COMES NOW the undersigned Affiant, a peace officer under the laws of the State of Texas, after having been duly sworn on oath, deposes and says that I have good reason to believe and do believe that COLTON LEE CARTER committed the offense of DEL CS/MARIJ TO MINOR as charged in the complaint to which this Affidavit is attached and that my belief in the foregoing is based on the following information.

I, MARC WALLER, AM A CERTIFIED PEACE OFFICER FOR THE STATE OF TEXAS CURRENTLY EMPLOYED WITH THE TEMPLE PD, BELL COUNTY, TEXAS. PURSUANT TO MY DUTIES, I'VE BEEN ASSIGNED TO AN INVESTIGATION INTO A REPORT OF DEL CS/MARIJ TO MINOR IN WHICH THE SUSPECT IS COLTON LEE CARTER. PURSUANT TO THIS INVESTIGATION I HAVE REVIEWED ALL OFFENSE REPORTS AND WITNESS STATEMENTS MADE IN CONNECTION WITH THIS INVESTIGATION.

I WOULD ADVISE THAT ON MAY 06, 2026, Officers with the Temple Police Department were dispatched 1305 Paseo Del Oro, Temple, Bell County, Texas, in reference to a gunshot victim. When they arrived, they located a deceased male at the residence.

As Detectives began investigating, they learned of a possible suspect in the case who they believed to be residing in an adjacent town. Detectives went to the address they had for the possible suspect and began to follow the vehicle until Detective H. Enriquez obtained probable cause to stop the car. Detective H. Enriquez informed Officer J. Nash that he had observed the suspect vehicle failed to signal its intent to turn 100 feet prior to turning. As the suspect vehicle entered the city limits of Temple, Officer J. Nash, working uniformed patrol stopped the car and identified the driver as Colton Carter with a juvenile female as the passenger. Both were detained for further investigation related to the homicide.

Before placing the juvenile female in the back of his patrol car for the detention, Officer Nash removed two cell phones and a commercially produced vape pen from the juvenile's pockets. Officer Nash learned from the juvenile that Carter had given the juvenile the vape pen prior to the traffic stop.

A further review of the vape pen shows that it may have been imported from California as it contained various California warning labels such as "85% to 90% THC."

Through my training and experience as a Texas Peace Officer, I know THC to mean tetrahydrocannabinol. This substance will be submitted to the Texas Department of Public Safety Crime Lab for forensic analysis.

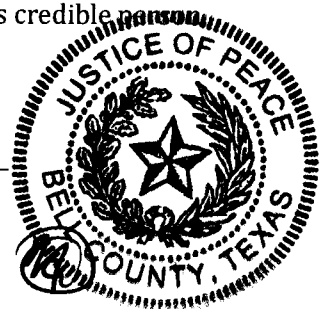
WHEREFORE, PREMISES CONSIDERED, YOUR AFFIANT REQUESTS THAT A WARRANT

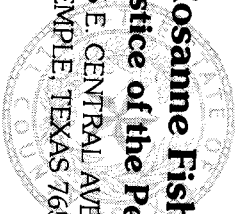
