

# Let's Draw an Ice Cream Truck!

A drawing lesson from the  
Drawing with Mark DVD episode:



This will also be good practice for drawing different cars and trucks!

Here is what our finished drawing will look like.

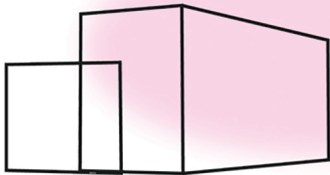
We can use our basic shapes:



Start with your pencil,  
crayon or marker.  
Sketch lightly and  
have fun. Let's start!

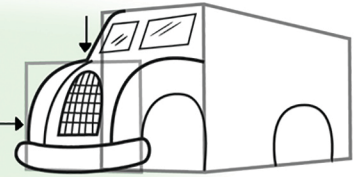


1. Let's start by drawing two rectangles. The smaller one is placed in front of the larger.



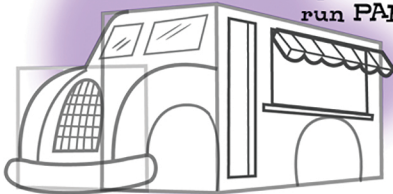
These are boxes that will  
help provide foundation for  
our truck. We're also using  
**PERPSECTIVE** to make it  
look like the truck is driving  
up the street.

2. We can start adding some detail to the front now.  
Please notice how the  
curves on the front of the  
truck end at the top of the  
small box and follow the  
sides of the small box.

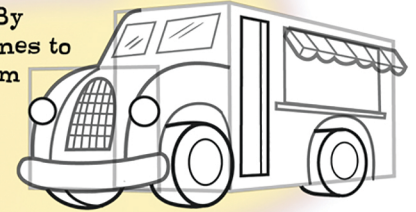


3. Draw out the awning and window so people can get  
their ice cream!

Add a door too. The vertical lines go straight  
up and down. The horizontal lines  
run **PARALLEL** with the lines  
of the larger box  
in perspective.



4. Now we can add the headlights and  
bumper. And especially the tires  
so the truck can drive! By  
adding parallel curved lines to  
the tires, this makes them  
look like they're in  
perspective too.



5. Now we can add more detail  
to the truck like a horn on top.  
You can also add a giant ice cream  
cone so everyone knows it's  
an ice cream truck. You  
could change the sign  
for another business.  
It could be a  
hamburger for a  
nice food truck!



6. Add a background of the city or park.

Whatever you wish! You can also  
add your name or more decorations  
to the side of the truck.

The box shapes that  
we started with  
will be erased but they  
were a great foundation to  
use when we drew this  
truck.

Use boxes again to draw  
any kind of truck  
you want.
