On August 29, 2022, at approximately 8:25 pm, Pryor Creek Police Department received a 911 call reporting a "drunk driver" that went through three different stop signs and almost hit two cars. Caller advised that the vehicle was a white Toyota SUV, and the driver was hanging out of the driver's side window. Caller advised that the driver did not look like he was "conscious at all" and that the vehicle did not have any lights turned on.

Pryor Creek Police Department received a second call advising a "guy super drunk driving" on Elliott Street in Pryor. Caller advised that the driver was asleep at the stop light driving a white Toyota SUV. The caller advised that he "woke up" the driver and then the driver drove to a convenience store and is now parked. Caller advised that the vehicle is a white Toyota Sequoyah with tag number CZ9-268. Caller said that the driver is asleep again in the parking lot with his blinker still on.

Pryor Creek Police Department received a third call from a clerk at the same convenience store advising they had a drunk at their store.

A Pryor Creek Police Officer located the white Toyota SUV at the convenience store located at 711 E Graham and subsequently arrested the driver of the vehicle for Actual Physical Control of a motor vehicle (A.P.C./ D.U.I). The department is aware of the video that is on social media. The department is currently looking into the arrest and the facts surrounding the arrest.
