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"Critical Incident" shall mean an incident involving the use of force by a Covered
Officer while on or off duty, in which one or more of the following occurs: (1) a Covered
Officer intentionally discharges a firearm which results in death or grave bodily injury to
a person; (2) a Covered Officer unintentionally or negligently discharges a firearm
resulting in death or grave bodily injury to a person; (3) the death of a person occurring
while said person is in the custody or control of a Covered Officer, including deaths
occurring following a person's arrest or while in detention; (4) the death of a person
occurring while said person is being pursued by a Covered Officer whether such pursuit is
on foot, in a vehicle, or other means of pursuit; or (5) a use of force by a Covered Officer
resulting in the death or grave bodily injury to the person who is the subject of said use of
force.
"Firearm" shall mean a device designed to be used as a weapon from which a

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"Grave Bodily Injury" shall mean significant or substantial physical injury to a person.

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SECTION TWO. INDEPENDENT INVESTIGATIONS UNIT

The Circuit Attorney may, in his or her discretion and in accordance with the provisions of this ordinance, establish an Independent Investigations Unit ("IIU") for the purpose of investigating possible criminal conduct by Covered Officers arising from or in relation to their involvement in a critical incident.

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SECTION THREE. IIU AUTHORITY

The IIU may, at the discretion of the Circuit Attorney, assume primary responsibility from the City of St. Louis Division of Police for the investigation of possible criminal conduct by Covered Officers arising from or in relation to their involvement in a critical incident.

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The Circuit Attorney shall have the authority to act to take control of any investigation or pending investigation by the City of St. Louis Division of Police of possible criminal conduct by Covered Officers arising from or in relation to their involvement in a Critical Incident, subject to the provisions of this ordinance and in accordance with the written procedures set forth in the Investigative Protocol to be established pursuant to Section Four. Such authority shall include the authority to control the scene of a Critical Incident and to direct officers of the City of St. Louis Division of Police at the scene to collect evidence and information related to the Critical Incident or that may be pertinent or of assistance to the investigation of a Critical Incident.

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Where the Circuit Attorney exercises his or her discretion and directs the IIU to assume responsibility from the City of St. Louis Division of Police for an investigation of possible criminal conduct by Covered Officers arising from or in relation to their involvement in a Critical Incident the Circuit Attorney may, in his or her discretion, act to suspend any and all internal or administrative investigations, whether pending or then in progress, of the Critical Incident by the City of St. Louis Division of Police until such time as the IIU has completed its investigation, subject to the provisions of this ordinance and in accordance with the written procedures set forth in the Investigative Protocol to be established pursuant to Section Four.

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SECTION FOUR. INVESTIGATIVE PROTOCOL

The Circuit Attorney, upon his or her determination to establish an IIU, shall provide written notice of said determination to the Mayor, the Board of Aldermen, and the Commissioner of the City of St. Louis Division of Police. Within thirty (30) days following receipt of notice of the Circuit Attorney's determination to establish an IIU, the Circuit Attorney and the Commissioner of the City of St. Louis Division of Police or their designees shall meet in good faith to develop mutually agreed upon written protocols, the Investigative Protocol', to govern how the Circuit Attorney, IIU, and the City of St. Louis

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4	The Circuit Attorney and Commissioner of the City of St. Louis Division of Police
5	shall submit copies of the agreed upon Investigative Protocol to the Mayor and Board of

	The ordinance would result in an increase in the Office of the Circuit Attorney's Office's budget equal to 1% of the annual budget of the City of St. Louis Division of Police. The fiscal year 2017 budget for the Police Department is \$161,529,480 and \$162,410,240 for fiscal year 2018. The increased funding for the Independent Investigations Unit would equal \$1,615,295 based on the Police Department's fiscal year 2017 fiscal year budget and \$1,624,102 based on the 2018 fiscal year budget. A special fund entitled "Independent Investigations Unit Fund" would be established to hold the funds used to pay the operational cost of the new unit. At the end of each fiscal year any unused portion of an annual allocation to the Independent Investigations Unit Fund would not be carried forward to the next fiscal year's allocation. Rather, each annual allocation to the Independent Investigations Unit Fund shall equal the amount prescribed in this ordinance.

	The only annual operating cost associated with this ordinance is the cost of compensation and office equipment for the employees of the new Independent Investigations Unit within the Office of the Circuit Attorney's Office. The Circuit Attorney's Office projects it will staff the new Independent Investigations Unit with 4 prosecutors, 5 special trained investigators and 2 support staff employees.
