



IHMVCU MATCH-UP PREVIEW

Game 1 – Davenport West vs. Alleman – Time: 10 a.m.

NEED TO KNOW: The Falcons snapped a 60-game losing streak with a 51-35 win over Clinton earlier this season and have been competitive in several of their other games, a continued sign of growth in Pat Finn's second full year as head coach. The Falcons' top two scorers – Kaitlyn Powell and Grace Schneiderman – and their leading rebounder, Kylee Devore, are all sophomores. The Pioneers graduated four seniors from last year's Class 2A regional championship team, with Sam Coleman the only senior on the roster. That's led to some growing pains for head coach Megan Delp as players are settling into roles.

Game 2 – Pleasant Valley vs. United Township – Time: 11:45 a.m.

NEED TO KNOW: For the first time in five years, there is not a Spelhaug or an Arthofer on the Pleasant Valley roster. Ilah Perez-Johnson is the top returning scorer after averaging 2.9 points per game last season. Since returning to an Iowa vs. Illinois format in 2017, Pleasant Valley has not lost a shootout game, beating Moline, Rock Island and Geneseo. Despite five seniors on the roster, UT has struggled out of the gate but there's plenty of talent on the roster. Jasmine Bell was a first team all-Western Big Six selection last year and Jade Hunter earned honorable mention honors as a sophomore.

Game 3 – Davenport Central vs. Annawan – Time: 1:30 p.m.

NEED TO KNOW: Behind a young and athletic group, Central already has matched its win total from last season and should only improve as the roster – which has just three seniors – gains more experience. Despite not having a player over 5-foot-9, the Lady D's lead the MAC in blocks. This is Annawan's second year in the event. The Bravettes return five starters from last year's 18-10 squad, including three-year starters Keagan Rico and Reese Randall, who were both on Annawan's state championship team in 2017.

Game 4 – Assumption vs. Sherrard – Time: 3:15 p.m.

NEED TO KNOW: Along with Bettendorf and Pleasant Valley, Assumption has not lost a shootout game since the format changed back in 2017. The Knights don't have a single player averaging double digits but have six players scoring at least five points per game. Assumption likes to play aggressively on defense and came out of the holiday break leading the MAC in steals. Taylor Barber is becoming a fixture at the shootout for the Tigers, playing in her third straight event and coming off an MVP performance last season. Senior Carly Whitsell also has been a big piece this season, scoring 17 points in a win over Alleman prior to the holiday break.

Game 5 – Bettendorf vs. Rock Island – Time: 5 p.m.

NEED TO KNOW: This will be a battle of depth as Bettendorf likes to sub five players at a time while Rock Island also has shown the ability to go 10 deep this season. Senior Maggie Erpelding is leading the Bulldogs this year, but junior Ashley Fountain continues to grow her game after a breakout sophomore season. The Rocks had their 40-game Western Big Six winning streak snapped in their first game without standout Brea Beal, but Rock Island has had plenty of pieces step up early this season. Hannah Simmer is a returning first team all-Western Big Six selection and has been a versatile player for the Rocks.

Game 6 – Davenport North vs. Moline – Time: 6:45 p.m.

NEED TO KNOW: Paul Rucker is in his first year as head coach of the Wildcats after previously serving as an assistant at North Scott. The Wildcats have plenty of firepower, with four different players scoring game-highs through the first three weeks of the season. Bella Sims is a returning first team all-MAC selection at point guard for North. Moline has the distinction of being the team to snap Rock Island's 40-game conference losing streak and has situated itself well at the top of the Western Big Six standings. The Maroons rely on their Big 3 of Bralee Trice, Cierra McNamee and Kadence Tatum, who all averaged double figures early in the year.

Game 7 – North Scott vs. Geneseo – Time: 8:30 p.m.

NEED TO KNOW: This is the second straight year North Scott has played in the nightcap after falling to Rock Island last year. The Lancers are the defending Iowa Class 4A state champion and have won two of the last three state titles. North Scott senior Grace Boffeli is headed to UNI and has been on a tear to start the season, averaging over 30 points per game. The Maple Leafs are in their first season in the Western Big Six and have been getting contributions from up and down the lineup, including from sophomore Kammie Ludwig, who scored 26 points in a win over Sterling last month.



After basketball season, LaFountaine earned first team Western Big Six honors in softball and was awarded the Don Morris Award as the conference's top student athlete. LaFountaine is currently preparing to begin her college softball career with older sister Brittni at Illinois State University.

Taylor Barber

After scoring 16 points and grabbing five rebounds to help Sherrard rally past Davenport Central in last year's shootout, Barber helped the Tigers earn a Class 2A regional title. She averaged 11 points and three rebounds, earning first team all-Three Rivers West honors as a sophomore.

Allie Timmons

Following basketball season, Timmons

enjoyed a standout senior season pitching for Assumption. She went 32-0 with a 1.28 ERA and 222 strikeouts, helping the Knights win their third straight Class 3A state title. After starting the year at Iowa, Timmons is transferring at semester to Drake, joining her sister Nicole on the Bulldogs softball team.

Bella Sims

Sims earned first team all-MAC honors after averaging 11.1 points, 4.4 rebounds, 3.7 assists and 3.0 steals per game. The junior led the Wildcats to an early season upset of Cedar Rapids Washington, who opened the season ranked 13th in Iowa Class 5A.

Kylie Wroblewski

After averaging 16.1 points and 11.7 rebounds last year, the Bettendorf post earned third team all-state honors by

the IPSWA then joined the college ranks at St. Ambrose. In her freshman season, Wroblewski leads the Fighting Bees in points and rebounds per game.

Carli Spelhaug

Spelhaug finished her basketball career with second team all-state honors from the IPSWA and then repeated as MAC player of the year and was a first team all-stater in softball. Spelhaug is currently preparing for her freshman season with Iowa State softball.

Brea Beal

Beal three-peated as Illinois Gatorade player of the year and Illinois Ms. Basketball, capping a stellar four-year career with the Rocks. Beal is now with the South Carolina Gamecocks, where she's started every game through Dec. 17.




