Extradition Process 101

- After issuance of the Warrant of Arrest (WOA), the information is added into a national law enforcement database.
- If the subject is apprehended outside of the jurisdiction where the WOA was issued, confirmation is made with the requesting jurisdiction that the WOA is valid.
- If the WOA is valid, verification on whether the requesting jurisdiction is willing to extradite is made. If unwilling to extradite, the subject is released from custody.
- If willing to extradite, the subject may continue to be detained or released with conditions pending extradition.
- The subject may either waive extradition or contest and not waive extradition.
- If the subject contests extradition, the requesting jurisdiction must provide evidence to prove that the person in custody is the same person identified in the WOA.
- Requesting jurisdiction must prepare a Governor's Demand for Extradition Letter and Letter of Appointment of Agent, along with any other documents or evidence that would support positive identification of the subject for extradition.

The next hearing in the Pasatiempo matter is scheduled for October 30, 2021, where the status of his extradition will be discussed.
