

Protocol for Reviewing Specific Titles To Identify Sexually Explicit Content

- ☐ Gather with your school team.
- ☐ For each title:
 - ☐ Go to booklooks.org and search for the title
 - ☐ Individually read the excerpts that have been extracted from the book
 - ☐ Using the definition of "sexually explicit content," individually identify content within the excerpts that may fit the criteria for any of the following: sexual bestiality; lewd exhibition of nudity; sexual excitement; sexual conduct; sadomasochistic abuse; coprophilia, urophilia; and fetishism.
 - ☐ As a group, discuss content that may fit the definition.
 - ☐ Determine if, based on that content, the book meets the definition of "sexually explicit content."
- ☐ Record your group's determination on the recording sheet.
 - ☐ Circle "yes" or "no" on your recording sheet. If you circle "yes," add notes identifying the specific content that led you to identify it as sexually explicit.
 - ☐ If your team struggles to come to a consensus on whether the book meets the "sexually explicit content" definition, record notes regarding your group's discussion and indicate that you believe another group should also review the content.

Note: Some titles may not be on booklooks.org. If the title is not there, you may reference Common Sense Media (books) to read the description listed under "Sex, Romance and Nudity." Reference additional sources as needed.
