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Notes/Narratives**NARRATIVE**

On 02/09/2013 at 0105 hours, I was conducting speed detection and enforcement on River Road just north of the entrance of 170 River Road and just south of the exit of Greek Park Circle. I was sitting in a marked University of Georgia Police vehicle. While sitting at this location, I turned to check to the north to see if there was oncoming traffic. Upon looking north, I observed a silhouetted figure running southbound in the roadway.

I continued to watch the figure and noted that the individual was in the middle of the southbound lane of traffic and weaving back and forth between the edge of the road and the center double-yellow lines. I have used this location previously for speed detection and enforcement on numerous occasions and know the roadway to be used extensively by motor vehicles, bicycles and pedestrians (including joggers). In the past, when I have observed joggers, they have stayed close to the shoulder of the road or utilized the grass along the edge of the road to stay out of the roadway. Because the figure seemed to, at one point, stumble and was wearing dark colored clothing, I turned on my vehicle's emergency lights and notified University Dispatch that I would be out with a pedestrian running in the roadway.

I next made contact with Ayodeji Oludare Osinowo [REDACTED] I asked Osinowo to come across the road and speak to me in front of my patrol vehicle. I explained to Osinowo the reason I was talking with him. He stated that if there had been a car, he would have gotten out of the way. I asked him how he would have done that since he was running with his back to traffic. He stated if he had heard a car, he would have gotten out of the way. Osinowo was in the roadway just south of an almost 90-degree turn in the road.

Osinowo stated he was trying to get to Building 1516 from the Tate Center and that he had been running all the way from there. Osinowo stated that he had to work in the morning and was trying to get home. Osinowo coughed and exhaled at which time I detected the odor commonly associated with an alcoholic beverage coming from his breath. I also observed that Osinowo appeared to have been crying.

Osinowo stated that he hadn't had much to drink and that he was 19-years-old. A later GCIC check of his GA ID would confirm this. Based on the fact that I had observed Osinowo stumbling in the roadway while wearing dark clothing, his admission to consuming alcohol and the fact that I could distinctly smell it on his breath, I believed him to be intoxicated to the point of being a hazard. I placed him under arrest for Pedestrian Under the Influence (OCGA 40-6-95 - Citation No: 037655) and Underage Possession of Alcohol (OCGA 3-3-23 - Citation No: 037656). I placed Osinowo in

double-locked handcuffs behind his back and searched him incident to arrest.

OFC Lambert arrived to my location to transport Osinowo to the Clarke County Jail. Osinowo was placed in the back seat of her vehicle and secured with a seatbelt. After completing the citations for OFC Lambert, I provided them to her. Osinowo advised that he had some questions for me. I opened the door to speak with him and explained to him that he was being charged with Pedestrian Under the Influence and Underage Possession of Alcohol. At this, Osinowo began to argue that he did not have any alcohol on his person when I had contact with him. He began to argue the charge at which time I stopped the conversation.

After OFC Lambert left the scene, I realized I still had Osinowo's belongings with me. I notified her and asked her to stop transport so I could give her Osinowo's belongings. I met OFC Lambert at the Carmike Cinemas located at the intersection of Barnett Shoals Road and Lexington Road. I gave OFC Lambert Osinowo's cell phone, wallet and keys.

OFC Lambert then transported Osinowo to the Clarke County Jail where deputies had to assist her in getting him into the jail. Due to a lack of shift resources, my observations of Osinowo, my detection of an odor commonly associated with an alcoholic beverage from Osinowo's breath and his admission to consuming alcohol, I did not read him his Miranda Warning and ask for a sample of his breath.

My MVR video was in use during the time of this event. At the time I started shift, I noted that the microphone for the MVR was not charged. My personal audio recorder was in use during this incident. The MVR video from mine and OFC Lambert's vehicles as well as the audio from my personal recorder has been included with the case file. My audio from the incident was also placed onto the cases drive.

On 02/09/13 at approximately 0105 hours, I arrived on scene with Sgt. Pennington to assist as a backup officer and transport unit. Sgt. Pennington had searched the individual, Ayodeji Oludare Osinowo, prior to my arrival and placed him in double locked handcuffs behind his back. Osinowo was seated in the rear seat of my patrol car and seat belted in. My patrol car was searched prior to the start of shift and after transporting Osinowo.

I began transport to the Athens Clarke County Jail at 0123 hours. I was notified midtransport by Sgt. Pennington that he was still in possession of Osinowo's belongings (wallet, keys and cell phone). I advised University Police Dispatch that I was stopped at the Carmike Cinemas to wait for Sgt. Pennington to bring Osinowo's belongings at 0128 hours. After obtaining his belongings, I resumed transport to the jail at 0134 hours.

I arrived at the Clarke County Jail at approximately 0140 hours. Upon my arrival at the jail, I attempted to assist Osinowo safely out of the rear of my patrol car. I asked Osinowo repeatedly to swing his legs out first. Osinowo passively refused to cooperate and instead chose to slide head first out of the patrol car. I was able to catch Osinowo before he could get more than his upper body out of the a patrol car, however he refused to assist me in getting himself back into the patrol car so that he could exit properly. I repeatedly told Osinowo not to exit head first as he would be unable to catch himself, and I would be unable to pick him up. Due to Osinowo's uncooperative behavior and continued wiggling out of the patrol car head first, I had no choice but to call for help and keep Osinowo's head on top of my boot to prevent it from striking the pavement. University Police Dispatch called and advised the Clarke County Jail of my predicament outside in the sally port and they came out to help at approximately 0150. The deputies videotaped their involvement with Osinowo, as they had to physically pick him up. Osinowo was released into the care of Clark County Deputies along with his belongings and copies of the citations.
