
**ORDER AND JUDGMENT**


1. On February 9, 2022, the Court called the case of State of Missouri v. Timothy Alan Walker. This cause was scheduled for a two-day judge tried case.
2. The parties announced ready and the State, after opening statement, presented its case. The State then rested.
3. The Defendant, after opening statement, presented their case and rested.
4. Both the State and Defendant presented closing arguments.
5. The Court heard testimony from the widow of the decedent, post-mortem physician and forensic toxicologist, several Missouri State Highway investigators, to include an accident reconstructionist, as well as the Defendant and his witnesses.
6. The evidence presented also included a myriad of photographs.
7. The Court, after hearing all of the testimony and viewing the evidence makes the following findings:  
This Court did not find Defendants testimony credible at all and his testimony was not supported by any of the State's evidence and testimony of its witnesses.

Therefore, this Court finds the Defendant, Timothy Alan Walker, **GUILTY** of Count I, Assault in the 1<sup>st</sup> Degree, and Count II, Armed Criminal Action, beyond a reasonable doubt.
