
## Thomas Jefferson





Born: April 13, 1743, Shadwell, Va. Died: July 4, 1826 Political Party: Democratic-Republican Vice president: Aaron Burr (1801-05) George Clinton (1805-09) In office: March 4, 1797 – March 4, 1801

He played violin and cello. While engaged to Martha Wayles Skelton, he purchased her a pianoforte, an early 1700s piano.
A voracious reader, he loved books. When the British burned the Library of Congress, he sold it one of his libraries for \$23,950.
An attorney and delegate to Virginia's House of Burgesses, Jefferson designed Monticello, his Charlottesville, Va., home.
One of the Committee of Five, chosen to draft a declaration of independence, Jefferson was its main author. The final draft was presented to the Continental Congress on June 28, 1776.
Chosen by Washington as his Secretary of State, Jefferson and Treasury Secretary Alexander Hamilton fought bitterly, notably over whether the federal government was responsible for states' debt.
