PREP GIRLS BASKETBALL

A look at the IHMVCU Shootout matchups

10 A.M. | WHARTON FIELD HOUSE Clinton River Queens vs. Rockridge Rockets

CLINTON: This is the debut for the River Queens (1-8 at the break) in the IHMVCU Shootout. Clinton, coached by Cathy Marx, a former high school standout at Riverdale and a four-year letterwinner at the University of Iowa, is led by sophomore Carryn Sattler, who averages 8.5 points per game. The other four Clinton starters are seniors. It has been a challenging start for Clinton, dropping four straight MAC games since their 44-41 win over Camanche on Dec. 9.

ROCKRIDGE: The Rockets (5-14 in the 2023 portion of the schedule) beat Galva to open the season on Nov. 14 and entered the new year coming off a 1-3 finish at the Cliff Warkins Memorial Classic in Prophetstown, where they lost to Wethersfield and Stockton, bounced back to beat Fulton and then lost 37-27 to Bureau Valley last Saturday. Scoring is a concern for the Rockets under head coach Ryan McDonald. The Rockets average 32.7 points per game, and three players combined for 92 of their 126 points in four tournament games last week. Junior post Erica Danner averaged 9.8 ppg in those four games, while senior guard Chloe Strachan averaged 9 points and made six 3-point baskets.

10:45 A.M. | CARVER CENTER Wilton Beavers vs. Mercer County Golden Eagles

WILTON: Wilton (3-6 entering the new year) is playing games 18 days apart — the most among the 12 teams participating in the shootout. Its last game was a 40-31 home win over the Durant on Dec. 19. The Beavers' head coach is Jeremy Putman. Junior Kinsey Drake leads the Beavers in points (11.8 ppg), rebounding (9.7 rpg), assists (2.6 apg) and steals (3 spg).

MERCER COUNTY: The Golden Eagles (9-8 entering 2024) are coached by Kate Engwall. Mercer County is in the middle of playing three games in five days, with a road contest Thursday at Wethersfield and a home game against Biggsville West Central on Monday, sandwiching this IH-MVCU morning matchup. Senior Sydney Lamkin (12.3 ppg) and junior Molly Hofmann (10.5 ppg) averaged in double digits in scoring at the Cliff Warkins Memorial Classic last week, going 2-2. Seniors Maddie Hofmann (9.5 ppg), Hallie Schreurs (5.8 ppg) and Gabriella McPeek (5.0 ppg) also made solid contributions in the tournament.

11:45 A.M. | WHARTON FIELD HOUSE Davenport Central Blue Devils vs. Erie/Prophetstown Panthers

CENTRAL: The Blue Devils (2-7 at the break) have dropped three of their past four games. Central is coached by Amara Burrage. The Blue Devils' leading scorer is junior Angel Hinton, who is averaging 11.5 points per game on 40% shooting. Her teammate in senior Anayshia Mitchell has a team-high 20 steals, good for about 2.5 per game.

ERIE/PROPHETSTOWN: The Panthers are 7-8 under head coach Chris Brown. They are coming off a strong showing on their home court at the Cliff Warkins Memorial Classic, where they finished 3-1 with the lone loss by three points to Mercer County. Senior Kennedy Buck scored in double figures in all four of those games, averaging almost 15 points a game. Another senior, Sydney Schwartz, had a 17-point outing in the tournament against Fulton that included four 3-pointers. She finished the tournament with 35 points, while sophomore Lauren Abbott and senior Hannah Huisman added 30 and 27, respectively. Erie-Prophetstown had lost five straight before that after starting the season 4-2.

12:30 P.M. | CARVER CENTER Calamus-Wheatland Warriors vs. Abingdon-Avon Tornadoes

CALAMUS-WHEATLAND: The Warriors (10-1) are the top team in the Tri-Rivers East Conference, finishing the first half of the season at 10-1, and face the Abingdon-Avon Tornadoes (13-4) in a marquee matchup. The Warriors allowed 30 points or fewer in seven of their 10 wins, including allowing single digits to the likes of New London (1-8), Prince of Peace (1-9) and Cedar Valley Christian (0-8). Four seniors and one sophomore have started every game for the Warriors. Seniors Emily Boeckmann (12.8 ppg), Kahlie Hill (12.5 ppg) sophomore Katie Hein (12.4 ppg) lead the way offensively. Boeckmann also is averaging 4.9 steals and 1.9 blocks per game.

ABINGDON-AVON: A-Town won 5 of 6 entering the holiday break and then went 4-0 last week to win the Beardstown Lady Tiger Classic championship. Freshman guard Kennedy Quinn was named the most outstanding player at the tournament. Junior forward-center Hailey Redding also earned all-tournament honors. The Tornadoes are coached by Brent Dugan. The Tornadoes' average margin of victory is 18.6 points, including seven games by double figures. Their tournament title run included three





wins by seven-points, including a 38-31 win against Illini Bluffs (16-3) in the title game.

1:30 P.M. | WHARTON FIELD HOUSE Bettendorf Bulldogs vs. Geneseo Maple Leafs

BETTENDORF: The Bulldogs (4-6 at the break) are coached by Ryan Webber, who coached the United Township boys bas-

ketball team in the Western Big 6 Conference previously. Webber's Bulldogs have been on a roll of late, winning their past three games before the break by an average margin of 37 points — this after starting the season 1-6. Bettendorf regularly starts three juniors and two seniors. One of the Bulldogs' juniors, Alivia Carr, averages a team-high 14.8 points per game on 43.5% shooting from the field, a team-high 7.3 rebounds per game and a team-high 2.6 steals per game.

GENESEO: The Maple Leafs (6-8 at the end of 2023) lost 6 of 8 games to end the year under head coach Scott Hardison. Gen-

eseo went 1-3 at the State Farm Holiday Classic last week, with junior guard Hanna Kreiner leading the scoring with 37 points (9.3 ppg). Returning senior starters Addie Mills and Mia Kelly added 25 and 24 points, respectively, for the team that averaged 32 points a game in the four tournament games.

2:15 P.M. | CARVER CENTER Davenport West Falcons vs. Rock Island Lady Rocks

WEST: The Falcons – 2-6 entering the holiday break – dropped five straight MAC games heading into the holiday hiatus after starting 2-1. Coached by Nathan Beutin, West's senior-heavy roster – seven of the 10 girls on the roster are in their last season – have averaged 42 points per game in conference play. Sophomore Raelyn Lacourse leads the team with 10.3 ppg and has made 14 3-pointers this season.

ROCK ISLAND: The Falcons will be facing the Rock Island Lady Rocks — 6-9 in the 2023 portion of the schedule — and coach Henry Hall in this matinee affair. Rock Island averages 41 points a game. Like the Falcons, the Lady Rocks also have a sophomore who stands above the rest in Ka'Zaria Bell. Bell has averaged a team-high 9.5 points and 7.7 rebounds per game, and she scored 34 points as Rock Island went 1-3 at the State Farm Holiday Classic. Junior Amayah Jackson scored 39 at The Classic, including 17 against Washington. Senior DaNaijah Cartwright added 8 ppg at the tournament.

3:15 P.M. | WHARTON FIELD HOUSE North Scott Lady Lancers vs. Moline Maroons

NORTH SCOTT: The Lady Lancers (3-6 in 2023) dropped five of their last seven games heading into the holiday break. They are coached by Devvin Davis. North Scott has varied its starting lineups on a game-bygame basis, with only two players starting every game. The leading scorers are senior Sydney Skarich (9.9 ppg) and sophomore Allison Moeller (8 ppg). Skarich also holds the team lead in rebounds (7.4), assists (1.8) and steals (2.6).

MOLINE: Moline (4-13) struggled out of the gate in 2023 with second-year head coach Adrian Ritchie, dropping 11 of its last 12 games going into the holidays. However, junior guard Jada Tatum is in the WB6 top 10 in scoring at 10.8 ppg for the Maroons.

4 P.M. | CARVER CENTER Mediapolis Bullettes vs. Riverdale Rams

MEDIAPOLIS: In a game that features two coaches that brought state titles back to the Quad-Cities at previous stops, Mediapolis' Todd Borrison returns to the area where he guided Preston (now Easton Valley) to a pair of state titles in the early 2000s and Davenport Assumption to the 2008 state crown. He also has coached at North Scott and Camanche. His Bullettes

bring an 8-1 first-half record to the Quad-Cities, 66 miles from the southwest. The Bullettes won six straight games to end 2023, all by double digits and averaged 48.5 points per game. Senior Haley Steffener (16.2 ppg), sophomore Grace Holsteen (15.1 ppg) and senior Hanna Wagenbach (14.6 ppg) lead the team in scoring.

RIVERDALE: Jay Hatch, who guided Rock Island Alleman to the 2005 state titles during 22 years at the school in which his teams compiled a 434-260 record, guides the Rams. Riverdale (11-4 entering 2024) is in second place in the Three Rivers-West Conference, behind only Sherrard. They won seven of their last eight games before the holiday break, then went 2-2 last week at the State Farm Holiday Classic, including a 35-25 loss to Sherrard. The Rams are tough defensively, allowing under 40 points per game. Riverdale showed scoring balance at The Classic, with seven players averaging between 4 and 8.3 points a game, led by senior guard Alexis Duke.

5 P.M. | WHARTON FIELD HOUSE Muscatine Muskies vs. Sherrard Tigers

MUSCATINE: The Muskies — 6-4 through their first 10 — are in a stretch of playing three games over a five-day period. After starting the season 5-1 under new head coach Courtney Joens, the Muskies dropped three of their last four games before the holidays. Making its first ap-

pearance in the Shootout, Muscatine starts four seniors and rotates between a junior and a freshman for its other starting position. Senior Brylee Seaman leads the team with 15.1 ppg.

SHERRARD: The 8-3 Tigers are undefeated (5-0) in the Three Rivers-West Conference and won six of eight to close 2023. They claimed the consolation championship last week at the State Farm Holiday Classic, winning three straight after a 61-54 loss to Bloomington Central Catholic. With head coach Doug Swanson at the helm, the Tigers have held their opponents to 35 ppg. Sherrard's leading scorer is sophomore Adalynn Elsbury, with 10.8 ppg, including four double-digit outings at The Classic. The two high-point games at the tournament came from juniors Rachael Fender (19 vs. El Paso-Gridley) and Violet Meskan (16 vs. Bloomington Central Catholic).

5:45 P.M. | CARVER CENTER Central DeWitt Sabers vs. Rock Island Alleman Pioneers

CENTRAL DEWITT: The Sabers, coached by Ron O'Brien, won eight straight to start the season before a narrow 58-57 loss at Davenport North, the No. 2-ranked team in Class 5A, on Dec. 21. Central DeWitt has a younger squad — four seniors, two juniors and six sophomores — but watch out for junior Lauren Walker. She has connected on 18 of 41 3-pointers (43.9 percent) and made 53.5 percent




