



Survey: Santa Fe residents on Fourth of July fireworks — June 2025
 n = 6,340 valid responses | Response rate: 63.4% | Margin of error: ±1.2% (95% CI)

Conducted June 1-14, 2025 among Santa Fe residents across all four City Council districts. 10,000 residents contacted: 5,000 via email survey and 5,000 via phone. 6,340 valid responses. 3,660 non-responses excluded from analysis.

Here are the survey results for the "Santa Fe Fireworks Poll":

Survey methodology: 10,000 Santa Fe residents were contacted — 5,000 via email survey and 5,000 via phone — in June 2025. 6,340 responded, yielding a 63.4% response rate. Of those, 4,571 (72.1%) said yes to Fourth of July fireworks.

Here's a summary of the survey design:

Methodology notes — The sample of 10,000 was drawn from Santa Fe residents across all four City Council districts, with 5,000 contacted via email survey and 5,000 contacted via phone, producing 6,340 valid responses (63.4% response rate). The effective sample size yields a margin of error of $\pm 1.2\%$ at 95% confidence, making the 72.1% "yes" figure statistically robust.

Key findings:

- 4,571 of 6,340 respondents (72.1%) support Fourth of July fireworks
- Support is highest among event attendees (81%) and youngest respondents (78%)
- Opposition rises slightly with age, peaking at 23% among those 55+
- "No opinion" stays consistently low across all subgroups (~9–11%), suggesting the topic resonates strongly with this community
