How are you, sir? Mr. Krim, you said?

Yes, sir.

Nice to see you, sir. Thank you for coming in.

**Ron Krim**

Yes, sir.

**Judge Morrill**

Welcome. Anybody else? Okay. Thank you all for coming. Come on back. Moving on.

5. Commissioners' Court opening remarks.

**Judge Morrill**

Agenda item number five, Commissioners' Court opening remarks. I'm going to say it's Commissioner Linney.

**Commissioner Linney**

Sure.

**Judge Morrill**

All right. Was I wrong?

**Commissioner Olivares**

It's okay.

**Judge Morrill**

All right.

**Commissioner Linney**

It's been a while. All right. Good morning, everyone. I attended the first class of Leadership Bee County and Commissioner Olivares; he's in there with me. It was an interesting first session and I am looking forward to eight more of them. So, also, I called Road and Bridge on some pot-holes, county road issues, edge work that needed to be addressed, as well as patchwork they had gotten done in Blueberry Hill, Viggo Road, Harrison Road, scraping back the grass on those two roads as well, and brush cutting and pickup in the same area. Also, Central Lane got boom maxed and trashed and tire pickup on Gill Ranch and some potholes on County Road 314 were taken care of. So, thank you, Road and Bridge for all that. I participated with registering people for the Margarita Walk downtown. That was a big turnout. There were 340 checked in, and 24 volunteers helped to do that. 10 downtown businesses were involved with the walk. It was a super successful event. I participated in the Western Week parade. That was a really good turnout. There was over 100 entries, I understand, in the parade. So, that was really, good. And also I want to thank Senator Hinojosa. I reached out to him. You know, it was always tradition that the jets would start the parade back when, back when, right? And so, I asked him if he would, because it was a little late for just us normal people, probably. So, I asked him if he would reach out to the public relations in Kingsville, and he did, however, they had budget cuts, and they fly every other weekend, and the Western Week weekend was not the weekend they were flying. So, he reached out to Corpus. Corpus had just got a new fleet of jets in that they do strictly formations with and they said they would have loved to have done it, but they had no pilots available. So hopefully next year we can get that done and just, you know, everyone looked forward to that, so that'd be a really cool thing to bring back. I was asked by the city to say a few words in National Night Out here on the courthouse grounds, which there was a big turnout for that again. And I attended the Saint James Fall Festival. And then this Thursday will be our second session of leadership Bee County. So, with that, I will pass to my left.

**Commissioner DeWitt**

Thank you, Commissioner. I appreciate it. Judge, I'm going to bounce around quite a bit, if it's alright? Just a little bit of this, little bit of that.

**Judge Morrill**

Absolutely.

**Commissioner DeWitt**

The first thing, I had a call this morning, and they wanted me to let everybody know they're going to be a Mental Health Chalk contest on Saturday and they invite everybody to come down and take a look at it. I had the honor a few years ago of being one of the judges. Some of the things they can do in the street between here and in front of the courthouse with chalk in a small area is absolutely fantastic. They have different age categories. I know Commissioner Farias and I were judges, and there were some what, three or four

year olds. They had this big old piece of chalk and they were making all kind of drawings. And then there was one, it looked like something out of a movie star had done it. I mean, it was absolutely gorgeous. It was beautiful that they just did with chalk. It's hard to believe what they can do. But they wanted me to emphasize that it would be this Saturday, right out here in front of the courthouse. To tie on to Commissioner Linney's Road and Bridge accolades, they've done some real good work on Mineral Cemetery Road. It was in pretty bad shape. They still have a little ways to go, but it's looking good. We're getting a lot of good comments on it. I met with the Pettus Superintendent of Schools, Dr. Hernandez. It's kind of an interesting thing and it'll come up later in the agenda. Several years ago, the school board contacted me and said, "We'd like you to make the street, North Street, one way." So, we brought it to the court. We made it one way. Well, then they started asking about a year ago, "Why is it one way?" "Y'all asked for it to be one way." "Well, we don't want it one way." I said, "Well, all you have to do is let us know and we'll change it back." So, it's on the agenda to change it back to two way on North Street, which is in front of the school. And they said the reason they had it one way originally was the school was under construction, and they forgot to ask us to change it back. So, I've been meeting with Dr. Hernandez up there. He had a couple more issues. They're going to be putting security gates at the front of the school. They wanted to know if they could put them out in the county right away. I said, "No, sir, we can't let you do that." I said, "It's a liability for the county, but we'll have the Road and Bridge go up there and mark where you can put them. So, they've gone up there and showed them where they can put them. And then it was kind of interesting. He said, "We'd like to get a light put up on North Street just for the entrance of the school. And we're sitting in his office. I said, "Sir, there's already one there. "And it's one of those, "Yes, there is." "No, there isn't." "Yes, there is." " No, there isn't." "Yes, sir, there is." I said, " I was here two nights ago and looked at it." I said, "I'll tell you what, maybe I'm mistaken. Let's go look." So, we went up there, and he said, "There is a light here." There sure is. "It must be the trees. That's why we don't see it." So, they're going to do some tree trimming and all. So, we're accommodating what they need up there. I had met him once before. They're good folks. They're doing a good job. They got a great school. The students are doing well, so we're glad to work with him on that. Okay, a couple of meetings ago, I talked about a young man I met in Pawnee that was going to put a subdivision in Pawnee. He bought some land right across the feed store, and he was telling me about all these houses going to put in and all that he's going to put them down in Tynan and in Bee County, San Patricio County. Well, I picked up some cattle feed this weekend, and he sold the property. He's not going to do it anymore, because he was telling me when we were talking he knew all the rules, and his engineer knew exactly what to do. And I said, "Well, have you checked with our Community Affairs director." "We don't need to. We know the rules." I said, "Okay. I recommend you check with Community Affairs, because we have subdivision rules that you have to follow." "Well, our engineer knows all about that." Evidently, I did some checking, but he has sold the property. So, that subdivision is not going in at Pawnee. I had a meeting in Mineral with quite a few folks, the Leadership Bee County folks. It's good that they're doing this and we have a couple of commissioners. I'm on a steering committee. We have some value packed trips for you, you guys coming up. So, we kind of plan this. We sit around and we figure out what we're going to do to y'all. There's a goat involved.

**Commissioner Linney**

I have no doubt.

**Commissioner DeWitt**

Anyway, we talked to some time ago about the possibility of the screw worm fly production being in Bee County. I got some bad news and some good news. The facility they were looking at out at Chase Field has been leased. The person that leased it said they're not going to do anything with it, but they wanted to lease it. I think there's something going on there about it. Okay, I'm going to hold the lease, and maybe I can lease it to them. But we've come up with an alternative. Between Mineral and Pawnee is the Old Pioneer oil and gas plant. They had a huge building, a large complex. Well, Conoco Phillips has bought out Pioneer. That is just sitting there, and it's for sale. Okay. It has been looked at by the folks that are going to do the screwworm flies. They said, "We can use it." There's some stuff in the works. I've contacted Conoco Phillips. I'm trying to get them to donate it to the county for a tax write off. They may or may not do that, and if they donate it to the county, then we could turn around with permission to court, maybe lease it back to the people that are going to do the screwworm flies. It's kind of in the works. They were pretty excited when they saw it. They said they could produce the flies, let's call it in Pawnee, truck them to Chase Field and load them on the airplanes and fly them out of Chase Field. So, it's still viable. It's still in the works. It hasn't died. So, it could happen. I attended a reception for a new medical student for Bee County. There's a process and a procedure that's utilized where medical students will come to Bee County and spend two or three weeks in Bee County, meeting the commissioners, coming to court, meeting the hospital folks, one thing or another, hoping that we'll wind up with a new surgeon here, or a new doctor. We had a reception for one of those folks here about a week ago. With that Judge, I will pass. And I got a contact for Mr. Krim from El Oso. They're looking for money to help put in or replace the 6-inch water line that serves Bee County. I think you're going to talk to us during public comment. We can't interact with you in public comment. So, I'll talk about it a little bit now. They want us to see if we can find some money for them, and one of the grants that we were able to get and administer it. But, he will tell us more about it when he gets up to talk.

**Judge Morrill**

Sounds good. Thank you, commissioner.

**Commissioner DeWitt**

So, I will pass to my left, sir. Thank you.

**Commissioner Farias**

All right. It's been a busy two weeks. First, I attended the Texas District and Retirement Conference with some of the venture capitalists, some of the people that we put our money into. And our money is doing very, very well here in our retirement system. We're still number two in the nation. We're doing great. So, our money, all the employees money is making money. Second, I participated in the Western Week parade. It was very well attended. And I also went out to the expo grounds, and they were doing real well. I got to go see the, I guess, the opening part of the parade. I want to thank the VFW for the presentation of the colors. Thank you so much. That was real good. And I want to congratulate all the young ladies that took part in the pageant. They worked real hard to complete the fundraiser for the scholarships and they did a really great job. So, they performed out there and got to watch that. So, thank you so much to

them. Also, I saw the entrance of the pavilion bathrooms out there at the Expo. It was a pretty bad safety issue, so got our maintenance department to fix ramps for both entrances, the men's and the ladies, and they're going to pour those in concrete this morning. So, that's going on right now. Also, I attended a ribbon cutting at the EOC and that was well attended. We thank all the people that came out. TEDUM and all of Mr. Willow's bosses and everybody came down for that. That was really nice. And all the folks that were out there for the ribbon cutting. If you haven't gone out there to see our new EOC, our Emergency Operations Center, please make an appointment or call up there. Mr. Jemison's office is there. So is Ryan Garza and Rob Reyes. And you know, go see that facility. Attended the National Night Out and that was also very well attended. We thank all the law enforcement agencies that participated. Everybody was there. It was a really nice event for that evening. Attended the meeting with the city of Beeville at the Emergency Operations Center with all the local officials that included the schools, private schools, the college, nursing homes, all the fire departments. It was preparing for the upcoming water issues that we have here, and preparing also for the stage four water restrictions that are going to go on. Attended the Halo Flight, the 38-year anniversary. We also want to thank Halo Flight for being here in Bee County for 38 years of service here. They really come along. They got a new hangar out there, two helicopters. It's a nice facility. We thank them for being here. Okay, the courthouse boiler update. We had a brand new boiler that we installed here at the courthouse. It's 90% complete. We have three remaining parts that are ordered and should be here. They're just superficial parts, but it should be done by Thursday. So, this winter, we won't have to close any days or be in here in our coats or the courtrooms, judge. And have them nice and warm for everybody.

**Judge Morrill**

We don't close because it's cold.

**Commissioner Farias**

Huh?

**Judge Morrill**

We don't close just because it's cold.

**Commissioner Farias**

Well, it just make it uncomfortable for some of the courts that are being held there. But, no, we're going to get that boiler working. So, it's going to be brand new from top to bottom, all the way to the judge's office.

**Judge Morrill**

Sure.

**Commissioner Farias**

Had several meetings with Chief Kirk, from the sheriff's office, with the contractors, and that's for the SO, the sheriff's office, water storage tank. And we have an item on the agenda today to move forward with that. And also,

three out of the four vendors are local vendors. We always try to support our local vendors, you know, as far as that goes there. They're taxpayers here. Meeting with the Bee Development Authority on the lift station and on that, that was one of the projects that was funded by the ARPA funds to get the lift station out there. It hasn't been functioning, and we got awarded the letter for the grant, but it's on hold until the government opens back up. So we did get an approval letter. The check is in the mail.

**Judge Morrill**

Awesome.

**Commissioner Farias**

All right. That's all I can say about that. I got a call from Mindy Teague with the Nueces River Authority, and they're doing a needs assessment on two of the Colonias in my area. One is the hilltop area on the feeder road on 181 and the other one is the Country Villas on 202. And I didn't punt; I passed that to our Community Affairs director Bobby Jemison. He knows all the information on those, so he's handling it. Thank you so much, Mr. Jemison. I appreciate that. We also had Trooper Yanick call our licenses and weights Trooper, and both of our scales needed a little touch up and repairs. He got the one on 181 working really quick, and it's up and running. So, he's operating out of that. The one on 59 needs a little bit more so it'll be done this week. And I had a meeting with the Texas jail standards and advisory board and all the upcoming changes for the states since the legislature's over and they had new rules to pass and everything else. So, that was a marathon meeting, but I got through it. So, there's a lot of changes coming up for the sheriff and their staff that are going to be forthcoming. So, with that, Judge, I'm going to pass.

**Judge Morrill**

Wow. Okay. Commissioner Olivares, what you got, sir?

**Commissioner Olivares**

So, I'm going to make mine a little bit more brief, because I did cover some of the same events here with our other commissioners here. But I did have the opportunity last week, but Commissioner Linney and I, we attended the Chamber of Commerce leadership class. Quite interesting. It was pretty fun. A little bit more than what I expected. So, it went well. And we're going to have a session every month for the next five months, six months.

**Commissioner Linney**

Eight more.

**Commissioner Olivares**

So, yeah, through April. So, things are going. I also attended the Halo ribbon cutting, which was held out here locally. Pretty good event. It's really fortunate that we do have a Halo flight available to us in the event of a major medical emergency. So, very, very good to have. I held a meeting with TxDOT to review some old action items Basically reviewing a lot of the status of studies that are currently being done. We got about 12 of them that are currently out

there, and they're still being studied. So, things are moving a little bit slow. But one of the things that we did discuss was the lighting out at 797 and 888. Trying to get some lighting in that area. It is pretty dark. We've had some other incidents that occurred there that constituents are asking if anything could be done. As a minimum, they're going to install some more reflectors in that area, but we're trying to get some lighting put up there. This past week, I did attend the Skidmore Volunteer Fire Department fundraiser. I was fortunate enough that I was asked to be a judge for the brisket tasting contest, which was pretty good. A lot of good food. Good, good cause for the department. Also, had an opportunity to meet the project manager for the solar farm that are being built in Tynan. And we went over a few safety issues that are occurring in the area. But all is going well, and they're progressing well with that. I had a meeting with AEP. We actually did an on-site meeting and drove around different areas to look at lighting for safety and also security lighting. So, actually pretty good. And some of the lighting that's going to go up, it's actually minimal cost to the county. So, which is a real good thing. So, I'll be presenting some locations to that at our next County Commissioners' Court. The JP4 building upgrades are going well. They're progressing well. So, we're going to have some more work done here in the next month or so to try and get that building complete. Also, I attended a workforce mobile unit training, which was at the JP's office. Excellent facilities. I didn't realize they had that. But basically, it's a big RV and they have about eight computers inside this mobile building to do training and help people facilitate any resume writing or whatever source they need. So, it's a good program. Also, this month here, I'll be participating again with the Barnhart mentoring. So, I do have some students that are assigned to me. So, looking forward to meeting with these students. I mentioned a while back about doing or providing some support for computer training within the county. Initially we were going to utilize the workforce. They had encouraging words, however, unfortunately, they're not going to be able to do that. So, we had to drop back and punt. Fortunately, the Barnhart Library will help us accommodate that to do some training, which is going to be close by, and we're putting the synopsis together now to identify whatever the needs are. So from very basic to advance on these XR trainings. So, I'm going to be reaching out to the department heads to start identifying staff and then also scheduling them on how that can be done. I know they've tried it once before and hopefully we can improve the process on some of this training, which is needed. Also, TAC is also available to assist with some of the training. So, we are going to be moving forward with that. As far as the Toledo jail, the upgrades are coming along. The plumbing is roughly about 60% complete. And in the process of doing this, we got our new rebidding, if you will, back from the contractors, and some of the cost that was provided is a little bit over the top. So, we're going to go back out and ask the contractors to basically do a little value engineering and determine what is really needed to get the building up and running. And these additional items that they want to add, we may have to do it later on. But I'll bring that details back to the court to see what we want to do there. But right now, the cost went above the 500 limit and then as we're growing down or getting some of the bids back, they're such at a high level, it's really difficult to understand what's in the bid. So, I went back out to get a little bit more definition that we don't need all these additional items. So, that'll be done and all the contractors are willing to do that. They realized, yeah, we did add a few extra cameras, or, yeah, we did add a couple of hardware, or we did add more stuff that we really don't need. So, we're going to come back and say, "Hey, what is really needed to get that going?" There are some things that we do need to have, but I think some of the options that's being worked on, and I'll present that to the court here. Hopefully I'll get all the information back this week. So, that's where we stand with that. So, Judge, cut a little bit short.

Judge Morrill

Well, thank you all. And thank you for that update on the Toledo jail and your efforts to keep those costs down. We need to make our dollars stretch as much as we can. I would just like to once again, thank Commissioner Olivares for leading the charge on getting this fancy new audio visual technology installed here in the Commissioners' Court. It may take a little bit of getting used to. I'm solely focused. I'm looking at y'all, but I'm solely focused on the little black knob at the end of this stick. I don't know how long it's going to take for me to, for this to disappear from my focal point, but for now, if you see me cross-eyed, it's just a shortcoming that I have. Folks, it's getting dry. It's staying warm. Which may be good news for boiler and future courthouse closings, but it's really bad for the countryside. We will likely have on our next agenda a burn ban. It's definitely something that, just for everybody, just as a general overview, the way that we run this process in Bee County, albeit informal, is our volunteer fire department, fire chiefs, and our EMC get together and discuss what they're seeing out on the ground. And then the EOC makes a recommendation to the court and we follow the EOC and our fire chiefs' recommendations. We try to be conservative. It's easy to institute a burn ban. It can be incredibly expensive, difficult, and risky to not institute a burn ban. So, we'll continue to pray for rain, but until that time comes, if you're a farmer or rancher out in the country, if you've got a burn barrel in your backyard, just know that a burn ban may be on the horizon. Last week, the city of Beeville made some public comments. They issued a Disaster Declaration. They raised their water emergency level to level four. And I want everybody, all the public, to know that Bee County and Bee County Commissioners' Court stands firmly behind the city of Beeville. We're here to support, to assist, and do anything that we can to provide whatever value we can as the city of Beeville navigates through this concerning situation that we find ourselves in, with this persistent drought in South Texas. We have faith and confidence that they and the experts that they have retained and whose advice and guidance they're relying upon will lead us through it and there will be better days ahead. So, in the interim, everybody, please be mindful, conserve water where you can, and let's try to stay positive and encouraging to the folks at the city because it's a very, very, very difficult situation that they find themselves in with very few options and even less quick options. Finally, it's politics season. I'm going to go through this very quickly in the interest of full disclosure to the public. When an elected official who has more than a year and 30 days left on their term, announces a bid to run for office, for a different office, under the Texas Constitution, they trigger what's called a resign to run. Right? So, the resign to run provision says, "Hey, you've announced. You've automatically resigned your current post." There's a companion Texas Constitutional provision that says any elected official who resigns still holds over in that position until their replacement is named. In Texas, when it comes to elected officials within the county that do not sit at this table, the Commissioners' Court makes those replacements. When it comes to my seat, when a judge resigns, the commissioners appoint a replacement. And when a commissioner resigns, whether under a resign to run statute or just of their own volition, the judge in the county in which that commissioner serves, is the only person who can replace them. So, when it comes to seeing any of our commissioners, which not to point you out, but I guess I will, Commissioner Linney announced a candidacy for this seat earlier this month. He automatically resigned. He now serves in a holdover role. He'll serve in this role for as long, or he will serve in this role until I replace him.

It's my discretion. If you have any questions, you're more than welcome to reach out to me individually, and I'm happy to discuss with you current controlling precedent out of the 13th Court of Appeals. Otherwise, please understand that we do understand the Texas Constitution. We do understand the statutes of the laws of the state of Texas. As it relates to this particular situation, there's nothing untoward going on. Any decision that I make is always and only going to be what is the best decision for Bee County. It's always going to be that and the decision rests solely with me. So, that took a more serious context than I expected it to, but I hope everybody is clear on that point. Nobody wants to go back through? Okay. Good. It's rare that I'll give them an option to do so.

Moving on to agenda item number 6, public comment. Are there any members of the public who wish to address Commissioners' Court? Gentlemen.

### Hector Pimentel

Do you want me to go up there to the podium?

### Judge Morrill

We'd love for you to come up to the lectern. Yes, sir. Make sure that little green light is on as well.

### Hector Pimentel

Yes, sir. I was just testing you. First of all, thank you guys for giving me the opportunity or giving us the opportunity to be here. I work for Hlavinka Equipment Company. We solely have tractors, implements too, as well. So, we do have shredders. We're really trying to push the municipality a lot now. We really been more into the high horsepower to the farmers and the community, from here all the way to Chapman Ranch, let's be honest. San Patricio, Chapman Ranch and all that. But I got hired on. I really want to be more into the municipality end of it. So, if you guys ever need quotes or let's just demo a piece of equipment, just give me a shout. My number is on there. And again, just thank you for your time. And if there's anything I can do. Oh and on that flyer, I guess in the back and in the front, they're the same. That will just kind of show you roughly from a compact tractor to a midsize horsepower tractor with the shredder, what it would kind of cost, roughly, on there. But if you guys have any questions, please give me a shout. My name is Hector. My number is on there as well. Thank you, guys.

### Commissioner DeWitt

We can't interact with you, but do you have another set you could leave with our auditor's office?

### Hector Pimentel

Yes.

**Commissioner DeWitt**

Please.

**Judge Morrill**

And I'd ask you, Hector, if you could please contact my office at some point in time today after the meeting. We may have some additional questions for you to see what sort of opportunities may exist.

**Hector Pimentel**

Sounds great. Thank you.

**Judge Morrill**

Thank you for coming in.

**Ron Krim**

Good morning. Thank you all for your time. I really appreciate you. Thank you, Mr. DeWitt, for answering your email yesterday. You probably weren't working, but I was.

**Commissioner DeWitt**

I work 24 hours, sir.

**Ron Krim**

Me too. No matter what. We are El Oso Water. We serve five counties in Texas and South Texas. Bee County, we're in the northern part of your county in Pawnee, Texas. We have over 900 miles of pipe. We only have 2,300 connections. So, we have a lot of pipe out there. The reason I'm coming to you today is in the Pawnee area, there's about two and a half to three miles of 6-inch pipe that needs to be replaced. We have a GSI system. It started in late 24. We're picking up the leaks through our mapping. So just this year, we've had 15 leaks on this line. This line serves all the way up to Three Rivers, Texas to the Love's truck stop. We have ways of turning the water around, but this particular section of pipe has become very difficult. We just talked about water. We lose about 3 to 600,000 gallons before we can get to these leaks, because they're so remote. We rely on farmers and customers to let us know, "Hey, we don't have pressure." So, we go out and start looking. Anyway, we are trying to apply for the Colonia Grant, where this area is within 150 miles of the Mexican border. So, we're looking for the max. The cost of the project is over \$2 million and it requires bores and driveways. Everywhere the water goes, we have to bore it if it's inside that right away, which a lot of it's in private. But you know, we do have to bore through their driveways, too. So, it costs a lot. I did meet the young man in Pawnee that you're talking about with the subdivision. Yeah. That's an interesting young man. He's already applied for water, but I guess he already sold it. So, I don't know. But anyway, I just wanted to come and ask the county for to apply for this grant for El Oso Water because when you have 900 miles of pipe, we're fixing a lot of leaks. We started this communication in May and I'm just now getting the maps and everything gathered together and the engineering for this project.

Judge Morrill

Could you tell us your name once more?

Ron Krim

Ron Krim.

Judge Morrill

Ron Krim. Thank you, sir.

Ron Krim

K-R-I-M. Don't trust the Cs.

Judge Morrill

Thank you, Mr. Krim. We appreciate it. Please continue to work with Commissioner DeWitt and he can work with my office and we'll proceed as best we can for you. Thanks for everything you guys do.

Ron Krim

I certainly appreciate it. Thank you all very much for your time.

Commissioner DeWitt

We probably will get in touch with Grant Works and some of the others and have them contact the director or see what we can do.

Judge Morrill

Perfect. Thank you.

Commissioner DeWitt

Thank you for coming, sir.

Ron Krim

Absolutely. Thank you for having me.

Judge Morrill

## G. Change of Status

**DISCUSS AND CONSIDER ACTION ON THE FOLLOWING ITEMS:**

8. Approve purchase of Enterprise Justice-Tyler Technology software and installation for the Bee County District Clerk's, District Judges and County Clerk's Offices.

**Judge Morrill**

Okay. Discuss and consider action on the following items. I'm going to rearrange the agenda a little bit this morning. I'm going to move agenda item number 19 to the top. Agenda number 19, approve purchase of Enterprise Justice-Tyler Technology software and installation for the Bee County District Clerk's, District Judges and County Clerk's Office. We have Judge Starr Bauer this morning. Judge Bauer, you have the floor, ma'am. Thank you for being here.

**Judge Bauer**

Thank you very much. I appreciate your time and your attention, commissioners and judge. We had thought to bring the current proposals from Tyler to the court for a vote to expend roughly \$200,000 so that we could implement the Tyler Enterprise Justice System in our District Clerk's office and perhaps our County Clerk's office. Unfortunately, in preparing for today's presentation, I realized it was absolutely not going to be that simple. I met with Tyler Industries in September and was informed that the proposal that we received included OCA funding for the software. I then called OCA and was informed that the financing OCA had set aside for this project is running out and that Bee County would be the 44th county in line and the probability of getting that funding from OCA is, frankly it's zero. I have requested a full freight proposal from Tyler, which I will tell you will probably triple the cost. The cost right now is \$325,033. That is for the District Clerk and the County Clerk's office with OCA assistance. So, we had proposed \$200,000 at this time to get the District Clerk's office by itself, which is \$186,780. But as I mentioned, OCA is not going to be able to assist us in this funding. And I've been told it probably, as I have also mentioned, triple the cost. But we'll see. I do have an email into Tyler to see the full cost, and also to see if Tyler has any financing options. The other piece of bad news on this is, I had assumed that Tyler worked like most other companies and all you have to do is give them money and the product will arrive. Tyler, unfortunately, is horribly backlogged. And all of this is backlogged, and we would not receive the product for 18 months. Basically, they're a year and a half behind because of the demand. The demand is a result of our legislature and their new requirements for reporting. It would appear that our legislature is very interested in beefing up their oversight authority, not only on the judiciary, which, believe me, we are really feeling, but also on counties in general and the reports that are due into the Office of Court Administration, as well as the various administrative offices throughout our legislature are enormous. And I don't see that declining, which is why the implementation of the Tyler system is going to be essential for Bee County. It is a system that will see us into the future. Our current system, referred to as our heritage system, which is IDocket, is not going to be able to keep up with the demands of our legislature, and frankly, they are not particularly responsive to the needs and demands presently. I will tell you that the District Clerk's Office, as well as the County Clerk's Office is probably going to have to hand put in. I don't know how to say that.

**Commissioner Dewitt**

Scan. Scan in.

**Judge Bauer**

They're just going to have to, you know, chisel in stone the current reports that are required because we've been working with IDocket and we're just having some problems. And more than likely, we'll continue to have those problems, which is why we really need to see the Tyler program implemented as soon as possible. I want to keep this in front of the Commissioners' Court because my understanding is the \$200,000 that I thought, or we thought would be available at this time, because we're not using it, we can't save it. I was really hoping I could just put it in the district court's budget and sit on it. I can't. And so, I want to basically just put a bug in y'all's ear at this point. It's probably not going to be \$200,000. It's probably going to be closer to 800,000, if not a little more than that. And so, kind of keep in mind every budget year there needs to be a little earmark on some money, because this will happen, and when it happens and it becomes absolutely necessary, it's going to be very hard to come up with \$800,000 if we haven't been earmarking a little bit along the way.

**Commissioner DeWitt 41:02**

Couple of questions if I could.

**Judge Bauer**

Yes, commissioner.

**Commissioner DeWitt**

The 200,000 we have now, where is it that it's going to go away?

**Judge Bauer 41:07**

My understanding from April is that she had found about 200,000 that we could apply to the title purchase at this time. And I don't know if it was from reserves or if it was from other budget areas. I know, in all seriousness, the district court budget, we usually have quite a bit of our budget left over at the end of the year and so I know some of it was from various areas and line items in our budget.

**Commissioner DeWitt**

Okay. Can we make a down payment with that 200,000 and spend it with them and get on their list, so to speak?

**Judge Bauer 41:42**

I've looked. I've sent my email to Tyler asking if I've informed them that there appears to be about \$200,000, we can do now. And if we can, if they have any financing options with their company and also to get the full freight proposal. And if we do a full and I'm sorry to keep referring to it as a full freight proposal, but if we go that route, if that wouldn't bump

us up, because the sooner we can implement the Tyler Enterprise System, the better. No doubt. Yes, sir.

**Commissioner Farias 42:18**

Are we in compliance? I mean, using IDocket now, or is it just going to be hammered into stone?

**Judge Morrill 42:25**

We are in compliance as best as we can be, Judge.

**Judge Bauer 42:27**

And that, yes, that really is the truth. We are in compliance as best we can be. And we are not alone. We are along with a lot of other rural counties throughout the state of Texas, we're having the same problems. The Office of Court Administration knows this. The legislature knows this. The district judges do have a meeting with the governor's office this Thursday afternoon at four to discuss this issue, and so I hope to come back to the Commissioners' Court with the answers to some of the questions I've told you we have currently. Also, I do understand that we're still under contract with IDocket. The IDocket contract renews every May, and right now, we're not in a position to do without IDocket. I want to make that clear, because I assume that that chart or expense will come up in May. But until we are ready on Tyler, we're going to have to dance with the one that's rung us. Are there any other questions?

**Commissioner DeWitt 43:39**

I think what we're saying is that we'll see this on the next agenda again with some updates.

**Judge Bauer 43:43**

You will see this on the next agenda, probably for several next agendas. Yes, several next agendas. But I did. I thought about taking it off the agenda today, but I thought, "No, I want y'all to know what's coming up and see and kind of have it." Like I said, we need to start earmarking some funds. I don't think we can get away from this.

**Commissioner Olivares 44:04**

Just a quick question. I mean, I'm sure IDocket, I mean, hearing on the sideline here some of the challenges with IDocket, and I know they have to be aware of their own challenges. Have they made any effort to come into and say to the county, "You know, we can improve our process or procedures or our program to assist."

**Judge Bauer 44:24**

They have made some efforts. I don't want to discount that. But the programming, I don't think is, I don't know enough about computers to really answer your question knowingly. I can just tell you what happens is, we send in the ticket, we tell them, here's the problem. They tell us, it's fixed. We run the report, it's not fixed, and then there's another problem. It's a different problem. And it's just been it's just continued to be that way.

When I spoke with OCA, they asked who our current program was. And when I told them, they were alarmed for us. And so, I said, "Would that bump us up any further? And I was told by Mr. Green, "No, but I see your need." And so, yeah, we, I don't, I really don't think that IDocket is capable of complying with the current, with their program, with the requirements the legislature has imposed on us.

**Commissioner Olivares**

Good. Thank you.

**Judge Bauer**

Yes, any other questions?

**Judge Morrill**

I don't believe so. Thank you so much, Judge Bauer.

**Judge Bauer**

Thank you. And if I may be excused.

**Judge Morrill**

Of course you may. As Judge Bauer is walking out, I'll say Bee County and the four other districts we share with our three district judges are incredibly fortunate to have the judges that we have in our region. Their efforts on the bench are matched by their efforts off of the bench. And not to paint too sharp of a picture, but what district judges do, our district judges do is they cover five entire counties. So, you'll see them in different counties most every day of the week. The new legislative laws and in the new legislative focus over the last couple sessions on runaway judges and whatever else it is that they, their experience, have identified as something that needs to be addressed, probably largely stemming from our more urban counties, creates a weird conundrum for conservatives and Republicans in the state that truly, I believe, viscerally values our rural way of life and small communities, and the end result is you have state laws that are being passed down that are putting additional reporting requirements, technological reporting requirements. The laws are made without a clear idea of exactly how your rural counties are going to comply with those laws. And so, it's not a Bee County thing, it's the vast majority of the 254 counties in the state of Texas thing. This is a very, very serious issue, and it's something that we ought to think about more seriously, maybe when we're talking to our state legislators who are trying to protect us, the public, from runaway district judges when, in effect, what they are doing is they're creating red tape and bureaucracy that is so overwhelming and suffocating that it's making it increasingly difficult for district judges to do the very thing that we have placed our trust in them to do, which is to handle our criminal cases, our felony criminal cases, all of our family cases, child service, CPS cases, all of our civil cases, extraordinary writs. The amount of work that they have to do is just being layered and layered upon with additional reporting requirements sent to some amorphous state agency to make sure that they are in fact doing it correctly. These are district judges. These are lawyers. These are people who have taken an oath. These are folks who all hold a law license, which means when they make a mistake, they may not only lose their politicians seat, they may lose their very right to practice law in the state of Texas. At some point in time, our state legislators should learn the very simple lesson that when the people put individuals such as Judge Bauer into the

position that she's in, there goes with it a level of trust that we should be entitled and we can rely upon. That Judge Bauer and all of our other rural district judges in the state of Texas are going to do their best effort to execute their obligations. The ones that actually matter, not the ones that they report back to government officials in Austin who's looking to check a box to satisfy some state legislator from Harris County or Travis County or whatever county they come from. So, I'd like to not get off my soapbox, and I'll say thank you again, Judge. I mean it when I say we've got great district judges. They work very hard. Our auditor's office can tell you just how involved they are, just how knowledgeable and focused they are on not only continuing to execute their obligations but continuing to advance the needs of the other departments that serve our district courts, our district clerk's office, primarily. They do a lot of work off the bench that we never see. So, I guess my bottom line is, thank you, Judge. We're here for you. Anything that we can figure out, working with April in the auditor's office to find a way to start storing money, preparing for this future inevitability, coming up with a lay away plan or a down payment, we're going to do. So, anything you need from us, please let us know. Thank you, Judge.

**Judge Bauer 50:45**

Thank you, Judge and commissioners. It's an honor to serve.

**Judge Morrill 50:52**

Thank you, ma'am. We will take no action on agenda item number 19.

**Judge Morrill**

Agenda item number 8, approve mutual aid agreement between Rural Economic Assistance League Inc (R.E.A.L) Transportation and Bee County.

**Commissioner DeWitt**

I think we have Mr. Benavidez here from REAL.

**Judge Morrill**

Come on up, sir.

**Mr. Benavidez**

Thank you, judge and commissioners for having me today. I just wanted to thank you for considering the proposal of a mutual aid agreement between REAL Transportation and Bee County to support transportation evacuations during emergency events. This agreement would formalize our ability to assist one another during times of crisis by enabling the coordinated sharing of transportation resources, personnel, and logistical support. A recent example is in 2024 when Aransas County reached out to us. They were hit by a hurricane and needed help moving the residents. That successful coordination, I think, prompted us to try to work with all of the other counties that we serve to put

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agreements in place so that we can work together to help evacuate residents, whether it be a hurricane, gas leak, flood, wildfire. Particularly with those individuals with disabilities and limited mobility. So again, I just want to thank you for considering the mutual aid agreement with REAL Transportation. Thank you.

**Commissioner DeWitt**

Let me make a motion to approve so we can discuss.

**Judge Morrill**

I have a motion. Do I have a second?

**Commissioner Linney**

Second.

**Judge Morrill**

I have a second. Further discussion? Commissioner DeWitt has the floor.

**Commissioner DeWitt 52:21**

We need to be sure that you get with our emergency management coordinator, Mr. Ryan Garza. We'll get him a copy of his contract. But what you're doing dovetails exactly into what Judge Morrill has tasked me with, if you would major disaster in Bee County. How do we get rid of debris? One thing or another. This dovetails in with that on how we take care of the people. So, I really appreciate you guys bringing that to us. I read it. It is well worded. The only thing, we don't have a Bee County judge pro tem. So, strike that off. We can't afford one, if you would. But this is an excellent contract. We look forward to working with y'all but we'll make sure that Ryan Garza gets this and gets in touch with y'all. And if you've got a business card that you could leave us to give to Mr. Garza, I would appreciate it, sir. Thank you.

**Mr. Benavides**

Absolutely.

**Judge Morrill**

Thank you, Commissioner DeWitt. You know, we appreciate everything REAL Transportation does in our county and the strong working connection that we have with you all. Any further discussion?

**Commissioner DeWitt**

One other thing. Many years ago, we did an evacuation of Bee County, and we thought we knew what we were doing. We had everything set in place, the buses and everything else, except we had no drivers. The school buses were going to be used. We were going to evacuate the nursing homes. I forgot what hurricane it was. They were going to San Antonio. We're going to put bands on them. We clocked them in and all. But all the

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drivers were gone. No one could drive the equipment. So, that's what I saw when I saw this. You guys have the people to do this and it'll work.

**Mr. Benavidez**

Yes, sir.

It didn't work the last time. I was in Community Affairs then and it didn't work. Thank you.

Thank you. I appreciate it.

One good example of that is Friday I spent time with one of your county residents, Elizabeth Lidle. She's a wonderful young lady who uses our service every day to get to Coastal Bend College. She is autistic and counts on us every day to

take her to school. The thing that touched me the most when I was talking with Elizabeth was I asked her what it meant to ride the bus, and her answer was, "It makes me feel less disabled." And I think that is exactly why taking down these transportation barriers are important for residents like Elizabeth Lidle that just want to go to school and just don't have a way to get there. And that's where we can step in and help those residents. And so, rest assured, I'm communicating with your residents. I want to keep the dialog going with them, because I'm all about improving the lives of people just like Miss Lidle. Improving the lives of the residents here in Bee County. So, rest assured, you have a partner in me. If there's ever anything you think we can do to improve our service or make it better, reach out and I will work hard to make that happen for you guys, because people of South Texas are important to me. I just moved down here to be closer with my family. So, finding ways to do that is important to me. So, it looks like I have great partners here in you guys to make that happen. And I'm looking forward to really working with you folks.

**Judge Morrill**

Agenda item number 12, approve First Amendment to sign location lease agreement between Lamar Advantage Outdoor Company, LP and Bee County.

**Commissioner DeWitt**

Judge, can I give some history on this before we make a motion?

**Judge Morrill**

Yes, sir. You may.

**Commissioner DeWitt**

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This sign is located at the old yard property over near Jackson Street. Many years ago, as a commissioner, as you drive by that property, I kept looking at this sign and thinking, "That sign is on our property." And I checked with the other commissioners and they said, No, it's not. It's not. It's not. I said, "Well, I think it is. Let's do a survey and see exactly where it is." When they did the survey, it was indeed on our property. And it's one right at the corner. It's galvanized. It goes up. It's a nice signpost. And then you start thinking, "Okay. Who's getting the money for this sign?" Well, it took a lot of tracking backwards to find out even who had the sign. It was a company in Victoria. I contacted them and they said, "No, no. It's not on your property. It's somebody else." I said, "No, sir. It's not. It's not highway department. It's on county property. The guy said, "Nah, nah. I said, "I tell you what. Why don't you come over? We'll meet on site, and I'll show you the survey stake." So, he comes over. He said, "You know what? That is on your property." He said, "We want at least three foot around the post." I said, "No, sir. No, sir. We need to talk." I said, "We want to start getting the revenue for the sign." He said, "We paid every year." I said, "That's fine. Who are you paying it to?" He wouldn't tell me. I have some suspicions, but that's another story. So, we made an agreement with them. And he said, "Well, what are you going to do if we don't?" I said, "You can take sign out." I said, "It's on our property illegally." Well, we can't do that. He said, "It's too expensive." He said that it would probably cost 40 to \$50,000 to put it back because of the type of sign it is and all this. I said, "That's fine." So, we have before us, Judge, the contract now that for this said sign that is on our property. It's a 10-year contract and I see what they're wanting to pay, and I think it's light. Because it's one of those things that they're saying is they're going to give us this good deal for \$2,000 a year, and they're going to increase it to no \$1,000 a year. 1250 beginning the fifth year of the lease. Judge, I implore the court, we need to charge quite a bit more, because if they don't pay it, what are they going to do? Move the sign? So, I want to make a motion that we charge at least \$2,000 a year with an upgrade of \$200 per year for the time of the release. That's my motion. If y'all want to increase that or decrease it, I don't have a whole lot of, how am I going to say it? It's a sign company. They didn't want to work with us at first because they said it wasn't on our property. We're in the driver's seat, gentlemen.

### **Commissioner Olivares**

Is the dollar amount you're proposing, is that a fairly good number? I'm not familiar as far as...

### **Commissioner DeWitt**

Well, they offered us \$1,000 or so. What do they get the lease a sign? When you lease a sign at the top, it's so much a month or so much a year, and it's several thousand dollars.

### **Judge Morrill**

We do have a pending motion. Was that a motion or was that an indication that you were going to make a motion?

### **Commissioner DeWitt**

That was a motion.

### **Judge Morrill**

Okay. So, do we have a second?

**Commissioner Olivares**

Second.

**Judge Morrill**

I've got a second. Okay. I would recommend... It's kind of funny, right? We got a motion and a second. My recommendation is to, is to withdraw the motion and the second and to reject the contract and allow them to come back to us and we can enter into negotiations and see what they say. It gives us a little bit.

**Commissioner DeWitt**

I agree. I will withdraw my motion.

**Commissioner Olivares**

I withdraw my second.

**Commissioner DeWitt**

I advise that we contact the company and have them contact the county judge's office and go into negotiation with the county judge, and the county judge can bring it back to the court.

**Judge Morrill**

Okay. So, we can take no action.

**Commissioner DeWitt**

Take no action. That is correct. Take no action.

**Judge Morrill**

It might be less harsh than a rejection.

**Commissioner DeWitt**

It's just that I think it's very light after what I went through with that bunch before. And we're in the driver's seat. It's on our property without our permission originally. We'll go from there.

**Judge Morrill**

Lamar, get in touch with county judge's office. Thank you very much. We will take no action on agenda item number 12. Moving on.

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14. Agenda item number 13, Approve potential action on game rooms located within the county that are in violation of Bee County Order regarding requirements for eight liners that requires a 1,000-foot separation distance from school district owned property or church owned property. Mr. Jemison, you're here today. Community Affairs Director. You have the floor, sir

**Bobby Jemison**

Judge and commissioners. This came about from a complaint from an individual that was complaining about game rooms that are in violation of the county orders. In the package, you have a copy of the county orders which stipulates and specifies what that business requirement is. From church owned property and school owned properties are 1,000 feet. Also, in the package that you have, you'll notice the spreadsheet that lists all of the currently permitted game or establishments that have amusement games on the premises. There are 17. Out of the 17, there's seven that are in violation of the county order. I will make a correction to one of them. I was in one of their establishments Friday, and they have removed the game rooms. That is number five. Their games are no longer in that establishment or in that building. So really, what's before the court this morning is we need to, obviously, I'm asking for direction from the Commissioners' Court to how you want to proceed with these establishments that are in violation of our game room order.

**Commissioner DeWitt**

Judge, if you would, I'll make a motion to enforce the order with a caveat that, through no fault of their own, this is something that we should have caught in the previous Community Affairs directors, and we did not. I was involved in writing this order back in 2014. The county attorney did review it. But to give them a little leeway, I would couch this in my motion, is that we do enforce the order, but it goes through December 31st and we just do not renew their permits. In other words, they can continue to operate while they're looking for a place to go. It gives them about 60 days.

**Judge Morrill**

I've got a motion. Do I have a second?

**Commissioner Olivares**

I have a second with comment.

**Judge Morrill**

I have a second. Commissioner Olivares, you have the floor.

**Commissioner Olivares**

So, thank you, Commissioner DeWitt. Understanding, you know where that number comes from, I did a little bit of research and looked at the Constitution to see what it states there. Unfortunately, there is no prescribed distance from churches or schools on how far it needs to be. They leave that primarily up to the Commissions' Court to come up with that number. In doing so, and doing some of my research, there's a wide range as far as what that distance could be. Anything from 300 feet to 1500 feet. So, it grows. The question is, what is the right distance, and what is the impact back to the county? So, the 1,000 feet, I think, is a reasonable distance amount. I think if it needs to be decreased or increased, it probably needs to hold a little bit further discussion, or at least to do some case studies and say, "Hey, what are these other counties doing?" And, you know, thanks to the computer, I did a little bit of research, you know, and there are other counties that have minimized 300 feet, and then others, seem like the norm is more like 1,500 feet. So that seemed to be more of the norm. But I think that would require a little bit more discussion as far as what is the right number for that. But it is part of our ordinance, and I think we should enforce it. I know it's probably not a popular decision, but I think overall, if we have rules and laws, we need to abide by them.

**Judge Morrill**

Any further discussion? I only take issue with one thing that you said.

**Commissioner DeWitt**

Yes, sir.

**Judge Morrill**

You said, through no fault of their own. Folks, if you are a citizen of Texas or the United States and you break a law, is it a defense to say I didn't know? No. Ignorance is not a defense. This ordinance was passed by public vote at this Commissioners' Court. This ordinance is a publicly available document available here in Bee County.

**Commissioner DeWitt**

I stand corrected, judge.

**Judge Morrill**

But y'all are going to really have to rein me. I'm getting on my soapbox today. I do really like this. I haven't even touched it. However, I don't disagree with you as far as extending the olive branch, giving them a little bit of time in which to figure out what they're going to do moving forward. So, I appreciate that I just had that one legal issue. It was through their fault. It was their fault. It's not our fault. It's our fault as well for not enforcing it, but it's certainly their fault for failing to understand all the rules and regulations that apply to game rooms in Bee County. I have a motion and a second. Any further discussion?

**Commissioner Linney**

I have one question.

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**Judge Morrill**

Yes, sir.

**Commissioner Linney**

How about residential people that I have? There's a person in Tynan that was talking to me about there's a new game room opening up, and it's literally in the front yard of this man's house. He's worried that, he had a friend of his that had the same situation and said, "I constantly had trash. I had drunk people in my front yard coming from the game room." So, is there anything to do with not just the church and school, but as a resident as well?

**Judge Morrill**

Nothing.

**Bobby Jemison**

Not in the current order.

**Commissioner DeWitt**

We don't have zoning out in the county.

**Bobby Jemison**

My suggestion for that would be to contact the sheriff's office and file an official complaint.

**Commissioner Linney**

I've spoken to Sheriff Aguirre about that one.

**Commissioner DeWitt**

What was interesting when we passed this in 2014, I remember Commissioner Haggard and I worked on this real hard with the county attorney, and there was a new game room going to open up in Skidmore. And we passed this, and the game room people were here, and we were thinking about this \$500 per machine. And when they walked out, they were raided that night, and all the machines were taken. And we said we should have gotten the \$500 before we left. Anyway, that's just some history.

**Judge Morrill**

Thank you, Mr. Jemison, for bringing this to our attention. I have a motion and a second. Any further discussion? Hearing none, all those in favor, please indicate by saying, "Aye."

Judge, this is the one we talked about earlier that I met with the superintendent on. When would be the public hearing date? We have to have what? At least 30 days.

**Judge Morrill**

Yes.

**Commissioner DeWitt**

Because it has to be in the newspaper.

**Judge Morrill**

So, mid-November, maybe.

**Commissioner Farias**

The 10th. November 10th.

**Judge Morrill**

That's, that's just right at 30 days.

**Commissioner Farias**

Then it goes to the 24th.

**Judge Morrill**

Yeah, let's go to the next one. When is the 24<sup>th</sup>?

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**Commissioner Farias**

24<sup>th</sup>.

**Judge Morrill**

Is that what you're saying, too?

**Judge Morrill**

All opposed? Motion passes without exception. Thank you, gentlemen. Agenda item number 15; approve to update selected Bee County safety-security lights from high pressure sodium lights to LED lights. Is this you, Commissioner DeWitt?

**Commissioner DeWitt**

Yes, sir. It's me again.

**Judge Morrill**

You have the floor, sir.

**Commissioner DeWitt**

Thank you, Judge. What we did. We started in 2018 and I made it part of the agenda item in your packet. When we started safety and security lighting system for Bee County. We currently have probably close to 200 lights around the county that we put up on dangerous intersection curves, that sort of thing. The original lights were high pressure sodium. They had an orange glow. The new lights and Commissioner Olivares has gotten a whole bunch of these put in. They are LED lights. They're like three and four and five times brighter. And what I would like to do, we have some very dangerous situations on Highway 181 between here and Pettus, and I want to upgrade those. And we've already contacted AEP. It's going to cost about 140 bucks a piece to do it from high pressure sodium to LED. And I'll read it, Judge, if I could read the list.

**Judge Morrill**

Please.

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**Commissioner DeWitt**

We're looking at Farm to Market 2824 intersection and state highway 181 business just north of Beeville. There are two lights there. Those are very important. In that curve, there's a lot of people that travel 2824. The next one is West King Lane, intersection of state highway 181 just north of Normanna. Then one to Farm to Market 1465 and State Highway 181 near Tuleta. The next one is Farm to Market 623 at intersection with State Highway 181 in Pettus near the Dairy Queen. There's a huge light right there that illuminates that whole intersection. There have been numerous accidents. So, this is very important to upgrade that one to the LED. The next one is at the intersection of North Street. That's a main Pettus School, student and school bus route with State Highway 181. We've got one where North Street goes into 181. We want to upgrade that to LED. And then at the Pettus Community Center, one light. The Pettus Community Center, Pettus Fire Department staging areas, intersection with Farm to Market 623. And these seven light upgrades will improve safety and security for citizens and visitors and travelers passing through Bee County on heavily traveled roadways. Estimated cost is around \$1,000 and AEP requires payment. I've been working very closely with Ben Ramirez in the auditor's office. He's done a fantastic job, Judge. He really has. And I would make a motion to the court to allow these seven upgrades to be in effect.

**Commissioner Farias**

Second.

**Judge Morrill**

I've got a motion and a second. Any further discussion? Hearing none, all those in favor, please indicate by saying, "Aye."

Aye.

**Judge Morrill**

Agenda item Number 16, approve brush disposal lease agreement on County Road (CR) 205 between Bee County and Emmett Carpenter for the Road and Bridge Department. I'm going to step away from the desk. Yeah, if you can take over for a second.

**Commissioner DeWitt**

That'll be mine.

**Judge Morrill**

Okay. So, I'm going to give you the floor, and then I'm going to give you the reigns until I return.

**Commissioner DeWitt**

All right, sir.

**Judge Morrill**

Thank you.

**Commissioner DeWitt**

You read it in the record, right?

**Commissioner Farias**

Yes.

**Commissioner DeWitt**

Okay. What this is, the land has been totally deeded over to the Carpenters. One thing that I want to talk about in his contract is that these contracts are for two years. We have several of them around the court. The basic contract is \$100 a month, paid monthly. And what I'm going to recommend to the court is that we change that to \$200 a month. I've been on the court for many, many years, and it's always been \$100 and these people's taxes have gone up. They did not ask for this. This is something I'm looking at around the county. We're not paying them enough for what the service that they're giving the county. And these are good people. They're civic-minded people, and I think the least we can do is pay them a little bit more. So, my recommendation is to alter this contract to \$200 a month and then I want to pay them once a year instead of once a month. Why should we

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issue a check every month and go to the expense of the process in the check and this sort of thing? Issue them a check at the beginning of each contract year for the entire year and be done with it.

**Commissioner Farias**

In advance.

**Commissioner DeWitt**

In advance. Yes. So that's my motion to increase this, to approve this, increase the \$200 a month, and issue one check at the beginning of the contract each year in advance. That's my motion.

**Commissioner Linney**

Second the motion.

**Commissioner DeWitt**

**Commissioner DeWitt**

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Go ahead.

**Commissioner Farias**

Chief Kirk and I've been working on this. And he wants to come up and if you got any questions for him. We've already approved this, but I wanted to bring it back to the court with the numbers that we have and the vendors. So, we've already got a complete.

**Commissioner DeWitt**

It looks good.

**Commissioner Farias**

All four pieces of the puzzle are put together. Chief Kirk has been working really hard on this. We've had lots of meetings with different vendors, tanks, foundation, plumber, and electrical. Four pieces to it.

**Commissioner DeWitt**

And you've got it, pretty much, turn keyed now, don't you?

**Chief Kirk**

Pretty much.

**Commissioner Farias**

Chief, do you want to take over?

**Chief Kirk**

Yeah. Commissioners, I think you've probably all seen your packets. The only thing that's not in your packet is we got an estimate in from Scott Electric for the electrical work on that. I got that email in yesterday, and the cost on that is \$2,100 even for the electrical work. That would be the only addition to what's already in your packet.

**Commissioner Farias**

Judge and commissioners that is still within budget, on that, for the Sheriff's Office and then we expect to mirror that same project over to the Emergency Operations Center and that will be hot funds, since it's for that location there. So, we're within budget, and then with some of the remaining budget money there, we don't want to take the water from the city. We want to buy some water to start off and put in those tanks. And I think we've already got, Mr. Garza has already given us a couple of vendors.

**Chief Kirk**

We've got one vendor right now and I'll work on some more.

**Commissioner Farias**

Okay. Instead of putting 50,000 gallons of water in that storage tank all the time, we can hire, and it's still within budget. So, I'm asking to move forward on this project and get the blessing of the court.

**Commissioner DeWitt**

Would you mind putting the numbers out so that we can put it in the record? What is it going to cost?

**Chief Kirk**

I can do that.

**Commissioner DeWitt**

Please.

**Chief Kirk**

So, for the tank installation, let me back that up. In your package, you'll have a timeline of the different companies that were asked for bids and such. So, the bids that we did receive for the tank installation itself from Sky Wells out of Hunt, Texas, that final number was 47,927. Forty-seven thousand nine hundred twenty-seven dollars. For the tank base, the concrete tank base with local contractor, AmBee Construction, that tank base with footers and packed with sand, was \$15,970. The plumbing bid for the plumbing work, including a jet pump to bring it into the facility, was a total of \$19. And then, as I mentioned, the bid from Scott Electric, which is the only electrical bid I have in hand right now, was \$2,100 even.

**Commissioner DeWitt**

Chief, if I could. Once that's done, we have an emergency. We have no water; we can cut the valve off on the other side of the EOC and pipe this water in and be done.

**Chief Kirk**

I don't have the infrastructure details about the EOC, but I can tell you at the Sheriff's Office we have to cut off the city water.

**Commissioner DeWitt**

I misspoke.

**Chief Kirk**

Right.

**Commissioner DeWitt**

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Cut it off and turn the valve off and turn this on. You guys are good to go.

**Chief Kirk**

Yes, sir.

**Commissioner DeWitt**

And pressure up.

**Chief Kirk**

That's our project goal. Yes.

**Commissioner Farias**

And one of the reasons I'm just going to interject here on that plumbing bid. That's a three-phase jet pump to pressure up that whole location.

**Commissioner DeWitt**

Oh, my goodness.

**Commissioner Farias**

So, I kind of questioned that right off the bat. Then Stellar said, "Wait, it's a three-phase. This is a big building, or big, you know, two buildings to pressure up and keep going for four days." It's also got the ability on the tank to come in with another. It's got a connection. We can buy several tankers of potable water. We're still in that situation. Hook it up to there.

**Commissioner DeWitt**

Like HEB does.

**Commissioner Farias**

Like HEB does and pressure it up. And then we also got a line from the city that we can have trickling in if the city gets to a point where it can afford to, you know, we can restock our water.

**Commissioner DeWitt**

Good job, guys. Chief, excellent work. Excellent work, sir.

**Chief Kirk**

Thank you.

**Commissioner Olivares**

Yeah. Good point. At the EOC, you know, I was fortunate that there is a way to tie into the main inlet at the EOC building. We're just going to have to excavate underneath that existing driveway without tearing up any concrete. So, we can tie it in pretty well.

**Commissioner DeWitt**

Good.

**Commissioner Olivares**

Definitely needed, though.

**Commissioner DeWitt**

Absolutely. And the good thing about the EOC is that hot funds money is not coming out of the court's regular budget. That's a good thing. And it's understood there'd be a few little cost differences because of the connections or something between them. But I think it's a great project. Good idea.

**Chief Kirk**

Commissioner, if I can be clear on the way this project is going to work, as far as infrastructure goes, it will not be hooked up to the building with electricity or plumbing until there's an emergency.

**Commissioner DeWitt**

Right.

**Chief Kirk**

So, we'll be able to, basically, if you will, a generator type cord, be able to provide electricity in the same with a flexible 3-inch water line into the existing inlet and then cut off the valves and bring water in that way. It won't be fixed to the facility until there's an emergency, so we will be able to fix it.

**Commissioner Farias**

And it won't be a lock type plug that we connect to it.

**Commissioner DeWitt**

Good deal. Excellent work. Work. Commissioner, chief, y'all did good.

**Commissioner Farias**

And that total figure, I don't know whether we figured it out.

**Judge Morrill**

My total is \$85,797. Did anybody else do math? Because I'm notoriously bad.

**Commissioner DeWitt**

We ought to approve 100 then, sir.

**Commissioner Farias**

Well, it's 100 in the budget. We've already got in some of the other monies we're going to use to fill the tank to start with, not using city water. So, there's cushion in there, enough to order the tankers of water once it's complete.

**Chief Kirk**

The preliminary bid that we have for potable water, I believe, is a 6,000-gallon tank and that's \$900 a tank. Isn't that what it was, commissioner?

**Commissioner Farias**

Yes, sir.

**Chief Kirk**

So, at a 45 or 47,000 capacity was 44,000 usable gallons in the tank. What's that calculation?

**Commissioner Farias**

Well, not to exceed 100,000. And we should be within balance on the water

**Commissioner DeWitt**

And if it comes up differently, we'll take appropriate action.

**Judge Morrill**

So, my motion is to approve this project going forward. We've already approved it, to approve the final numbers.

**Commissioner DeWitt**

I'll second that. Second.

**Judge Morrill**

Thank you.

**Chief Kirk**

Thank you.

**Judge Morrill**

Thank you, Chief Deputy and Commissioner Farias for your motion. Commissioner DeWitt, for your second. Any further discussion?

**Commissioner Olivares**

Just one note of interest, instead of buying the water, maybe some of our local water districts are willing to donate the water from their wells. The only challenge would be is finding a transportation to get it from point A to point B.

**Commissioner Farias**

Well, to get it to be potable water for them to bathe with and wash and do dishes, it might be a question about where we get it from. We get it from a licensed source that's already approved.

**Commissioner DeWitt**

And we've got a certificate.

**Commissioner Olivares**

I know, like Skidmore, and also Tynan, it's all potable water, so it's all approved.

**Commissioner Farias**

We can look at all, you know, whatever choices we have. Would you want to make sure we stay within balance? TECQ has given us their blessing on this. So that's another big plus.

**Judge Morrill**

Good job, Commissioner. Thank you.

**Commissioner Farias**

Thank you, sir.

**Judge Morrill**

Any further discussion? Hearing none, all those in favor, please indicate by saying "Aye."

Thank you, Mr. Massey. It's always good to see you, sir. Anybody else? Okay, moving on. Thank you all for being here. Please come back.

5. Commissioners' Court opening remarks.

**Judge Morrill**

Agenda item number 5, Commissioners' Court opening remarks. I can't remember from week to week which way I started.

**Commissioner Olivares**

He went first.

**Judge Morrill**

What's that?

**Commissioner Linney**

Flip a coin.

**Judge Morrill**

Okay.

**Commissioner Olivares**

He went... It doesn't matter. Go ahead.

**Judge Morrill**

Who knew we were going to get into a dispute this early? I'm going to go to my left to Commissioner Olivares because I do recall going to you first the last time. Save the best for the middle.

**Commissioner Olivares 03:36**

Quite alright. Good morning, everyone. Good to see such a good looking crowd out there. First of all, I'd like to start off a little recognition to our Road and Bridge administrator group. They've been answering a lot of requests that have been coming through the county on a lot of road repairs. One of the significant things that they just completed was re seal coating, or seal coating on Old St Mary's Highway and Southgate. And there's a few other roads that's going to be coming down the list. They still have several items that they're going to be getting into or needing to complete, so just please be patient. We're getting there and they're making some great progress. As an example, boom maxing on County Road 536 has been on the list for getting done for quite some time. It's finally been completed. And then the gentleman that called about County Road 605, that's also being addressed. So, thank you, Road and Bridge for your diligent work and staying on schedule. Pretty active Week. This week, I had the fortune to attend the city council meeting which they talked about the water conservation. Think we might have a little bit more information here shortly. So, very, very good meeting. Also, which had pretty good attendance as well, was the Mental Health Fair which was that event that took over this past weekend. Great event and great thing for the kids. Awesome, awesome event. Also, as most of you were, I attended the Leadership Conference, which is going to be once a month for the next four or five months. Great session. We had individuals that came in from different parts of the community. Very enlightening for me to understand what all they bring to the table. So very, very good. Also had an opportunity to meet with our NRA grant administrators in Tynan, and basically these individuals wanted to mainly make a pass through to look at the county to see what the water requirements and upgrading of facilities were going to require. They didn't do any major inspections. They just wanted to tour the area. And then, commissioner, they went over to Pettus as well, too, and just did a, I don't know if you were able to join them or not. Good information and meeting for them. Attended a ribbon cutting ceremony for the Divine Wolf. I met the owners, met the current operator there. So, it's going to be a good facility. I encourage everyone to visit that place. Good food. And I like the idea they're going to have a little venue in the back for music and so forth. It's looking good. A little bit of an update on the old jail. We basically have a little bit of a pause. I'm waiting on pricing back from our contractors. The initial pricing that we got back has gone up somewhat significant. So, I've asked all of the contractors to go back and do a little bit of re-engineering, Value Engineering, to see what do we really need. All three areas, both IT, the electrical and also the architect. So, once I get those prices back a little bit firmed up, hopefully, I was hoping last week, but it didn't come through, so we will get it down to our budget dollars. I'm confident it can be done. We just got to take away a little bit of the fluff, judge. And with that, I'll pass to my commissioner to the right.

**Commissioner Farias**

All right. Good morning. We had a pretty busy two weeks here. I'm going to start off with the Bee Development Authority. We had a little work session over there. Senator Hinojosa was present with us. We discussed three projects. One of those projects is what Mr. Massey is on, the screw worm facility out there. And then we had two new projects, which we're working on now. On the other part, we had a preventative maintenance and safety meeting, and we were all present. We had some good ideas there to go forward. We had a couple of safety concerns, and we took care of those. So those are working really well. I supported the Crime Stoppers fundraiser this past week and thank them for all that they do and for all that they do for this county and for the area. Checked on the finished work by Jesse, the Expo maintenance Foreman out there, and he was doing some work around the pavilion bathrooms. They did a great job. I want to thank them all and John for being there. And then met with Chief Kirk to finalize the storage tank for the water at the sheriff's office. Now that ring has already been poured. I think the next part is going to be the sand and then it has to cure for a couple of weeks before we move forward with the tank. And that is to help us in the water crisis in case we get there, so we don't have to transfer any prisoners into different areas of the state. And that'll save us a lot of money. So, we're being proactive about that. Chief, thank you very much for all the hard work you put into it. I appreciate that. And then I attended the Chalking for Mental Health here at the courthouse grounds. It was very

well attended. There's lots of folks here, and they had looked like they had a great time the whole time they were here. I don't know how much they raised, but they did really well. Then we came to Commissioners' Court disaster declaration to support the city of Beeville. I think Daniel Dorgan is here to give us a little update in a bit. And then we had our regular Bee Development Authority meeting out there at Chase Field. And one of the main items on there was we had listened to the concerned ranchers in the area on the Navy's touch and go. They're starting to do a lot of touch and go out there. They're having some concerns. So, they came out to speak with us. So, we're still, we're still discussing that. I had a Zoom meeting with Komatsu for our courthouse restoration, and we met with the consultants. We got a good look at the next step for the courthouse. You know, our courthouse, take a look around, and it needs some help. So, we're working on that right now. I attended the Golden Trojan breakfast at the AC Jones High School. That was really, really well attended. Big shout out to their culinary arts and providing breakfast for everybody out there. Those kids do a fantastic job of serving. And Commissioner Olivares joined us out there and it was great. Very, very good.

**Judge Morrill**

What is a Golden Trojan?

**Commissioner Farias**

Golden Trojan is somebody that's over 45. You would qualify.

**Judge Morrill**

I wasn't a Trojan. Thanks for outing me. So, you're a Golden Trojan?

**Commissioner Farias**

I am.

**Judge Morrill**

Congratulations.

**Commissioner Farias**

I got a free pass to get in all the home games.

**Judge Morrill**

Everybody that's over the age of 45?

**Commissioner Farias**

Yeah.

**Judge Morrill**

That's awesome. Go Trojans.

### Commissioner Farias

I'll try to get you a pass. Then after that, we met with the BEIC. The Bee Development Authority was trying to secure some funding for our match grant for the lift station and BEIC was very generous. And they helped us out with a good portion of our matching funds for that. And that's coming up next. As soon as the government opens up, we will get our letter so we can move forward. I checked on the courthouse elevator and it's not working too good. Pauletta got stuck in there. But they're working on that now to see if we can get that working correctly. So, I would take the stairs if you're going to go upstairs to see the judge or anything. I would use the stairs. The boiler here at the courthouse is about 95% complete. They're working out there today, so we should have a brand-new boiler system for the courthouse here by the end of the month. And that was one piece that hadn't been touched in over 20 years. So, we're looking forward, hopefully we can get that piece going really, really well. Finished the carpet installation at the District Attorney's office and that looks very well. So y'all go up there and take a look at that job that was done by JL Squared. And then working on storage tank number two at the EOC. We're beginning to work on that part of the project for the water storage tank. And thank you, Commissioner, for helping me out with that. I was a little overwhelmed there for a bit. And then that is it. I'm going to pass to Commissioner DeWitt.

### Commissioner DeWitt 12:04

Thank you, sir. I appreciate it. Couple things. We're going to have a safety lesson first. If you're ever operating equipment with a metal fuel tank and have that fuel tank near the muffler, that fuel gets hot enough to boil. Whatever you do, don't take the cap off. This happened in Mineral to a fellow named Oscar Sanchez, Jr. He suffered pretty severe burns. As he took the cap off, first came out the aerosol, then the actual fuel came out and drenched him, and it caught on fire. He's doing okay, not in good shape. They're having a benefit fundraiser for him in Pettus at the Chameleon Park on November 9<sup>th</sup> at 11 o'clock. And if you'd like to donate, they have no insurance. He's a volunteer firefighter. He's the assistant manager of the municipal district there. If you'd like to donate, leave your donation there to municipal office. They would appreciate anything possible. So be very, very careful when you're operating around equipment and gasoline or diesel, because that fuel gets hot and it will start boiling. It will start bubbling in that tank. Because, from what I understand yet, I don't know why he checked it, but he had a hard time getting the top off. Well, it was so much pressure when he took the top off, the fuel came with it. So be very, very careful. We're going to have Mr. Frank Massey. He is here today to talk about some exciting developments with the screwworm facility that we're trying to get to Bee County. And I want to direct y'all's attention to the latest Parks and Wildlife Magazine. It has an article on the screw room fly, and it talks about the fly. The first experiments on this fly were done here in Texas, and they used an x-ray machine from a dentist's office on these flies, trying to figure out what was going on. And they were ridiculed. They said, "It's never going to work." What happened when they focused radiation on the little worms. The males became sterile. Okay. According to the article, the males, once they grow into flies, and they fly up, the males will breed 10 times. The female screwworm fly will only breed once. Okay. If they breed with a sterile male, the eggs are no good. And that's how they stopped the screwworm infestation here before in Texas. And I think it was completely eradicated. I think an article said 1966. So, some of y'all remember the screwworms that we had. Those of us that grew up during that time period, it was bad. If you had a young calf or a deer or something, he was immediately, they call it being blown. The female fly would go lay eggs on it, and a few days, the maggots would hatch out and start eating the animals. So, we don't want that back in Texas. And I appreciate Mr. Massey being here. He has done a fantastic amount of work. He's going to brief us on what's going on. It's pretty exciting. I'm teeing up to kind of get everybody ready for your talk. So, we'll look forward to seeing or hearing that. Met with the Pettus Municipal District and the folks that Commissioner Olivares was talking about with the grant. I want to compliment our Auditor's Office. Miss Frances Melvin is our grant writer. She was there on site with us. There were three or four people from the state that were there with this grant. It was very important that we be there and that Commissioner Olivares is there to meet these people. It makes a difference when you're dealing with the state folks, if you're there on site with them. Something that that came up that is interesting, though, everything's going along smooth, but the soonest they could turn dirt, what was it? 26th or 27th?

**Frances Melvin**

27<sup>th</sup>.

**Commissioner DeWitt**

27<sup>th</sup>. And it's like every other grant. You got to get it in the pipeline. It takes a while to get there. And my appreciation goes to Miss Melvin for being there. She did a great job. She led them through the whole process. She told them what we needed. The folks from the municipal district were there. It was a very good meeting. We have some folks here that own the daycare. I think they made themselves known a while ago. They're going to be talking to the court during public session, so I'll tee it up for them before we get here. They want to talk to the court about their taxes and tax abatement. One thing I would like to say in public comment or commissioners' comments about the tax abatements. Unless the court changes, there's \$1,000 fee to submit the paperwork for tax abatement. Now, the last time we did that, an auditor will remember this, the company that came in gave us \$1,000 check before they left, and they didn't get the abatement. Well, I think their feelings got hurt because the check bounced. How many times? Twice? Anyway, there is \$1,000 fee, and the paperwork required takes quite a bit of county time, and it's supposed to be, judge, it's supposed to be renovated, renewed every five or six years. I don't think that's happened. So, if they're wanting to go forward with this, that's what's going to have to happen. Okay. I had the privilege of being in Goliad this last week. Governor Abbott was there. It was a peace officer meeting. He was there to present a certificate to Larry Busby, the sheriff over I believe in Live Oak County. The longest serving sheriff in Texas, period. And in just one or two more years, he's going to be the longest serving sheriff in the entire United States. So, if you all know Sheriff Busby, tell him hello and congratulate him. It was well attended. It was fantastic. The Governor was there, border patrol was there, ice was there, sheriffs from all over the country were there. It was excellent. It was excellent. I would like to compliment Commissioner Farias, Commissioner Olivares and our chief deputy, Russell Kirk, for the work they've been doing on getting an emergency water system set up for the jail and the Emergency Management Center. They've done all the work, and it started, I think, Mr. Kirk started all this. Think about, okay, with a wave of one y'all are all in charge of a jail with 150 prisoners, and you run out of water. What do you do? What do you do? You have got 150 people you're responsible for, and you're out of water. Well, they came up with the idea, let's put in a water storage tank. They got TCEQ down, got their blessing. I think it's 45,000 gallons, when we get through with it. Something like that here. Emergency Management Center. Think about the Emergency Management Center. It's there for an emergency. We've got a whole line of showers for people to take showers. We've got extra restrooms. The whole nine yards. Well, guess what? The last time the city ran out of water, we didn't have any water out there. You couldn't have used any of it. So, one of these tanks is going to go in at the emergency management center right in the back of the parking lot. So, if you go by the jail, or if you go by Emergency Management, you'll see them putting a ring around. They were talking about the tank that's going to go in. But I want to compliment these people for the projects they've done, especially Commissioner Farias and Commissioner Olivares. They have never hesitated to jump in, get a project going, follow it all the way through, be sure it was completed the way it was supposed to. You heard him talking about the work that's going on at the old the old sheriff's office and jail. Commissioner Olivares' background is an engineer, so he knows what should be done and what shouldn't be done. He knows the paperwork. He knows how to talk to the contractor. Commissioner Farias, I don't know where he got all this knowledge on construction, but this guy is doing stuff everywhere. In the Justice Center, carpet, roofs. Fantastic. So, gentlemen, I want to lead a round of applause for that.

**Commissioner Farias**

Thank you, sir.

**Commissioner DeWitt**

With that, judge, I will pass to my right.

**Judge Morrill**

Sure.

**Commissioner DeWitt**

Yes, sir.

**Judge Morrill**

All right.

**Commissioner Linney**

Good morning. As Commissioner Farias said, it has been a busy two weeks. I was invited by the former county judge Stephanie Moreno to attend the 2025 Eagle Ford Shell Excellence Award put on by South Texas Energy and Economic Roundtable and the Texas Oil and Gas Association. And then, I played in their golf tournament. And that was a well-attended event. Lots of people showed up for that. The tournament and the meeting. Also, I was asked to be a judge for the costume contest at the animal shelter. That was interesting. There was a lot of people that showed up for that. Thank you to the city for asking me to do that. St Mary's reached out to me to put on a movie night this past Saturday. And that too was, we probably had 50 to 60 people show up to that. And that was, it was a great, great night. Just like the other Commissioners, I also attended the Chalking for Mental Health at the courthouse and volunteered my time to help out with them, with the 5k or the 3k run, 5k run, and everything they do up here at the courthouse. So, it's up here all day. Took care of some issues for some folks at a couple of cemeteries. They reached out to me. There was a couple issues going on, so I went out there to both different cemeteries and took care of that for them. And I attended the Pawnee Volunteer Fire Department fundraiser barbecue there. There was a lot of people. I think they ordered enough food to do like three to 400 plates. And to my knowledge, they sold out. So, good job. And then Road and Bridge, thank you guys. They picked up some illegal dumping on Henry Lane, some patching on Kingrea and mowing, and they're waiting on some material to come in to patch up holes on La Para Road and County Road 340, 344. And then also the city reached out to me again, and they want to do this next Saturday, do another movie night right across from City Hall, I believe, is what Melissa said. So, we'll be doing that this coming Saturday. With that, I'll pass back to judge.

**Judge Morrill 22:45**

Thank you all very much for those detailed reports. It's very interesting. Appreciate y'all bringing it to light and the good work that y'all are doing for the county. The good work that other members of the county are doing for everybody. So, I don't have any opening remarks.

## 6. Public Comment.

**Judge Morrill**

Agenda Item number six, public comment. We're honored to be in presence today of our, not, she's not new, but she's new to Bee County after a recent redistricting by the State House this summer. Bee county is in a different congressional district, and it's a distinct honor of pleasure, and I can't tell you

how much we appreciate you making the effort and taking the time to come and visit with us this morning, Congressman Monica De La Cruz from the 15th District of Texas.

### **Congresswoman Monica De La Cruz**

Thank you. Thank you, judge, and thank you commissioners for being so warm in your welcome to me. This is the start of a beautiful relationship with Bee County. Again, I am Congresswoman Monica De La Cruz, and I represent the 15th Congressional District of Texas in Washington, DC, and have had that honor for two terms. With redistricting, I will then become your Congresswoman in the next cycle, which will be the 120th Congress, beginning January 2026. We're in 2025. 27 actually. 27. So, about a year way, but this district is 90% new. So, there's a lot of new faces to meet. And really what I wanted to do was to a; make an initial introduction, but b; find out what's important to you all, so that when we enter January 2027, I can focus on the key areas that are important to you. I heard a couple things that stand out right away. But before I get started, I want to introduce two very important people from my team, and that's first, my chief of staff right here, Karen Navarro. She works with me in Washington, DC, and travels into Texas with me as well. And then district director Ruben Villarreal, if you will, please stand you'll see a lot of director Villarreal, because he's the one who travels the entire district. There are several things I know we're going to work very well together. First STRPA, Susan Kibby is a great supporter of mine, as has been your organization. So, thank you for that. I've worked very closely with you all on several property rights issues, including screwworm and so I sit on Agriculture Committee, and that is something very, very important to me. I'd like to talk about a couple things that I've done. I've had large farming and ranching communities, so I've worked with the Secretary of State, the trade secretary, the Secretary of Agriculture, Secretary Rollins, to hold the Mexican government accountable through the 1944 Water Treaty and make sure they deliver to us the water that they owe us, which, with the pressure that we've had from President Trump, we've been able to get a year's worth of water in six months. Never been done before. But the second thing that you have mentioned several times is screwworms. Screwworm is my specialty, and where I have done the most work, and so I worked very closely with Secretary Rollins and the president's office to get the sterile fly facility at Moore Air Base in Mission, Texas. That's the front line of the border of where the screwworm will come. That was an \$8.5 million investment that we worked exceptionally hard to get. After we got the screwworm facility in Mission, I worked with the governor's office, and I'm very proud to say that we have an investment of \$750 million into the Moore Air Base center. So, this is unprecedented amount. It's something that we're working extremely hard with the Secretary of Agriculture. And I want to give you some peace of mind, because I've spoken with ranchers like Mr. McAllen, Mr. Guerra, among many more that have talked about the devastation that happened. If you lived through that time that was devastating to our cattle industry. Well, we are dropping 100 million flies in Mexico, and that's 100 million a week in Mexico, and within the next couple of months, we will be dropping 300 million sterile flies out of Moore Air Base in Mission, again, into Mexico, reinforcing our efforts. In the last three weeks, we have not seen any gain of distance towards the Texas, Mexico border from the screwworm that is headed this way. That is a huge improvement, because they were only 70 miles away, and we've been able to keep them 70 miles away. So, we're working around the clock. USDA is working around the clock to make sure that this screwworm does not come over here and devastate our cattle industry. There's a lot of things I'll mention. We've been able to get over \$12 million in constituent services for our people. Now I'll say that again. That's \$12 million to people like you all who've had problems with Social Security, IRS, among many others. And lastly, I'm known on the hill as the federal grant support letter queen. So, I've been able to get millions of dollars of new money to everybody, from our municipalities to our COPS program to our firefighters, among many other infrastructure programs as well. So again, I'm Congresswoman Monica De La Cruz, and I look forward to the honor of serving you all in the near future. And you guys will see me around here in Bee County. I'm looking forward to get to know you. God bless you all.

**Congresswoman Monica De La Cruz**

We know you have a very busy schedule. I know you need to leave, but once again, thank you so much for your presence here today and your comments. Commissioner DeWitt.

If I could, Ms. De La Cruz.

**Congresswoman Monica De La Cruz**

Absolutely.

**Commissioner DeWitt**

If you could wait just long enough to hear Mr. Massey's presentation, it's directly related to the screwworms and an idea that we have that you may not know about.

**Congresswoman Monica De La Cruz**

Okay, wonderful. Yes, I will be happy to. Yes, absolutely. And Susan and I are very close. Like I said, I've been endorsed by SCPRA, so we can definitely connect as well through Susan.

**Mr. Frank Massey**

Thank you for including us and her name in your conversation. We think the world of her. You have very good state credentials.

**Congresswoman Monica De La Cruz**

Yes.

**Mr. Frank Massey**

People like you.

**Congresswoman Monica De La Cruz**

Thank you. Thank you.

**Judge Morrill 30:03**

Thank you again. Mr. Massey, were you going to make public comment?

**Mr. Frank Massey**

**Judge Morrill**

Why don't you come down next, sir. We prefer you at the mic. Well,

**Mr. Frank Massey**

For the record, I'm Frank Massey. I reside in Bee County, out in the Mineral area. I'm a rancher. I'm a retired builder. I'm also retired from a fortune 500 company a few years ago. And it seems like retirement didn't suit me. So, here we go. I have had conversations, personally, individually, with just about everybody here on the bench. And by the way, let me back up and say, thank you. Good morning, Your Honor and Commissioners. Thank you for giving me the minute, a minute to update this program. So, I am a board director for South Texas Property Rights Association. I'm also on the state beef commodity committee for Texas Farm Bureau, and that puts me out and about and all around the state attending meetings. And the current issue that's really on the "Hot Topic" is New World screwworms. And so, it seemed that everywhere I went, I could have been in the same car with the Texas Department of Animal Health folks with Dr. Dingus and Dr. Lansford, and also with Texas Parks and Wildlife. So, I made the joke that if you guys can't make the meeting, just send me your slides. I'll gladly make the presentation. But in setting these presentations, it occurred to me that, gosh, these people are looking for ways to get ahead of the New World screwworms. I mean, I thought, "Gosh, if they could just see all the equipment that's already paid for, all the issues, all the things we have at Chase Field. We have land, we have water, we have buildings. We have a willing county. You know, what a great place. The airfield is just the biggest asset we have. We have the ability, if we could produce screwworm flies, sterile screwworm flies, we could have them to the border in 30-40 minutes, opposed to a four-hour flight from Panama. Currently the only place in the world that produces sterile New World screwworm flies. It is at the COPAC facility, which is jointly owned by USDA in the country of Panama. Since the government's closed this last three weeks, we're not sure what all is happening in Panama. But besides that, it just seemed like a no brainer that we could offer up our local facilities to jumpstart this program. So, I fed the idea to Commissioner DeWitt. He shared it with some of you guys. We brought in Randy Sykes. We brought in Bee Development and Corporation. We've made joint presentations to the House Ag Committee in Austin during the first session and during the special session. We've not had anybody tell us it was a bad idea. So, I don't mean to step on Congress, Congress lady's toes here, but you indicated that you would have 125 million screw flies ready to go, in what length of time?

**Congresswoman Monica De La Cruz**

No, they're already. Mexico has a facility. It is, it is in full production, and we're already dropping 100 million flies right now.

**Mr. Frank Massey**

Well, I don't want to get in, stand here and argue with you, but I spoke with them, with the Ag administer last week, and that has not happened. So, the timing, the timing is, it is the issue. So that's where we were. We're ahead of the game. We think that we can. We have brought in the people who actually built the COPAC facility in Panama. Vaughn Construction. They've been out to Chase Field with us. We've done a study. We've come up with a cost estimate. We've had Texas A&M do a white page so they could tell us how much it would cost to build it and to run it. The only drawback to that is that recently, that hangar 26, when we were going to convert, we thought about converting, was leased to Mr. Villarreal, who's building electric vehicles out there. He had an option through August 31st on that building. When he heard or got wind that we were thinking about putting screwworm facility in there, he exercised his option. We sat and visited with him for a couple hours trying to figure out how

we can still use the building. And he's not opposed to it, except that he wants to be a partner. A profiting partner in the endeavor. So, currently we have moved to a plan B operation. We contacted Conoco Phillips. They have the old, closed Pioneer Plant out near Pawnee. It's been vacant for about five years. Conoco has got that building. Conoco bought it from, who was it, Dennis?

**Commissioner DeWitt**

Pioneer.

**Mr. Frank Massey**

Somebody bought it from Pioneer first. But anyway, it's a nice facility. It's only about 10 years old. We contacted Conoco Phillips. They met us there. We did a tour of the building. We brought Vaughn Construction in. They have digitized the plans and they've figured out what it's going to cost.

**Congresswoman Monica De La Cruz**

Excuse me. I'm so sorry, but I have to be at city hall 10 minutes ago. I'm going to contact Susan for your number so that we can get in contact and see how we might be able to work together.

**Mr. Frank Massey**

Leave your card on the desk. I'll get it to you.

**Congresswoman Monica De La Cruz**

Yes, sir. We sure did. Thank you. God bless y'all. Bye-bye.

**Mr. Frank Massey**

So, currently we're looking at Plan B. Vaughn Construction has been there. We've digitized. They have digitized the plans. I talked to Vaughn Construction on Friday. They were in a meeting that we had in Austin, with Commissioner Sid Miller. And we should have the exact cost, or pretty close cost, analysis, ready this week. So, I jumped ahead by talking about Sid Miller. We visited with him on Friday. We had a 30-minute meeting that lasted an hour and a half. Mr. Miller gave us his blessing. He wanted to know what he could do to help us. He says that we and he are the only people in the state of Texas who are currently doing anything from a state-based effort. Everybody else is waiting on the USDA to do something, and they're not moving fast. I'm sorry to tell you that I will correct Congress lady's, woman's statement about making screwworm flies available next week. That's not happening. They haven't turned the first shovel of the dirt. So anyhow, so back to Sid Miller. He gave us the contact information in the Department of Agriculture to start applying for grants. President of our organization is there this week, working with that lady. They're going to identify which grants are available. How we can make those work for our project at the Pioneer Plant. Next week, we have a meeting with Don Buckingham and Commissioner Buckingham and Railroad Commission Commissioner Jim Wright. With his connections with Conoco, we're going to see if we can get Conoco maybe to donate that building to either Bee County or to Texas A & M or Texas Department of Animal Health Commission. But whichever way the wind blows, one of those organizations can help us move this project through. So, we believe we could be producing 125 million sterile blow flies in under a year here in Bee County. If that happens, then Dynamic Aviation, who currently has the contract with USDA to transport flies from Panama into South America or into Mexico and eventually into Texas, when they get here. They've already been out to Chase Field. They love it. They'd like to move their hub of operations here. So,

they'll be coming in, flying the flies out for us. So, Chase Field will get fuel sales. They'll get mechanics on duty. They'll have plane storage. They may not, they may not get the, you know, the facility for screwworm development, fly development but they will get some residual. You know, the airfields are one of our biggest assets here. Let's utilize it. So anyway, I've kind of stumbled through this. There's been a lot of moving parts. We've got a lot of people involved. We've got Vaughn Construction, who I told you, built the actual facility in Panama, and their sister company ISI, are the people who build Alligator Alcatraz. They're on board with us, and they have the ability to build things quickly. We believe we can have a production facility along with a training program. We've also brought Texas A & M into this, this equation. We think that quite possibly that extension may be able to run it for us. Either way, whoever can do this for us, we're open to help. But here's the bottom line, guys, wouldn't 500 more jobs look great for Bee County? And it takes 500 people to currently run the COPAC plant in Panama. They run that plant around the clock in three shifts. And it takes them 500 people. 500 people would be a great boost to our economy. So, thank you for your interest. Thank you for letting me run around behind the scenes. Just keep your ears open, and if we need somebody to help us apply for that grant money, we may be knocking on your door. It's quite obvious they're not going to give Frank Massey or STPRA \$100 million or \$50 million. But Bee County, they might. Thank you.

#### **Judge Morrill 40:24**

Thank you, Mr. Massey. We appreciate your time, your interest and your efforts on the community and the larger issue of all rural life. Mr. Dorgan, my apologies. Thank you for coming in. You have the floor, sir.

#### **Daniel Dorgan**

All righty. Good morning, everyone. My name is Daniel Dorgan. I'm the Interim city manager for the city of Beeville. Good morning, judge, commissioners. Thank you so much. As many of you know, the city has issued our declaration of emergency in mid-October of 2025 and entered stage four of our drought contingency plan, the most severe and restrictive stage of our plan. The city appreciates the support for Bee County. I believe last week, you also followed the suit with regard to declaration of emergency for the county. Just as for the public and just for public knowledge in the audience, for anyone looking for more details on the water restrictions, as far as watering and frequently asked questions, we do have a website. It's Beevillewater.com. So, there's a dashboard there and you can look at all the different items we have on there as well. In September of this year, the city of Beeville issued a \$33.9 million certificate of obligation bond, as well as a \$2.1 million tax note to help pay for the construction of an additional well, as well as the rehabbing of the two existing wells in town. Just recently, last week, city council authorized the city manager to select the construction company Direct Select, which, in that sense, means that you know competitive bid process is not, the city doesn't have to follow those rules under the declaration of emergency from Governor Abbott's declaration earlier this year. Council also approved a \$3.9 million work order with Garver Engineering to continue the design and the engineering of the construction of the additional well, as well as the rehab of the two existing wells. Once we have a construction manager under contract, we'll be ready to move full steam ahead. My thought is to have that on a council agenda, hopefully early November of next month. According to our engineer's timeline, the two existing wells that we have in town that we're going to be rehabbing, that each can produce roughly 750,000 gallons per day, which gives us roughly \$1.5 million. I'm sorry, million gallons from just those two wells. In addition to drilling one additional well, it's going to be drilled about 2000 feet. It's going to go down to the Jasper aquifer, and we can produce roughly about 2 million gallons. So, in total, that'd give us about 3.5 million gallons, which is roughly our daily average use for the city of Beeville. As far as our timeline is concerned, it's a very aggressive timeline. We're looking at to have all this construction hopefully starting and mobilizing by the end of the year, here 2025, and then we can have the conveyance system, the pumps and all the construction of the wells and rehab wells completed by the end of February. So, we should have, hopefully, the goal is to have water being into our system by the end of February of 2026. Now, also, too, what that comes with, we're going to have to potentially purchase rental RO skid systems, because it takes roughly four to six months to design

and construct the permanent RO system. So, we're looking at different companies to get a rental skid for each of the two locations of the existing well, and then the drilling of the new brand new well in town. So, we're going to be looking at three rental skids, reverse osmosis skids moving forward. Just in addition to, I know there's a lot of questions out there of our water wells, and whether, you know, you're able to purchase the permit for it as well as drill water wells and so you are. But also, we are going to be amending our ordinance to make sure that we have, you know, equal across the board, as far as, is it an irrigation well versus a, you know, drinkable portal well. As far as also to making sure our permit fees are at the tier system, as far as residential use, commercial users and industrial users, as well. Just making sure we're equitable across the board. So as far as that, you know, I'm open for any questions, but we are moving very quickly, and we understand that, you know, the lake levels are not getting any better. As you all know, as of late, the water, you know, the combined lake levels between Lake Corpus Christi and Choke Canyon Lake are under 12% and so, you know, we're working closely with Corpus Christi as well. I know they have had a lot of action, you know, on their end, as far as trying to drill well fields and whatnot as well. So, we do have meetings with them every week. So, they provide us, you know, updates from the city of Corpus Christi water as well. So, be happy to answer any questions or comments from staff.

**Judge Morrill 45:32**

We can't ask any questions on public comment. Mr. Dorgan, thank you so much. I know you're incredibly busy, so thank you for taking your time out to provide us with an update. Be more than happy to put you on the agenda, in the future, on your availability permitting to put you on the agenda and take more time. But I feel very confident. I know it's a scary time for everybody that's city and everybody inside Texas, but I feel very confident with the efforts that you and city council have exerted to today's date, and I look forward to seeing you being able to succeed in carrying out your plan to offset these, this entire situation that we find ourselves in. So, thank you, sir.

**Daniel Dorgan**

Yes, sir. Thank you.

**Judge Morrill**

Okay, now it's all just going to be fun public comment from here on out, right? We do have other individuals who had indicated that they'd like to address Commissioners' Court this morning. I have a list of two individuals. If there's more after I call these two, then just raise your hand and I'll get you up here. The first one would be Ron Klem. Hey, Mr. Klem.

**Mr. Krim**

Krim.

**Judge Morrill**

Krim. My apologies, Mr. Krim.

**Mr. Krim**

That's all right.

**Judge Morrill**

I went to high school with a guy named John Klem.

**Mr. Krim**

Oh, is that right?

**Judge Morrill**

Yeah, but it was spelled differently. Than Krim.

**Mr. Krim**

Well, if you ever run into any of mine, they're mine. They belong to me. I'm going to hand you all out a deal here of the pricing and the map and yeah, if you want to go ahead, I'm going to keep one for myself to show you. I already gave this gentleman, Mr. Farias, one. And this way I can show what we're doing. So, my name is Ron Krim. I'm from El Oso Water Supply Corporation. I'm the general manager. The gentleman with me, Buddy Kurlick, is our treasurer and director of our board. This is, I think I mentioned last time that we serve five counties with water, and water is critical. Water is life. And we have about 900 miles of pipe in the ground. That's about a drive from here to Tulsa, Oklahoma. So, we have a lot of water pipes. This particular one in your county, we're applying to the county for a grant through the county for this. About two and a half miles of pipe. The map here that shows all the pen marks on it. Those are all the leaks we've had and they are dated. Most of them are in 2025. If you all look, it's about two and a half miles of pipe, and it goes to Pawnee, Texas, and we serve a school up there. And so far, we've been very fortunate not to run out of water. We had once. We had to close the school one time because we just couldn't get there fast enough. Every time this line leaks, we lose between two and 500,000 gallons of water. Because it's rural, it's in ranch County. We get there as fast as we can. Our workers are very good. They actually know where to look and what valves to listen to, what meter to look at to see where the water is going. This is a critical line, and we want to upgrade it to an eight-inch, and we want to move it up toward Ray Point from there. Not all of it is in your county. A little bit is outside of it, but 98% of it's in your county. So, we want to apply. As you can see, the price tag for this is over \$2 million, \$2.6 million because we have a lot of gates and roads that we have to bore under, whatnot. We're going to apply for whatever we can get through the counter. We looked at a couple of grants already. Some are outstretched. We need to get a little closer date. They're out to 2027, the federal grants. So, we're looking to get it as soon as possible. If anybody has any questions, I'd be glad to answer if I can.

**Judge Morrill 49:50**

You can't. I'm sorry, Mr. Krim, but I appreciate it. I really appreciate the effort that you've taken.

**Commissioner DeWitt**

We have an agenda item. We can talk to him then.

**Judge Morrill**

Don't go anywhere. Just have a seat.

**Mr. Krim**

All right.

**Judge Morrill**

We'll pick you up at the next agenda item.

**Mr. Krim**

Yes, sir.

**Judge Morrill**

Thank you, Mr. Krim. Next individual on public comment that I have is Buddy Kerlick.

**Buddy Kerlick**

I'm with Ron.

**Judge Morrill**

Oh, okay. I'll take you off then. Is there anybody else who'd like to address? Yes, sir. Please come down.

**William Miller**

All right. So, my name is William Miller and I'm from Brownsville, Texas. Some of these names are wrong, but you can just take one and pass it down. And this is a pack, and today I'm going to be talking to you about game rooms. Exciting. There is one for everybody. One, two, three.

**Judge Morrill**

One more.

**William Miller**

One more.

**Judge Morrill**

I need one more. I mean, I don't need it.

**William Miller**

Sure, you do.

**Commissioner DeWitt**

Yes, you do. Absolutely.

### **Commissioner Linney**

One for her.

### **William Miller**

Well so, and here's some, here's, here's a business card. Well, yeah, I need that one to present. Here's some business cards. And I apologize, I just have two of these business cards. But here are my ranch cards. Here you can pass those out as well. Okay.

### **Commissioner DeWitt**

Feels awfully thick, judge.

### **William Miller**

So, believe it or not, my family is from Beeville, Texas. Okay. About 10 years ago, first off, I'm a nerd. I'm not very good at public, you know, speaking, so you guys' just kind of bear with me a little bit. But about 10 years ago, we started what's called 47 Compliant Gaming and in 10 years, because our system is completely compliant, and there is a way to play this compliantly, it's just very involved and very difficult. Governor Abbott signed into law House Bill 892 and House Bill 892 gives counties the authority to regulate game room activity, which means you can charge for it now and what people don't realize is 892, is very broad and very open. You've pretty much been given carte blanche to make as much money as you can, right? But in return for that, you need to make sure that this system is compliant. Well, what I've created is a software called 47 Red. Red stands for redemption, and that forces compliance from player to employee to owner. It's impossible to inject any kind of outside money in the system. It's impossible to be non-compliant, and it just works, and it runs well, and it's been operating for over 10 years now. And it's not that difficult. I can show you how the system works, but if you want, we can go through this little quick presentation. And in here, you're going to have three things, right? You're going to have three things to look at. The first one is a briefing called Bee County 47 Compliant Amusement Ordinance Briefing, right? And we can go over that, or I'm going to go through this so you can see it. The next thing you'll see in there is the Bee County 47 Compliant Entertainment Gaming permit application. And if you'll look at this, it's basically blank, but the 47 Red system handles all of that for the county and the Sheriff's Department. It's automatic. The work has been done. Okay. Then, of course, the third thing in here is a copy of Bee County Commissioners Court 47 compliant amusement gaming facility ordinances. Now, you guys have your ordinances in place, but I would like you to really investigate this, because this is 10 years of wisdom of and knowledge of exactly how much money this system can pay back to the county, of what it can truly afford to pay. Right? So, this isn't saying, do it, don't do it, but there's some things in there that you probably didn't realize or understand. So, executive cover letter, Lone Star Compliance Technologies LLC, respectively submits this policy briefing outlining a lawful self-funding framework for the regulation of amusement redemption facilities in Bee County. This ordinance introduces two facility framework. So, House Bill 892 and House Bill 4446, most people don't even realize that House Bill 4446 is even a thing. And both of these laws, and they're both laws, 892 was set up in 2019, it became effective. 4446 became effective in 2023. And 892 basically says you have the right to run this game as long as you're playing it compliantly. 4446 basically tells you how to do it. Okay. So, when Governor Abbott signed these things, and I promise you they're laws because of the system. I can give you a sample of right now, and there's no other reason for it. He signed these because no longer could these illegal ones operate. And people don't understand that there is a real way to operate, and a real way for counties to not only gain control of it, but to benefit from it. And the key is control, because I'm sure you've seen it right now. There are game rooms popping up here and there, and they're all playing it illegally, because they don't even

realize that there's a right way to play this game. There's a legal way to play this game, and it's very fun, and it benefits all parties. Okay. We can scroll down to the permit allocation and few future expansions on the next page. And if you'll see down there, there are three scenarios. What I'm proposing in Bee County, because I've run the numbers, is that Bee County, in 4446 you have the right to limit the number of game rooms, and I highly recommend that happens. And Bee County can handle what I believe is two, no more than two. We call them class one facilities. And that's between 200 and 400 games. And legally, they're called contrivances. Okay. And if you can see those numbers, and those are real numbers down there, I promise you that's not pie in the sky numbers. Those are real numbers that can be achieved easily. But I'll let you guys go through that at your leisure if you want. Being this is a public hearing, there's a lot of, how do I say it? There's a lot of trade secret stuff that I can't get into. A lot of programming and stuff that makes this work perfectly compliantly that I just can't divulge right here. But in person, be more than happy to show you exactly how it works and exactly where the compliance sits. And if you would like, I'd be more than happy to show you right now a copy of how the redemption system works. And really, there's two aspects of law 47 that are only applicable to this being compliant. One, you got to make sure that that game does not pay cash. If you pay cash, you violated the statute. And two, the prize that they're getting has to have a wholesale value of \$5 or less. So, those are the only two real things that the county needs to be in charge of to be compliant, and they're not difficult. And my system sets that up for you automatically, so you can play in perpetuity. Everybody can have fun. You limit the game rooms and then come back at a later date and decide, well, do we have room for expansion? Because what I believe you don't want to happen is flood this county with game rooms. Because remember, everybody's money is predicated on this being successful, right? So, having a, you know, illegal players all every place, it just, it doesn't, it doesn't help anybody, right? And anyway, that's it. If you would like to see this, I'm more than happy to show you right now.

**Judge Morrill** 58:12

I don't think we have time during public comment, Mr. Miller.

**Mr. Miller**

It's very quick.

**Judge Morrill**

But I can't tell you how much I appreciate you coming. We have your business cards, please before you leave. Well, we don't have any down here, I'm sure. I was gonna say a business card of mine, and you can contact our office. Miss Gomez is going to grab a business card of mine. Let's get together offline and discuss something in a private setting.

**William Miller**

Yeah, so I believe this is very important. Counties don't even realize, they don't even realize what the governor has signed. The difference between gambling and this, this 47 compliant gaming, if gambling comes to the state of Texas, and it probably will, right? And it probably will, I hope it does. I have racehorses, and my racehorses are tied directly to every dollar that's been on gambling. So, I'll run for more money. But if gambling comes, it's going to benefit five counties. And let me tell you exactly how it works. I've got friends that own very big casinos. The state's going to take 12.5% of what's called the hold. The hold is what these machines keep that the profits operate out of. Of that 12.5% the county, the county where this gaming sits, is going to get 3%. Let's think about that. Legalized gambling is only going to benefit five counties. That's it. It'll never come to Bee County. Promise you. It'll never come to some of these counties. 892 and 4446 give the opportunity for every single county in the state of Texas

to benefit from this and put some real revenue, as long as it's played correctly, in their pockets. I'll leave you with that.

**Judge Morrill** 59:57

**William Miller**

Thank you.

**Judge Morrill**

Is there anybody else who wishes to address Commissioners' Court? Yes, ma'am. If you please identify yourself again for the record. You may proceed.

**Molly Debor**

Thank you for letting me join y'all today. My name is Molly Debor, owner and director of Little Bud's Daycare here in town across from AC Jones. I'm here to speak on behalf of families, our workforce and local economy and the vital early childhood sector, about why Bee County should adopt the property tax exemption for qualified childcare facilities. First, let's clarify what the opportunity is. In November 2023 Texas voters approved Proposition Two, which amended the Texas Constitution by adding article eight, section 1R. That amendment provides the governing body of the county or municipality to exempt taxation on all or part of the appraised value of real property used to operate childcare facilities. The governing body may adopt the exemption as a percentage of the appraised value of the real property. The percentage may not be less than 50%. The legislature, by general law, may define childcare facilities and may provide additional eligibility requirements for the exemption authorized by this section. In effect, section 1R empowers counties and cities to decide to exempt 50% or more of the appraised value of a qualifying childcare facility. Following that constant constitutional change, the legislature passed Senate Bill 1145, effective January 2024 which added tax code section 11.36, outlining the eligibility criteria, which is the property owner or operator must run a licensed childcare facility, participate in Texas rising star, which is what the workforce dictates who gets that. They come in and make sure we're following the right standards. Going above and beyond just a regular childcare facility and meet the requirement that at least 20% of enrolled children receive the subsidized care through the Texas Workforce. Why should we do it? The why part. Why is it smart, practical and forward thinking for Bee County to adopt this? One of our region's challenges is access to quality childcare. When providers face heavy cost burdens like property taxes, building maintenance and staffing, it can reduce capacity, limit hours or force closure. By adopting this exemption, Bee County gives the meaningful incentive for providers to stay, expand, or upgrade their facilities. It helps subsidize and grow our childcare infrastructure. We know that working parents need reliable, affordable, high-quality care for their children. If childcare is too expensive or unavailable, parents may reduce their hours, leave the workforce, or commute further, all impacting the local productivity. By eating the cost burden on local childcare centers, we would help more parents work, support more local jobs, and strengthen our economy. Because the law ties eligibility to participation in Texas rising star, and serving families with subsidized care, adopting this exemption encourages providers to raise the quality, serve more children of diverse backgrounds and expand access. This means a better outcome for children and families of Bee County. By adopting this exemption, Bee County signals that we value early childhood and the infrastructure that supports our future workforce. It's an investment in our people and our community's long-term health. It also fosters public private collaboration between the providers and the local government. We'll be working together. Because the law gives the exemption as a local option, the county controls how far to go, between 50 and 100%, how to implement and what oversight to require. And because it's targeted to quality rated childcare providers, it ensures the relief goes where it yields

the most community benefit. Recently, a local, another local Texas government, moved to adopt the property tax exemption under Section 1R, tax code 11.36 in Jackson County. That's where I'm from. The local officials recognized the burden on childcare providers and adopted the exemption this year, in June. Giving tax relief directly to licensed and quality childcare centers. Their action illustrates how the option can be implemented and support providers and offer a useful model for us to follow. I printed that in the file. I just didn't make enough copies for everyone, but I can get that to everyone. In conclusion, by adopting the property tax exemption under Section 1R, the Texas tax code 1136, Bee County can make a smart move that encourages and strengthens quality childcare facilities, supports working families and local economy, demonstrates local leadership and in early childhood and an early childhood investment and offer targeted relief that aligns with eligibility and accountability. I urge the Commissioners' Court to move forward, to set the percentage and establish a process and communicate broadly to make sure that our childcare sector in Bee County is stronger, more reliable, stronger, more stable, and better able to serve our children and families.

That's the information I got from a reliable source.

**Judge Morrill 1:08:46**

Well, we have 1,411 votes. And for the folks in attendance and those that may be watching, your Bee County appraisal district is not a county entity. It's an arm of the state of Texas. If you're upset about your valuations, complain to the state. However, all taxing jurisdictions within Bee County do have a certain number of votes by which they

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can cast for the members of the Board of Directors of the Bee County appraisal district. Bee County has 1,411 votes. We can apportion them amongst various candidates. We can lump them all in one candidate. There are six nominees. Those nominees were nominated by the taxing jurisdictions earlier this month, and those nominees, of which most are the current sitting directors of the Bee County appraisal district, are King Fuller, Ernest Hurst, Jr., Michael Keeney, Paul Looney, Paul San Miguel, and Jess Staples. So, at this time, I'm going to open the floor and by that, I just mean us, not y'all, for discussion on how to apportion our 1,411 votes and hopefully we can find a coalescence, coal... ah, forget it.

**Commissioner DeWitt** 1:10:13

Judge, if you would. I know two members on there that have done a really good job. It's Mr. Looney and Mr. Staples. I think, I know we talked about not splitting our votes, but at this point in time, I'd like to move 1,000 votes to Mr. Looney and 411 to Mr. Staples. That's just on the table.

**Judge Morrill** 1:10:30

Okay. Anybody else have any other concepts, thoughts, ideas? This would be the time for us to discuss.

I don't have any feedback from some of the other board members. They moved away from Pritchard and Abbott into a new appraisal company, because your county appraisal district, and this isn't a dig against the Bee County appraisal district. It's full of fine individuals, and I'm a big fan of our chief appraiser, Deb Castaldo. I think she's done a yeoman's job and worked very, very hard under difficult circumstances, and she has the vim and vigor to stick around. Our prior, we had one for a long time, and then we had some for very short periods of time. But the long and short of it is there are only a couple of entities that actually engage in the appraisal process. One of them is Pritchard and Abbott. One of the other ones is, whoever the new company is. I just don't know it off the top of my head. Your board of directors is very important because they're making board level decisions such as, which appraisal entity your appraisal district is actually going to use, and by the way, that is the vast majority of the cost for operating the appraisal district, which is not an inconsequential amount of money that all taxing jurisdictions have to pay to support this state agency. Please. You have the floor.

**Commissioner Olivares** 1:12:43

Thank you. Thank you, Judge. I guess the question is, you know, all the votes for two individuals? I mean, should the votes be split, distributed? I'm looking for some feedback.

**Judge Morrill** 1:12:54

So, we can do whatever we want. At the end of the day, the top, I believe it's five, right?

**Commissioner DeWitt**

I think so.

**Judge Morrill**

The top five vote recipients will make up the new board. So, if a taxing jurisdiction casts no votes, well, that just increases the impact of our 1,411 votes. I've also known King for decades, and he served on this board for several years. I think he's done a good job. So, I wouldn't have any objection to apportioning some votes to him as well.

The CB COG has rejuvenated its focus on trying to assist community stakeholders in grant finding opportunities, if you would, Mr. Krim, if you would get with my office sometime today, we'll get you Ms. Martinez's telephone number so you can reach out directly to her and let her know that that I sent you or Commissioner DeWitt said you were both on the board, and she'll put you in touch with the right people. There may be some opportunities there that might fit within your metrics. I know there's also, I don't know if you've gotten with the governor's office, but sometimes that's a good way to utilize bureaucracy to find opportunities for you, even if it's not something that they directly can assist you with. They may be able to put you in touch with a resource that we're just not aware of at this time.

**Commissioner DeWitt 1:27:12**

And something I might add, our county judge is the chairman of the board. So, if we can get your foot in the door, we can do what we can to push that door open. Please contact them. Contact Ms. Martinez. She's very vivacious. She'll start looking.

**Judge Morrill 1:27:28**

Absolutely. And I believe Karnes County is part of the Alamo area COG and they're a very strong COG group as well. And I would just recommend you touch base with Judge Hedke and ask for what input he may have. And if he doesn't have any input, I know Judge Teal is real active on it, AA COG as well.

**Commissioner Farias**

So, there's a new commissioner that was put on the Texas Water Development Board that represents us up here. And I believe that Commissioner Fuentes from Hidalgo County, he's on that board, and so is Commissioner David Garza from Cameron County. That would be two good contacts to locate. He represents us all the way to Bee County.

**Ron Krim**

Very good. I'll take anything. I'll look anywhere you guys recommend.

**Judge Morrill 1:28:16**

Absolutely. And anything that we can do to assist you, we're here and we want to help. So, we want to the extent you need any type of assistance that we can provide. We're certainly here to help you. So, we're not trying to pass the buck.

**Ron Krim**

No, no. I appreciate it.

**Judge Morrill**

But you definitely have our backing. So, thank you so much, Mr. Krim.

**Ron Krim**

Yes, sir. Thank you all very much.

What I was looking at is we have an incident that happened. But no, I just want to make sure that whoever comes to rent up here, that they're aware of these things or to provide there. On the item E, insurance requirements. The general liability and the liquor liability, if they could make sure that there was an attached document to the contract.

**Commissioner Olivares** 1:29:54

So, it sounds like a process improvement there, when we do initiate the lease that we are receiving these documents.

**Judge Morrill** 1:30:01

Yeah, no, I think that's great. You know, it's very difficult. We had that issue, this issue, come up earlier this year. You know, the vast majority of our Expo rentals are for community members, and you can group them in with silver and golden anniversaries, Quinceaneras, big birthdays, other family-styled events. And it's competitive to get on our calendar. And one of the things that we see is oftentimes whether they're sophisticated entities that are looking to put on a money-generating event. Families, looking to put on a large family event, or community event, 501C threes, or aspirational 501C threes, looking to do something for the community that's good for the community. They all have a lot of shortcomings when it comes to getting all their ducks in a row. And so as far as the lease agreement goes, there is the black and white letters of the lease agreement, but there's also the practical component of the lease agreement. When we have somebody who's never done this before, a mom who's trying to put on a Quinceanera for her daughter. We try to work with them as far as the dates go and their deadlines and coming up with the money and coming up with the coverage that they need and dotting their I's and crossing their T's. But the bottom line is, there could always be, and in this case, they're although Mr. Rodriguez has done a yeoman's job, and along with Mrs. Gomez, in managing this process. There's a lot I think that we could do to assist them, to make it easier, make it easier for them to communicate to the third party seeking to rent the facility of what their obligations are, so that they don't seem surprised when we point to a provision in their contract that they signed, when they only looked at the front page and we said, "No, you do have to have security, and this is how much it's going to cost. These are your options." And all of a sudden it becomes a "We can't put the deal on anymore or it becomes a very stressful situation for them. So, I think improving this is a great idea. Have any changes been made? What I'd like to do is get a voluntary commissioners committee of two commissioners to go through this and look and see what improvements work with Wally, work with Pauletta. See what improvements could be made to the, not only the lease agreement, but the mechanism for tracking and following it and bring it back to a future Commissioners' Court meeting, because I think this is an area where we could have definite improvement. I really appreciate y'all

bringing this to our attention.

**Commissioner Farias**

I did check with Landon Guilick and Randi Schauer. And all the kids that participate in 4H programs, if they're signed up with 4H, they're covered by the state. I was kind of worried. They use our facilities all the time, so what happens if one of them falls and breaks an arm? No, they're covered.

**Judge Morrill**

Yes, sir.

**Commissioner Farias**

Even if they travel with them, as long as they're 4H, signed up with 4H, they're covered under their umbrella. I think this needs to be tightened up a little bit more.

**Judge Morrill**

Great.

**Commissioner DeWitt**

You know, whatever we do, it needs to be coordinated by the county attorney and attorney and probably community affairs because I know that Mr. Jemison has seen some things in here that need some tweaking.

**Judge Morrill 1:33:53**

Thank you for reminding me because I do know that we talked about that. I'm sorry, Mr. Jemison, but I think you'd be a great addition to this ad hoc committee as well. Are there any commissioners who'd like to volunteer for this role? Thank you all so much for your willingness to volunteer.

20. Approve installation of Safety and Security Lighting on existing poles at Saint Mary's Street, Refugio Street, 1st Street, and County Road 6002 in Skidmore-Tynan.

**Judge Morrill**

Agenda item number 15, approve installation of safety and security lighting on existing poles at St. Mary's Street, Refugio Street, First Street, and County Road 6,002 in Skidmore-Tynan. Commissioner Olivares, this is your agenda item. You have the floor, sir.

**Commissioner Olivares 1:34:57**

Thank you, Judge. Yeah, this one I've been working here for quite some time, over a year, to try and get some security lighting throughout the throughout the community, not only have I noticed some of the challenge we're having in the area because of poor lit areas, but also had many citizens volunteer fire departments and churches express the same safety concern. So, I did meet with Madam auditor earlier this year, prior to budgeting, to ensure that we had at least a few dollars to add to the budget so we could incorporate some of these. One of the big items to include here is I have an opportunity to meet with an engineer. There's actually two. There's one out of south Bee County and there's one out of Beeville. So, the engineer I met with was Mr. Raul. He and I conducted a field trip and went to each one of these locations to ensure that we would have a good proper placement with the lighting, in addition to that, to understand what cost impact would be back to the county. Fortunately, the locations that we've identified, the light fixtures, would be zero cost back to the county. The cost of the county would include basically the monthly fee for the lighting. So, similar to the other lighting we have in place. So that's the good news for us. And then all of these, you know, wouldn't require any pull, wouldn't require any transformers, basically use what's existing there. So that's very, very good for us. This is also pretty much, well, not pretty much, this is in compliance with the, I want to say that it's not really an ordinance here and to the resolution that was put together. You know, the pole is located on public right away, so we check that mark. An existing electrical pole must be available to process the light fixture and deferred costs. We meet that criteria as well. The intersections of hills and curves. Unfortunately, we don't have any big hills and curves, so that really doesn't apply, but it is, you know, there are facilities there, like the Dollar General, which is extremely dark. We have reached out to them, and for whatever reason, they're not putting up in the lights. So, I feel confident we are meeting all the requirements for these lights to go up.

**Commissioner DeWitt**

Do you have a motion, sir?

**Commissioner Olivares**

So, my motion would be to improve the safety and security for persons traveling on County Road at a cost of roughly around approximately \$12.64 per month per light, which comes up about \$75 a month.

**Commissioner DeWitt**

I'll second. How many are there total that you're putting in?

**Commissioner Olivares 1:37:50**

So total, I've identified five locations in Tynan and five locations in Skidmore. Five locations in Papalote and five in Beeville.

**Commissioner DeWitt**

So, this is twenty?

**Commissioner Olivares**

No, no. For this motion there is only these. I'll be back. I'll be back. I'll be coming back.

**Commissioner DeWitt 1:38:00**

Okay, that's why I was asking.

**Commissioner Olivares**

The only clarity I want to make around that is identify these areas. Doesn't mean that they have to go in or it doesn't mean that the county needs to spend the money, but part of the budgeting process is to ensure that they were included.

**Commissioner DeWitt**

So, this is for four?

**Commissioner Olivares**

So, currently right now this is for...

**Commissioner Farias**

1,2,3,4.

**Commissioner Olivares**

This is for six. So, I have here...

**Commissioner Linney**

St. Mary's Street, Refugio Street, First Street, and County Road 602.

**Commissioner Olivares 1:38:39**

Let me read the locations here. Okay. So, I have two lights that are going to occur on Refugio Street. I'm sorry, on St. Mary's Street.

Two on that one?

15 years. And she knows everything there is to know about these systems. She also is the one when agenda items are submitted incorrectly or incompletely, or in the case of everybody sitting at this table, at least the vast majority of us, the vast majority of the time, we just sent her an email, and she does it all for us. It is, can be incredibly time-consuming and can be incredibly frustrating, and usually that frustration is between the hours of 7 pm and 2 am on the night before we have to post the agenda. And so, in looking at, I think we're having to go through this process. But you've gone and you've looked at, we moved to Civic Plus, for purposes of our website. Is that correct?

**Candy Estrada**

Yes.

**Judge Morrill**

Not too long ago, they have a companion product that could provide agenda management services for us. You've compared the two, and you have a proposal that you submitted to Commissioners' Court that's in our agenda packet. I know the commissioners may have some questions and insight, and so I'm going to turn the floor over to you. If you'd like to give your summary as you see it in your recommendation, and then answer questions. That's great if you'd like to answer questions right off the bat, you have the floor. Thank you, Candy.

**Candy Estrada**

Okay. Granicus, we've been with them for several years, but they are currently discontinuing the current program that we're on. So, that end of life is going to be the end of this year. So that's why we started looking around for another agenda management program. So, we looked at Civic Plus, and I reviewed it. Cyndi reviewed it with me, went over with it with Pauletta. And we also looked at Granicus' product and Civic Plus is just a lot more user friendly. It's cheaper, and they offer more services at a cheaper price. So, I also had several people go back and look over at their website that constituents go on and look at just to see how user friendly it was and they seem to like Civic Plus more. So, I think it's a, for me, I like it, it looks better, and it works better. Like their website, I was able to train myself to go on there and use it. It's just very user friendly. So, looking at their product, when they were showing it to us, it looks a lot easier than what we currently have. So, I think it'd be best to go with them.

**Commissioner Farias**

Do we already include this in our budget?

**Judge Morrill**

We pay for Granicus.

**Candy Estrada**

I know we talked about it at the beginning of the year.

**April Cantu**

I mean, we have already paid for an annual cost for the current system, which we pay about, what, 800 I think it's 800 a month that we pay for the Granicus product. They're being discontinued. It looks, I mean, because totaling the startup is what would be put out prior. And we do have sufficient professional service funds to be able to absorb that.

**Commissioner DeWitt 1:46:35**

I had a hard time following the dollars. I saw 30,000 here and 20,000 there.

**April Cantu 1:46:40**

So, if you see this gray area, commissioner, the one that says the Civic Plus.

**Judge Morrill**

For us it's green. Fancy.

**April Cantu**

Yes, well, I'm glad ours is gray. Total investment startup cost.

**Commissioner DeWitt 1:46:53**

I know we just got to say we're spending 800 a month, but now we're talking about 22865.

**Judge Morrill**

So, first of all, we're spending 800 a month on a program that's going to be discontinued starting January 1st. So now the option is, this is the new Granicus project, and this is Civic Plus.

**Commissioner DeWitt**

Oh, okay. Okay.

**Judge Morrill**

So, this is the cost for Civic Plus, the cost for Granicus, and that's the difference. Just showing that Granicus is more expensive across the board.

**Commissioner DeWitt 1:47:23**

Is there another, any other products out there and has IT been involved?

**Judge Morrill**

Candy?

**Commissioner DeWitt**

Is there any other product out there and has IT been involved? What's their recommendation?

**Craig Oliver 1:47:39**

Good morning, gentlemen. Craig Oliver, IT director. Yes, we have been involved. Me and Candy went over this last year. It was not a good time to take that project on at the time because of other pressing items during the time to get that started. And not only that, but Granicus was also extending it to the end of this year. So that gave us a little bit of time to release a little bit of pressure for Candy. We did look at other products. The Granicus product that she was looking at to continue, she didn't like because it was not as user friendly navigation. It is still a client platform, which means we have to have a piece of software that everyone that logs into it has to use. As to where with Civic Plus, it's all web based, much like our email and everything else, you just go to a website and sign in credentials match you get to do what you need to do and handle it that way. It also integrates with our new platform that we went to on our website, which keeps us compliant. That was one of my big issues. Is Civic Plus helping us stay compliant legally? So, this helps with our agenda meetings. I guess we do Robert's rules and things. It also integrates in with the minutes for the county clerk to be able to keep up with that, both streaming audio and stuff, to have that available as well. So, overall, the price to me looked like Civic Plus was coming in less than what we looked at, and they were, like she said, they were offering additional services that keeps us up to date. And on your comment about, you know, 1 o'clock in the morning, yes, this last agenda I did receive an email from Candy at 1 am. And I say this only because during these times with the current platform and moving forward with Granicus, when they have an update to their client program, she has to get us involved because of the installation of the software. You know, that's one of our policies, our security policies. So, we have to remote into wherever she's at, update the program, and then she's able to go ahead and complete what she needs to do. So, this alleviates a lot of that, because it's all server side, without having a client.

**Commissioner Olivares 1:50:08**

Judge, I've had an opportunity to sit down with Candy and review the current program. It's a little bit clunky; it's a little bit challenging to get into. It's not very user friendly. So, anything above that would be a plus back to the county and to the commissioners that actually log into that account or search for details. So, I think this is a plus.

**Craig Oliver 1:50:28**

One last thing, Civic Plus was going to give us a discount on the product as well, because we do, we now have multiple products for them. We have their social archiving, which archives all of our social media accounts, our web hosting, and then now bringing this on would also be bundled into a group platform.

**Commissioner DeWitt**

So how quickly can we get this done?

**Craig Oliver** 1:50:51

That would be on Civic Plus. There is an on-boarding process that it does take, if we can get it signed and over to them, I think...

**Candy Estrada**

We're looking at 12 weeks.

**Commissioner DeWitt**

Ah.

**Commissioner Olivares**

That's not bad

**Commissioner DeWitt**

Move to approve.

**Commissioner Olivares**

I'll second.

**Commissioner DeWitt**

Let's cut to the chase.

**Judge Morrill**

You stole Commissioner Olivares' motion. And all three of y'all seconded it at exactly the same time. So, we have a motion and a second. There's further discussion? Yeah, go ahead, Candy.

**Candy Estrada**

There's one which is just the regular Civic Plus product, just the agenda management program. And then there's the other one which we're adding the Civic Plus media, video streaming and on demand. ## Proposal for Pettus Community Center Enhancements

Presented By: Pettus Environmental Restoration (Nonprofit)

Regarding Agenda Item #13: While the item is worded as a donation “given to” the Pettus Community Center, we would like to clarify for the record that this is a private donation specifically dedicated to the beautification, safety, maintenance, and the Pettus Fire Department to ensure full transparency and accountability, there will be no monetary fund’s given directly to the County or the facility; all funds remain within our nonprofit account and will be managed directly by our board to pay for the improvements.

Our goal is simple: to restore the pride of this building and ensure it remains a safe, modern, and welcoming space for all residents of Pettus, the Pettus/Tuleta Fire Department, which is housed in the same building, and the Judge and county employees who also utilize this facility.

- ❖ **Community Driven Investment:** This project is 100% funded by a private donor via Pettus Environmental Restoration. There is no cost to the County taxpayers.
- ❖ **Preserving County Assets:** The Community Center serves us well; we are ever so grateful to have a community space that helps so many people and entities. Several areas now require attention to prevent further deterioration and protect the County’s long-term investment.
- ❖ **Efficiency and Safety:** By upgrading to Modern LED lighting and fixing water damaged areas, we are improving the buildings safety, energy efficiency, and overall environment.

- ❖ **Direct Management:** As noted, our nonprofit maintains control of our funds and the procurement process, ensuring the project is completed to the donor specifications and the board's approval.

### **Proposed Scope of Work (Priority Order)**

**Project Manager: Oscar Sanchez Jr.**

We have identified an array of improvements, beginning with the most critical structural need:

- **Roof Repair & Restoration:** Addressing current leaks to ensure the building is watertight. This is our priority to protect all subsequent interior investments.
- **Exterior Revitalization:** Full power washing of the entire exterior.
- **Repainting the County side** in professional, neutral colors.
- **Repainting the Fire Department side** to match updated aesthetic.
- **Interior Flooring:** Professional resurfacing of all current floors. These floors have served for 15-20 years plus and are currently heavily stained; resurfacing will restore their original clean finish.
- **Ceiling and Lighting:** Replacement of all water-stained ceiling tiles throughout the building once the roof is secure.
- **Instillation of new, energy-efficient LED lighting fixtures.**
- **Possible Restroom Upgrades:** Installation of new, modern fixtures in the current bathrooms to improve hygiene and appearance. (if in our budget after priority work is complete)

The Roof & Records Inquiry:

We are aware that the roof continues to leak, despite a section being redone sometime between 2015-2019 (still awaiting information on that Inquiry). To ensure our interior upgrades (like ceiling tiles and lighting) are protected, we have a quote from a bonded, licensed roofing company that is extremely fair. We hope to collaborate with the County to ensure the roof is sound before we begin the affected interior finishing.

- ✓ **Final Contingency & Next Steps**

Our board is committed to the betterment of Pettus. However, we must respect our donor’s intent and our board’s approved projects.

- ✓ **Fund Control:** All donated funds shall remain in the Pettus Environmental Restoration account under the control of our Board.
- ✓ **Contingency:** Should the court vote against any of these specific upgrades, our nonprofit will respectfully refocus those funds toward other board-approved projects that positively impact the Pettus community and environmental restoration.

We ask for your approval today to move forward with these enhancements so we can begin restoring this vital community facility.

We respectfully request continued funding in the same amount awarded last year to further enhance the 156th Judicial District Attorney's Office through critical office furniture upgrades. The prior award allowed us to purchase a conference room table and chairs and to fully update one attorney's office. These improvements have had an immediate and positive impact by creating a more professional, functional, and welcoming environment for victims, their families, and the public we serve. While this initial funding addressed some urgent needs, much of the office remains inadequately furnished. We are now seeking support to continue this effort by purchasing ergonomic office chairs for prosecutors and staff. Many employees are currently using outdated or insufficient seating, which affects daily productivity, comfort, and long-term health in a high-demand work environment. Providing appropriate office furniture is essential to maintaining a safe, secure, and efficient workplace where staff can collaborate effectively with law enforcement and meet privately with victims and their families. These upgrades will allow us to fully utilize our renovated office space, improve operational efficiency, and better support our mission of prosecuting felony offenses amid an increasing caseload. Continued investment in our office infrastructure will build upon the success of last year's award and directly support public safety, employee well-being, and the fair administration of justice.



## Affordable Care Act Reporting and Tracking Service (ARTS) Renewal Information

The Texas Association of Counties Health and Employee Benefits Pool (TAC HEBP) has begun the renewal process for those counties and districts participating in the Affordable Care Act Reporting and Tracking Service (ARTS). Renewal will enable your entity to produce the forms required by IRS Sections 6055/6056 for calendar year 2026, assuming this reporting continues to be a requirement. Reporting will consist of Form 1095C in electronic format, which must be made available to employees and filed with the IRS (plus transmittal Form 1094C, filed with IRS). Current law requires all employers with 50 or more full-time equivalent employees to file these forms. ARTS will provide measurement period tracking for 2026 and beyond (to determine whether an employee must be offered health coverage), as well as affordability testing for groups that require employee contributions toward the cost of their own health coverage.

**As your county or district provides health benefits through TAC HEBP, ARTS will continue to be available at NO COST in 2026, assuming program deadlines are met.**

Your entity will need to continue sending employee, payroll, and unpaid leave of absence files to TAC HEBP in order to utilize this service for the 2026 reports. **Payroll data must be provided for each payroll cycle. Employee files must be provided, at a minimum, once per quarter. LOA files may be provided if and when applicable.** The information provided will be used to determine:

- 1) whether individuals are eligible for a federal premium subsidy or tax credit; and
- 2) whether your entity is subject to penalties under the ACA employer mandate.

Some payroll vendors have worked with TAC to produce these files for you. You will be responsible for the completion of required information in your payroll system and submission to TAC, but this eliminates the need for manually producing additional spreadsheets.

If you use a payroll system that will produce the required IRS forms, and you determine that your entity does not need measurement period tracking or affordability monitoring, you may not need ARTS. It is a service offered by TAC and is completely optional.

- 2) Group agrees to pay program fees as described in the **2026 ARTS Fee Schedule** on page 2.

### Enrollment and Data Submission Deadlines

- Groups who wish to participate in the ARTS program must return the signed documents to TAC HEBP no later than **March 31, 2026** in order to participate.
