
## Home sales down


Housing prices are high partly because the supply of new houses has been lagging for more than a decade. A pickup in 2021 and 2022 subsided last year, and multi-family buildings — vital to lower-income households — led the decline. Meanwhile, those searching for homes want fewer square feet than they did 20 years ago.

## Existing home sales are down from a post-pandemic rebound

Total existing home sales, including single-family homes, townhomes, condominiums, and co-ops, declined 4.3% to a seasonally adjusted annual rate of 4.19 million in March. On a year-over-year basis, sales were 3.7% lower than a year ago.
