6	Statement of purpose of bill as introduced: This bill proposes to establish a
7	Vermont Coronavirus Economic Stimulus Equity Program.
8 9	An act relating to the Vermont Coronavirus Economic Stimulus Equity Program
10	It is hereby enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Vermont:
11	Sec. 1. VERMONT CORONAVIRUS ECONOMIC STIMULUS EQUITY
12	PROGRAM
13	(a) Definitions. As used in this section:
14	(1) "CARES Act" means the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic
15	Security Act (CARES Act), Pub. L. No. 116-136.
16	(2) "Economic Impact Payment" means a recovery rebate for
17	individuals authorized under section 2201 of the CARES Act as codified in
18	<u>26 U.S.C. § 6428.</u>
19	(3) "Eligible adult" means any individual who is a current resident of

20 Vermont, was a resident of Vermont on April 1, 2020, and was ineligible to

1	receive an economic impact payment under the CARES Act due to
2	immigration status.
3	(4) "Eligible child" means an individual under 18 years of age for whom
4	an eligible adult is a parent or guardian.
5	(5) "Personally identifiable information" means an individual's:
6	(A) name;
7	(B) address;
8	(C) date of birth;
9	(D) place of birth;
10	(E) immigration status;
11	(F) unique biometric data generated from measurements or technical
12	analysis of human body characteristics used to identify or authenticate the
13	individual, such as a fingerprint, retina or iris image, or other unique physical
14	representation or digital representation of biometric data;
15	(G) name or address of a member of the individual's immediate
16	family or household;
17	(H) Social Security number or other government-issued identification
18	number; or
19	(I) other information that, either alone or in combination with the
20	information listed in subdivisions (A)–(H) of this subdivision (5), would allow
21	a reasonable person to identify the individual with reasonable certainty.

1	(6) "Resident of Vermont" means any individual living in Vermont who
2	intends to make the State his or her principal place of domicile either
3	permanently or for an indefinite number of years. Individuals who live in the
4	State for a particular purpose involving a defined period of time, including
5	students, migrant workers employed in seasonal occupations, and individuals
6	employed under a contract with a fixed term, are not residents for purposes of
7	this section.
8	(b) Establishment of Program; eligibility; maximum award.
9	(1) On or before November 15, 2020, the Agency of Administration
10	shall establish the Vermont Coronavirus Economic Stimulus Equity Program
11	to award direct relief grant payments to eligible adults and eligible children.
12	(2) In order to receive payment under the Program, an eligible adult
13	shall certify that he or she:
14	(A) is a resident of Vermont;
15	(B) was ineligible to receive an economic impact payment under the
16	CARES Act due to reasons of immigration status; and
17	(C) had an adjusted gross income of less than \$99,000.00 in taxable
18	year 2019 or, if filing jointly, an adjusted gross income of less than
19	<u>\$198,000.00 in taxable year 2019.</u>

1	(3) Each eligible adult shall receive \$1,200.00 and \$500.00 for each
2	eligible child, provided that an eligible adult shall not receive an award for an
3	eligible child if another applicant received an award for that child.
4	(4) Each award issued under this section shall be issued as a direct
5	payment from the State of Vermont.
6	(5) All applications for a payment under this section shall be submitted
7	on or before March 1, 2021.
8	(c) Administration of Program.
9	(1) The Program shall be administered by the Agency of Administration
10	in consultation with the Executive Director of Racial Equity and the Agency of
11	Human Services. The Agency of Administration may partner with public or
12	private entities to conduct outreach, provide application assistance, process
13	grant applications, or deliver assistance payments to eligible individuals.
14	(2) The Agency shall adopt requirements, guidelines, or procedures as
15	necessary to implement and administer the Program. When the Agency adopts
16	requirements, guidelines, or procedure under this subdivision, it shall consider
17	how to disperse payments to applicants who lack banking services or a mailing
18	address to which a payment may be sent. The Agency shall not be required to
19	initiate rulemaking pursuant to 3 V.S.A. § 831(c) in relation to any
20	requirement, guideline, or procedure that is adopted or issued in relation to the
21	Program.

1	(3) The Agency may utilize staff and resources from any State agency or
2	department as necessary to administer the Program and may partner with any
3	nongovernmental entity to promote or implement the Program.
4	(d) Contract for implementation. Notwithstanding any provision of law to
5	the contrary, the Agency may enter into contracts, as deemed necessary, with
6	any nongovernmental entity to implement and administer the Program without
7	the need to competitively bid such contracts. For the purposes of the Program,
8	the public health risk posed by COVID-19 shall be deemed to be an emergency
9	situation that justifies the execution of sole source contracts pursuant to
10	Bulletin 3.5, the State's Procurement and Contracting Procedures.
11	(e) Confidentiality; personally identifiable information. All personally
12	identifiable information that is collected by the Agency through
13	implementation of the Program by any entity of State government performing a
14	function of the Program or by any entity that the Agency contracts with to
15	perform a function of the Program shall be kept confidential and shall be
16	exempt from inspection and copying under the Public Records Act.
17	(f) Protection of personally identifiable information. The Agency shall
18	ensure that any entity of State government performing a function of the
19	Program or any entity that the Agency contracts with to perform a function of
20	the Program:

1	(1) implements appropriate procedures and safeguards to protect any
2	personally identifiable information that it obtains in relation to the Program;
3	(2) shall not disclose an individual's personally identifiable information
4	to another State entity or contractor performing a function of the Program
5	unless that disclosure is necessary for the administration of the Program;
6	(3) complies with the prohibition on disclosure of personally identifiable
7	information under 20 V.S.A. § 4651; and
8	(4) complies with all applicable requirements of 9 V.S.A. chapter 62.
9	(g) Reports.
10	(1) The Secretary of Administration shall report to the Joint Fiscal
11	Committee at the November meeting of the Committee regarding how the
12	Agency of Administration or its contractors will make payments under the
13	Program, including how payments shall be dispersed to applicants who lack
14	banking services or a mailing address to which a payment may be sent.
15	(2) On or before April 30, 2021, the Secretary of Administration shall
16	report to the House Committee on Appropriations and the Senate Committee
17	on Appropriations regarding the implementation and administration of the
18	Vermont Coronavirus Economic Stimulus Equity Program. The report shall
19	include:
20	(A) a summary of the payments awarded under the Program,
21	including the amount of payments awarded;

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1	(B) any challenges encountered by the Agency or contractors in the
2	implementation and administration of the Program; and
3	(C) a summary of the results or success of the Program.
4	Sec. 2. APPROPRIATION; VERMONT CORONAVIRUS ECONOMIC
5	STIMULUS EQUITY PROGRAM; REVERSION
6	(a) The amount of \$5,000,000.00 is available in fiscal year 2021 to the
7	Agency of Administration for the administration and payment of grants
8	pursuant to the Vermont Coronavirus Economic Stimulus Equity Program. Of
9	the funds available under this subsection:
10	(1) \$2,000,000.00 shall be appropriated from the General Fund; and
11	(2) notwithstanding 2018 (Sp. Sess.) Acts and Resolves No. 11, Sec.
12	C.106(b)(3) and (4), \$3,000,000.00 of the funds appropriated from the Tobacco
13	Litigation Fund to the Judiciary to address adjudication of Children in Need of
14	Supervision cases shall be transferred to the Agency of Administration.
15	(b) The Agency of Administration may use up to \$50,000.00 of the funds
16	available under this section for the administration of the Program.
17	(c) If funds available to the Agency of Administration under this section
18	have not been awarded on or before June 30, 2021, any remaining funds shall
19	revert to the Tobacco Litigation Fund for use by the Judiciary in fiscal year
20	2022 to address adjudication of Children in Need of Supervision cases
