



Horry County Republican Party Resolution on Election Integrity

WHEREAS there were significant election errors committed in the runoff election of June 28, 2022 in Horry County, specifically the error of the Horry County Board of Voter Registration and Elections, which mailed 1377 Democrat Party ballots to voters who had requested ballots for the June 28, 2022 runoff election of Republican Party candidates.

AND WHEREAS in solidarity with the Republican Party of Texas, the Republican Party of Maricopa County AZ, and the Republican Party of Langdale County, Wisconsin, and the recent Resolutions from those areas, to reject the 2020 Election results;

AND WHEREAS we believe the 2020 Election violated Article 1 and 2 of the US Constitution in that various Secretaries of State throughout the country illegally circumvented their State Legislatures in conducting their elections in multiple illegal ways; as did South Carolina's own State Election Commission (SEC);

AND WHEREAS none of Horry County's voting machines were certified in 2020, which was required according to the Help America Vote Act (HAVA Act) passed by the U.S. Congress in 2002, thus making our state's results and the election itself illegitimate;

AND WHEREAS the use of SCYTL Election Reporting Company, a company based in Spain, by the state of South Carolina, makes our results illegal;

AND WHEREAS there have been deficiencies in SCYTL's counting discovered throughout the United States;

AND WHEREAS South Carolina's State Election Commission (SEC) is a group of appointees NOT elected by The People, but who nevertheless

have been making rogue, unilateral decisions without the consensus of The People, including decisions about which vendors provide election night reporting in South Carolina;

AND WHEREAS South Carolina's State Election Commission (SEC) claims there were not internet connections at voting locations, while multiple voters saw and reported internet connections at their polling locations.

AND WHEREAS through COTS (commercial off-the-shelf) equipment, there was internet and hacking vulnerability at polling stations;

AND WHEREAS the State Election Commission (SEC) has been collaborating with far too many state agencies, including but not limited to DMV, DHEC, and others, under the guise of those agencies helping to secure our elections, but which unnecessarily and vastly increased the complexity of operations, as well as the number of entry points and methods for bad actors to have impacted South Carolina's election, through in-house, influencer or hacked means;

AND WHEREAS there is NOTHING in the South Carolina Constitution which provides for the other agencies that participated in the 2020 election, to have been involved with our voting processes;

AND WHEREAS Horry County Election Board oaths, which are required according to law, are not being documented;

AND WHEREAS Horry County has no record of budgeting for any of our election equipment and left it to the State Election Commission, with question on multiple occasions;

AND WHEREAS the 2000 Mules documentary, using publicly collected evidence of geo tracking and municipal video surveillance, shows election fraud occurring in other American counties during the 2020 Election, in the form of ballot trafficking through drop boxes;

AND WHEREAS we believe that substantial election fraud in key metropolitan areas significantly affected the results in five key States in favor of Joseph Robinette Biden Jr.; While South Carolina voted

(overwhelmingly) for Donald J. Trump, the evidence in other states leads us to challenge the veracity of the 2020 Presidential election;

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, The Republican Party of Horry County South Carolina formally requests the Horry County Council, the Horry County Sheriff and the District 15 Solicitor, to conduct a full forensic investigation within the respective purview of the Government offices they hold, of the errors committed by the Horry County Board of Voter Registration and Elections, which mailed incorrect Democrat Party ballots to voters who had requested ballots for the June 28, 2022 runoff election.

AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, we ask and encourage the South Carolina State Legislature to do everything in its power to dissolve and defund the State Election Commission, and put the responsibility of election integrity in the hands of the elected position of Secretary of State; and that the South Carolina Legislature also do everything in its power to complete all ongoing investigations of the 2020 election, including looking into Michael Gableman's investigation and Alex Halderman's Report, to ensure no cheating happens in future elections, and to make it illegal to use electronic machines for voting, in the state of South Carolina;

AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED we strongly urge all Republicans to work to ensure election integrity and correct all fraud and weaknesses identified in the 2020 Election;

AND BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED that we encourage every other Republican County Party in the State of South Carolina and all other States - particularly those that experienced voter fraud and cheating - to issue a similar resolution to reject the 2020 election results, on behalf of The People.

PASSED: This resolution was passed unanimously with 45 credentialed precincts in attendance by the Horry County Republican Party Executive Committee at our regularly scheduled monthly meeting on August 1, 2022.
