Breslau, Prussia, April 4 .- Professor Richard Abegg, a distinguished chemist and professor of chemistry at the University o. Breslau, was killed while attempting a landing following a bal-Professor Abegg, who was very fond of ballooning, ascended here yesterday in the balloon Silesia, which belongs to the Aeronautic Society. He was ac-

companied by a woman relative and Engineer Carl Gerstel. Strong wind currents were encountered, and when Tessin, in Mecklenburg-Schwerin, it was decided that it would be dangerous to continue the fight. Accordingly the gas valve was opened and the bailoon dropped slowly to the earth.
