Since 1992 the Humanities Foundation has developed over 2500 units of affordable and workforce housing. The Foundation also provides a wide range of health and human services for residents and the community. Amid the COVID-19 pandemic, staff remain dedicated to providing these essential services. To protect the health and well-being of our residents and staff, Humanities Foundation has implemented the following procedures.

Food Pantry

Since the Program's inception, the Foundation has delivered 1,500,000 meals!

Our Food Pantry is among our most vital resident services. During COVID-19, Humanities Foundation has increased the frequency of food deliveries to each of our properties and registered community partners.



To protect our communities, staff administering our food pantries now wear protective gear pursuant to CDC and other agency guidelines. All food is packaged in boxes or bags and delivered to the doors of residents to prevent the accumulation of crowds and limit exposure.



Youth Feeding Program

Humanities Foundation has partnered with County Schools to provide the children of our communities lunches. This ensures that the children do not miss key nutritional meals as a result of school closures.
