

# Louisiana corrections housing data from 2016

Corrections officials say the number of offenders in Extended Lockdown has decreased by about 400 since the closure of Camp J at Angola

<b>Extended Lockdown:</b> Disciplinary housing, single-person cells like at Camp J	<b>1,319</b>
<b>Working Cell Block:</b> Segregated cell housing where offenders do leave daily for work	<b>1,008</b>
<b>Other Maximum Security:</b> Segregated for a variety of reasons, often for administrative purposes	<b>456</b>
<b>Protective Custody:</b> Segregated housing for offenders determined to need special protection	<b>170</b>
<b>Death Row:</b> Highest security single-person cells	<b>76</b>
<b>Closed Cell Restriction:</b> Non-punitive housing for offenders determined to need segregated housing	<b>39</b>
<b>Treatment segregation:</b> Under order of medical professional	<b>35</b>
