Dear Governor Northam:

The undersigned organizations, associations, and businesses are writing to express our support for HB 1966 related to the Uniform Statewide Building code; issuance of building permits. HB 1966 initially passed the House of Delegates on February 4th by a vote of 94-4; passed the State Senate, with amendments, on February 18th by a vote of 97-1; and passed by House of Delegates again on February 18th by a vote of 96-1.

HB 1966 ensures that applicants for building permits receive timely reviews, written explanations of reasons for permit denial, and timely re-reviews. HB 1966 also clarifies existing Code language to ensure that revenues generated by local building department fees are re-invested back into the department so that they can continue to hire new staff, implement technology upgrades, and streamline and modernize the department's processes. Furthermore, although initial drafts of HB 1966 had a potential fiscal impact to the Commonwealth, the General Assembly made several amendments to eliminate that fiscal impact.

Local building departments are on the front lines of driving economic development and community revitalization around the Commonwealth. Whether you are renovating your home, expanding your existing office space, opening a new restaurant or brewery, or building a single-family or multi-family housing development, local building departments are responsible for ensuring that new, rehabilitated, and existing structures in the Commonwealth comply with the Uniform Statewide Building Code, the Statewide Fire Prevention Code, and the various other codes that have been established to protect the health, safety, and welfare of all Virginians in the places where they live, work, and spend time with friends and family.

Virginia has long been recognized as one of the best places to work, live, start a business, and raise a family. Extended and unpredictable permit review periods, as well as understaffed local building departments, have a substantial impact on a homeowner's or business owner's decision to pursue a new construction, renovation, or expansion project. HB 1966 will help bolster our local building departments so that communities around the Commonwealth can continue to realize the type of positive investment and reinvestment that we've seen in recent years.

We respectfully request your support of this important legislation.
