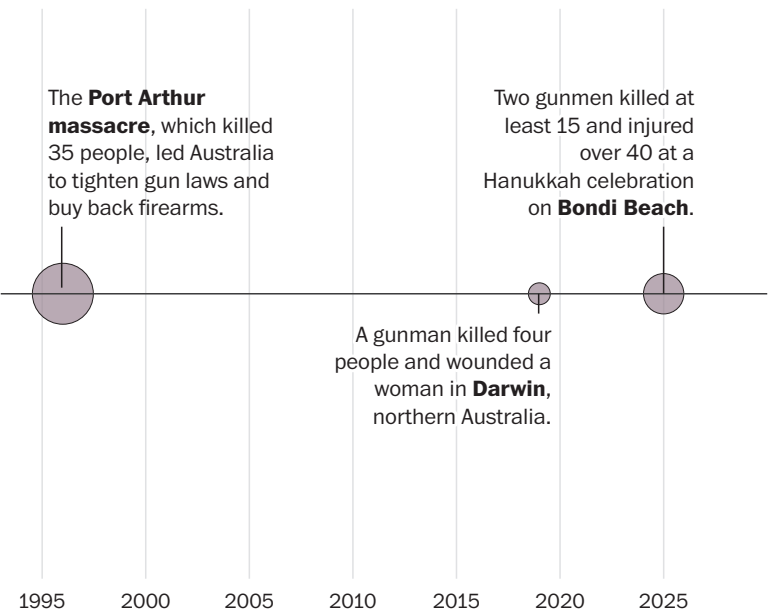


# Latest public mass shootings in Australia

The Regional Gun Violence Research Consortium at the Rockefeller Institute of Government defines a public mass shooting as an incident in a public or populated location involving at least some victims who were targeted at random and/or for their symbolic value. To be considered a public mass shooting, an incident must include four or more deaths (not including the perpetrator) during the shooting.
