



## Area residents react to violence

Some find events discouraging; others feel more hopeful

Mark Towell, 59, of Henrico County, was at dinner with friends on Saturday night when he heard news of the attempted assassination

of former President Donald Trump.

Towell's phone "started going crazy with texts" from family, friends and colleagues letting him know what had happened. At first, he struggled to come to grips with what they were telling him.

"It was surreal," he said. "I can't believe it's happening."
