Gov.-elect Earl K. Long missed by less than 1,000 votes defeating a constitutional amendment requiring two-thirds legislative approval for new taxes, official returns showed yesterday.

Gov. Kennon announced the official results of the April 17 general clection and Secretary of State Wade O. Martin Jr. promulgated returns.

Long, other state officials, legislators and local officials formally were elected in the balloting.
