



INFORMATION FOR VERMONTERS GOING TO THE MARCH TO END FOSSIL FUELS:

Welcome! We're so excited that we're going to have such a strong showing of Vermonters in NYC and looking forward to connecting with so many of our comrades from around the country.

Bus Logistics:

- Pick-up and Drop-off locations: See below for details for your stop. Please be on time! We're coordinating a lot of people and logistics and tracking down late passengers will make all of our plans go wonko. Links to coordinate carpooling are listed with each stop.
- Masking: Illnesses are on the rise and we want to work together to keep our community safe. We encourage masks on the buses, but currently aren't requiring them. If anyone who registers needs others to mask for their own medical needs, we would shift that to a requirement. Please be respectful of the other activists on the bus and help keep all of us healthy.
- On the bus: The buses will have bathrooms and we will bring snacks and water for all. Please also bring your own snacks and water as well!
- If you volunteered for a specific role, we'll be sending you a separate email about that. Thank you!

- 3rd stop: Brattleboro - Vermont Marketplace (formerly the Outlet Center), 580 Canal St. - 8:00 am. [Self-organized carpooling to/from the Brattleboro bus stop!](#)

Leaving NYC Location and Timing:

- 5:00 pm - meet both buses outside 1011 1st Avenue between 55th and 56th Street. Text your bus lead with questions if needed!
- Drop-off times depend on traffic getting out of NYC! If you are getting picked up, please have them text you or our bus lead for an updated ETA once we're out of the city. Here are our best guesses:

Western Bus:

- Rutland - 10:00 pm
- Burlington - 12:00 am midnight

Eastern Bus:

- Brattleboro - 8:45 pm
- White River Junction - 10:00 pm
- Montpelier - 11:15 pm

What to Bring:

- 350VTers will be wearing green or blue t-shirts. We'd love it if you'd wear a green or blue shirt too and we'll be a giant sea of activists!
- Please make sure you can meet your own needs for the full day! That means checking the weather ahead of time and bringing layers/rain gear as appropriate. You will be able to leave things on the bus during the march, but bring any valuables with you in person. And walking shoes!
- Please bring a refillable water bottle and snacks for yourself. Be prepared to purchase lunch/dinner in NYC or bring for yourself. We will ALSO have water to refill your bottles and extra snacks on the buses.
- Drinking water refill stations will be provided at the march, and porta-potties will be set up at the start of the march and at the closing rally, including ADA units & hand washing stations.
- Bring your favorite portable protest sign! But nothing on wood sticks - cardboard tubes or bamboo poles are ok. We'll bring some big banners for group photos, etc.

Schedule for 9/17 in NYC:

- **11 am-12:15pm: Pre-March Picnic with other 350 Groups.** Bring your lunch (or buy something nearby) and meet in Central Park with other 350 activists from around the country. We'll be just inside the west side of the park at 65th St ([see map](#)). There's a take out stand and public bathrooms close by at Tavern on the Green and there are restaurants and places to pick up food on Broadway around 64th St across from Lincoln Center, which is just a block west from the meeting locations. We'll have some coffee, donuts and pizza. Text/Call Sonia at 917-747-0047 if you can't find us day-of.
- **12-12:30 pm: 350 Local Group March Meet-up.** We'll be gathering with the 350NYC hub outside The New York Society for Ethical Culture at 2 West 64th St. on the corner of Central Park West and West 64th St. We'll plan to leave the location together at 12:30 pm to walk down a few blocks to the beginning of 55th and Broadway to get in line for the official march. We will have marshals dedicated to our hub to ensure we all get there together safely and who will accompany us for the duration of the march. Meet us by 12:30 at the Society for Ethical Culture or come straight to 55th and Broadway if you are running late. Text/Call Sonia at 917-747-0047 if you can't find us day-of.
- **1 pm - 4:30 pm: March to End Fossil Fuels.** March begins at 56th St. and Broadway. We'll meet the Vermont buses there! The march route is 1.5 miles and will end with a rally at 1st Ave and 50th St, near UN Headquarters. The Rally should end at 4:30 pm.
