Adding up the costs for deliveries from Uber Eats, DoorDash

At dinner time, it's easy to open a food delivery app like Uber Eats or DoorDash and presto! Dinner is at your door.

All is well, until you check the bill. And you wonder how a \$10 order of a burger and fries suddenly became \$20.

The service fees on food delivery apps really add up.

You're not just paying a driver. You're paying a service fee for using the service. And a delivery fee. And a tip. And paying higher prices for the food than you would if you ordered it at the restaurant.

Many food delivery apps charge restaurants a commission rate of 20% to 30% for using its services. Restaurants have to hike up their prices in order to recoup the commission costs.

"It's a deeply flawed system. It used to be, if you wanted to order take-out, you'd go to your drawer with all the menus and order something from one of those restaurants. Now, you open the app and flip through that. And if your restaurant isn't on the app, (the consumer) isn't going to think about you,"

Va. voter challenges rare to see

Not just anyone can see state voting list; process is regulated



Back in 1891, a former Union Army captain named Henry De B. Clay, who worried that challenges had removed Black voters from the voter list for the 1st District in Newport News, asked the Warwick County registrar if he could copy the list.

The registrar said no, and the Virginia Supreme Court said he was right to do so.

Clay (not to be confused with Hanover County-born Henry Clay, who served as speaker of the U.S. House of Representatives) was trying to prevent efforts like those reported this
