Augustana offers events for Hispanic Heritage Month

In conjunction with the ongoing observance of Hispanic Heritage Month, the Augustana College Library will host events and exhibits open to the public.

The celebration includes an exhibit of artwork by local artist Lola de Guerra on the second floor of the library through Oct. 12. She has painted scenes from her childhood in Ecuador, where she was born, and Venezuela as well as still-lives and landscapes of the Quad-City area. She has displayed her work in Venezuela and local exhibitions, including the Quad-Cities Regional Art Showcase.

At 3 p.m. Tuesday, Oct. 8, Theo's Java 101, the coffee house on the fourth floor of the library, will host a bilingual poetry reading and presentation by Bolivian author Juan Carlos Orihuela, a current writer in residence at the International Writing Program at the University of Iowa. An award-winning writer and published author and poet, he will present his poetry in Spanish and discuss, in English, the craft of writing.

Also, Quad-City Arts Visiting Artists Sotavento will be featured in a formal performance 3 p.m. Oct. 13 in Centennial Hall. Donation is \$3.
