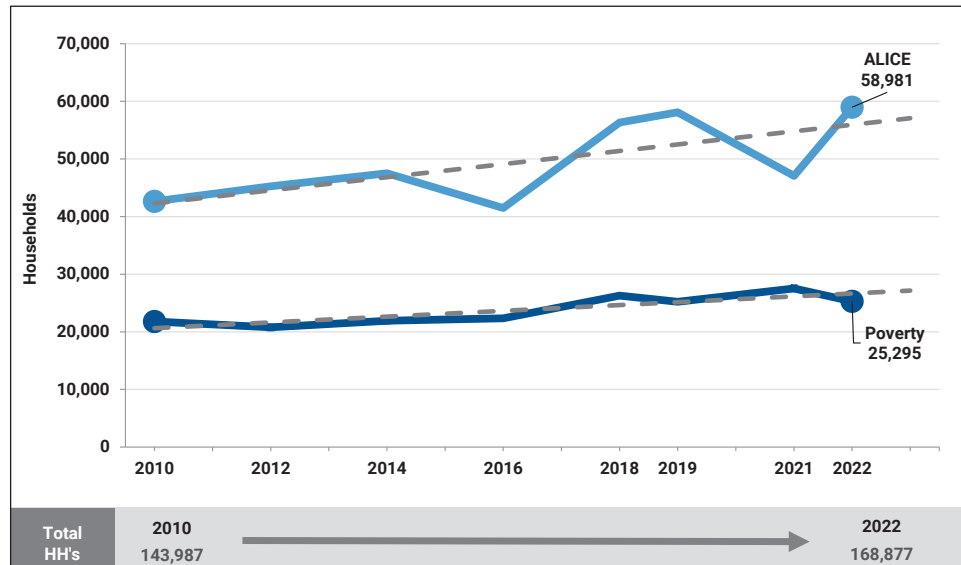

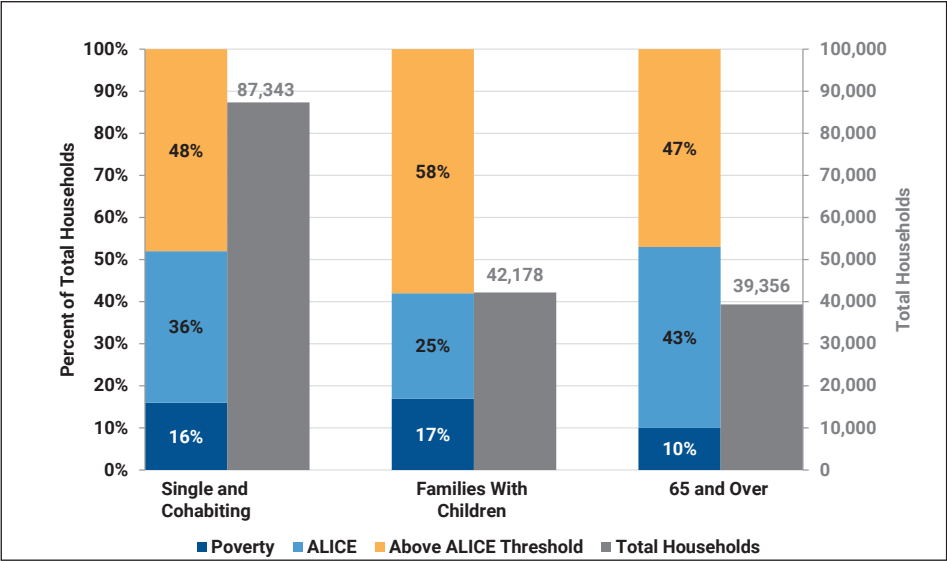

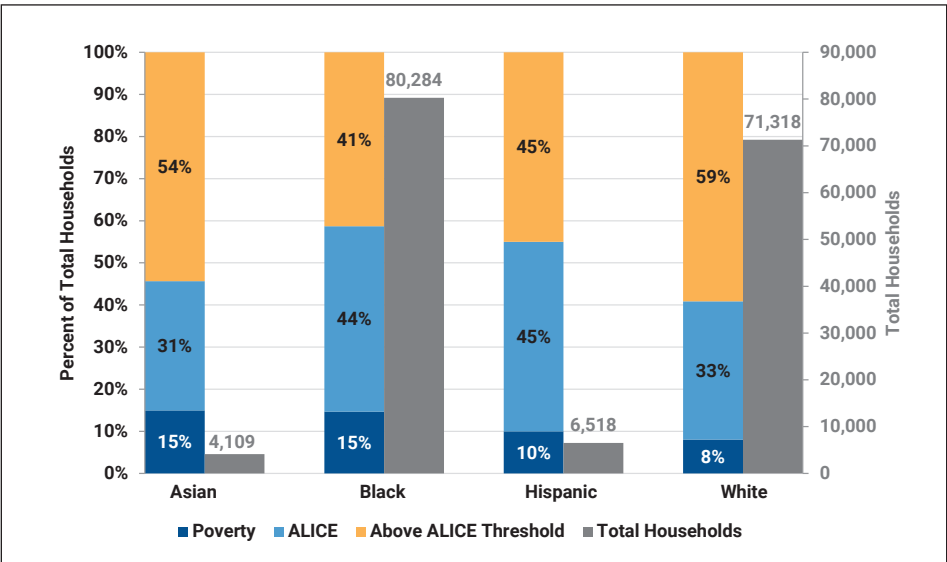

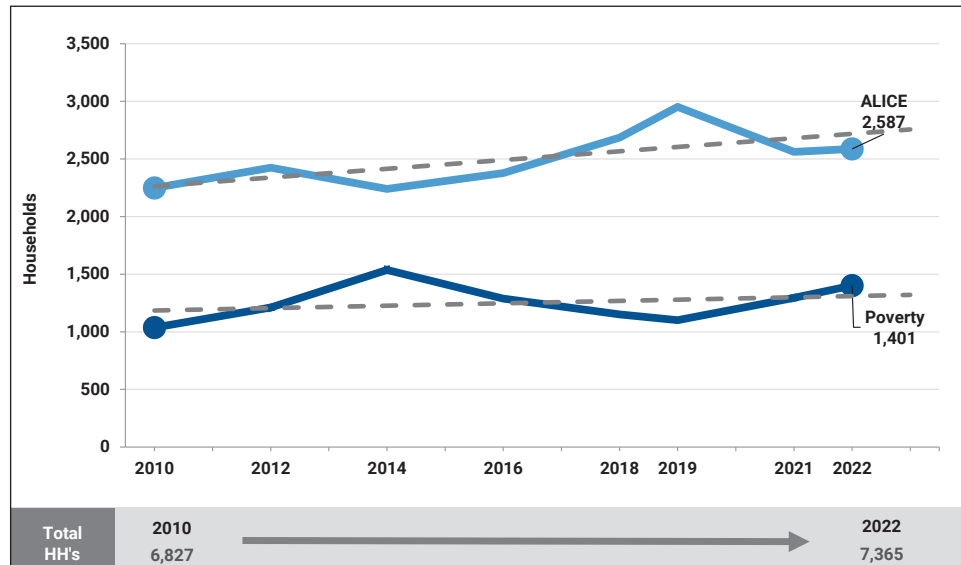

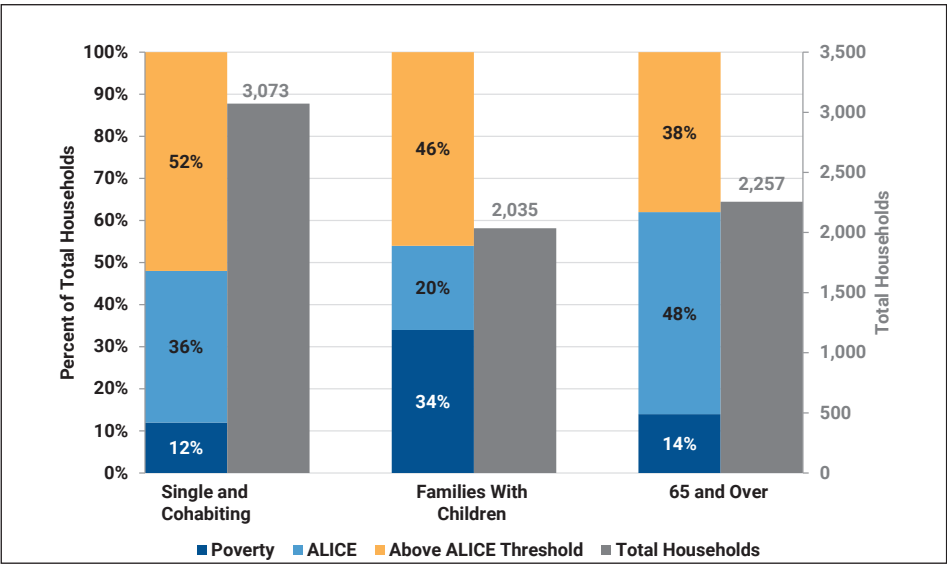

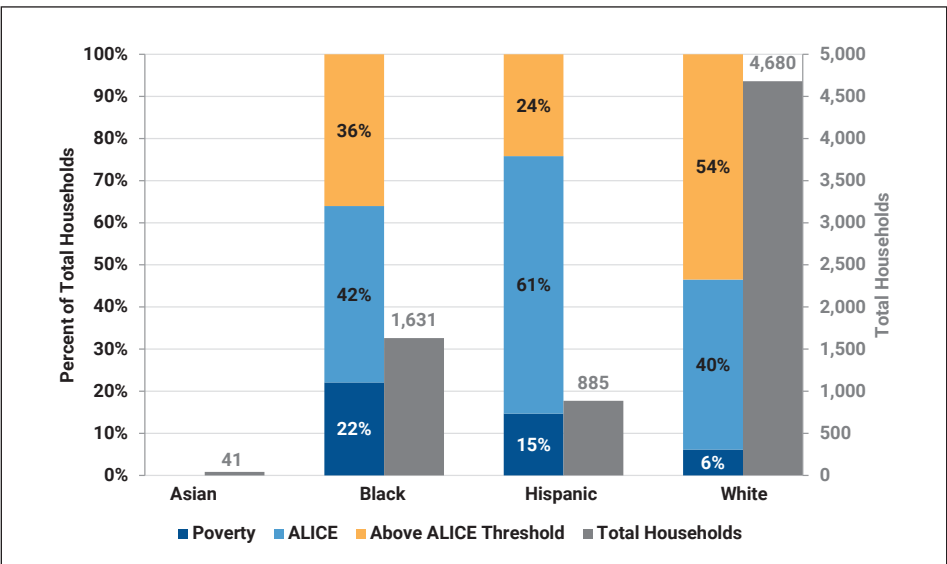

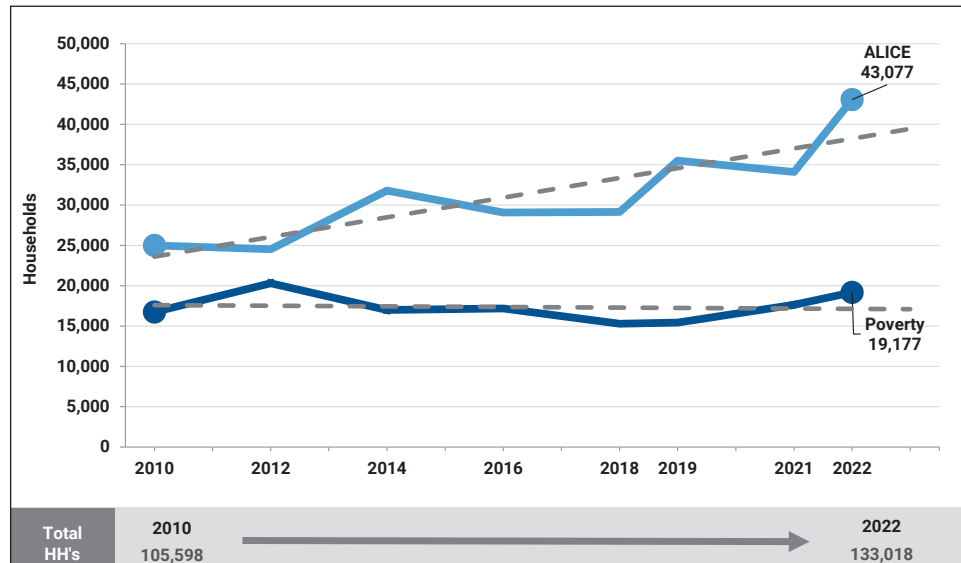

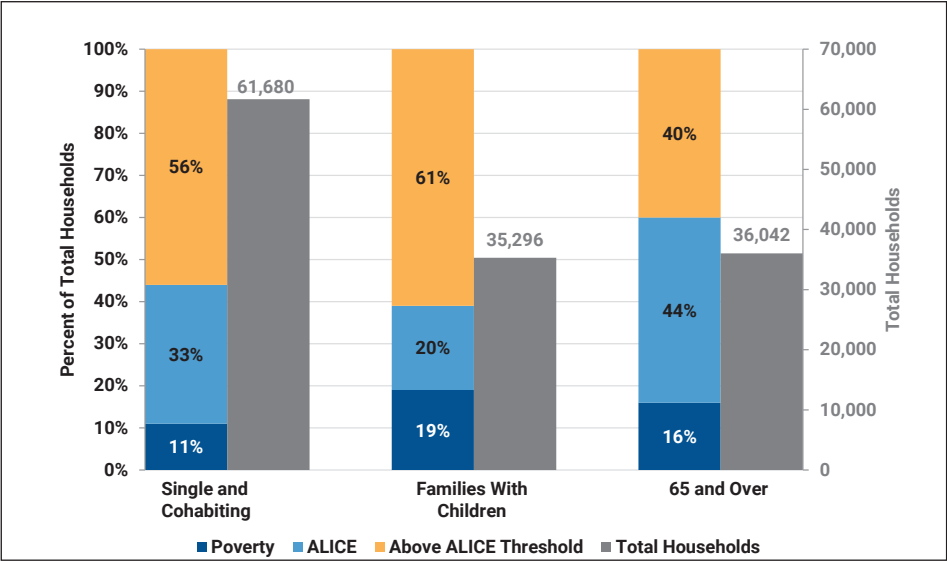

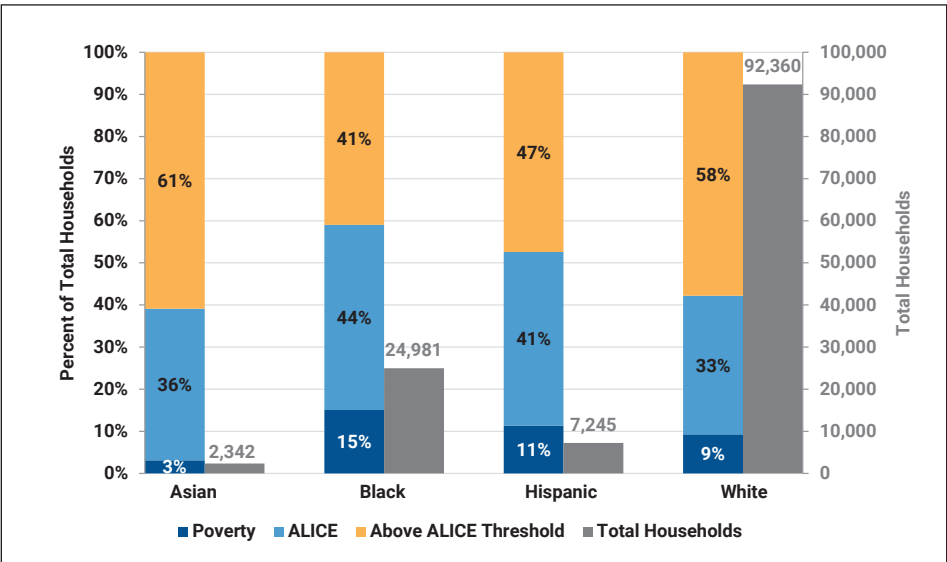

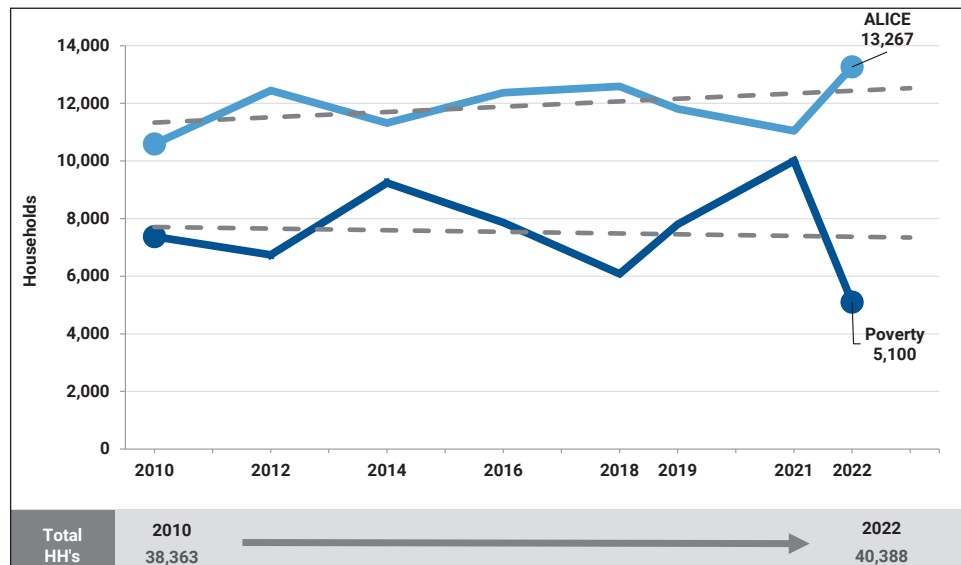

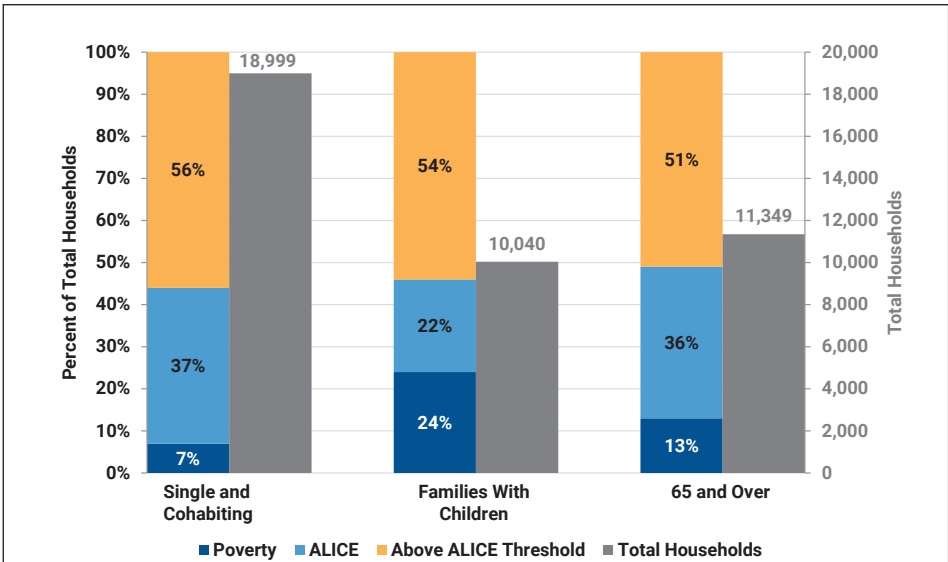

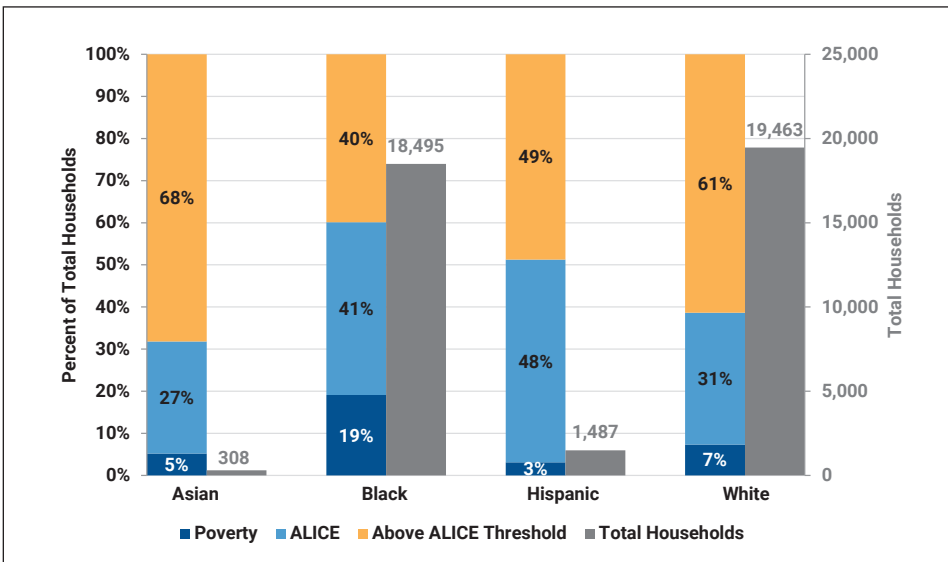

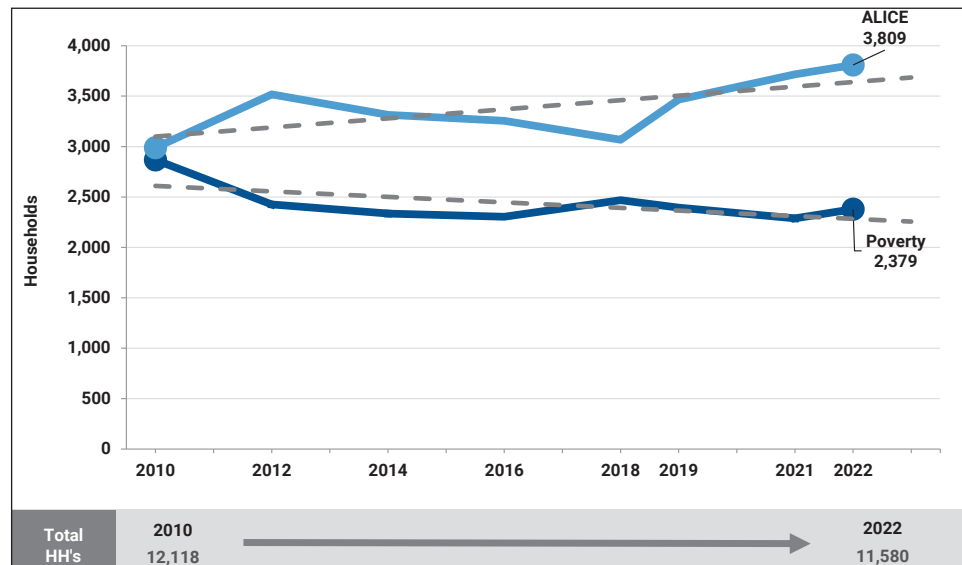

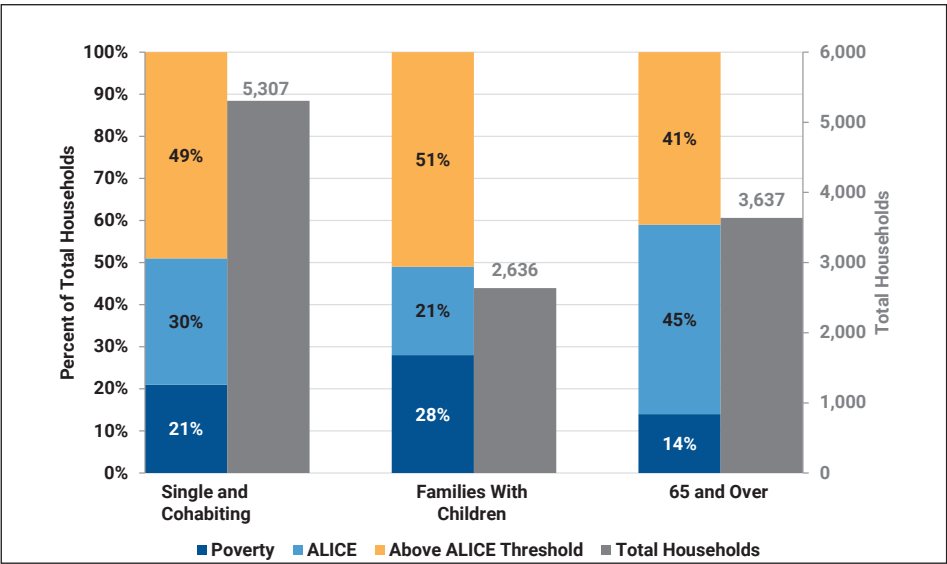

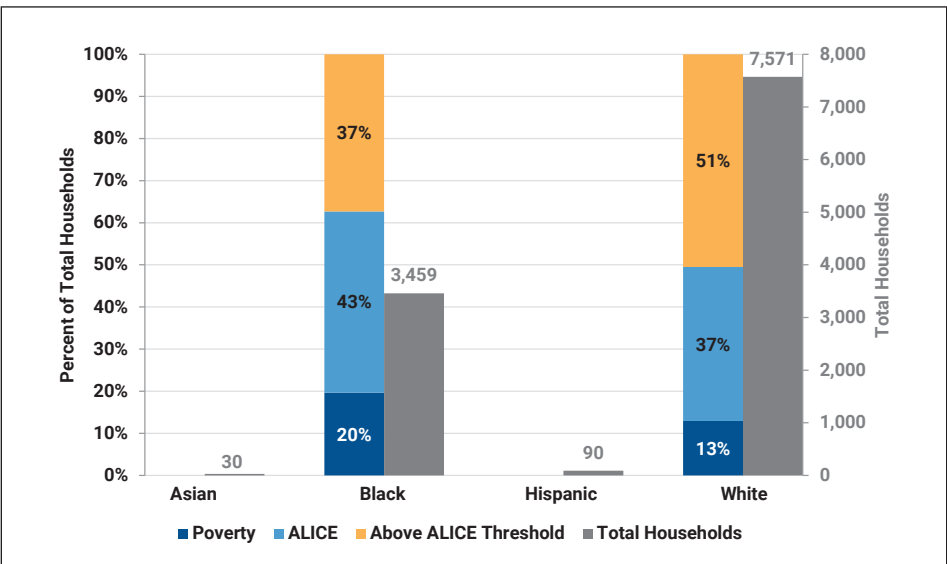

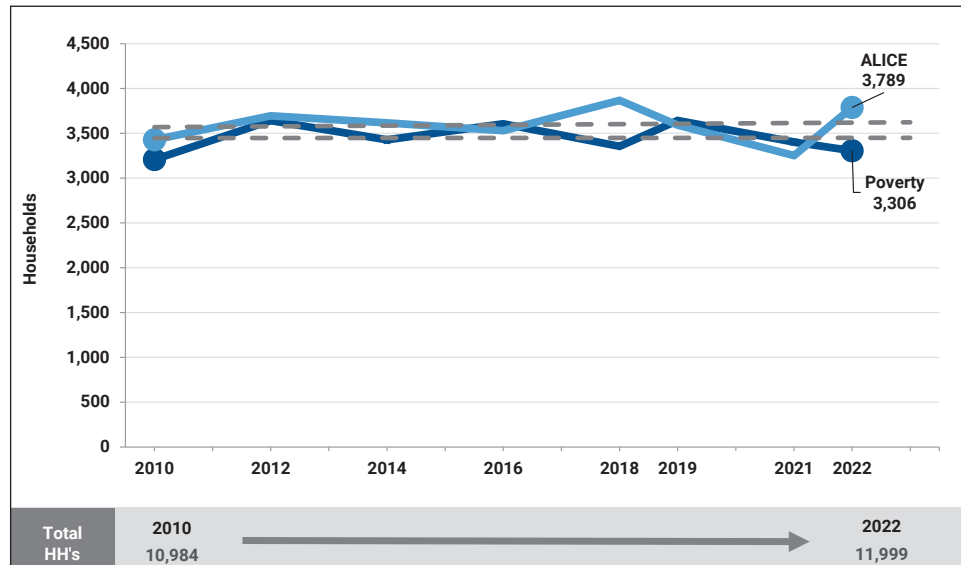

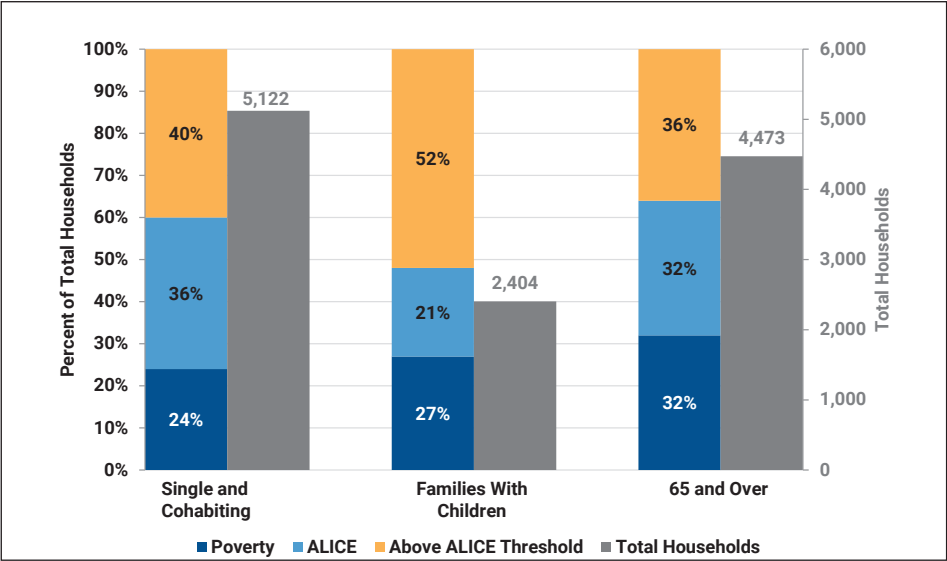

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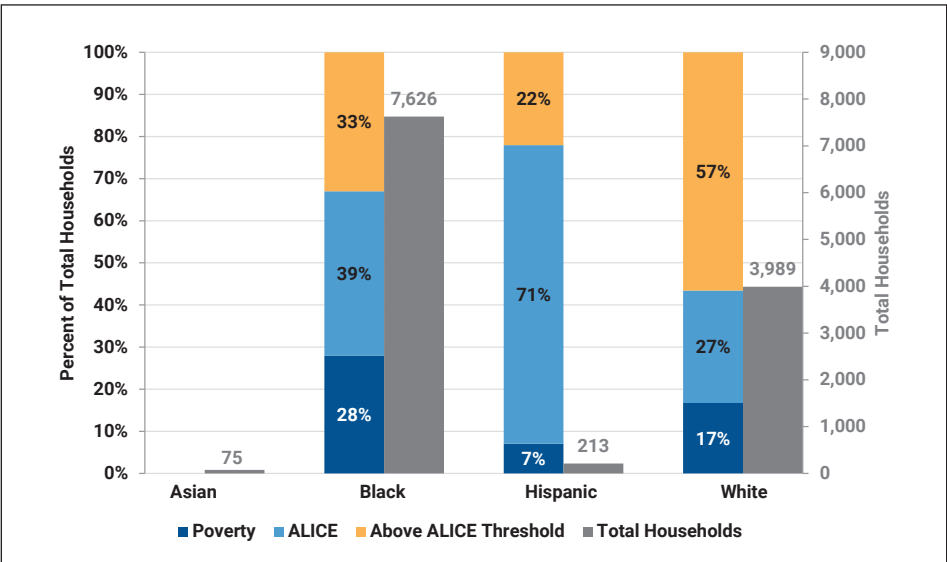
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Household Financial Status by Household Type, Williamsburg County, 2022

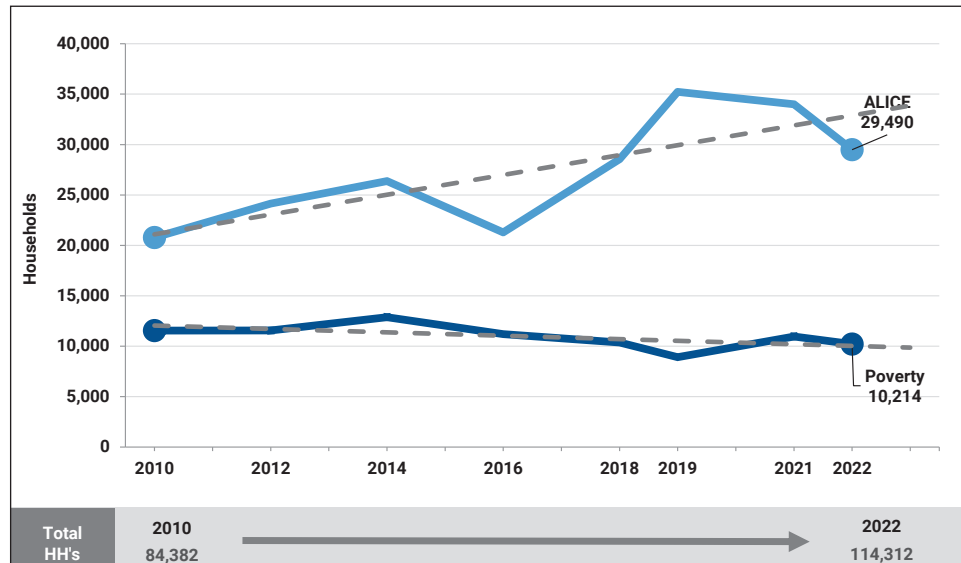

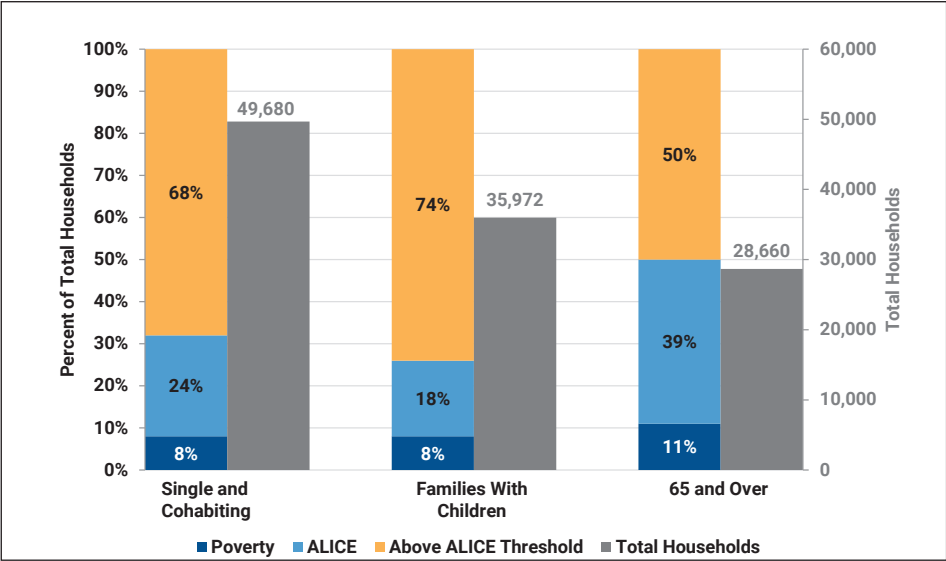

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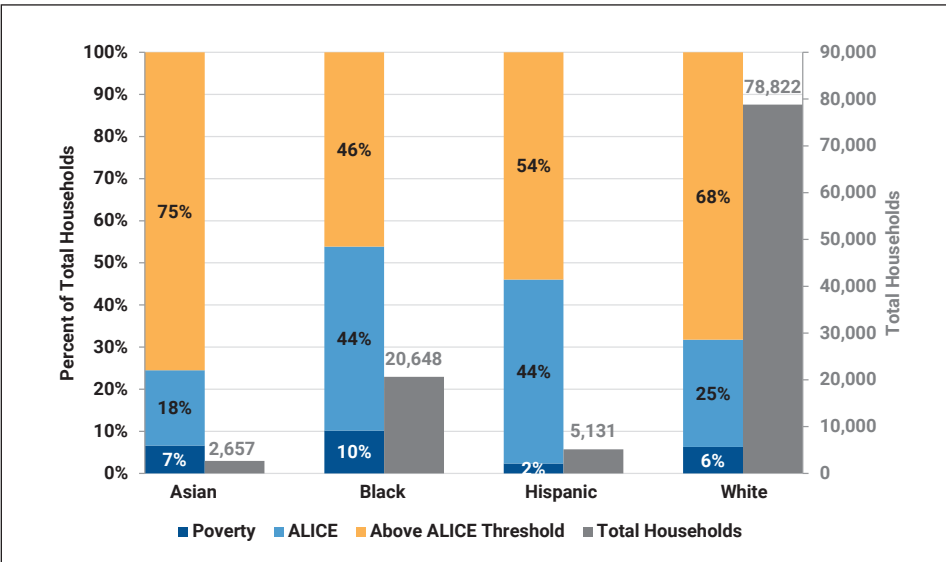
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Household Financial Status by Household Type, York County, 2022
