Senator Quinata Calls Out Speaker Terlaje's False Speculations and Supports Improving Healthcare and National Security on Island.

Senator Roy Quinata is calling out Speaker Terlaje's press release from this morning, stating that the speaker's comments are mere speculation. While Senator Quinata continues to support the effort to return ancestral lands to its original landowner, he believes that we should not impede on the effort to build a medical campus that meets the needs of our people and enhances the quality of care for all.
