

## How Virginia compares

On July 1, Virginia joins 18 other states in legalizing recreational marijuana. Here’s a comparison to laws in some of the states that border Virginia and to a few others that legalized earlier.

Possession	Up to an ounce per adult. An ounce to a pound – civil penalty of up to \$25. More than a pound – a felony. Sales	Adults may privately share up to an ounce. Sales are prohibited.	Adults may transfer up to an ounce to other adults if there is no payment.
