3/19/22

- 4:30 am: Violent Crime Unit (VCU) Attorney: Instructs Reporting Police Officer (PO): Submit Application before 1 pm. The case is likely Exhibiting, not Robbery (or Attempted Robbery). Requests all Body-worn Camera (BWC) and In-Car Camera (ICC) footage.
- 9:30 am: prosecutor texts Reporting PO and reminds Reporting PO of the 1 pm deadline. Reporting PO confirms the application will be submitted before 1 pm.
- 3:12 pm: VCU Attorney receives warrant application for Robbery 1 (2x), Armed Criminal Action (ACA) (2x), and Felony Resisting Arrest. No BWC/ICC or video included.
- 5:00 pm: VCU Atty reviews warrant application. Speaks with two Sr. Assistant Circuit Attorneys, confirm charge analysis.
- 6:30 pm: Again, VCU Atty speaks with Reporting PO Robbery/ACA charges are not issuable. Exhibiting may be issuable. VCU Atty requests Reporting PO reapply on an exhibiting charge, Sunday (20th) before the 1 pm deadline.
- 8:00 pm: VCU Atty sends Reporting PO Refused (RFPF) warrant supp. A separate email to Reporting PO to reapply on a single count of Exhibiting. Received after 1 pm.
- <u>3/21/22</u> around 8 am: prosecutor begins reviewing exhibiting case. Prosecutor calls POs 1 & 2, getting statements from both officers. Prosecutor again requests (through follow-up request) all BWC/ICC from Reporting PO, as no video had yet been provided.
- 3/22/22 around 9:30 am: prosecutor meets with Reporting PO and requests video from several specific video cameras on the campus of a local business. Reporting PO states he will seek and provide copies.
- <u>3/24/22</u> around 8:30 am: VCU Atty issues one count of exhibiting against the suspect based on statements from PO's 1 & 2, partial BWC, and Officer IDs. Most BWC/ICC and local business security camera footage remained outstanding.
- 3/25/22 around 8:30 am: VCU Atty meets w/ Reporting PO, inquiring about the status of the local business security camera footage. Reporting PO informs VCU Atty he has not made contact with the local business but will try again.
- <u>3/25/22</u> around 11 am: CAO Investigator contacts local business security, requesting any surveillance footage of the incident.
- <u>3/25/22</u> around 12:30 pm: Local business provides copies of footage from security cameras capturing the incident.

• <u>3/25/22</u> around 3 pm: In a phone call with CAO attorneys, the Local business's security manager states no officer has contacted them regarding surveillance.
