HOUSE BILL NO. 160 BY REPRESENTATIVE HILFERTY AN ACT

To amend and reenact Children's Code Articles 412(G), 811.1(A)(5) and (10) (introductory paragraph) and (F), and 811.3, to enact Children's Code Article 879(D) and (E), and to repeal Children's Code Article 811.1(G), relative to juvenile crime victims; to provide with respect to the rights of victims; to provide relative to definitions; to amend provisions relative to the confidentiality of delinquency proceedings; to provide relative to the exclusion of witnesses; and to provide for related matters.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:

Section 1. Children's Code Articles 412(G), 811.1(A)(5) and (10)(introductory paragraph) and (F), and 811.3 are hereby amended and reenacted and Children's Code Articles 879(D) and (E) are hereby enacted to read as follows: Art. 412. Confidentiality of records; disclosure exceptions; sanctions

G.(1) In accordance with Articles 811.1 and 811.3, the district attorney or court may shall, upon request, release to the victim of a delinquent act constituting a crime of violence as defined in R.S. 14:2(B), or to the victim's legal representative or designated family member:

 (\underline{H}) (a) The results of adjudication and disposition hearings.

(2) (b) Notice of the taking into custody, release pursuant to Chapter 6 of Title VIII of this Code, release due to a rejection of charges by the district attorney, escape, or re-apprehension of the child accused of the crime of violence against the victim.

(3) (c) Advance notice of court proceedings relating to the delinquent act. (4)(d) Certain information contained in the predisposition report to the court pursuant to Article 890, limited to those items described in Subparagraph (2) of that Article.

(e) The name of the judge presiding over the adjudication and disposition hearings.

(f) The offense which forms the basis for adjudication.

(g) The name of the accused.

(2) In a juvenile delinquency case involving a crime of violence as defined in R.S. 14:2(B), the court shall, upon written request, release to the public the following:

(a) The nonidentifying results of adjudication and disposition hearings.

(b) The name of the judge presiding over the adjudication and disposition hearings

(c) The offense which forms the basis for adjudication.

Art. 811.1. Rights of the victim of alleged delinquent act

A. The juvenile court, district attorneys, and law enforcement agencies shall provide the following services to victims of alleged delinquent acts, providing the victim reported the act to law enforcement authorities within seventy-two hours of its occurrence or discovery, unless extenuating circumstances exist for later reporting: * * *

(5) The court should provide, whenever possible, a secure waiting area during court proceedings that does not require victims and their legal representatives to be in close proximity to accused children and their families and friends. The juvenile court shall provide a secure waiting area in cases involving violent crime. The victim, or the designated member of the victim's family in a case involving homicide or injury to a minor, shall have the right to be present at all court proceedings and, whenever practical, be allowed to observe the proceedings by simultaneous transmission through audiovisual equipment, if such technology is available in the courtroom.

(10) If requested, The district attorney shall, whenever practical, consult the victim of a violent felony-grade offense and or the designated member of the victim's family in the case of homicide or injury to a minor shall be consulted by the prosecutor in order to obtain their view regarding:

F. Any information about the status of the case in juvenile court which is received by the victim or his legal representative shall remain subject to the confidentiality restrictions of Article 412 and shall not be further disclosed by him.

G.(1) In order to protect the identity and provide for the safety and welfare of juvenile crime victims under the age of seventeen <u>eighteen</u> years, all public officials and officers and public agencies, including but not limited

to all law enforcement agencies, sheriffs, district attorneys, judicial officers, clerks of court, and the Department of Children and Family Services or any division thereof, shall not publicly disclose the name, address, or identity of a juvenile victim of crime who at the time of the commission of the offense is under seventeen <u>eighteen</u> years of age. The public disclosure of the name of the juvenile crime victim by any public official or officer or public agency is not prohibited by this Subparagraph when the crime resulted in the death of the victim.

(2) Notwithstanding any other provision of law to the contrary, all public officials, officers, and public agencies, including but not limited to all law enforcement agencies, sheriffs, district attorneys, judicial officers, clerks of court, and the Department of Children and Family Services or any division thereof, charged with the responsibility of knowing the name, address and identity of juvenile crime victims as a necessary part of their duties shall have full and complete access to this information regarding a juvenile crime victim and they may lawfully utilize initials, abbreviations, or other forms of indefinite descriptions on all public documents used in the performance of their duties to whatever extent they deem necessary, to prevent the public disclosure of the name, address, or identity of a juvenile victim of crime under the age of seventeen eighteen years.

Art. 811.3. Definitions

In this Chapter: (1) "Juvenile crime victim" means a person, under the age of seventeen eighteen, against whom an offense against the person that is a felony a delinquent act has been committed.

(2) "Victim" means a person against whom an offense that is a felony-grade (2) victum means a person against a second delinquent act has been committed.
(3) "Victim's family" means a spouse, parent, child, stepchild, sibling,

the spouse, child, stepchild, sibling, parent, grandparent, guardian, legal custodian, or legal representative of the victim, except when the person is in custody for an offense or is the defendant.

Art. 879. Presence at adjudication hearing; exclusion of witnesses

D. This Article does not authorize exclusion of any of the following witnesses:

(1) A party who is a natural person.

(2) A single officer or single employee of a party which is not a natural person designated as its representative or case agent by its attorney.

(3) A person whose presence is shown by a party to be essential to the presentation of his cause such as an expert.

(4) The victim of the offense or the family of the victim.

Е A court may impose appropriate sanctions for violations of its exclusion order including contempt, or when such sanctions are insufficient, disqualification of the witness. Section 2. Children's Code Article 811.1(G) is hereby repealed in its entirety.

Section 3. This Act shall become effective on January 1, 2024.

HOUSE BILL NO. 406 BY REPRESENTATIVE MINCEY

AN ACT

To amend and reenact the heading of Part IV of Chapter 3 of Title 32 of the Louisiana Revised Statutes of 1950 and to enact R.S. 32:481, relative to interstate flooding mitigation; to require the Department of Transportation and Development to develop flood mitigation methods for possible implementation along the Interstate 12 corridor in Livingston Parish; to require a report to include an analysis of practical and cost-effective engineering methods used by other states including Texas, projected costs associated with the methods, and projected construction timelines; to require submission of a report detailing the comparative analysis of methods; to provide an effective date; and to provide for related matters. Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:

Section 1. The heading of Part IV of Chapter 3 of Title 32 of the Louisiana Revised Statutes of 1950 is hereby amended and reenacted and R.S. 32:481 is hereby enacted to read as follows:

PART IV. PASSING SCHOOL VEHICLES INTERSTATE FLOODING MITIGATION

<u>\$481. Comprehensive engineering comparative analysis of flood mitigation</u> methods; Livingston Parish

A. The department shall develop a comparable cost analysis of engineering methods to improve water drainage issues resulting from impediments to the natural water flow, on the Interstate 12 corridor in Livingston Parish along existing median walls which may additionally or alternatively include potential engineering solutions as well as retrofitting the existing median walls to improve the natural water flow along the Interstate 12 corridor.B. The comparable analysis of potential engineering solutions shall include the following:

(1) Practical and cost-effective engineering methods and potential solutions

used by other states including but not limited to Texas.

(2) Projected costs associated with the potential solutions.

(3) Projected construction timelines for the potential solutions of the methods used.

C. The department shall provide a report of the comparative analysis of potential solutions including those used by other states and methods necessary for implementation to the House Committee on Transportation, like work of the state of the formation of the state Highways and Public Works and the Senate Committee on Transportation, Highways and Public Works, not later than October 1, 2023.

Section 2. This Act shall become effective upon signature by the governor or, if not signed by the governor, upon expiration of the time for bills to become law without signature by the governor, as provided by Article III, Section 18 of the Constitution of Louisiana. If vetoed by the governor and subsequently approved by the legislature, this Act shall become effective on the day following such approval.

HOUSE BILL NO. 428 BY REPRESENTATIVE PRESSLY

AN ACT To amend and reenact R.S. 47:287.732.2(A)(3) and to enact R.S. 47:203(C), 287.732.2(A)(4)(c) and (d) and (G), 300.6(B)(2)(e), and 300.7(C)(2)(d), relative to state income tax; to provide relative to computation of income of estates, trusts, and partnerships subject to state income tax; to provide relative to income derived from flow-through entities; to provide for an exclusion of such income from the taxable income of estates, trusts, and partnerships subject to certain conditions; to provide for requirements and limitations associated with the exclusion; to provide for applicability; to provide for prospective termination of the election; and to provide for related matters.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana: Section 1. R.S. 47:287.732.2(A)(3) is hereby amended and reenacted and R.S. 47:203(C), 287.732.2(A)(4)(c) and (d) and (G), 300.6(B)(2)(e), and 300.7(C)(2)(d) are hereby enacted to read as follows:

§203. Partnership computations

* * *

C.(1) In computing the taxable income of a partnership, the partnership shall exclude net income or losses received from an entity of which the partnership is a shareholder, partner, or member if the entity properly filed a Louisiana corporation income tax return pursuant to R.S. 47:287.732.2 which included the net income or loss. However, no such exclusion shall be allowed for any amount attributable to income that, for any reason, will not bear the tax due pursuant to R.S. 47:287.732.2.

(2)(a) A partnership whose federal income tax return is adjusted due to S corporation or partnership income or losses for which the partnership used the exclusion provided in Paragraph (1) of this Subsection shall furnish a statement to the secretary disclosing the nature and amounts of such adjustments within sixty days after the federal adjustments have been made and accepted by the partnership. However, if the partnership does not receive a statement of the federal adjustments until after it accepts the adjustments, it shall have sixty days from the receipt of such statement within which to furnish the required statement to the secretary.

(b) For purposes of Subparagraph (a) of this Paragraph, paying the federal tax shown due or signing a consent to immediate assessment shall constitute an acceptance of the federal adjustments.

§287.732.2. Election for S corporations and other flow-through entities Α

(3) The election shall be effective for the taxable year of the entity for which it is made and for all succeeding taxable years of the entity, until the election is terminated by the secretary <u>or an application for prospective termination</u> of the election is effective.

(4)(a)

(c) An application for prospective termination of the election shall be effective automatically for the subsequent taxable year upon completion of the following:

(i) The shareholders, partners, or members holding more than one-half of the ownership interest in the entity consent, in writing and maintained in the entity's records, to the application for prospective termination.

(ii) The entity timely submits the application for prospective termination to the secretary, in a manner as prescribed by the secretary, no later than November first prior to the close of the taxable year for calendar year filers or sixty days prior to the close of the taxable year for fiscal year filers.

(d) Upon the entity's completion of Items (c)(i) and (ii) of this Paragraph and the automatic effectiveness of the election's termination, no election otherwise allowed by this Section shall apply for thesucceeding five taxable years of the entity or its successor. * * *

G. The secretary may promulgate rules necessary for administering

the provisions of this Section in accordance with the provisions of the Administrative Procedure Act. * * *

§300.6. Louisiana taxable income of resident estate or trust

B. Modification. For purposes of this Section, federal taxable income shall be modified by adding or subtracting the items set forth below:

(2) There shall be subtracted from federal taxable income, unless already excluded therefrom: * * *

(e)(i) Net income or losses received from an entity of which the estate or trust is a shareholder, partner, or member if the entity properly filed a Louisiana corporation income tax return pursuant to R.S. 47:287.732.2 which included the net income or loss. However, no such exclusion shall be allowed for any amount attributable to income that, for any reason, will not bear the tax due pursuant to R.S. 47:287.732.2.

(ii)(aa) An estate or trust whose federal income tax return is adjusted due to S corporation or partnership income or losses for which the estate or trust used the exclusion provided in Item (i) of this Subparagraph shall furnish a statement to the secretary disclosing the nature and amounts of such adjustments within sixty days after the federal adjustments have been made and accepted by the estate or trust. To amend and reenact R.S. 44:4.1(B)(31) and R.S. 46:1807(A) and to enact R.S. 46:1807(B)(8) and Chapter 21-A of Title 46 of the Louisiana Revised Statutes of 1950, to be comprised of R.S. 46:1823 through 1838, relative to victims of vehicular homicide; to provide relative to the powers and duties of the Crime Victims Reparations Board; to provide exceptions to public record requirements for certain information submitted to the board; to authorize the board to take actions and perform duties necessary relative to victims of vehicular homicide; to create the Victims of Vehicular Homicide Fund; to provide relative to the payment of reparations for loss for death resulting from vehicular homicide; to provide relative to applications for reparations; to provide relative to the criteria for the payment of reparations; to provide relative to sources of money in the fund; to provide relative to termination; to provide relative to the amount of the reparations award; to provide relative to reports; to provide relative to limited liability of the state; to provide for definitions; and to provide for related matters.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:

Section 1. R.S. 44:4.1(B)(31) is hereby amended and reenacted to read as follows:

B. The legislature further recognizes that there exist exceptions, exemptions, and limitations to the laws pertaining to public records throughout the revised statutes and codes of this state. Therefore, the following exceptions, exemptions, and limitations are hereby continued in effect by incorporation into this Chapter by citation: * * *

Section 2. R.S. 46:1807(A) is hereby amended and reenacted and R.S. 46:1807(B)(8) and Chapter 21-A of Title 46 of the Louisiana Revised Statutes of 1950, comprised of R.S. 46:1823 through 1838, is hereby enacted to read as follows

§1807. Powers and duties of board; staff

A. The board shall administer the provisions of this Chapter and Chapter 21-A of this Title and shall be responsible, in accordance with this Chapter and Chapter 21-A of this Title, for determining all matters pertaining to applications for reparations, investigations, and determinations based upon its findings, the granting or rejecting of claims, and fixing the amounts of such grants or payments and the methods of their payment.

B. In the performance of its powers and duties the board shall:

(8) Take such actions and perform such other functions as are required by Chapter 21-A of this Title or necessary to perform its purposes.

CHAPTER 21-A. VICTIMS OF VEHICULAR HOMICIDE

§1823. Short title

This Chapter may be cited as the Victims of Vehicular Homicide Act. <u>§1824. Definitions</u>

As used in this Chapter:

(1) "Board" means the Crime Victims Reparations Board as provided in R.S. 46:1803.

(2) "Reparations" means payment of compensation in accordance with the provisions of this Chapter for loss resulting from death by reason of a crime enumerated in this Chapter. (3) "Victim" means:

(a) Any person who suffers death as a result of a crime committed in this state and covered by this Chapter.

(b) A Louisiana resident who suffers death as a result of a crime described in R.S. 46:1826, except that the criminal act occurred outside of this state. In this Subparagraph, "Louisiana resident" means a person who maintained a place of permanent abode in this state at the time the crime was committed for which reparations are sought.

<u>§1825. Eligibility to apply for reparations</u>

Survivors enumerated in Civil Code Article 2315.2 shall be eligible to make an application to the board for reparations and shall be eligible for an award of reparations in accordance with the provisions of this Chapter. Upon charging or indictment of an offender convicted of a violation of R.S. 14:32.1, the judge shall inform such survivor of eligibility for an award of reparations. The judge shall also provide the contact information for the board to such persons for submitting an application to the board for an award of reparations.

<u>§1826.</u> Crimes to which Chapter applies

A. The board may make an award and order the payment of reparations for loss in accordance with the provisions of this Chapter for death resulting from the offense of vehicular homicide, pursuant to R.S. 14:32.1, when the offender failed to maintain compulsory motor vehicle liability security pursuant to R.S. 32:861, and the victim failed to maintain uninsured motorist coverage.

B. For the purposes of this Chapter, a person shall be deemed to have committed a criminal act or omission notwithstanding that by reason of age, insanity, or other reason he was legally incapable of committing a crime.

§1827. Application; requirements; confidentiality

A.(1) An application for reparations shall be filed in writing with the board within one year after the date of the death or within such longer period as the board determines is justified by the circumstances. The application shall be valid only if reasonable documentation of the crime resulting in the death is submitted with the application.

(2) For the purposes of this Subsection, "reasonable documentation" means any of the following:

(a) A police report documenting the commission of the crime of vehicular homicide, pursuant to R.S. 14:32.1, and documenting that the offender did not maintain compulsory motor vehicle liability security pursuant to R.S. 32:861. (b) Court records evidencing the criminal prosecution of the crime of

vehicular homicide, pursuant to R.S. 14:32.1. (c) A certification of the crime signed under oath by a prosecuting attorney

or investigating law enforcement officer who has personal involvement in the prosecution or investigation of the criminal case relative to the application.

(d) A copy of the death certificate.

B. Application shall be made on a form prescribed and provided by the board, which shall contain the following:

(1) A description of the date, nature, and circumstances of the act or acts resulting in the death of the victim.

(2) A copy of the death certificate.

(3) An authorization permitting the board or its representatives to verify

the contents of the application.

(4) Records, documents, and information in the possession of the board received pursuant to a law enforcement investigation or a verification of application by a law enforcement agency shall be considered investigative records of a law enforcement agency as described in R.S. 44:3 and shall not be disseminated under any condition without the permission of the agency providing the record or information to the board.

<u>\$1828.</u> Criteria for making awards; prohibitions; authority to deny or reduce awards

A. The board shall order the payment of reparations in an amount determined by it if, upon receipt of the application and without hearings, it finds by a preponderance of the evidence that loss was sustained by reason of death and that such loss was proximately caused by the crime of vehicular homicide, pursuant to R.S. 14:32.1.

B. A finding by the board, for purposes of considering an application for award under this Chapter, that the charge or indictment of a crime enumerated in R.S. 46:1826 resulted in a loss covered by this Chapter shall be a sufficient finding with respect to the crime giving rise to the application for a reparations award.

C. No person shall be denied or otherwise deemed ineligible for reparations pursuant to this Chapter, nor shall any award for reparations pursuant to this Chapter be reduced, on the basis that the person has any conviction or adjudication of delinquency, on the basis that the person is currently on probation or parole, or on the basis that the person has previously served any sentence of incarceration, probation, or parole unrelated to the offense for which reparations would otherwise be awarded pursuant to this Chapter.

§1829. Amount of reparations award Awards

Payable under this Chapter shall not exceed sixty thousand dollars per occurrence, in the aggregate, for all claims arising out of the same crime. No survivor shall recover more than fifteen thousand dollars on behalf of each victim.

<u>§1830. Reparation order; terms and conditions</u>

A. The board may order the payment of an award in a lump sum.

B. The state treasurer shall pay to the person named in the order of payment of reparations the amount stated therein in accordance with the provisions of such order.

C. The board shall not be subject to garnishment, execution, or attachment on any award.

§1831. Finality of decision

A decision or order of the board with respect to any application or claim for reparations shall be final and shall not be subject to any review by a court.

<u>\$1832. Effect of reparations award on right to recover damages in civil</u> action; repayment of award

A. An order for reparations payments pursuant to this Chapter shall not affect the right of any person to institute a civil suit to recover damages for the death from any other person. However, if damages in a civil action are recovered, from the offender or any other third party, the person shall reimburse the Victims of Vehicular Homicide Board, through the board, in an amount equal to the amount of the reparations award or such lesser amount as is recovered in damages in the civil action.

B. When any person who has received an award from the board files a civil action to recover damages, he shall, at the time of the filing of the suit, notify the board.

<u>§1833. Recovery from the offender</u>

A. Whenever any person is charged with vehicular homicide pursuant to R.S. 14:32.1 and an order for the payment of reparations is or has been made pursuant to this Chapter from the act constituting the crime for the charge, the attorney general, within two years after the date on which charges are final, may institute a civil action against the person charged for the recovery of all or any part of the reparations payment. The suit shall be instituted in the district court having jurisdiction in the parish in which such person resides or is found. The court shall have jurisdiction to hear, determine, and render judgment in any such action. Any amount recovered pursuant to this Subsection shall be deposited in the state treasury and, after meeting the requirements of Article VII, Section 9 of the Constitution of Louisiana, credited to the Victims of Vehicular Homicide Fund hereinafter created. If an amount greater than that paid pursuant to the order for payment of reparations is recovered and collected in any such action, the board shall pay the balance to the person.

B. The board shall provide the attorney general with such information, data, and reports as he may require to institute actions in accordance with this Section.

§1834. Victims of Vehicular Homicide Fund; creation; sources and use of funds

A. The Victims of Vehicular Homicide Fund, hereinafter referred to as "the " is hereby created as a special fund in the state treasury. fund.

B. The fund shall be composed of:

(1) Monies derived from appropriations by the legislature or private funds not to exceed five hundred thousand dollars per fiscal year.

(2) Any federal monies made available to the state for victim compensation. (3) All monies received from any action to recover damages for a crime which was the basis of a reparations award pursuant to this Chapter.

(4) Any gift, grant, devise, or bequest of monies or properties of any nature

or description. C. Monies in the fund shall be invested by the treasurer in the same manner

as state general fund monies. Unexpended and unencumbered monies in the fund at the end of the fiscal year shall remain in the fund. Subject to appropriation, monies in the fund shall be used solely to pay reparation awards pursuant to this Chapter and disbursements therefrom shall be made by the state treasurer upon written order of the board, signed by the <u>chairman, or a court.</u>

<u>§1835. Report to legislature and governor</u>

<u>The board shall submit an annual report to the legislature and the governor</u> detailing its activities during the preceding year. The report shall be made available electronically on the website of the Louisiana Commission on Law Enforcement and Administration of Criminal Justice. A sufficient number of copies shall be printed for distribution to the governor, the chairman of the House Committee on Judiciary, the chairman of the Senate Committee on Judiciary C, and to as many others as may be requested.

<u>§1836. Penalty for fraud</u>

No person shall procure or counsel another person to procure reparations pursuant to the provisions of this Chapter by any fraud. The penalty for the violation of the provisions of this Section shall be a fine of not more than five hundred dollars or imprisonment for not more than one year, or both.

<u>§1837. Limited liability of the state</u>

The state shall not be liable for the claim of any applicant in excess of the funds appropriated for the payment of claims under this Chapter.

<u>§1838. Termination of fund</u>

Unless otherwise extended, the provisions of this Chapter shall be null, void, and without effect and shall cease to exist on August 1, 2027. Approved by the Governor, June 29, 2023.

AN ACT

To enact R.S. 47:297.23, relative to individual income tax; to provide for an individual income tax credit for the adoption of certain children; to provide for the amount of the credit; to provide for limitations and requirements: to authorize the promulgation of rules; to provide for applicability; to provide for an effective date; and to provide for related matters.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:

Section 1. R.S. 47:297.23 is hereby enacted to read as follows:

§297.23. Tax credit; adoption

A.(1) There shall be allowed a refundable credit against the tax imposed by this Chapter for a taxpayer who adopts a child who is unrelated to the taxpayer and who is no more than two years of age. The amount of the credit shall be equal to five thousand dollars and shall be claimed in the year in which adoption of the child becomes final. For purposes of this Section, the age of the child shall be determined at the time of the adoption placement.

(2) The tax credit authorized pursuant to the provisions of this Section shall not apply to the adoption of a child from foster care as defined in Children's Code Article 603.

(3) A taxpayer who claims the credit authorized pursuant to the provisions of this Section shall be prohibited from also claiming the deduction authorized pursuant to the provisions of R.S. 47:297.21 for the adoption of the same child.

B.(1) If the amount of the credit authorized pursuant to the provisions of this Section exceeds the amount of the taxpayer's tax liability for the taxable year, the excess tax credit amount shall constitute an overpayment as defined in R.S. 47:1621(A), and the secretary shall make a refund of the overpayment from the current collections of the taxes imposed pursuant to this Chapter. The right to a refund shall not be subject to the requirements of R.S. 47:1621(B). (2) The taxpayer shall maintain all records necessary to verify the adoption

and, if requested, shall provide the records to the Department of Revenue when filing the taxpayer's tax return.

C. The secretary of the Department of Revenue may promulgate rules in accordance with the Administrative Procedure Act to implement the provisions of this Section, including rules related to the submission of documentation when claiming the credit.

D. No credits authorized by this Section may be claimed for any taxable year beginning after December 31, 2028.

Section 2. The provisions of this Act shall be applicable to adoptions finalized on or after January 1, 2023.

Section 3. This Act shall become effective upon signature by the governor or, if not signed by the governor, upon expiration of the time for bills to become law without signature by the governor, as provided by Article III, Section 18 of the Constitution of Louisiana. If vetoed by the governor and subsequently approved by the legislature, this Act shall become effective on the day following such approval.

BY SENATOR TALBOT Prefiled Pursuant to Article III, Section 2(A)(4)(b)(i) of the Constitution of Louisiana.

AN ACT

To enact R.S. 22:1880.2, relative to out-of-network emergency ambulance services providing covered healthcare services; to provide for definitions; to provide reimbursement for emergency ambulance providers by health insurance issuers; to provide for balance billing requirements for out-ofnetwork emergency ambulance providers; to provide for effectiveness; and to provide for related matters.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:

Section 1. R.S. 22:1880.2 is hereby enacted to read as follows:

§1880.2. Payment of claims for covered healthcare services provided by out-ofnetwork care insurer of the enrollee receiving the covered healthcare services; **definitions**

A. As used in this Section, the following definitions apply unless the context indicates otherwise:

(1) "Ambulance provider" means an ambulance provider as defined in R.S. 40:1131. For purposes of this Section, "ambulance provider" does not include an air ambulance provider.

(2) "Clean claim" means a claim that has no defect of impropriety, including any lack of required substantiating documentation or particular circumstances requiring special treatment that prevents timely payment from being made on the claim.

(3) "Covered services" means those emergency ambulance services which an enrollee is entitled to receive under the terms of a healthcare benefit plan.

(4) "Enrollee" means a person who is entitled to receive covered healthcare services under the terms of a healthcare benefit plan.

(5) "Healthcare benefit plan" means a plan, policy, contract, certificate, agreement, or other evidence of coverage for healthcare services offered, issued, renewed, or extended in this state by a healthcare insurer.

(6) "Healthcare insurer" means an entity that is subject to state insurance regulation and provides coverage for health benefits in this state and includes the following:

(a) An insurance company.

(b) A health maintenance organization.

(c) A hospital and medical service corporation.

(d) A risk-based provider organization.

(e) A sponsor of self-funded governmental plan.

(7) "Out-of-network" means a provider that does not contract with the healthcare insurer of the enrollee receiving the covered healthcare services.

B. The minimum allowable reimbursement rate under any healthcare benefit plan issued by any healthcare insurer to an out-of-network ambulance provider for providing emergency services shall be one of the following items:

(1) At the rates set or approved, whether in contract or ordinance, by a local governmental entity in the jurisdiction in which the covered healthcare services originate, or as provided for in R.S. 33:4791.

(2) In the absence of rates as provided in Paragraph (1) of this Subsection, the minimum allowable rate of reimbursement under any health benefit plan issued by any healthcare insurer shall be three hundred twenty-five percent of the current published rate for ambulance services as established by the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services under Title XVIII of the Social Security Act for the same service provided in the same geographic area; or the ambulance provider's billed charges, whichever is less.

C. Payment made in compliance with this Section shall be considered payment in full for the covered services provided, except for any copayment, coinsurance, deductible, and other cost-sharing amounts required to be paid by the enrollee. An ambulance provider is prohibited from billing the enrollee for any additional amounts for paid covered services.

D. All copayment, coinsurance, deductible, and other cost-sharing amounts provided by Subsection C of this Section shall not exceed the in-network copayment, coinsurance, deductible, and other cost-sharing amounts for the covered healthcare services received by the enrollee.

E. A healthcare insurer shall, within thirty days after receipt of a clean claim for covered services, promptly remit payment for ambulance services directly to the ambulance provider and shall not send payment to an enrollee.

F. If the claim is not a clean claim, the healthcare insurer shall, within thirty days after receipt of the claim, send a written notice acknowledging the date of the receipt of the claim and shall provide one of the following items:

(1) That the insurer is declining to pay all or part of the claim and the specific reason or reasons for the denial.

(2) That additional information is necessary to determine if all or part of the <u>claim is</u>

Payable and the specific additional information that is required.

AN ACT To amend and reenact Code of Criminal Procedure Art. 973(E) and to enact Code of Criminal Procedure Art. 985.2, relative to expungement of records; to provide relative to automated expungement of certain criminal records; to require the Louisiana Bureau of Criminal Identification and Information to send certain records to the Louisiana Supreme Court Case Management Information System; to provide relative to duties of the clerks of district courts; to authorize the adoption of rules and regulations by state police and the supreme court; to provide relative to the effects of expunged records of arrest and conviction; and to provide for related matters.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:

Section 1. Code of Criminal Procedure Art. 973(E) is hereby amended and reenacted and Code of Criminal Procedure Art. 985.2 is hereby enacted to read as follows:

Art. 973. Effect of expunged record of arrest or conviction

E. Nothing in this Article shall be construed to limit or impair in any way the subsequent use of any expunged record of any arrests or convictions by a judge, magistrate, commissioner, law enforcement agency, criminal justice agency, or prosecutor including its use as a predicate offense, for the purposes of the Habitual Offender Law, setting bail, sentencing, or as otherwise authorized by law. * * *

Art. 985.2. Automated expungement of qualifying records

A. The Louisiana Bureau of Criminal Identification and Information shall identify within its criminal repository database all records with a Case Management Information System (CMIS) number and final dispositions for individuals eligible for an expungement pursuant to the provisions of Code of Criminal Procedure Articles 976, 977, and 978.

B. Beginning January 1, 2025, a defendant may submit a request through the Louisiana Bureau of Criminal Identification and Information for expungement through the automated process. The form shall contain the defendant's name, date of birth, last four digits of their social security number, arrest date, and case number. Within thirty days of receipt of the request, the Louisiana Bureau of Criminal Identification and Information shall expunge any eligible records identified in Paragraph A of this Article and shall send the records with a Case Management Information System number and final dispositions to the Louisiana Supreme Court Case Management Information System.

C. Within thirty days of receipt of records from the Louisiana Bureau of Criminal Identification and Information, the Louisiana Supreme Court Case Management Information System shall send notice by United States mail or electronically of all records identified pursuant to Paragraph A of this Article to be expunged by automation to the clerks of the district courts of Louisiana. The clerks of the district courts of Louisiana shall verify and identify such records and mark those records as expunged by automation. If a clerk of a district court is unable to verify and identify any record identified for automatic expungement, the clerk shall notify the Louisiana Supreme Court Case Management Information System within thirty days of receipt of the notice required pursuant to the provisions of this Paragraph, who shall then notify the Louisiana Bureau of Criminal Identification and Information that the record is not expunged by automation.

D. The clerks of the district courts of Louisiana shall send notice by United States mail or electronically of all records expunged by automation to the district attorney of the parish of the person's conviction, the sheriff of the parish of the person's conviction, and the arresting agency. The district attorney, sheriff, and arresting agency shall acknowledge the records as expunged by automation according to Code of Criminal Procedure Article 973. Nothing in this Paragraph shall be construed to require the arresting agency, booking agency, or the district attorney to manually segregate or sequester upon acknowledging or identifying the records.

E. The Department of Public Safety and Corrections, office of state police, is hereby authorized to adopt and promulgate rules and regulations in accordance with the Administrative Procedure Act to carry out the provisions of this Article for criminal records in district courts of Louisiana which date back to January 1, 2006.

F. Nothing in this Article shall prevent an otherwise eligible individual from obtaining an expungement pursuant to any provision in this Title. An individual eligible for an automated expungement under this Article shall not have a cause of action for any damages resulting from the omission of their records in the process provided by this Article.

G. This Article shall be subject to the appropriate funding necessary for implementation and provided for in the executive budget for Fiscal Year 2025-2026.

Section 2. The legislature hereby recognizes the judicial power vested in

the state supreme court pursuant to Article V, Section 1 of the Constitution of Louisiana and, accordingly, urges and requests the supreme court to adopt rules to carry out the provisions of this Act.

Section 3. Monies appropriated by the legislature for the implementation of this Act to the Louisiana Commission on Law Enforcement and the Administration of Criminal Justice shall be distributed to each sheriff in the state in proportion to the number of automatic expungements submitted to the sheriff by the clerks of court pursuant to the provisions of this Act

Section 4. The provisions of Sections 1, 2, and 3 of this Act shall become effective if an Act or Acts of the Legislature of Louisiana originating in the 2023 Regular Session containing specific appropriations of monies for the office of state police, the Louisiana Supreme Court, the Louisiana Clerks' Remote Access Authority, and the Louisiana Commission on Law Enforcement and the Administration of Criminal Justice for the implementation of the provisions of this Act becomes effective. If such appropriations are made in a single Act, Sections 1, 2, and 3 of this Act shall become effective when the Act that made the appropriations becomes effective. If such appropriations are made in different Acts, Sections 1, 2, and 3 of this Act shall become effective when the Act having the later effective date becomes effective.

Section 5. The provisions of this Section and Section 4 of this Act shall become effective upon signature of this Act by the governor or, if not signed by the governor, upon expiration of the time for bills to become law without signature by the governor, as provided by Article III, Section 18 of the Constitution of Louisiana. If this Act is vetoed by the governor and subsequently approved by the legislature, the provisions of this Section and Section 4 of this Act shall become effective on the day following such approval.

AN ACT To enact Chapter 12-B of Title 30 of the Louisiana Revised Statutes of 1950, to be comprised of R.S. 30:1161 through 1179, relative to renewable energy leases; to provide for rights and obligations; to provide for terms and conditions; to provide for remedies; to provide for termination; to provide for privileges; to provide for redesignation; and to provide for related matters.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:

Section 1. Chapter 12-B of Title 30 of the Louisiana Revised Statutes of 1950. comprised of R.S. 30:1161 through 1179, is hereby enacted to read as follows: CHAPTER 12-B. RENEWABLE ENERGY LEASES

PART 1. THE LESSEE

§1161. Renewable energy lease

A "renewable energy lease" is a lease of immovable property that is entered for the primary purpose of the lessee's engaging in the production of wind, solar, or hydroelectric energy using the leased immovable, and any other lease pursuant to which the lessee's primary activity on the leased immovable is the production of wind, solar, or hydroelectric energy. A renewable energy lease is not a mineral lease. The lessee's rights in a renewable energy lease and his rights in the buildings, improvements, and other constructions on the leased immovable are susceptible of mortgage.

§1162. Preservation of rights

The owner of land burdened by a renewable energy lease and the lessee of a renewable energy lease shall exercise their respective rights with reasonable regard for those of the other. Subject to the laws of registry, the lessee of a renewable energy lease shall not unreasonably interfere with the rights of others lawfully exercising their rights in the land.

§1163. Lessee's obligation to act as reasonably prudent operator

A lessee of a renewable energy lease is not under a fiduciary obligation to his lessor, but he is bound to perform the contract in good faith and to develop and operate the property leased as a reasonably prudent operator for the mutual benefit of himself and his lessor. Parties may stipulate what shall constitute reasonably prudent conduct of the lessee to develop and operate the leased property.

§1164. Lessee's right to assign or sublease

The lessee's interest in a renewable energy lease may be assigned or subleased in whole or in part, unless the lease expressly prohibits assignments or subleases. If a renewable energy lease contains a provision that expressly prohibits either assignments or subleases, then unless the lease language clearly shows a contrary intent, the provision will be interpreted as prohibiting both assignments and subleases.

§1165. Responsibility of assignee or sublessee to original lessor

A. To the extent of the interest acquired, an assignee or sublessee acquires the rights and powers of the lessee and becomes responsible directly to the lessor for performance of the lessee's obligations. Except as otherwise expressly agreed to in writing by the lessor, an assignor or sublessor is not relieved of his obligations or liabilities under a renewable energy lease unless the lessor has discharged him expressly and in writing in a separate instrument executed

at the time of the assignment or sublease or thereafter. The lessor shall not unreasonably withhold the discharge. A partial assignment or partial sublease does not divide a renewable energy lease. A renewable energy lease lessor shall accept performance by an assignee or sublessee whether or not the assignment or sublease is filed for registry.

B. If the assignor assigns his rights in the renewable energy lease, the assignor shall provide to the lessor a notice of assignment containing the name, address, phone number, and email address of the assignee. The assignee or his operator shall comply with all applicable requirements of R.S. 30:1154.

§1166. Demands by lessor; effect on assignee or sublessee

An assignee or sublessee is bound by any notice or demand by the lessor on the lessee unless the lessor has been given written notice of the assignment or sublease. If such notice has been given, any subsequent notice or demand by the lessor shall be made on the assignee or sublessee. PART 2. TERMINATION AND REMEDIES FOR VIOLATION

§1167. Termination of renewable energy lease

A renewable energy lease terminates at the expiration of the agreed term or upon the occurrence of an express resolutory condition.

§1168. Right to relief for violation

If a renewable energy lease is violated, an aggrieved party shall be entitled to any appropriate relief provided by law. Parties may stipulate what constitutes <u>appropriate relief.</u>

\$1169. Rules of default applicable except as specified

The provisions of the Louisiana Civil Code concerning putting in default are applicable to renewable energy leases subject to the modifications in this Part. §1170. Written notice; requirement and effect on claims for damages or

dissolution of lease If a renewable energy lessor seeks relief from his lessee for any claim that the lessee has failed to develop and operate the property leased as a prudent operator, he shall give his lessee written notice of the asserted breach of performance and allow a reasonable time for performance by the lessee as a prerequisite to a judicial demand for damages or dissolution of the lease. If a lessee is found to have had actual or constructive knowledge of its failure to perform as a prudent operator and is held responsible for consequent damages, the damages may be computed from the time a reasonably prudent operator would have remedied the failure to perform. In other cases where notice is required by this Part, damages may be computed only from the time the written notice was received by the lessee. The parties may stipulate what constitutes a reasonable time for performance under this Section.

<u>§1171. Nonpayment of royalties; notice prerequisite to judicial demand</u>

If a renewable energy lessor seeks relief for the failure of his lessee to make timely or proper payment of rent or royalties, he shall give his lessee written notice of such failure as a prerequisite to a judicial demand for damages or dissolution of the lease.

§1172. Required response of lessee to notice; effect of response

The lessee shall have thirty days after receipt of the required notice to pay the rent or royalties due or to respond by stating in writing a reasonable cause for nonpayment. The payment or nonpayment of the rent or royalties or stating or failing to state a reasonable cause for nonpayment within this period has the following effect on the remedies of dissolution and damages:

A. If the lessee pays the rent or royalties due within thirty days of receiving the required notice, the remedy of dissolution shall be unavailable unless it be found that the original failure to pay was fraudulent. The lessee also remains liable for interest from the time the payments were due under the lease.

B. If the lessee pays the rent or royalties due within thirty days of receiving the required notice, but the original failure to pay rent or royalties was either fraudulent or willful and without reasonable grounds, the court may in its discretion award as additional damages in an amount not to exceed the amount of rent or royalties that were not timely or properly paid, interest on that sum from the date due, and reasonable attorney fees. In all other cases, such as mere oversight or neglect, damages shall be limited to interest on the rent or royalties computed from the date due, and reasonable attorney fees if such interest is not paid within thirty days of the written demand.

C. If the lessee fails to pay rent or royalties due and fails to inform the lessor of a reasonable cause for failure to pay in response to the required notice, the court may dissolve the lease. In addition, the court may award as damages the amount of rent or royalties due, interest on that sum from the date due, and reasonable attorney fees regardless of the cause for the original failure to pay.

D. The parties may stipulate a time period longer than thirty days within which the lessee shall pay rent or royalties due following written notice for payment thereof by the lessor, but in no circumstance shall such time period be greater than sixty days from delivery of the written notice to the lessee.

§1173. Notice; manner of delivery

For any written notice required under this Chapter, the parties to a renewable energy lease may stipulate the conditions, manner, and method by which delivery of such written notice to the lessee shall be made.

§1174. Summary eviction not applicable

A renewable energy lessee cannot be evicted by summary process.

§1175. Dissolution may be partial or entire

A renewable energy lease may be dissolved partially or in its entirety. A decree of partial dissolution may be made as to those portions of the land subject to a renewable energy lease on which construction of the renewable energy facility has not commenced within ten years of the effective date of the lease, or in any other fashion which may provide appropriate justice in the judgment of the court.

PART 3. THE LESSOR'S PRIVILEGE

§1176. Lessor's privilege

The lessor of a renewable energy lease has, for the payment of his rent, and other obligations of the lease, a privilege on all equipment, machinery, and other property of the lessee on or attached to the property leased. The right also extends to equipment, machinery, and other property of a sublessee on or attached to the property leased, but only to the extent that the sublessee is indebted to his sublessor at the time the lessor exercises his right.

§1177. Right to seize property on premises or within fifteen days of removal

The renewable energy lessor may seize the property subject to his privilege before the lessee removes it from the leased premises, or within fifteen days after it has been removed by the lessee without the consent of the lessor, if it continues to be the property of the lessee, and can be identified. §1178. Manner of enforcement

The renewable energy lessor may enforce his privilege in the same manner as the privilege accorded other lessors.

§1179. Exclusion; offshore wind

Unless incorporated by reference into an agreement, this Chapter shall not apply to offshore wind energy agreements entered into by the state.

Section 2. The Louisiana State Law Institute is hereby directed to redesignate Chapter 12 of Title 30 as Chapter 12-A.

Section 3. This Act shall become effective upon signature by the governor or, if not signed by the governor, upon expiration of the time for bills to become law without signature by the governor, as provided by Article III, Section 18 of the Constitution of Louisiana. If vetoed by the governor and subsequently approved by the legislature, this Act shall become effective on the day following such approval.

AN ACT

To enact Chapter 20 of Title 51 of the Louisiana Revised Statutes of 1950, to be comprised of R.S. 51:1751 through 1759, relative to social media; to provide for limitations and restrictions of certain accounts on a social media platform; to provide for age verification of account holders; to provide for parental consent; to provide for enforcement by the Department of Justice; to provide for terms, conditions, definitions, and procedures; to provide relative to implementation; and to provide for related matters.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:

Section 1. Chapter 20 of Title 51 of the Louisiana Revised Statutes of 1950, comprised of R.S. 51:1751 through 1759, is hereby enacted to read as follows: <u>CHAPTER 20. SECURE ONLINE CHILD INTERACTION</u> <u>AND AGE LIMITATION ACT</u>

§1751. Definitions

For the purposes of this Chapter, the following terms shall have the following meanings unless the context clearly indicates otherwise:

(1) "Account holder" means a person who has, or opens, an account or profile to use a social media company's platform.

(2) "Director" means the director of the division of public protection of the Department of Justice.

(3) "Division" means the division of public protection of the Department of Justice.

(4) "Educational entity" means a Louisiana public school, a charter school, the Louisiana Schools for the Deaf and Visually Impaired, a private school, a community college, a state college, a state university, or a nonprofit private postsecondary educational institution.

(5) "Interactive computer service" means an information service, information system, or information access software provider that provides or enables computer access by multiple users to a computer server and provides access to the internet. An interactive computer service includes a web service, a web system, a website, a web application, or a web portal.

(6) "Louisiana account holder" means a person who is a resident of this state and an account holder, including a Louisiana minor account holder.

(7) "Louisiana minor account holder" means a Louisiana account holder who is a minor.

(8) "Louisiana resident" means an individual who currently resides in this state.

(9) "Minor" means an individual under circumstances where a social media company reasonably believes or has actual knowledge that the individual is under the age of sixteen and is not emancipated or married. A social media company shall treat an individual as a minor if the social media company verifies that the individual is under the age of sixteen, as provided in this Chapter.

(10) "Post" means content that an account holder makes available on a social media platform for other account holders or users to view. (11) "Social media company" means a person or entity that provides a social media platform that has at least five million account holders worldwide and is an interactive computer service.

(12)(a) "Social media platform" means a public or semipublic internet-based service or application that has users in Louisiana and that meets all of the following:

(i) The service or application connects users in order to allow users to interact socially with each other within the service or application. A service or application that provides email or direct messaging services, enterprise cloud storage services, enterprise cybersecurity services, educational devices, or enterprise collaboration tools for K-12 schools shall not be considered to meet this criterion on the basis of that function alone.

(ii) The service or application allows users to do all of the following:

(aa) Construct a public or semipublic profile for purposes of signing into and using the service or application.

(bb) Populate a list of other users with whom an individual shares a social or virtual connection within the system, including subscribing to content related to another user.

(cc) Create or post content viewable by other users, including but not limited to, on message boards, in chat rooms, on video channels, or through a landing page or main feed that presents the user with content generated by other users.

(b) "Social media platform" shall not include an online service, website, or application where the predominant or exclusive function is any of the following: (i) Electronic mail.

(ii) A service that, pursuant to its terms of use, does not permit minors to use the platform and utilizes commercially reasonable age assurance mechanisms to attempt to prohibit minors from becoming an account holder or user.

(iii) A streaming service that provides only licensed media in a continuous flow from the service, website, or application to the end user and does not obtain a license to the media from a user or account holder by agreement to its terms of service.

(iv) News, sports, entertainment, or other content that is preselected by the provider and not user generated, and any chat, comment, or interactive functionality that is provided incidental to, directly related to, or dependent upon provisions of the content.

(v) Online shopping or electronic commerce, if the interaction with other users or account holders is generally limited to the ability to upload a post and comment on reviews, the ability to display lists or collections of goods for sale or wish lists, and any other function that is focused on online shopping or electronic commerce rather than interaction between users or account holders.

(vi) Interactive gaming, virtual gaming, or an online service that allows the creation and uploading of content and the communication related to that content for the purpose of interactive gaming, educational entertainment, or associated entertainment.

(vii) Photograph editing that has an associated photograph hosting service if the interaction with other users or account holders is generally limited to liking or commenting.

(viii) Single purpose community groups for public safety if the interaction with other users or account holders is limited to that single purpose and the community group has guidelines or policies against illegal content.

(ix) Career development opportunities, including professional networking, job skills, learning certifications, and job posting and application services.

(x) Business-to-business software.

(xi) A teleconferencing or videoconferencing service that allows reception and transmission of audio and video signals for real-time communication.

(xii) Cloud storage.

(xiii) Shared document collaboration.

(xiv) Cloud computing services, which may include cloud storage and shared document collaboration.

(xv) Providing access to or interacting with data visualization platforms, libraries, or hubs.

(xvi) Permitting comments on a digital news website if the news content is posted by only the provider of the digital news website.

(xvii) Providing or obtaining technical support for a platform, product, or service.

(xviii) Academic, scholarly, or genealogical research.

(xix) Internet access and broadband service.

(xx) A classified advertising service in which the provider of the online service, website, or application is limited to all of the following:

(aa) Permitting only the sale of goods.

(bb) Prohibiting the solicitation of personal service.

(cc) Posting or creating a substantial amount of the content.

(dd) Providing the ability to chat, comment, or interact with other users only if it is directly related to the provider's content.

(xxi) An online, service, website, or application that is used by or under the direction of an educational entity, including a learning management system, a student engagement program, or a subject or skill-specific program, where the majority of the content is created or posted by the provider of the online service, website, or application and the ability to chat, comment, or interact with other users is directly related to the provider's content.

(13) "User" means a person who has access to view all or some of the posts on a social media platform but is not an account holder.

§1752. Age requirements for use of social media platform; parental consent

A. A social media company shall make commercially reasonable efforts to verify the age of Louisiana account holders with a level of certainty appropriate to the risks that arise from the information management practices of the social media company or apply the accommodations afforded to minors pursuant to

this Chapter to all account holders.

B. A social media company shall not permit a Louisiana resident who is a minor to be an account holder on the social media company's social media platform unless the minor has the express consent of a parent or guardian. Acceptable methods of obtaining express consent from a parent or guardian include any of the following:

(1) Providing a form for the minor's parent or guardian to sign and return to the digital service provider by common carrier, facsimile, or electronic scan.

(2) Providing a toll-free telephone number for the minor's parent or guardian to call to consent.

(3) Coordinating a call with a minor's parent or guardian over video conferencing technology.

(4) Collecting information related to the government-issued identification of the minor's parent or guardian and deleting that information after confirming the identity of the minor's parent or guardian.

(5) Allowing the minor's parent or guardian to provide consent by responding to an e-mail and taking additional steps to verify the identity of the minor's parent or guardian.

(6) Any other commercially reasonable method of obtaining consent in light of available technology.

C. Notwithstanding any other provision of this Chapter, a social media company shall not permit a Louisiana resident who is a minor to hold or open an account on a social media platform if the minor is ineligible to hold or open an account pursuant to any other provision of state or federal law.

D. The division may adopt rules in accordance with the Administrative Procedure Act that provide examples of all of the following:

(1) Acceptable processes or means by which a social media company may meet the age verification requirements of this Chapter, including adjusting for new technologies.

(2) Acceptable forms or methods of identification for individuals to verify that they are over the age of sixteen, which may not be limited to a valid identification card issued by a government entity.

(3) Acceptable processes or means to confirm that a parent or guardian has provided consent for the minor to open or use an account pursuant to this Section.

§1753. Prohibition on data collection for certain accounts and advertising

For a Louisiana minor account holder, a social media company shall prohibit all of the following:

(1) Adults from direct messaging a Louisiana minor account holder unless the minor is already connected to the adult on the service.

(2) The display of any advertising in the account based on the Louisiana minor account holder's personal information, except age and location.

(3) The collection or use of personal information from the posts, content, messages, text, or usage activities of the account other than information beyond what is adequate, relevant, and reasonably necessary in relation to the purposes for which such information is collected, as disclosed.

§1754. Parental access to social media account settings; parental supervision

A social media company shall provide a parent or guardian who has given parental consent for a Louisiana minor account holder as provided in this <u>Chapter with a means for the minor account holder or the parent or guardian to</u> initiate account supervision. Such supervision shall include the ability for the parent to view privacy settings of the minor's account, set daily time limits for the service, schedule breaks, and offer the minor the option to set up parental notifications when the minor reports a person or issue.

§1755. Investigative powers of the division

A. The division shall receive consumer complaints alleging any violation of this Chapter, and any person may file a consumer complaint with the division that alleges a violation of this Chapter.

B. The division shall investigate a consumer complaint to determine whether a violation of this Chapter has occurred.

§1756. Enforcement powers of the division

A. The division has exclusive authority to administer and enforce the requirements of this Chapter.

B. Subject to the ability to cure an alleged violation of Subsection **D** of this Section, the division director may impose an administrative fine of up to two thousand five hundred dollars for each violation of this Chapter, and the division may bring an action in a court of competent jurisdiction to enforce any provision of this Chapter.

C. In a court action by the division to enforce any provision of this Chapter, the court may do any of the following:

(1) Declare that the act or practice violates a provision of this Chapter.

(2) Issue an injunction for a violation of this Chapter.

(3) Order any profits, gains, gross receipts, or benefit from a violation of this Chapter to be forfeited and paid to the aggrieved person.

(4) Impose a civil penalty of up to two thousand five hundred dollars for each violation of this Chapter.

(5) Award damages to the aggrieved person.

(6) Award any other relief that the court considers reasonable and necessary.

D.(1) At least forty-five days before the day on which the division initiates an enforcement action against a person that is subject to the requirements of this Chapter, the division shall provide the person with a written notice that identifies each alleged violation and an explanation of the basis for each allegation.

(2) Except as provided in Paragraph (3) of this Subsection, the division shall not initiate an action if the person cures the noticed violation within forty-five days after the date on which the person receives the notice by providing

the division with a written statement indicating the violation is cured and no further violations will occur.

(3) The division may initiate a civil action against a person who does either of the following:

(a) Fails to cure a violation after receiving the written notice described in Paragraph (1) of this Subsection.

(b) Commits another violation of the same provision after curing a violation and providing a written statement in accordance with Paragraph (2) of this Subsection.

(4) If a court of competent jurisdiction grants judgment or injunctive relief to the division, the court shall award the division all of the following:

(a) Reasonable attorney fees.

(b) Court costs.

(c) Investigative cost.

(5) A person who violates an administrative order or court order issued for a violation of this Chapter shall be subject to a civil penalty of not more than five thousand dollars for each violation. A civil penalty in accordance with this Section may be imposed in any civil action brought by the division.

(6) All monies received from the payment of a fine or civil penalty imposed and collected pursuant to the provisions of this Section shall be used by the division to promote consumer protection and education.

§1757. Annual report

A. The division shall compile an annual report that contains all of the following information:

(1) An evaluation of the liability and enforcement provisions of this Chapter, including but not limited to the effectiveness of the division's efforts to enforce this Chapter and any recommendations for revisions to this Chapter, including proposals for legislation.

(2) A summary of the consumer interactions, protected and not protected by this Chapter, including a list of alleged violations the division has received.

(3) An accounting of all of the following:

(a) All administrative fines and civil penalties assessed during the year.

(b) All administrative fines and civil penalties collected during the year.

(c) The use of funds from all administrative fines and civil penalties collected during the year. **B.** The division may update or correct the report as new information becomes

available.

C. The division shall maintain the report, which shall be published on its <u>website.</u>

§1758. Waiver; prohibited

<u>Notwithstanding any contract or choice of law provision in a contract, a waiver</u> or limitation, or purported waiver or limitation, of any of the following shall be yoid and unenforceable as contrary to public policy, and a court or arbitrator shall not enforce or give effect to the waiver:

(1) A protection or requirement pursuant to this Chapter.

(2) The right to cooperate with the division or to file a complaint with the division.

<u>§1759. Subject to appropriation</u>

The implementation of this Chapter shall be subject to the appropriation of funds by the legislature for this purpose.

Section 2. The provisions of this Act shall be given prospective application only.

Section 3. This Act shall become effective on July 1, 2024.

AN ACT

To enact R.S. 14:73.13, relative to computer related crime; to create the crime of unlawful deepfakes; to provide for definitions; to provide penalties; and to provide for related matters.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:

Section 1. R.S. 14:73.13 is hereby enacted to read as follows:

§73.13. Unlawful deepfakes

A. Any person who, with knowledge that the material is a deepfake depicting a minor, knowingly creates or possesses material that depicts a minor engaging in sexual conduct shall be punished by imprisonment at hard labor for not less than five nor more than twenty years, or a fine of not more than ten thousand dollars, or both. At least five years of the sentence of imprisonment imposed shall be served without benefit of parole, probation or suspension of sentence.

B.(1) Except as provided in Paragraph (2) of this Subsection, any person who, with knowledge that the material is a deepfake that depicts another person, without consent of the person depicted, engaging in sexual conduct, knowingly advertises, distributes, exhibits, exchanges with, promotes, or sells any sexual material shall be punished by imprisonment at hard labor for not less than ten nor more than thirty years, a fine of not more than fifty thousand dollars, or both. (2) Any person who, with knowledge that the material is a deepfake depicting <u>a minor, knowingly advertises, distributes, exhibits, exchanges with, promotes,</u>

or sells any sexual material that depicts a minor engaging in sexual conduct shall be punished by imprisonment at hard labor for not less than ten nor more than thirty years, a fine of not more than fifty thousand dollars, or both. At least ten years of the sentence of imprisonment imposed shall be served without benefit of probation, parole, or suspension of sentence.

C. For the purposes of this Section:

(1) "Deepfake" means any audio or visual media in an electronic format, including any motion picture film or video recording, that is created, altered, or digitally manipulated in a manner that would falsely appear to a reasonable observer to be an authentic record of the actual speech or conduct of the individual or replace an individual's likeness with another individual and depicted in the recording. "Deepfake" does not include any material that constitutes a work of political, public interest, or newsworthy value, including commentary, criticism, satire, or parody, or that includes content, context, or a clear disclosure visible throughout the duration of the recording that would cause a reasonable person to understand that the audio or visual media is not a record of a real event.

(2) "Distribute" means to publish or make available to another person but does not include any alteration of a recording, including altering the length of the recording, so long as such alteration does not knowingly remove any content, context, or clear disclosure visible throughout the duration of the recording that would cause a reasonable person to believe that the audio or visual media is not a record of a real event.

(3) "Minor" means a person under the age of eighteen years.

(4) "Sexual conduct" means any of the following, whether actual or simulated: sexual intercourse, oral copulation, anal intercourse, anal oral copulation, masturbation, bestiality, sexual sadism, sexual masochism, penetration of the vagina or rectum by any object in a lewd or lascivious manner, exhibition of the genitals or pubic or rectal area for the purpose of sexual stimulation of the viewer, or excretory functions performed in a lewd or lascivious manner, whether or not any of the conduct is performed alone or between members of the same or opposite sex or between humans and animals. An act is simulated when it gives the appearance of being actual sexual conduct.

Section 2. If any provision or item of this Act, or the application thereof, is held invalid, such invalidity shall not affect other provisions, items, or applications of the Act which can be given effect without the invalid provision, item, or application and to this end the provisions of this Act are hereby declared severable.

AN ACT To amend and reenact R.S. 17:100.13, relative to expanded academic supports provided for certain low-performing students; to provide relative to the students who qualify for expanded academic supports; to provide relative to accelerated instruction offered to the low-performing students; to provide relative to high-quality tutoring providers; to provide waivers; to provide relative to the responsibilities of the state Department of Education; and to provide for related matters.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:

Section 1. R.S. 17:100.13 is hereby amended and reenacted to read as follows:

\$100.13. Expanded academic support, accelerated learning committees A. For the 2021-2022 and 2022-2023 school years, <u>Each school year</u>, each student in grades four three through eight who failed to achieve mastery on any statewide assessment administered pursuant to the state's school and district accountability system in reading or math during the 2020-2021 and 2021-2022 school years in the previous academic year shall be provided expanded academic support as provided in Subsection B of this Section.

B. Each city, parish, or other local public school board shall develop an educational plan and supporting budget to provide expanded academic support to students identified pursuant to Subsection A of this Section using federal funds provided for educational relief due to the COVID-19 pandemic. Such plan shall be submitted to the state Department of Education not later than September 30, 2021, for review and approval.

(1) Educational plans shall adhere to state board rules and regulations pertaining to pupil progression and individual academic improvement plans. (2) Supporting budgets shall adhere to all applicable federal and state regulations, including but not limited to those enacted pursuant to the federal Elementary and Secondary School Emergency Relief Fund.

C. The department shall review each plan submitted for compliance with applicable federal and state regulations, including state board regulations pursuant to pupil progression and individual academic improvement plans. The department shall provide feedback to the local board if necessary to bring the plan into compliance with applicable regulations. D. If, following timelines set forth by the department, a city, parish, or

other local public school board fails to submit a revised plan that complies with applicable regulations, the department shall reject such plan and shall require the board to adhere to the requirements set forth in Subsection E of this Section. If any city, parish, or other local public school board fails to have an approved plan in place by August 1, 2023, the school board shall adhere to any revised requirements provided for in this Section or any State Board of Elementary and Secondary Education policy that is not inconsistent with this <u>Section.</u>

E. The parent or legal guardian of a student identified in need of expanded academic support shall be provided one of the following options:

(1) Accelerated instruction as provided in Subsections F through H of this Section to commence no later than thirty days after the student is identified in need of expanded academic support.

(2) Prioritized placement in a class taught by a teacher labeled as "highly effective" pursuant to the state's teacher evaluation system, if a highly effective teacher is available in the school.

F. Accelerated instruction provided pursuant to this Section shall:

(1) Include targeted instruction in the subject matter areas of reading or <u>math</u> in which the student has failed to perform satisfactorily.

(2) Be provided in addition to the instruction normally provided to students in the grade level in which the student is enrolled.

(3) Be provided for not less than thirty total hours during the following summer and school year, and include instruction for not less than once per week. Be provided in one-on-one or small group instruction, at least three times a week, in thirty-minute minimum sessions, which may be embedded in the <u>school day or provided outside of the school day.</u>

(4) Be designed to assist the student in achieving grade level performance proficiency in the applicable subject area.

(5) Be taught using high-quality instructional materials that are fully aligned with state content standards and that are <u>specifically</u> designed for supplemental instruction.

(6) Be provided to a student individually or in a group of not more than twelve five students, unless the parent or legal guardian of each student in the group authorizes a larger group.

(7) Be provided by a person with training in using the instructional materials pursuant to Paragraph (5) of this Subsection and who receives ongoing oversight while providing the accelerated instruction or a high-quality tutoring provider, as defined in Subsection G of this Section. If the school board selects a tutoring provider that has not been classified as a high-quality tutoring provider by the state Department of Education, the school board shall apply for <u>a waiver from the department and stipulate how the tutoring services will be</u> provided.

(8) To the extent possible, be provided by the same person for the entirety of the student's supplemental instruction period.

(9) Be provided in accordance with guidelines on research-based best practices and effective accelerated instruction strategies developed and provided by the state Department of Education.

G.(1) Each public school shall establish an accelerated learning committee for each student in grades four through eight who failed to achieve mastery on any statewide assessment administered pursuant to the state's school and district accountability system. The committee shall be composed of the student's parent or legal guardian, the teacher of the subject in which the student has failed to perform satisfactorily, and the school principal or his designee. The student's parent or legal guardian shall be notified of the time and place the committee will meet and the purpose of the committee.

(2) A student's accelerated learning committee shall, not later than August thirty-first, develop an accelerated learning plan for the student that provides the accelerated instruction needed to enable the student to perform on grade level by the end of the 2021-2022 school year. The student's parent or legal guardian shall be provided with a copy of the student's accelerated learning plan.

H. If a student fails to perform satisfactorily in the same subject matter area on a state assessment administered in the subsequent school year, the accelerated learning committee shall:

(1) Identify the reasons the student failed to perform satisfactorily.

(2) Determine whether the student needs additional expanded academic support including accelerated instruction, summer learning programs, or other resources to meet the student's academic needs.

G.(1) For the purpose of providing accelerated instruction, the state Department of Education shall publish on its website a list of approved highquality tutoring providers.

(2) In approving high-quality tutoring providers, the department shall require the tutoring providers to:

(a) Use high-quality instructional materials that are aligned with research on effective teaching and learning and state content standards.

(b) Implement high-impact tutoring practices pursuant to Paragraph (F)(3) of this Section.

(c) Utilize diagnostic or assessment data to guide instruction.

(d) Use well-trained tutors who have passed background checks required of school employees.

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* As it appears in the enrolled bill

(e) Offer tutoring through in-person services or video conferences, or both, and provide all tutoring services through live, face-to-face interactions.

(3) The department shall publish the list of high-quality tutoring providers no later than October first of each year beginning in 2023

(4) Approved providers listed by the department shall be exempt from the state procurement laws.

H. Within fifteen calendar days of a parent selecting accelerated instruction, the parent shall be provided a written plan detailing the accelerated instruction that will be provided, including information on who will provide the instruction and when the instruction will be provided. The plan shall include specific dates for progress reports and information on the parent's role in accelerating the student's learning.

I.(1) Each city, parish, or other local public school board shall provide a report by June first of 2022 and 2023 of each year to the state Department of Education on the all of the following:

(a) The number of students identified as needing expanded academic support, the number of students provided each type of academic support, and the number who failed to achieve mastery on any statewide assessment administered pursuant to the state's school and district accountability system during the 2021-2022 each school year continuing to need additional academic support.

(b) A list of the high-quality tutoring providers and any teachers used by the local board to offer the expanded academic supports.

(c) A summary of how the school day has been restructured to offer the expanded academic supports.

(d) The amount and source of funds spent on providing expanded academic supports.

(2) The By July first of each year, the department shall submit a report to the Senate and House committees on education publish a report on its website by July first of 2022 and 2023 summarizing the information required by Paragraph (1) of this Subsection by school, by school system, and statewide.

J. The determination of whether students are in need of additional expanded academic support shall not be used in evaluating teacher performance or determining school or district accountability scores and letter grades.

K.(1) No state funds or obligated federal funds shall be used to implement the provisions of this Section.

(2) If funding that is compliant with Paragraph (1) of this Subsection is unavailable, the state is not obligated to provide funding to continue the expanded academic support provided for in this Section.

To amend and reenact R.S. 36:101(B) and (C)(1) and 107, to enact R.S. 36:108(C) and (D) and Chapter 44 of Title 51 of the Louisiana Revised Statutes of 1950, to be comprised of R.S. 51:2701, relative to the Department of Economic Development; to create the office of port development within the department; to provide for powers and duties of the office; to provide for a commissioner of port development; to provide for a port development advisory commission; to provide for effectiveness; and to provide for related matters

Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana: Section 1. R.S. 36:101(B) and (C)(1) and 107 are hereby amended and reenacted and R.S. 36:108(C) and (D) are hereby enacted to read as follows:

§101. Department of Economic Development; creation; domicile; composition; purposes and functions

B. The Department of Economic Development, through its offices and officers, shall be responsible for fostering the growth of industry, ports, and other commercial enterprises in Louisiana that will contribute to the overall improvement of the economy of the state. The department shall promote the advantages of Louisiana to out-of-state business and industry, facilitate the expansion of existing enterprises, including port development, and coordinate with other state agencies and units of local government plans and programs aimed at developing optimum conditions for new and expanding industrial and commercial enterprises in Louisiana.

C.(1) The Department of Economic Development shall be composed of the executive office of the secretary, the office of management and finance, the office of business development, the office of port development, and such other offices as shall be created by law. * * *

§107. Assistant secretaries

A. Each office within the Department of Economic Development, except the office of management and finance, the office of port development, and the office of entertainment industry development, shall be under the

immediate supervision and direction of an assistant secretary. The office of port development shall be under the immediate supervision and direction of a commissioner of port development. The assistant secretary or commissioner of each such office shall be appointed by the governor with the consent of the Senate. Each shall serve at the pleasure of the governor and shall be paid a salary which shall be fixed by the governor, which salary shall not exceed the amount approved for such position by the legislature while in session.

B. Except as otherwise expressly provided in this Title, the duties and functions of each office and its assistant secretary or commissioner shall be determined by the secretary, and all of such duties and functions shall be exercised under the direct supervision and control of the secretary.

C. Except as otherwise provided in R.S. 36:801, each assistant secretary or commissioner shall employ, appoint, remove, assign, and promote such personnel as is necessary for the efficient administration of his office and its programs and the performance of its powers, duties, functions, and responsibilities, in accordance with applicable civil service laws, rules, and regulations, and with policies and rules of the department, all subject to budgetary control and applicable laws.

D. Each assistant secretary or commissioner shall exercise all powers and authority granted to him in this Title subject to the overall direction and control of the secretary.

§108. Offices; purposes and functions * *

C. The office of port development shall perform the following functions of the state:

(1) Include in various activities the facilities, capacities, and capabilities of ports and intermodal and infrastructure transportation systems functioning in the state.

(2) Develop and implement a statewide port strategic plan, subject to legislative approval by concurrent resolution.

(3) Provide for the attraction, retention, and expansion of industrial and business investments at or near Louisiana ports.

(4) Identify obstacles to growth of Louisiana ports and develop remedies for such obstacles.

(5) Identify sources of nonstate funds for economic development purposes and develop and implement a plan to increase access to these funds.

(6) Cooperate and collaborate with regional and local economic development entities throughout the state with regard to port development.

(7) Perform any other functions as directed by the secretary or governor.

(8) Perform any other functions as suggested by the Port Development Advisory Commission.

D. Notwithstanding any other provision of this Section to the contrary, the Offshore Terminal Authority, including the deepwater ports licensed thereunder, is specifically excluded from this Section and shall remain under

the jurisdiction of the Department of Transportation and Development. Section 2. Chapter 44 of Title 51 of the Louisiana Revised Statutes of 1950, comprised of R.S. 51:2701, is hereby enacted to read as follows:

CHAPTER 44. PORT DEVELOPMENT ADVISORY COMMISSION

§2701. Port Development Advisory Commission

A. The Port Development Advisory Commission is hereby established within the office of port development. It shall be composed of the following:

(1) The secretary of the Department of Economic Development or his designee. (2) The commissioner of multimodal commerce or his designee.

(3) The chairs of the Senate Committee on Commerce, Consumer Protection and International Affairs and the House Committee on Commerce or their designees.

(4) Three representatives of the Ports Association of Louisiana selected by its board of directors, including one representative each representing inland, deepwater, and coastal ports.

(5) Two representatives of the Regional Economic Alliance of Louisiana selected by its membership including one located outside of the coastal zone.

(6) A member of the Senate selected by the president of the Senate.

(7) A member of the House of Representatives selected by the speaker of the House of Representatives.

B. The Port Development Advisory Commission shall meet and develop an operational plan for the 2024 Regular Session of the Legislature for the following:

(1) An allocation of the department employees, equipment, facilities, and funding the commission finds necessary to carry out the functions conferred upon the office of port development by the provisions of R.S. 36:108(C) to become effective on July 1, 2024

(2) The organizational structure of the office of port development, with a further initial allocation of the office's powers, duties, responsibilities, officers, equipment, and employees among the specific divisions provided for in R.S. 36:108(C), to become effective on July 1, 2024.

(3) Proposed legislation for the 2024 Regular Session of the Legislature necessary to implement the operational plan on July 1, 2024.

C. The operational plan of the Port Development Advisory Commission shall be presented to the Senate Committee on Commerce, Consumer Protection and International Affairs and the House Committee on Commerce, meeting jointly, for their review, amendment, and approval no later than February 1, 2024.

D. A majority of the members of the commission shall constitute a quorum for the purpose of taking any action, and actions of the commission may be taken by an affirmative vote of the members of the commission present.

E. The commission shall elect a chairman and may elect other officers as it deems appropriate.

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F. Members of the commission shall serve without compensation, except per diem or expenses reimbursement to which they may be individually entitled as members of the constituent organizations.

G. The department and Senate Legislative Services shall provide staff support for the commission.

H. After July 1, 2024, the commission shall continue to exist in an advisory capacity to the commissioner.

Section 3.(A) The provisions of Section 1 of this Act shall become effective when an Act of the Louisiana Legislature containing a specific appropriation of monies for the implementation of the provisions of this Act becomes effective or July 1, 2024, whichever is later.

(B) The provisions of this Section and Section 2 of this Act shall become effective upon signature by the governor or, if not signed by the governor, upon expiration of the time for bills to become law without signature by the governor, as provided by Article III, Section 18 of the Constitution of Louisiana. If vetoed by the governor and subsequently approved by the legislature, the provisions of this Section and Section 2 of this Act shall become effective on the day following such approval.

AN ACT To enact Chapter 3-G of Title 15 of the Louisiana Revised Statutes of 1950, to be comprised of R.S. 15:563 through 563.3, relative to offenses against minors; to create the Child Abuse and Neglect Registry; to provide relative to registration requirements; to provide for crimes of conviction; to provide for duties of the Louisiana Bureau of Criminal Identification and Information; to provide relative to a public database; to provide for exempt data; to provide relative to restrictions; to provide for duration of registration; to provide relative to implementation; and to provide for related matters.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:

Section 1. Chapter 3-G of Title 15 of the Louisiana Revised Statutes of 1950, comprised of R.S. 15:563 through 563.3, is hereby enacted to read as follows:

CHAPTER 3-G. CHILD ABUSE AND NEGLECT REGISTRY

§563. Registration of persons convicted of child abuse or neglect

A. Any person residing in this state who has pled guilty or nolo contendere to, or has been convicted of, any of the following felony offenses, or who has pled guilty or nolo contendere to, or has been convicted of any conspiracy to commit any of the following felony offenses, where the victim is a minor, as defined in Children's Code Article 116, may be required to register and provide notification as a child abuser in accordance with the provisions of this Chapter:

(1) R.S. 14:34 (Aggravated battery)

(2) R.S. 14:34.1 (Second degree battery)

(3) R.S. 14:34.7 (Aggravated second degree battery)

(4) R.S. 14:35.3 (Domestic abuse battery)

(5) R.S. 14:37.1 (Assault by drive-by shooting)

(6) R.S. 14:37.4 (Aggravated assault with a firearm)

(7) R.S. 14:37.7 (Domestic abuse aggravated assault)

(8) R.S. 14:43.5 (Intentional exposure to HIV)

(9) R.S. 14:46.4 (Re-homing of a child)

(10) R.S. 14:79.1 (Criminal Abandonment)

(11) R.S. 14:93.2.3 (Second degree cruelty to juveniles)

B.(1) Upon conviction, the court shall provide written notification to any person convicted of an offense listed in Subsection A of this Section when the victim is a minor that he shall be required to register on the Child Abuse and Neglect Registry upon release, or as a condition of his probation or parole.

(2) An offender listed in Subsection A of this Section shall register in person with the sheriff of the parish of the person's residence, or residences, if there is more than one, and with the chief of police if the address of any of the person's residences is located in an incorporated area which has a police department. If the offender resides in a municipality with a population in excess of three hundred thousand persons, he shall register in person with the police department of his municipality of residence.

C.(1) No later than three business days after release, the offender shall register and provide all of the following information to the appropriate law enforcement agencies listed in Subsection B of this Section:

(a) Name and any aliases used by the offender.

(b) The offender's physical address or addresses of residence.

(c) Name and physical address of the offender's place of employment. If the offender does not have a fixed place of employment, the offender shall provide information with as much specificity as possible regarding the places where he works, including but not limited to travel routes used by the offender.

(d) Name and physical address of the school in which he is a student.

(e) Two forms of proof of residence for each residential address provided, including but not limited to a driver's license, bill for utility service, and bill for telephone service. If those forms of proof of residence are not available, the offender may provide an affidavit of an adult resident living at the same address. The affidavit shall certify that the affiant understands his obligation to provide written notice in the same manner as provided in R.S. 15:542.1.4(B) to the appropriate law enforcement agency with whom the offender last registered when the offender no longer resides at the residence provided in the affidavit.

(f) The crime for which the offender was convicted and the date and place of such conviction, and if known by the offender, the court in which the conviction was obtained, the docket number of the case, the specific statute under which he was convicted, and the sentence imposed.

(g) A current photograph of the offender.

(h) The offender's telephone numbers, including fixed location phone and mobile phone numbers assigned to the offender or associated with any residence address of the offender.

(i) A description of every motorized vehicle registered to or operated by the offender, including license plate number and vehicle identification number, and a copy of the offender's driver's license or identification card. This information shall be provided prior to the offender's operation of the vehicle.

(j) The offender's social security number and date of birth.

(k) A description of the physical characteristics of the offender, including but not limited to sex, race, hair color, eye color, height, age, weight, scars, tattoos, or other identifying marks on the body of the offender.

(1) Every email address of the offender.

(2) Knowingly providing false information to any law enforcement officer, office, or agency required to receive registration information pursuant to the provisions of this Chapter shall constitute a failure to register and, upon conviction, be fined not more than one thousand dollars and be imprisoned for not more than one year.

D. Upon receipt of the registration information as required by the provisions of this Section, the law enforcement agency shall immediately forward the offender's information to the bureau electronically.

E.(1) The offender registration and notification requirements required by this Chapter are mandatory and shall not be waived or suspended by any court. Any order waiving or suspending offender registration and notification requirements shall be null, void, and of no effect. Any order waiving or suspending registration and notification requirements shall not be construed to invalidate an otherwise valid conviction, unless by joint written motion of the district attorney and the offender.

(2) Notwithstanding the provisions of Paragraph (1) of this Subsection and any other provision of law to the contrary, an offender required to register as a sex offender in accordance with R.S. 15:540 et seq. shall not be required to register pursuant to the provisions of this Chapter.

(3) Notwithstanding the provisions of Paragraph (1) of this Subsection, the court may waive registration and notification requirements for an offender convicted of second degree battery as provided in R.S. 14:34.1.

§563.1. Duties of the Louisiana Bureau of Criminal Identification and Information

A.(1) The Louisiana Bureau of Criminal Identification and Information shall develop and maintain the central registry known as the Child Abuse and Neglect Registry. The registry shall contain the information transmitted to the bureau pursuant to the provisions of this Chapter. Upon receipt of the registration and information of any person subject to the provisions of this Chapter, the bureau shall immediately enter the appropriate information in the public registry. The bureau shall accept electronically submitted information and registration renewal information from law enforcement.

(2)(a) The bureau shall provide for public access to the information contained in the registry, including internet-based access, which shall have field-search capabilities.

(b) Notwithstanding the provisions of Subparagraph (a) of this Paragraph, the following information shall be exempt from public access:

(i) Social security numbers.

(ii) Names of the victims of the offenses requiring registration.

(iii) Telephone numbers, subject to the provisions of Subparagraphs (c) and (d) of this Paragraph.

(iv) Email addresses.

(c) Notwithstanding the provisions of Subparagraph (b) of this Paragraph, which provides for exemptions to public access of telephone numbers, email addresses, online screen names, or other online identities, the registry shall contain the ability to search by telephone numbers, email addresses, online screen names, or other online identities to provide information to the person conducting the search regarding whether or not that information has been linked to a person convicted of an offense in R.S. 15:563(A). This search shall not disclose the name or any other identifying information about the offender to the person conducting the search, except to identify that the information has been linked to a person convicted of an offense in R.S. 15:563(A).

(d) Notwithstanding the provisions of Subparagraphs (b) and (c) of this Paragraph, the bureau shall, upon request by any person or entity in a manner prescribed by the bureau, provide a list of telephone numbers, email addresses, online screen names, static internet protocol addresses, or other online identities of persons in the Child Abuse and Neglect Registry for the purpose of identifying and monitoring a registered user associated with the telephone number, email address, online screen name, static internet protocol address, or other online identity. The information provided to the person or entity shall not disclose the name or other identifying information of the offender that is associated with, or who is using, any of the telephone numbers, email addresses, on other names, static internet protocol addresses, or other online identities in the provided list.

(e) The bureau shall maintain a Child Abuse and Neglect Notification and

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<u>Registration website on the internet, which shall contain a disclaimer informing the public of all of the following:</u>

(i) The information contained on the site is obtained from offenders, and the department does not guarantee its accuracy or completeness.

(ii) Members of the public are not allowed to use the information to harass or threaten offenders or members of their families.

(iii) Harassment, stalking, or threats against offenders or their families are prohibited and doing so may violate Louisiana criminal laws.

B. The bureau shall develop and maintain the registry as to provide for automatic email notifications at the time when an offender begins residence, employment, or school attendance within a certain geographic radius or zip code. This function of the registry shall allow members of the public and organizations to request automatic email notifications to be sent to an email address provided by the requestor for a certain geographic radius or zip code specified by the requestor.

<u>Specified by the requestor.</u> C. The bureau is hereby designated as the state agency to receive information regarding an out-of-state person convicted of a similar offense as those in R.S. 15:563(A) who establishes a residence in this state pursuant to R.S. 15:542.1.3.

D. The bureau may promulgate rules and regulations in accordance with the Administrative Procedure Act to implement the provisions of this Chapter.

E.(1) The bureau shall provide for the capability which would allow a social networking website to compare the database of registered users of that social networking website to the list of electronic mail addresses, instant message addresses, and other similar online identifiers of persons in the Child Abuse and Neglect Registry.

(2) A social networking website desiring to compare its database of registered users to the list of electronic mail addresses, instant message addresses, and other online identifiers of persons in the registry shall provide to the bureau all of the following information:

(a) The name, address, and telephone number of the entity operating the social networking website.

(b) The legal nature and corporate status of the entity operating the social networking website.

(c) A statement signed by the chief legal officer of the social networking website to the effect that the information obtained from the registry shall not be disclosed for any purpose other than for comparing the database of registered users of the social networking website against the list of electronic mail addresses, instant message addresses, and other online identifiers of persons contained in the state registry to protect children from child abuse or neglect, and that disclosure of this information for any other purpose may be unlawful.

(d) The name, address, and telephone number of a natural person who is authorized to receive service of process for the entity operating the social networking website.

(3) After complying with the requirements of Paragraph (2) of this Subsection, the entity operating the social networking website may screen users or compare its database of registered users to the list of electronic mail addresses, instant message addresses, and other online identifiers of persons contained in the Child Abuse or Neglect Registry as frequently as the bureau will allow for the purpose of identifying, monitoring, or removing a registered user associated with electronic mail addresses, instant message addresses, and other online identifiers contained in the registry.

(4) An entity operating a social networking website which complies with the provisions of Paragraphs (2) and (3) of this Subsection, and its directors, officers, employees, or agents may claim such compliance as a defense to a claim for liability arising against the entity or those persons.

§563.2. Duration of registration and notification period

A person required to register pursuant to the provisions of this Chapter shall comply with the requirement for ten years from the date of initial registration for a first offense and for the duration of the lifetime of the offender for a second or subsequent offense, unless the underlying conviction is reversed, set aside, or vacated.

§563.3. Subject to appropriation

The implementation of this Chapter shall be subject to the appropriation of funds by the legislature for this purpose.

Section 2. This Act shall become effective on July 1, 2024. Approved by the Governor, June 28, 2023.

AN ACT

To enact Chapter 53 of Title 34 of the Louisiana Revised Statutes of 1950, to be comprised of R.S. 34:5210 through 5215, relative to the creation of the Southeast Louisiana Port Authority Advisory Commission; to provide for definitions; to establish a board of directors; to specify the purpose, powers, jurisdiction, and duties of the commission; and to provide for related matters.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:

Section 1. Chapter 53 of Title 34 of the Louisiana Revised Statutes of 1950, comprised of R.S. 34:5210 through 5215, is hereby enacted to read as follows: **CHAPTER 53. SOUTHEAST LOUISIANA PORT AUTHORITY**

ADVISORY COMMISSION

§5210. Short title

This Chapter shall be known and may be referred to as the "Southeast Louisiana Port Authority Advisory Act".

<u>§5211. Definitions</u>

The following definitions shall apply:

(1) "Act" shall mean the Southeast Louisiana Port Authority Advisory Act.

(2) "Commission" shall mean the Southeast Louisiana Port Authority Advisory

Commission created by this Chapter.

(3) "Board" shall mean the directors of the commission. (4) "Department" shall mean the Department of Transportation and Development.

(5) "Secretary" shall mean the secretary of the Department of Transportation and Development.

§5212. Purpose; legislative findings

A. The legislature hereby finds and declares it necessary to provide a forum for the exchange of information between the legislature, the department, and commission members representing the maritime port industry located in the parishes of Ascension, East Baton Rouge, Iberville, Jefferson, Orleans, Plaquemines, St. Bernard, St. Charles, St. James, St. John, and West Baton Rouge.

B. The legislature hereby finds and declares that it is a matter of public necessity to create the Southeast Louisiana Port Authority Advisory Commission to provide the legislature and the department a broad perspective regarding maritime ports and transportation-related matters to be considered in formulating department policies concerning the Louisiana maritime port system located along and near the lower Mississippi River.

§5213. Duties

The commission shall be responsible for the following:

A. Prepare a comprehensive one-year, five-year, and ten-year maritime port mission plan and submit the plan to the governor, speaker of the House of Representatives, president of the Senate, Senate and House committees on transportation, highways and public works, and the Senate and House committees on commerce, no later than December first of each year.

B. Review each project eligible to be funded pursuant to R.S. 34:3451 et seq. <u>and make recommendations for approval or disapproval to the legislature.</u>

C. Advise the legislature and the department on matters relating to port authorities.

§5214. Southeast Louisiana Port Authority Advisory Commission; creation; board of commissioners; compensation

A. The Southeast Louisiana Port Authority Advisory Commission is created to assess and make recommendations relative to ports located along the lower Mississippi River in the state of Louisiana.

B. The domicile of the commission shall be East Baton Rouge Parish.

C. There shall be seven commissioners on the board who shall be the governing body and shall be composed as follows:

(1) The chief executive officer of the Port of New Orleans or his designee.

(2) The chief executive officer of the Port of South Louisiana or his designee.

(3) The executive director of the Port of Greater Baton Rouge or his designee. (4) The executive director of the Plaquemines Port, Harbor and Terminal

District or his designee. (5) The executive director of the St. Bernard Port, Harbor and Terminal District or his designee.

(6) The secretary of the Department of Transportation and Development or his designee.

(7) The secretary of Louisiana Economic Development or his designee.

D. Commissioners shall serve as long as they hold their current position as president of their respective port or secretary of their respective agency. The commission shall elect from its members a chairman, a vice chairman, and a secretary-treasurer who shall serve two-year terms.

E. Commissioners shall not be entitled to any salary for the performance of their duties, but each may be reimbursed by their represented entity for actual expenses incurred in the performance of all duties in connection with business of the commission. Commissioners may be reimbursed for mileage expenses incurred for attendance at meetings of the commission. The mileage allowance shall be fixed by the commission in an amount not to exceed the mileage allowance authorized under state travel regulations, at rates and standards as promulgated by the division of administration subject to the availability of funds.

§5215. Meetings; quorum

The commission shall meet at least biannually and may meet more frequently upon call of the chairman. A majority of the commissioners shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of official business. All official actions of the commission shall require an affirmative vote of the commissioners present and voting at any meeting.

AN ACT To amend and reenact R.S. 32:378.2(H) and (M)(2), 414(A)(1)(c)(ii) and (D)(1) (b), and the introductory paragraph of 667(B) and (1)(b), and to enact R.S. 15:307.1 and R.S. 32:378.2(0), relative to ignition interlock devices; to provide standards for compliance with ignition interlock devices; to make technical changes; to provide relative to restricted driver's licenses; to extend the amount of time that a driver is required to have an ignition interlock device upon notice of noncompliance; to provide an ignition interlock affordability plan; and to provide for related matters.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:

Section 1. R.S. 15:307.1 is hereby enacted to read as follows:

§307.1. Ignition interlock affordability

A. The Department of Public Safety and Corrections, office of state police shall promulgate rules and regulations to establish and monitor compliance with an <u>ignition interlock affordability plan for individuals that demonstrate economic</u> hardship who are required to install an ignition interlock device.

B. The requirement to demonstrate economic hardship shall be satisfied if an individual required to have the ignition interlock device is eligible for the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP), Medicaid, Social Security Disability Insurance (SSDI), income from social security, or a judge's order for services of an indigent public defender (IPD) when the defendant demonstrated income below one hundred twenty-five percent of the federal poverty level. C. Individuals that meet the economic hardship standard shall be required to

pay no more than fifty percent of fees assessed by the ignition interlock service center for installation, monthly calibration, lease, and removal of the device.

D. Individuals that meet the economic hardship standard are responsible for any optional services an individual elects, fees related to any noncompliance as provided for in R.S. 32:378.2, state-mandated fees, and any costs related to damaged, missing or unreturned equipment, and recovery of such equipment.

E. Individuals become eligible for the affordability plan on the date that the individual provides the ignition interlock manufacturer, or ignition interlock service center, acceptable documentation verifying that the individual meets the standard for economic hardship. Continued eligibility may be verified at the discretion of the ignition interlock manufacturer or ignition interlock service center. Acceptable forms of documentation shall include an eligibility card or qualifying letter for SNAP, Medicaid, SSDI, or SSI administered by the Social Security Administration, or a judge's order for an indigent public defender as described in this Section. If the documentation does not name the individual required to install the ignition interlock device, the individual shall be required to sign a notarized affidavit provided by the Department of Public Safety and Corrections attesting to his eligibility for SNAP, Medicaid, SSDI, or SSI on a state-approved form.

F. An ignition interlock manufacturer or ignition interlock service center shall not refuse service to an individual that has demonstrated eligibility for the affordability plan in accordance with this Section.

G. An individual who has been refused service, after providing the documentation required in this Section to an ignition interlock manufacturer or ignition interlock service center, may file a complaint with the Department of Public Safety and Corrections, office of state police, applied technology unit. Effective August 1, 2024, all complaints for refusal of service shall be investigated by the office of state police, applied technology unit, within thirty days of receipt of the complaint.

H. If the investigation substantiates the refusal of service, the Department of Public Safety and Corrections, office of state police, applied technology unit, may issue a warning, suspension, or revocation of the certification for the ignition interlock manufacturer or the ignition interlock service center based on the facts of the investigation and the history of complaints related to the manufacturer or service center. An ignition interlock manufacturer or ignition interlock service center may appeal any suspension or revocation issued pursuant to this Subsection.

Section 2. R.S. 32:378.2(H) and (M)(2), 414(A)(1)(c)(ii) and (D)(1)(b), and the introductory paragraph of 667(B) and (1)(b) are hereby amended and reenacted, and R.S. 32:378.2(O) is hereby enacted to read as follows:

§378.2. Ignition interlock devices; condition of probation for certain DWI offenders; restricted license

* * * H. The person whose driving privilege is restricted pursuant to this Section

shall have the system monitored by the manufacturer, at the manufacturer's expense, for proper use at least bi-monthly every thirty days, and more frequently as the court may order, on the operation of each interlocking ignition <u>interlock</u> device in the person's vehicles. A report of such monitoring shall be issued by the manufacturer to the court and the department within fourteen days after the system is monitored. However, the report issued to the department shall be in an electronic format specified by the department.

(a) if the The manufacturer reports to the Department of Public Safety and Corrections that any combination of two of the following violations have occurred in a one-month period, including any repeat violation of the same type once during the period of installation: (a)(i) Tampering with the device.

(c) Failure to bring the ignition interlock device in for required service.

(d) Failure to take or pass a re-test.

(e) Failure to pass a breath test.

(f) Use of the emergency override feature without justification.

(b) The restricted operator fails to have the ignition interlock device serviced

by an approved ignition interlock provider every thirty days, more than two times during the period of installation. (c) The device has recorded any of the following, or any combination of the

following, three or more times in a thirty-day period:

(i) Failure to take or pass an initial breath test where pass is defined as a breath alcohol concentration less than 0.02g of alcohol per 210L of breath.

(ii) Failure to take or pass a retest where pass is defined as a breath alcohol concentration less than 0.02g of alcohol per 210L of breath.

(g)(d) Unauthorized removal of the device.

0.(1) Any driver statutorily required to utilize and maintain an ignition interlock device shall be in and remain in compliance with the standards set forth in Paragraph (M)(2) of this Section. Upon notice to the Department of Public Safety and Corrections of any violations of Paragraph (M)(2) of this Section, the department shall further restrict the driver's license and extend the period the ignition interlock device is required as follows:

(a) One month if the ignition interlock device was installed pursuant to a first offense of any violation provided for in Subsection (B)(1) of this Section.

(b) Six months if the ignition interlock device was installed pursuant to a second or subsequent offense of any violation provided for in Subsection (B)(1) of this Section.

(2) The department shall notify the driver that his driver's license will be restricted for the length of time provided in Paragraph (1) of this Subsection.

(3) A report of such noncompliance shall be issued by the manufacturer to the department in accordance with Subsection H of this Section.

\$414. Suspension, revocation, renewal, and cancellation of licenses; judicial review

A.(1) (c)

(ii) Upon second conviction, if the offender has a blood alcohol concentration of 0.20 percent or greater, his driver's license shall be suspended for four years. The offender shall be eligible for a restricted license after a period of forty-five days of suspension for the remainder of <u>for</u> the four-year period of suspension after he has provided proof to the department that his motor vehicle is equipped with a functioning ignition interlock device. A functioning ignition interlock device shall remain installed on his vehicle during the first three-year period of the four-year period of the suspension of his driver's license.

D.(1)

(b) Any licensee who has had his license suspended for operating a motor vehicle while under the influence of alcoholic beverages under the provisions of this Subsection shall be eligible to apply for a restricted driver's license after a period of twelve months upon proof that his motor vehicle has been equipped with a functioning ignition interlock device. The ignition interlock device shall remain on the motor vehicle for not less than six months from the date the restricted driver's license is granted. In the event that the department fails or refuses to issue the restricted driver's license, the district court for the parish in which the licensee resides may issue an order directing the department to issue the restricted license either by ex parte order or after contradictory hearing. * * *

§667. Seizure of license; circumstances; temporary license

B. If such written request is not made by the end of the thirty-day period, the person's license shall be suspended as follows: (1)

* * *

(b) On or after September 30, 2003, if If the person submitted to the test and the test results show a blood alcohol level of 0.08 percent or above by weight, his driving privileges shall be suspended for ninety days from the date of suspension on first offense violation, without eligibility for a hardship license for the first thirty days, and for three hundred sixty-five days from the date of suspension, without eligibility for a hardship license, on second and subsequent violations occurring within five years of the first offense. If the person was under the age of twenty-one years on the date of the test and the test results show a blood alcohol level of 0.02 percent or above by weight, his driving privileges shall be suspended for one hundred eighty days from the date of suspension.

Section 3. This Act shall be known and may be cited as "Bowling, Coss, and Dufrene Drunk Driving Prevention Act'

AN ACT To amend and reenact R.S. 15:571.3(B)(1)(a) and (D) and 574.4(A)(1)(a) and to enact R.S. 15:571.3(B)(3) and 574.4(A)(1)(c), relative to criminal sentencing; to provide relative to diminution of sentence; to provide for the rate of diminution of sentence for certain circumstances; to provide for parole eligibility; to provide relative to parole eligibility for certain circumstances; and to provide for related matters.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:

Section 1. R.S. 15:571.3(B)(1)(a) and (D) and 574.4(A)(1)(a) are hereby amended and reenacted and R.S. 15:571.3(B)(3) and 574.4(A)(1)(c) are hereby enacted to read as follows:

§571.3. Diminution of sentence for good behavior

B.(1)(a) Unless otherwise prohibited, every offender in the custody of the department who has been convicted of a felony, except an offender convicted a second time of a crime of violence as defined by R.S. 14:2(B) or an offender convicted a fourth or subsequent time of a nonviolent felony offense, and sentenced to imprisonment for a stated number of years or months, may earn, in lieu of incentive wages, a diminution of sentence by good behavior and performance of work or self-improvement activities, or both, to be known as 'good time". Those offenders serving life sentences will be credited with good time earned which will be applied toward diminution of their sentences at such time as the life sentences might be commuted to a specific number of years. The secretary shall establish regulations for awarding and recording of good time and shall determine when good time has been earned toward diminution of sentence. The amount of diminution of sentence allowed under the provisions of this Section shall be at the rate of thirteen days for every seven days in actual custody served on the imposed sentence, including time spent in custody with good behavior prior to sentencing for the particular sentence imposed as authorized by the provisions of Code of Criminal Procedure Article 880. * * *

(3) An offender convicted of a fourth or subsequent nonviolent felony offense shall earn a diminution of sentence at a rate of one day for every two days in actual custody held on the imposed sentence, including time spent in custody with good behavior prior to sentencing for the particular sentence imposed as authorized by Code of Criminal Procedure Article 880. The provisions of this Paragraph shall not apply to any person who has been convicted of a sex offense as defined in R.S. 15:541.

D.(1) Diminution of sentence shall not be allowed for an offender in a parish prison or in the custody of the Department of Public Safety and Corrections if the instant offense is a second offense crime of violence as defined by R.S. 14:2(B)

(2) Diminution of sentence shall not be allowed for an offender in a parish prison or in the custody of the Department of Public Safety and Corrections if the instant offense is a sex offense as defined by R.S. 15:541.

§574.4. Parole; eligibility; juvenile offenders

A.(1)(a) Unless eligible at an earlier date, a person otherwise eligible for parole shall be eligible for parole consideration upon serving twenty-five percent of the sentence imposed. The provisions of this Subparagraph shall not apply to any person whose instant offense is a crime of violence as defined in R.S. 14:2(B), a sex offense as defined in R.S. 15:541, or any offense which would constitute a crime of violence as defined in R.S. 14:2(B) or a sex offense as defined in R.S. 15:541, or whose instant offense is a fourth or subsequent conviction of a nonviolent felony offense, regardless of the date of conviction. Notwithstanding any provisions of law to the contrary, the provisions of this Subparagraph shall be applicable to persons convicted of offenses prior to and on or after November 1, 2017. * * *

(c) A person, otherwise eligible for parole, whose instant offense is a fourth or subsequent conviction of a nonviolent felony offense, shall be eligible for parole consideration upon serving sixty-five percent of the sentence imposed. The provisions of this Subparagraph shall not apply to any person who has been convicted of a sex offense as defined in R.S. 15:541.

AN ACT

To enact R.S. 9:2717.1, relative to contracts; to provide relative to foreign adversaries or persons connected with foreign adversaries; to prohibit the acquisition of immovable property; to provide for prospective application; to provide for actions and investigations by the attorney general; to provide for attorney fees and court costs; to provide relative to judgments; to provide for civil forfeiture; to provide for exceptions; to provide for definitions; and to provide for related matters.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:

Section 1. R.S. 9:2717.1 is hereby enacted to read as follows:

<u>§2717.1.</u> Prohibition of acquisition of immovable property by a foreign adversary or a person connected with a foreign adversary

A.(1) No foreign adversary or person connected with a foreign adversary may purchase, lease, or otherwise acquire immovable property in this state.

(2) A party to a contract to purchase, lease, or otherwise acquire immovable property may rescind the contract prior to the transfer of the immovable property if the party determines that the purchaser or lessee is a foreign adversary or a person connected with a foreign adversary.

(3) The provisions of this Section are applicable to contracts entered into by a foreign adversary or person connected with a foreign adversary to purchase, lease, or otherwise acquire immovable property after August 1, 2023. These provisions are not applicable to existing contracts to purchase, lease, or otherwise acquire immovable property or the renewal of existing leases that were in place prior to August 1, 2023.

(4) A person may conclusively rely upon an affidavit made by a person intended to acquire or holding an interest in immovable property to the effect that the person is neither a foreign adversary nor a person connected with a foreign adversary, and the correctness of those facts may not be controverted against a person relying on the affidavit, unless actual fraud by such person is proved. A person who gives a false affidavit shall be responsible for any loss or damage suffered by any person whose rights are adversely affected.

(5) No seller or lessor shall be liable pursuant to this Section, except a foreign adversary or a person connected with a foreign adversary that is required to forfeit or dispose of property pursuant to a court order as provided for in Subsection C of this Section.

B.(1) The attorney general may bring an action for injunctive relief in the name of the state against the foreign adversary or the person connected with a foreign adversary to enjoin the property transfer prior to the transfer of the immovable property. The attorney general shall serve the petition for injunctive relief upon all parties to the transaction.

(2) If the transfer or lease of the property has been completed, the attorney general may bring an action in the name of the state against the foreign adversary or a person connected with a foreign adversary.

(3) Any action by the attorney general may be brought in the district court having civil jurisdiction in any parish in which a portion of the immovable property is located, and the attorney general may recover reasonable attorney fees and court costs.

(4) The attorney general may open an investigation if any of the following exist:

(a) The attorney general has evidence that a foreign adversary or a person connected with a foreign adversary is attempting to enter into, conspiring to enter into, or has entered into a contract to purchase, lease, or otherwise acquire immovable property in this state.

(b) The attorney general believes it to be in the public interest that an investigation needs to be made to ascertain whether a foreign adversary or a person connected with a foreign adversary in fact is attempting to enter into, conspiring to enter into, or has entered into a contract to purchase, lease, or otherwise acquire immovable property in this state.

(5) If an action is brought pursuant to this Section then no later than one business day after filing the action, the attorney general shall record in the public mortgage records of the parish clerk of court of each parish in which any portion of the immovable property is located a notice of pendency of the action pursuant to Code of Civil Procedure Article 3751 et seq. The institution of the action and the recordation of the notice of pendency of the action shall have no effect on persons obtaining rights in the immovable property prior to the recordation of the petition. The attorney general shall cause the notice of pendency of action to be cancelled from the mortgage records no later than one business day after judgment is rendered or after a request for cancellation is made by any interested party in connection with the transfer of the property to a person other than a foreign adversary or person connected with a foreign adversary. If the notice of pendency of action relates to a property interested vested in a foreign adversary or person connected with a foreign adversary, the attorney general may petition the court for an order requiring the proceeds of the sale attributable to the property interest of the foreign adversary or person connected with a foreign adversary after the deduction of payments to mortgagees, lienholders, person providing services in connection with the transfer of the property, and credits to the purchaser relating to tax and other customary prorations, be deposited in the registry of the court in which the proceeding is pending.

(6) Prior to bringing an action pursuant to this Section, the attorney general shall provide written notice to the holder of each mortgage, lien, privilege, and other encumbrance encumbering the subject immovable property, which is filed in the public mortgage records in the parish where the immovable property is located. Such notice shall be provided in the same manner as provided in R.S. 40:2608 or R.S. 14:90.1.

C.(1) If the court finds that a foreign adversary or person connected with a foreign adversary has purchased, leased, or otherwise acquired property in Louisiana after August 1, 2023, the court may do one of the following:

(a) Order that the foreign adversary's interest in the property be sold to a person who is not a foreign adversary or to a person who is not connected to a foreign adversary.

(b) Order that the foreign adversary or person connected with a foreign adversary's interest in the property be sold at a judicial sale in accordance with the requirements of Code of Civil Procedure Article 2331 et seq.

(c) Under Subparagraphs (a) and (b) of this Paragraph, the court shall order that the price of the sale be not less than the sum of all of the following:

(i) Ad valorem taxes and other liens

<u>Payable to a political subdivision of the State which are due or past due and attributable to the property.</u>

(ii) Indebtedness, including interests, penalties, attorney fees, court costs, and other expenses, secured by a conventional mortgage on the property or any portion of the property.

(iii) Indebtedness, including interest, penalties, attorney fees, and court costs, secured by a judicial or legal mortgage on the property.

(iv) Indebtedness, including interest, penalties, attorney fees, and court costs, secured by a lien or privilege on the property.

(v) Commissions due to a real estate broker or real estate agent.

(vi) Costs related to the perfection of the sale.

(2) After satisfying all mortgages, liens, privileges, and other encumbrances encumbering the property subject to this Section, and payment of all persons providing services in connection with the transfer of the property, sheriff's fees, and credits to the purchaser relating to tax and other customary prorations, the remaining proceeds of the sale provided by this Subsection shall be considered a civil asset forfeiture and the money shall be paid to the Department of Justice to fund services for veterans of foreign wars. The attorney general may also enter into cooperative endeavor agreements with other state agencies or local governments to provide services for veterans who suffer from injury or disability as a result of a foreign war.

D.(1) All proceedings under this Section shall be made with due provisions to protect the rights of any person unless the attorney general proves beyond a reasonable doubt that the person entered into the transaction with the foreign adversary or person connected with a foreign adversary for the purpose of aiding such foreign adversary or person connected with a foreign adversary in compromising the security of the United States.

(2) No mortgage, lien, privilege, or other security interest recognized under the laws of this state and no ownership interest in indivision, lease, servitude, usufruct, right of use, bond for deed, or other real right shall be affected by a forfeiture or disposition pursuant to this Section.

(3) No forfeiture or disposition under this Section shall affect the rights of any person unless the attorney general proves beyond a reasonable doubt that the person entered into the transaction with the foreign adversary or person connected with a foreign adversary with the purpose of aiding such foreign adversary or person connected with a foreign adversary in compromising the security of the United States.

E. No attorney, title insurer, title insurance producer, title insurance agency producer, lender, mortgage loan servicer, notary public, real estate agent, real estate broker, seller, or lessor shall have a duty to make any investigation as to whether a party to a transaction involving immovable property is a foreign adversary, nor shall any such person be liable for failing to identify that a party to a transaction involving immovable property is a foreign adversary.

F. The provisions of this Section shall not apply to any of the following:

(1) A natural person who is an American citizen, regardless of whether the United States citizenship was acquired by birth or the United States citizenship was granted to a person after meeting the requirements established by the United States Congress in the Immigration and Nationality Act, 8 U.S.C. 1158, et seq.

(2) A person who is not a United States citizen but is a permanent legal resident or is lawfully present in the United States by virtue of authorization by the United States Department of Homeland Security.

(3) A juridical person, as defined in Civil Code Article 24, that is wholly owned by persons who qualify under Paragraphs (1) and (2) of this Subsection.
 (4) Immovable property purchased, leased, or otherwise acquired by a natural person that is used as a one to four family residential property.

(5) A juridical person that owned and conducted oil and gas operations located in Louisiana prior to July 1, 2023, and that is granted permissions by a General License issued by the United States Department of the Treasury, Office of Foreign Assets Control (OFAC General License) and that purchases or acquires property in Louisiana with a party or parties that are subject to the OFAC General License.

<u>G. For the purposes of this Section:</u>

(1) "Foreign adversary" means an individual or a government identified as a foreign adversary in 15 CFR 7.4(a) and identified in the database maintained by the United States Department of Treasury, Office of Foreign Assets Control.
 (2) "Person connected with a foreign adversary" means the juridical person, as defined in Civil Code Article 24, in which the foreign adversary has

the power to direct or cause the direction of the management or policies of the juridical person whether through ownership of securities, by contract, or otherwise. A person or entity that directly or indirectly has the right to vote fifty percent or more of the voting interests of an entity or is entitled to fifty percent or more of its profits is presumed to have the power to direct or cause the direction of the management or policies of the juridical person.

H. This Act shall apply only to property acquired by a foreign adversary or person connected with a foreign adversary on or after August 1, 2023. If a foreign adversary or person connected with a foreign adversary acquires immovable property despite the prohibitions as provided in this Section, the property shall only be subject to forfeiture during the period in which the prohibited foreign adversary or person connected with a foreign adversary owns the property. Rights in immovable property shall not be void or voidable because the property or right held in the property was previously held by a prohibited foreign adversary or person connected with a foreign adversary.

ACT No. 465

HOUSE BILL NO. 2 BY REPRESENTATIVE BISHOP AN ACT

To provide with respect to the capital outlay budget and the capital outlay program for state government, state institutions, and other public entities; to provide for the designation of projects and improvements; to provide for the financing thereof making appropriations from certain sources; and to provide for related matters.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:

Section 1. The following sums or so much thereof as may be necessary are hereby appropriated out of any monies in the state treasury from the sources specified, from federal funds and self-generated revenues belonging to the state of Louisiana and/or collected by boards, commissions, departments, and agencies thereof, all for making capital outlay and for the purposes and in the amounts specified herein for the Fiscal Year commencing July 1, 2023, and ending June 30, 2024, subject to the conditions thereafter provided:

A project with funding

Payable from General Obligation Bonds Priority 1 indicates that the funding for the project includes the reauthorization of funding which was previously granted as a line of credit by the State Bond Commission in Fiscal Year 2022-2023. As used in this Section, the term "general obligation bonds" means state general obligation bonds or other evidences of indebtedness

Payable from the Bond Security and Redemption Fund. The amount set forth in this Section opposite each project, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated and

Payable from the source of funding indicated; provided, however, amounts appropriated and

Payable from federal funds may be encumbered or expended only to the extent such amounts shall have been committed or received. Pursuant to the provisions of R.S. 39:82, funds for planning, acquisition, construction, and major repair projects appropriated by this Act may be retained until completion of the project, even if no bona fide liability exists on the last day of the fiscal year.

This Act shall constitute the comprehensive state capital outlay budget for the 2023-2024 Fiscal Year. Projects set forth which are

Payable from the proceeds available from the sale of general obligation bonds shall have the priorities as indicated. The Request for Line of Credit form used by the attorney general and Bond Counsel in evaluating Louisiana Constitutional, Internal Revenue Code, and applicable income tax regulations shall be filed with the commissioner of administration, State Bond Commission, and state attorney general. No general obligation bond cash lines of credit shall be granted to fund any lower priority project prior to the granting of general obligation bond cash lines of credit to fund all higher priority projects (the "general rule"), except as hereinafter provided. This prohibition against funding a lower priority project shall not apply upon a showing of an impossibility or impracticality either to proceed with all unfunded higher priority projects or to proceed with the funding of such projects or any part thereof through the issuance of general obligation bonds for any reason. Such showing shall be stated in reasonable detail in a certificate or certificates signed by the state agency responsible for administering the funding, and filed with the commissioner of administration and the State Bond Commission (hereinafter referred to as "the Commission"). Upon a determination by the Commission that proceeding with such a project or the funding thereof through the issuance of general obligation bonds is impractical or impossible, the Commission may then proceed with the sale of general obligation bonds or the granting of cash lines of credit without regard to the priority of the unfunded projects determined to be impossible or impractical

Upon recommendation by the state agency responsible for administering the funding, if it is determined at any time that proceeding with the project or with the funding thereof is no longer impossible or impractical, the State Bond Commission may rescind the certificate of impossibility or impracticality and may proceed with the project or with the issuance of general obligation

bonds or the granting of cash lines of credit to fund the project. Alternatively, the Interim Emergency Board (hereinafter referred to as "the Board"), upon reviewing certificates as described above and determining that proceeding with such projects or the funding thereof through the issuance of general obligation bonds is impossible or impractical, may designate a lower priority for such projects. The Board's determination and lower priority designation shall be submitted to the members of the legislature for their approval in accordance with the provisions of Chapter 3-B of Subtitle I of Title 39 of the Louisiana Revised Statutes of 1950. In accordance with the provisions of Chapter 3-B of Subtitle I of Title 39 of the Louisiana Revised Statutes of 1950, whenever at the written request of the appropriate legislators and agency, the Board determines that an adjustment to a project description originally set forth in such capital budget adopted by the legislature for a current fiscal year is necessary to correct a mistake in a project description, clarify a description, change the scope of a description, or make any other adjustment the Board deems necessary to implement the purpose of the project, such adjustment shall become effective only upon the approval by majority vote of the elected members of each house of the legislature in the manner provided for in Chapter 3-B of Subtitle I of Title 39 of the Louisiana Revised Statutes of 1950.

If such approval is granted, notification by the chair or secretary of the Board of the results of the balloting shall be transmitted to the State Bond Commission, which may then proceed with the sale of general obligation bonds or the granting of cash lines of credit for each change approved upon request of the commissioner of administration in accordance with the general rule.

With respect to Priorities 1 through 5, a lower priority project may be moved to a higher priority only upon a showing of an emergency or other cause not reasonably anticipated by the legislature, which shall be stated in reasonable detail in a certificate signed by the head of the appropriate department, political subdivision, or agency and filed with the commissioner of administration and the Board. Upon a determination by the Board that such project should be moved to a higher priority because of an emergency or other cause not reasonably anticipated by the legislature, the Board shall designate a higher priority to the project. The matter then shall be submitted to and be subject to the same approval by the members of the legislature in the manner previously indicated in this Section. If such approval is granted, notification by the chair or secretary of the Board of the change of priority shall be transmitted to the State Bond Commission, which then upon request of the commissioner of administration, may proceed with the sale of general obligation bonds or the granting of cash lines of credit in accordance with the general rule. As to projects within a priority, the State Bond Commission acting on requests submitted by the commissioner of administration shall determine when such project, or phases thereof, shall be funded. In making such determination, the State Bond Commission shall consider the amount of proceeds of general obligation bonds to be made available in light of money and capital market conditions; the expenditure requirements of the project; the time required for architectural plans and drawings, public bidding, and site acquisition and preparation; availability of receipt of federal monies; litigation affecting the undertaking or completion of a project; federal tax laws and regulations regarding the sale of municipal bonds; and other items of a similar nature bearing upon the possibility or the necessity to commence a project or any particular phase thereof.

Any other provision of this Act to the contrary notwithstanding, projects described in Priority 5 of this Act shall not be moved to a higher priority except upon one of the following conditions: (1) Funding is necessary to complete or additionally fund a project located elsewhere in the Capital Outlay Act. Determination of such condition shall be made by the head of the appropriate department or agency by means of a certificate to that effect filed with the Interim Emergency Board, who shall, by mail ballot, request approval of such change and if approved by a majority of each house of the legislature it shall be funded, or (2) unless required by an emergency or other cause not reasonably anticipated by the legislature, to be in accordance with procedures set forth in this Section. However, the State Bond Commission may authorize a non-cash line of credit for any project in Priority 5 which represents that portion of construction contracts which were let during a previous fiscal year, or construction contracts which will be let during the current fiscal year, but which will not require cash expenditures during the year. Such non-cash lines of credit, when combined with previously sold bonds or with higher priority bonds or lines of credit, or with funds appropriated from other sources, will provide sufficient appropriated funds to award equipment or construction contracts. Contracts shall not be awarded without approval of the division of administration.

Upon approval by the State Bond Commission, and subject to compliance with its policies and procedures and the procedures set forth herein, a line of credit providing for the use of funds in anticipation of the sale of general obligation bonds may be granted to the appropriate administering agency or department from the Comprehensive Capital Outlay Escrow Account, or if there is not a sufficient amount available in such account, from other available state cash in the state treasury, for capital improvement projects for which bond proceeds are appropriated by a current capital budget, prior to the actual issuance of bonds for such projects, unless the attorney general advises that an impediment exists to the valid issuance of the bonds on the date such line of credit is granted.

All bonds that are to be repaid, in whole or in part, by revenues generated by the project shall be designated as "Reimbursement Bonds." The State Bond

Commission shall enter into such agreements as are necessary to provide that the agency or subdivision, whose project is reimbursable, shall pay the bond debt costs into the Bond Security and Redemption Fund. Such costs may be paid annually or at the end of the term of the bonds issued as determined by the State Bond Commission.

Priority 1 general obligation bond funding shall be limited to:

(1) Projects and amounts which were previously authorized by Act 117 of the 2022 Regular Session of the Legislature; and which were granted cash lines of credit by the State Bond Commission. The bonds to fund these projects were not sold in Fiscal Year 2022-2023.

(2) The reauthorization of the portion of the outstanding Fiscal Year 2022-2023 Priority 5 Non-Cash Lines of Credit for projects which will require cash expenditures in

Fiscal Year 2023-2024 and therefore must be converted to Cash Lines of Credit in Fiscal

Year 2023-2024.

(3) Commitments made in the Higher Education Desegregation Settlement Agreement.

Priority 2 general obligation bond projects are for the completion of plans and specifications, land acquisition, site preparation, or for construction which will begin during the fiscal year. It is presently anticipated that the listed projects will require the sale of bonds or extension of lines of credit during the fiscal year after adoption of this Act.

Priority 3 general obligation bond projects are for the preparation of plans and specifications, land acquisition, site preparation, or for construction and shall be limited to funding for the portion of construction contracts which will not require cash expenditures during the fiscal year. The projects in this category shall be considered future year projects in the state's five-year capital outlay plan. It is presently anticipated that the listed projects will not require the sale of bonds or extension of lines of credit during the fiscal year. Priority 4 general obligation bond projects are for the preparation of plans

and specifications, land acquisition, site preparation, or for construction and shall be limited to funding for the portion of construction contracts which will not require cash expenditures during the fiscal year. The projects in this category shall be considered future year projects in the state's five-year capital outlay plan. It is presently anticipated that the listed projects will not require the sale of bonds or extension of lines of credit during the fiscal year.

Priority 5 general obligation bond funding shall be limited to funding for the portion of construction contracts which will not require cash expenditures during the fiscal year. These funds, when combined with previously sold bonds or with higher priority bonds on lines of credit, or with funds appropriated from other sources, will provide sufficient appropriated funds to award contracts. Non-cash lines of credit shall be required prior to the award of these contracts.

In accordance with the cash management plan adopted pursuant to R.S. 48:251(D) and the provisions of Act 161 of the 1998 First Extraordinary Session, the Department of Transportation and Development is authorized to enter into contracts or agreements for projects approved pursuant to the Highway Priority Program, Airport Construction and Development Priority Program, Port Construction and Development Priority Program, and Statewide Flood Control Program for projects bid and awarded, authorized, or commenced during the fiscal year which do not require cash expenditures for the full contract or agreement amount.

Notwithstanding anything contained in this Capital Outlay Act, or any previous Capital Outlay Act to the contrary, or any other provision of law, the Division of Administration may finance the design, construction, furnishing and equipping of facilities through the issuance of revenue bonds by the Office Facilities Corporation to be secured by and

Payable from State appropriations. The issuance of such revenue bonds shall require the approval of the State Bond Commission.

Section 2.(A) The expenditure of funds appropriated in this Act shall be in conformity to all existing statutes relative to public bidding, contractual review, and R.S. 39:101 through 128 and any other statutes affecting the capital outlay program for state government, state institutions, and political entities.

(B) Notwithstanding the provisions of R.S. 39:101, 102, and 112(C), projects included in Section 1 of this Act which did not submit a capital outlay application by November 1, 2022, in compliance with the provisions of R.S. 39:101 and 102 and which have not received late approval as required by R.S. 39:112(C) are hereby deemed to have until June 15, 2023, to submit a capital outlay budget request application pursuant to R.S. 39:101(A), and if the application is submitted by that date, the project is deemed to have complied with the late approval requirements of R.S. 39:112(C). Additionally, the capital outlay budget requests together with supporting information and documents for these projects shall constitute the feasibility study required by Article VII, Section 11(C) of the Constitution of Louisiana.

Section 3. Payment for projects specified in this Act must be made by warrant submitted to the division of administration, Department of Transportation and Development, the state treasurer or other administering agency as provided in Section 8, whichever is appropriate, only to the extent of funds required for immediate payment. Copies of invoices or other supporting documentation shall be submitted with warrants. In the event that any equipment included in this Act, is procured pursuant to the provisions of the State Lease-Purchase Act, R.S. 39:1761 et seq., the amounts included in this Act for each such piece of equipment shall not be appropriated. The provisions of R.S. 39:1771 which require equipment to be leased under the State Lease-Purchase Act to be included in the executive budget and approved by the legislature through inclusion in the General Appropriation Act shall be considered waived upon the inclusion of such equipment in this Act. Projects contained in this Act may, at the direction of the division of administration and with the approval of the State Bond Commission, alternatively be funded through

financing programs heretofore or hereafter provided by a public trust and public corporation duly organized pursuant to R.S. 9:2341 et seq., having for its beneficiary the state and the Louisiana Local Government Environmental Facilities and Community Development Authority, pursuant to R.S. 33:4548.1 et seq.

Section 4. If at any time during the Fiscal Year 2023-2024, the governor should find, or the Joint Legislative Committee on the Budget or the commissioner of administration should report to the governor, that the receipts of the treasury are falling short or appear likely to fall short of the revenue estimates for the fiscal year and that a cash deficit is likely to be incurred, the governor shall take such steps as deemed necessary to prevent the occurrence of a cash deficit. In the event that a capital outlay project funded in this Act falls under an agency which is abolished or for which funds are not appropriated in the 2023-2024 General Appropriation Act, then the funds appropriated in this Act for such capital outlay projects shall not be expended unless deemed necessary by the governor to protect life or property. In the event that legislation is enacted which transfers facilities or programs for which projects are funded in this Act, on behalf of one agency, institution, department, or management board to another agency, institution, department, or management board, then the projects in this Act shall be deemed transferred also.

Section 5. All monies appropriated by this Act and any applicable funds of a prior capital outlay budget act adopted by the legislature shall be deposited by the state treasurer in the Comprehensive Capital Outlay Escrow Account, established by this Section, in the state treasury. In accordance with R.S. 36:764, no later than sixty days following the end of each quarter, the state treasurer shall report to the Joint Legislative Committee on the Budget and the commissioner of administration, all funds contained in the Miscellaneous Fund of the Comprehensive Capital Outlay Escrow Account. Notwithstanding any provisions contained herein or other law to the contrary, any original issue premium or accrued interest proceeds received pursuant to the sale of general obligation bonds shall remain on deposit to the credit of the Bond Security and Redemption Fund until such time as they may be utilized in accordance with U.S. Department of the Treasury Regulations promulgated pursuant to the Internal Revenue Code of 1986. All such monies shall be administered according to the particular act pertaining to the fiscal year in which such monies were appropriated. If it is determined by the director of the office of facility planning and control, division of administration, that the funds appropriated by this Act or any prior capital outlay budget Act are not sufficient to complete the projects contained in any capital outlay budget Act, through unavoidable deficiencies in appropriation, including administrative and legal requirements, the commissioner of administration, subject to approval of the Joint Legislative Committee on the Budget, may direct the use of interest earned from the investment of general obligation bond or note proceeds in the Comprehensive Capital Outlay Escrow Account, not to exceed an aggregate of five million dollars in any one fiscal year, for the purpose of completing the projects contained in any capital outlay budget Act and such money shall be deemed appropriated in specific amounts necessary for such purpose. All appropriations in this Act which are made as additions to funds for previously authorized projects shall be included, for accounting purposes, in the account of the previously authorized projects. If it is determined by the director of the office of facility planning and control, division of administration, that it is cost effective and practical to combine individual appropriations, the commissioner of administration, subject to the approval of the Joint Legislative Committee on the Budget, may direct that two or more appropriations or parts thereof may be combined into a single project for accounting and audit purposes. The commissioner of administration may direct that funding in the various statewide and/or multiple parish projects for improvements for state facilities may be transferred to any project, in this Act or any previous Capital Outlay Act, which require supplemental funding for improvements for state facilities which qualify for funding through the various statewide and/or multiple parish projects for improvements for state facilities. The office of facility planning and control, division of administration is authorized to receive settlements and vendor rebates and to add a portion or all of these receipts to the existing project funds relating to the settlement and/or vendor rebates and appropriated in this Act or any previous Capital Outlay Act including those previously appropriated funds that become unavailable. Approval of the Joint Legislative Committee on the Budget will be obtained if the settlement and/or vendor rebates will be added to any projects in this Act or any previous Capital Outlay Act which are unrelated to the project from which the settlement and/or vendor rebates were received. The office of facility planning and control, division of administration is authorized to receive insurance payments and are hereby authorized to immediately repair facilities that suffer insurance losses without those projects being included in the Act and shall report to the Joint Legislative Committee on the Budget any expenditures from insurance funds received pursuant to this section. A portion, as determined by the commissioner of administration and not to exceed one percent (1%), of the funding for projects which qualify for the Percent for Art Program and not to exceed \$450,000 for an individual, qualifying project, may be transferred from the qualifying project budgets, to the Department of Culture, Recreation and Tourism for costs of acquiring art and administering the program. For all Percent for Art Program projects in this or any previous capital outlay, up to ten percent (10%) of the aforementioned one percent (1%) may be used for the costs of administering the projects.

Section 6. No later than February 1, 2024, agencies administering capital outlay projects will submit reports identifying completed projects and cash

balances to the Joint Legislative Committee on Capital Outlay pursuant to the reporting requirements of R.S. 39:105 and R.S. 39:116.

Section 7. The commissioner of administration, with the approval of the Joint Legislative Committee on the Budget, is authorized to supplement or substitute the appropriations specified in this or previous capital outlay acts with any federal or other funds which are or may become available and such funds shall be deemed appropriated in specific amounts necessary for the purposes of this Act. Any funds received by the State Bond Commission as a result of a prepayment of reimbursement contracts as authorized by law and the policy and procedure for reimbursement contracts of the Department of Treasury, office of State Bond Commission, shall be deemed available and appropriated in specific amounts necessary for the purposes of this Act pursuant to the procedure set forth in this section.

Section 8.(A) All projects herein authorized and funded shall be subject to the provisions of R.S. 39:101 through 128. With the exception of appropriations made to the Department of Military Affairs, the Legislature, the Louisiana Stadium and Exposition District, the Department of Economic Development, the Coastal Protection and Restoration Authority, the Division of Administration for Supplemental State Funds for Local Government Assistance Program, the Division of Administration for the Community Water Enrichment Program or the Department of Transportation and Development, all funds herein appropriated shall be considered as having been appropriated directly to the Office of Facility Planning and Control, Division of Administration. All cooperative endeavor agreements for nonstate entities shall be prepared by the appropriate administering agency and submitted to the office of State Procurement for review and approval. As part of its review, the office of State Procurement shall consult with bond counsel to the State relative to any federal tax issues.

(1) Notwithstanding anything contained in this act to the contrary or any other provision of law, the appropriations made for the Louisiana Stadium and Exposition District shall be appropriated directly to the Louisiana Stadium and Exposition District, and are public purposes pursuant to the provisions of Article VII, Section 14 of the Constitution of Louisiana primarily for economic development, including the generation of tax revenue, creation of jobs, and the generation of tourism, and may be used to reimburse any expenditure made prior to the granting of a line of credit or the sale of bonds by the State Bond Commission, determination by the State Treasurer that cash funding has been deposited in the Comprehensive Capital Outlay Escrow Account for the project.

(2) Further, with respect to appropriations to the Louisiana Stadium and Exposition District for the TPC Louisiana, Planning and Construction project, the Louisiana Stadium and Exposition District shall be permitted to use alternative competitive procurement and delivery methods for the award of any contracts to be funded through such appropriation.

(3) The Louisiana Stadium and Exposition District shall have the authority to directly appoint a design professional from a list of a minimum of three architectural firms or joint ventures with professional sports facility design experience acceptable to the Commissioner of Administration and shall be exempt from other state requirements for selection of designers. The design professional fee shall be in accordance with state guidelines administered by the Office of Facility Planning and Control, Division of Administration.

(B)(1)(a) Funds appropriated in the Capital Outlay Act under the name of non-state entities shall be administered by the Office of Facility Planning and Control, Division of Administration under cooperative endeavor agreements; however, projects involving state or federal highways may be administered by the Department of Transportation and Development, if appropriate. Except as provided in Section 8(A), cooperative endeavor agreements entered into pursuant to appropriations in this Act shall not be required to be submitted to the Division of Administration, Office of State Procurement.

to the Division of Administration, Office of State Procurement. (b) Further, for all projects in the Capital Outlay Act or a previous Capital Outlay Act which are appropriated to the Office of Facility Planning and Control, Division of Administration, including those administered by cooperative endeavor agreements, up to six percent of each line-item may be used for costs of administering the projects.

(c) For all projects in Capital Outlay Act or a previous Capital Outlay Act appropriated to the Department of Transportation and Development, up to six percent of each line-item may be used for costs of administering the projects, or for field engineering/construction supervision.

(2) Notwithstanding anything in this Act, or a previous Capital Outlay Act, the Office of Facility Planning and Control may enter into a cooperative endeavor agreement with the Archdiocese of New Orleans and Jefferson Parish for the Preservation and Restoration of Historic Structure for Hope Haven/Madonna Manor Campus, Planning and Construction project.

(C) Line-item general obligation bond projects appropriated to the Department of Transportation and Development in the Capital Outlay Act or a previous Capital Outlay Act shall be authorized to draw Transportation Trust Funds from the Highway Program appropriation, for supplemental funding on overruns in excess of the original estimated project cost as determined by the Department of Transportation and Development, provided however that said projects are in the state or federal highway system and in the priority program, and the overrun is less than \$50,000. Any such overrun of \$50,000 or more must be approved by the Joint Legislative Committee on the Budget.

(D) All ports, levee districts and other non-state entities must follow the provisions of R.S. 39:122.

(E) Pursuant to R.S. 39:122(B)(2), funds to be reimbursed by the state which

a non-state entity attempts to obligate prior to the receipt of funding shall not be eligible for reimbursement or payment by the state; however,

(1) Notwithstanding anything in this Act or any previous Capital Outlay Acts to the contrary, contracts may be entered into for the Lafayette Economic Development Authority, Lafayette Innovation Center (Lafayette) prior to the receipt of funding and the State is authorized to financially participate in obligations created by such contracts.

(2) Notwithstanding anything in this Act or the capital outlay act to the contrary, contracts may be entered into for the City of Broussard, Lake Talon Road Sewer Improvements, Planning and Construction project prior to receipt of funding and the State is authorized to financially participate in obligations created by such contracts.

(3) Notwithstanding anything contained in this Act or any other provision of law, Lafayette Parish is authorized to execute contracts for the Bayou Vermilion Flood Control project prior to execution of a cooperative endeavor agreement, the granting of a line of credit or the sale of bonds. The appropriation for this project may be used to pay any obligation incurred or to reimburse any expenditure made pursuant to such contracts unless the Commissioner of Administration is advised by bond counsel to the state that such may violate federal tax law. The office of facility planning and control shall consult with bond counsel to the State relative to any federal tax issues.

(4) Notwithstanding anything contained in this Act or any other provision of law, Lafayette Parish is authorized to execute contracts for the Parish Government Complex, Parish Courthouse project prior to execution of a cooperative endeavor agreement, the granting of a line of credit, or the sale of bonds. The appropriation for this project may be used to pay any obligation incurred or to reimburse any expenditure made pursuant to such contracts unless the Commissioner of Administration is advised by bond counsel to the state that such may violate federal tax law. The office of facility planning and control shall consult with bond counsel to the State relative to any federal tax issues.

(F) Pursuant to R.S. 39:112(E)(2), non-state entity projects shall require a match for each appropriation in this act; however,

(1) Notwithstanding anything contained in this Act, any prior Capital Outlay Acts, any other provision of law, or the provisions of R.S. 39:112(E)(2), the projects for the City of Opelousas for the Water Meter Replacement and Upgrades and for the Bridge Replacement and Upgrades shall be exempt for all match requirements.

(G) Notwithstanding anything contained in this Act or the Capital Outlay Act to the contrary or any other Act or provision of law, the appropriations made for the Executive Department for facilities which promote economic development included in the Repair, Restoration, and Replacement for Declared Disasters, Planning, Construction, Renovation, and Acquisition project, and the Department of Economic Development projects are for public purposes pursuant to the provisions of Article VII, Section 14 of the Constitution of Louisiana primarily for economic development, including the generation of tax revenues, creation of jobs, promotion of tourism, and creation of facilities for charitable, cultural, artistic, educational, social, civic, research, service, economic development activities, or provide facilities for professional golf events, pursuant to the terms of cooperative endeavor agreements, including leases and all expenditures of these appropriations and may be exempted, by the Commissioner of Administration, from all statutes relative to public bidding, contractual review and the provisions of R.S. 33:9029.2(D) and in lieu thereof be allowed to use alternative competitive contracting arrangements where the appropriate administering entity submits documentation to the Commissioner of Administration substantiating that it is in the best interest of the citizens of the state, due to economic and/or operational benefits, and the necessity to complete the projects in a timely manner; and, the appropriate administering entity shall have the authority to directly appoint the design professional from a list of a minimum of three design firms or joint ventures with the appropriate specialized facility design experience submitted to and acceptable to the Commissioner of Administration and shall be exempt from other state requirements for selection of designers, and may include expenditures for computers, fixtures, furniture, and other equipment as such is deemed to be capital outlay in nature, and unless the Commissioner of Administration is advised by bond counsel to the State that such may violate federal tax law, may be used to reimburse any expenditure made prior to the granting of a line of credit or the sale of bonds by the State Bond Commission, determination by the State Treasurer that cash funding has been deposited in the Comprehensive Capital Outlay Escrow Account for the project or the execution of a cooperative endeavor agreement from the Office of Facility Planning and Control, and may be used to acquire land or real property, the title to which is held in the name of an entity exempt from taxation under the provisions of 26 U.S.C. 501(c)(3).

(H) Notwithstanding any other provision of this Act or the Capital Outlay Act or any other provision of law to the contrary, all of the funds herein appropriated to the Department of Economic Development in connection with projects or programs for which the Department of Economic Development utilizes a cooperative endeavor agreement to further economic development as permitted under Article VII, Section 14 of the Louisiana Constitution, including the generation of tax revenues and creation of jobs, shall be considered as having been appropriated to the Department of Economic Development, may be used to reimburse any expenditure made prior to the granting of a line of credit and made prior to the execution of a cooperative endeavor agreement and shall be administered solely by the Department of Economic Development pursuant to, in compliance with, and on the terms

(I)(1) Notwithstanding any other provision of this Act or the Capital Outlay Act or any other provision of law to the contrary, funds appropriated for the Economic Development Award Program project for the Office of Business Development are to be used solely for capital and infrastructure improvements subject to verification by the Division of Administration, Office of Facility Planning and Control.

(2) Eligible expenses for Economic Development Award Program funds may include documented project expenses beginning on the date of LEDC Board approval of the project and may be reimbursed upon execution of the cooperative endeavor agreement for the project.

(J)(1) Due to the state's current investment in TPC Louisiana and the financial support it provides to the PGA TOUR event currently played at said facility, said PGA TOUR event shall not be played at New Orleans City Park Golf Complex without the prior agreement of the Commissioner of Administration and the Chairman of the Jefferson Parish Council.

(2) Notwithstanding the foregoing, the City Park Golf Complex may host any other golf tournament or event, including but not limited to any other PGA-affiliated or sponsored tournament or event.

(K)(1) For all projects administered by the Office of Facility Planning and Control and

Payable from proceeds of self-generated revenues, funds shall be remitted to the Office of Facility Planning and Control for deposit in the state treasury at such time as may be deemed necessary by the Office of Facility Planning and Control in order to cover the amount of contracts or other project expenses.

(2) Notwithstanding any provisions contained herein or any other law to the contrary, for projects with other means of financing provided to the administering agency by interagency transfer, the authority to draw these funds shall remain with the user agency.

(3) Any revenue bonds appropriated in Section 1 or Section 1.(A) of the Capital Outlay Act shall not be secured by the full faith and credit of the state.

(4) The State Treasurer shall refund to the appropriate source any surplus self-generated funds, advanced insurance funds received by the Office of Facility Planning and Control as Interagency Transfer from Office of Risk Management associated with hurricane damage recovery, and interest earned on these funds, provided the Treasurer's Office is notified, when these funds are deposited in the state treasury, that the user agency or Office of Risk Management intends to request a refund of this interest.

(L) Notwithstanding any provisions contained in this Act, the Capital Outlay Act, or any other provision of law to the contrary, any funds expended by the parish of St. Mary for the purpose of securing a federal grant, for the Infrastructure Improvements and Construction of a Welding Training Center Facility at the Charenton Canal Industrial Park, shall be eligible for reimbursement from any cash line of credit approved for the project.

(M) Notwithstanding anything contained in this Act to the contrary or any other provision of law, the resolution adopted by the Joint Legislative Committee on the Budget (the committee) on March 19, 2019 approving State of Louisiana Grant Anticipation Revenue Bonds, in one or more series, not exceeding \$650,000,000, and approving the related projects and providing for other matters in connection therewith, contains the following approvals:

(1) The first series of bonds in the original principal amount of not exceeding \$185,000,000 in order to fund the following projects in the following estimated amounts: Barksdale Project (\$61,600,000) and portions of the Loyola Project (\$77,600,000) and the I-10 Project (\$30,601,000) with the understanding that the Department has the ability to manage the actual application of bond proceeds in order to appropriately fund the Projects and meet expenditure requirements of the Internal Revenue Service.

(2) The second series of bonds for the express purpose of granting the required contracts in the principal amount of approximately \$142,000,000 in order to fund the following projects in the following estimated amounts: the balance of the Barksdale Project (\$16,518,000), the balance of the Loyola Project (\$87,500,000), portions of the I-10 Project (\$37,982,000) and the Belle Chasse Project (\$12,500,000) with the understanding that the Department has the ability to manage the actual application of Bond proceeds in order to appropriately fund the Projects and meet expenditure requirements of the Internal Revenue Service provided, however, the Department of Transportation and Development seeks approval from the Committee for the issuance of the second series of bonds and all subsequent series of bonds.

(N) Notwithstanding anything contained in this Act to the contrary or any other provision of law, the Research Vessel (R/V) Pelican Replacement is deemed to be a capital asset and the appropriation to Louisiana Universities Marine Consortium (LUMCON) to replace the R/V Pelican is for a public purpose and has a significant economic impact providing a variety of oceanographic research missions. Further, LUMCON shall be permitted to use an alternative delivery method to award contracts for design of the proposed replacement vessel. LUMCON shall have the authority to select the design professional from a list of a minimum of two engineering firms or joint ventures with ship design experience acceptable to the Commissioner of Administration and the selection shall be exempt from other state requirements for the selection of designers. The design professional fee shall be in accordance with state guidelines administered by the Office of Facility Planning and Control, Division of Administration. LUMCON shall further be permitted to use an alternative delivery method to award contracts for the construction of the proposed replacement vessel. LUMCON shall have the authority to select the contractor from a list of a minimum of three highly qualified ship builders/shipyards with relevant vessel construction experience acceptable to the Commissioner of Administration and the selection shall be exempt from other state requirements for the selection of contractors. The construction contract shall be administered by the Office of Facility Planning and Control, Division of Administration in accordance with state guidelines.

(O) Notwithstanding anything contained in this Act to the contrary or any other provision of law, the appropriations for Major Repairs for Higher Education Facilities – Infrastructure, and Buildings Based on Statewide Condition Assessment, Planning and Construction, in Act 7 of 2008 identifying specific projects for higher education is deemed to be complete, and any remaining residual funds are hereby authorized to be combined and accumulated to accomplish additional major repair projects within the higher education systems, as deemed necessary and approved by the Board of Regents and Facility Planning and Control. At the completion of the program, Facility Planning and Control shall submit a report to the Joint Legislative Committee on the Budget concerning the use of the remaining residual funds.

(P) Notwithstanding anything contained in this Act or any other provision of law, LSU Real Estate and Facilities Foundation (LRFF) is authorized to execute contracts for the University Lakes Restoration Project to Address Flood Control, Environmental, Safety, Health and Other Issues project prior to execution of a cooperative endeavor agreement, the granting of a line of credit or the sale of bonds. The appropriation for this project may be used to pay any obligation incurred or to reimburse any expenditure made pursuant to such contracts unless the Commissioner of Administration is advised by bond counsel to the state that such may violate federal tax law, after execution of a cooperative endeavor agreement. The Office of Facility Planning and Control shall consult with bond counsel to the State relative to any federal tax issues. Further, LRFF may use alternative competitive contracting arrangements with the prior approval of the Commissioner of Administration.

(Q) Notwithstanding anything contained in this Act to the contrary or any other provision of law, the USS KIDD DD-661, a World War II era Fletcher class destroyer and National Historic Landmark, is deemed to be a capital asset and the appropriation to the Louisiana Naval War Memorial Commission for Hull Repair & Reinforcement, Superstructure Repair, Interior Restoration & Painting and Docking Cradle Repairs & Upgrade is for a public purpose and will allow the vessel to continue to serve the citizens of Louisiana as a proven highly successful tourist attraction, educational institution, military memorial, patriotic ceremonial platform and documentary/theatrical film set. Further, the USS KIDD DD-661 the only surviving Fletcher class destroyer in her original WW2 configuration and the restoration project requires special consideration in the selection of a restoration contractor and in the location and complete identification of the repairs to be performed. Therefore, the Louisiana Naval War Memorial Commission, through the Office of Culture, Recreation & Tourism, shall be permitted to use an alternative delivery method to award construction contract(s) for the proposed repairs and renovations to the USS KIDD and its cradle. The Louisiana Naval War Memorial Commission, through the Office of Culture, Recreation & Tourism, shall have the authority to select the contractor(s) from a list of a minimum of three highly qualified ship builders/shipyards with relevant restoration experience acceptable to the Commissioner of Administration and the selection shall be exempt from other state requirements for the selection of contractors. The construction contract(s) shall be administered by the Office of Facility Planning and Control, Division of Administration in accordance with state guidelines and all restoration and repairs shall adhere to the U.S. Department of Interiors' Standards for Historic Ship Preservation Projects.

(R) Pursuant to R.S. 39:102, each capital outlay budget request submitted as required by R.S. 39:101 shall include a detailed project description and justification for each new project requested; however,

(1) Notwithstanding anything contained in this Act or the Capital Outlay Act to the contrary or any other provision of law, the scope of the appropriations made in this or any other Capital Outlay Act for the New Orleans West Bank Park Improvements, New Soccer and Recreational Facilities project shall be deemed to include the George W. Carver Playground, Renovations and Upgrades project for the West Bank Park project.

(2) Notwithstanding anything contained in this Act or the Capital Outlay Act to the contrary or any other provision of law, the scope of the appropriations made in this or any other Capital Outlay Act for the Pointe Coupee Parish School Board Office Relocation, Due to Flooding Caused by Hurricane Gustav, Planning and Construction project shall be deemed to include that the School Board Office is to be Located at 8777 Morganza Highway.

(3) Notwithstanding anything in this Act, any previous capital outlay act, or other provision of law to the contrary, the scope of the appropriation for the Port of South Louisiana Globalplex Terminal Building #71 Upgrade project shall be deemed to also include similar upgrades for other Globalplex Terminal Buildings and a Heavy Load Capacity Foundation or Floor.

(4) Notwithstanding anything in this Act, any previous capital outlay act, or other provision of law to the contrary, monies appropriated herein for the Port of South Louisiana Globalplex Terminal Building #71 and Other Globalplex Terminal Building Upgrades, Planning and Construction may be expended for design fees related to the conveyor system and ancillary equipment that exceed the customary ten percent limitation on design fee costs.

(5) Notwithstanding anything in this Act, any previous capital outlay act,

or other provision of law to the contrary, the scope of the appropriation for the Port of South Louisiana Globalplex Dock Access Bridge and Equipment Replacement/Repair project shall be deemed to also include an Access Road.

(6) Notwithstanding anything in this Act, any previous capital outlay act, or other provision of law to the contrary, the scope of the appropriation for the Port of South Louisiana Globalplex Rail Siding project shall be deemed to also include a Rail Spur.

(7) Notwithstanding anything contained in this Act or the Capital Outlay Act to the contrary or any other provision of law, the scope of the appropriations made in this or any other Capital Outlay Act for the Pontchartrain Levee District Lake Pontchartrain West Shore Hurricane Protection, Planning and Construction project shall be deemed to include Ascension Parish.

(8) Notwithstanding anything contained in this Act or the Capital Act to the contrary or any other provision of law, the scope of the appropriation made in this or any other Capital Outlay Act for the Statewide Roofing Asset Management Program and Waterproofing, Related Repairs and Equipment Replacement Program project shall be deemed to include Peltier Hall at Nicholls State University.

(9) Notwithstanding anything contained in this Act or the Capital Act to the contrary or any other provision of law, the scope of the appropriation made in this or any other Capital Outlay Act for the Longview Road Improvements, Beauregard Parish Police Jury project shall be deemed to include Longville Road Improvements for the Beauregard Parish Police Jury.

(10) Notwithstanding anything contained in this Act to the contrary or any other provision of law, the capital outlay request with an appropriation for the Water Treatment Facility, Booster Pump Station, and Distribution System Improvements project for the City of Franklin shall be deemed to be submitted timely and is otherwise compliant with the provisions of R.S. 39:101 and R.S. 39:102 as the project was originally submitted on time, by August 31, 2022, for the Water Sector Program and such request together with supporting information and documents shall constitute the feasibility study required by Article VI, Section 11(C) of the Constitution of Louisiana.

(11) Notwithstanding anything contained in this Act to the contrary or any other provision of law, the capital outlay request with an appropriation for the Sewer Rehabilitation project for the City of Morgan City shall be deemed to be submitted timely and is otherwise compliant with the provisions of R.S. 39:101 and R.S. 39:102 as the project was originally submitted on time, by August 31, 2022, for the Water Sector Program and such request together with supporting information and documents shall constitute the feasibility study required by Article VI, Section 11(C) of the Constitution of Louisiana.

(12) Notwithstanding anything contained in this Act to the contrary or any other provision of law, the capital outlay request with an appropriation for the Rehabilitation of Nine Sewer Lift Stations project for the City of Patterson shall be deemed to be submitted timely and is otherwise compliant with the provisions of R.S. 39:101 and R.S. 39:102 as the project was originally submitted on time, by August 31, 2022, for the Water Sector Program and such request together with supporting information and documents shall constitute the feasibility study required by Article VI, Section 11(C) of the Constitution of Louisiana.

(13) Notwithstanding anything contained in this Act to the contrary or any other provision of law, the capital outlay request with an appropriation for the Wastewater Treatment Plant Improvements project for the City of Westwego shall be deemed to be submitted timely and is otherwise compliant with the provisions of R.S. 39:101 and R.S. 39:102 as the project was originally submitted on time, by August 31, 2022, for the Water Sector Program and such request together with supporting information and documents shall constitute the feasibility study required by Article VI, Section 11(C) of the Constitution of Louisiana.

(14) Notwithstanding anything contained in this Act to the contrary or any other provision of law, the capital outlay request with an appropriation for the Water Distribution System Improvements project for the City of Westwego shall be deemed to be submitted timely and is otherwise compliant with the provisions of R.S. 39:101 and R.S. 39:102 as the project was originally submitted on time, by August 31, 2022, for the Water Sector Program and such request together with supporting information and documents shall constitute the feasibility study required by Article VI, Section 11(C) of the Constitution of Louisiana.

(15) Notwithstanding anything contained in this Act or the Capital Act to the contrary or any other provision of law, the scope of the appropriation made in this or any other Capital Outlay Act for the JESTC Training Facility Improvements project shall be deemed to include facilities at JESTC to accommodate a less than lethal training program utilizing mobile virtual training.

(16) Notwithstanding anything contained in this Act, any previous capital outlay act to the contrary, or any other provision of law, the scope of the appropriations made in this or any other capital outlay act for the Industrial Park Development project for New Roads shall be deemed to include underground electrical system upgrades.

(17) Notwithstanding anything contained in this Act, any previous capital outlay act to the contrary, or any other provision of law, the scope of the appropriations made in this or any other capital outlay act for the Lincoln Manner Subdivision Drainage project for Kenner shall be deemed to include 30th Street Roadway and Drainage Improvements from Loyola Drive to Ohio Street.

(18) Notwithstanding anything contained in this Act or the Capital Outlay Act to the contrary or any other provision of law, the scope of the

appropriations made in this or any other Capital Outlay Act for the Tensas Parish Recreational Facility project shall be deemed to include Recreational Facilities at Newellton, St. Joseph, and Waterproof.

(S) Notwithstanding anything contained in this Act to the contrary or any other provision of law, all non-state projects that include water systems in the scope of work shall also be required to include a rate study as part of the project.

(T) Notwithstanding anything contained in this Act or any other provision of law, the appropriations included herein identified as "

Payable from State General Fund (Direct) Non-Recurring Revenues" are appropriated for the purpose of making supplemental capital outlay appropriations for Fiscal Year 2022-2023.

(U) Notwithstanding anything contained in this Act to the contrary or any other provision of the law, the appropriations included herein identified as "Payable from Interest Earnings" are appropriated for the purpose of making

supplemental capital outlay appropriations for Fiscal Year 2022-2023.

(V) Notwithstanding anything contained in this Act to the contrary or any other provision of law, any water/sewer project that submitted by August 31, 2022 for the Water Sector Program shall be deemed to be submitted timely provided a capital outlay request is submitted and is otherwise compliant with the provisions of R.S. 39:101 and R.S. 39:102. Such request together with supporting information and documents shall constitute the feasibility study required by Article VI, Section 11(C) of the Constitution of Louisiana.

(W) Notwithstanding anything contained in this Act or any other provision of law, the Port of New Orleans is authorized to execute contracts for the Louisiana International Terminal Roadway and Rail Improvements, Planning and Construction and the Louisiana International Terminal, Drainage, Site Preparation and Mitigation, Planning and Construction prior to execution of a cooperative endeavor agreement, the granting of a line of credit, or the sale of bonds. The appropriation for this project may be used to pay any obligation incurred or to reimburse any expenditure made pursuant to such contracts unless the commissioner of administration is advised by bond counsel to the state that such may violate federal tax law. The office of facility planning and control shall consult with bond counsel to the state relative to any federal tax issues.

(X) Notwithstanding anything contained in this Act or any other provision of law, the Board of Commissioners for the Port of New Orleans is authorized to execute contracts for the Louisiana International Terminal Roadway and Rail Improvements, Planning and Construction and the Louisiana International Terminal, Drainage, Site Preparation and Mitigation, Planning and Construction project prior to execution of a cooperative endeavor agreement, the granting of a line of credit, or the sale of bonds. The appropriation for this project may be used to pay any obligation incurred or to reimburse any expenditure made pursuant to such contracts unless the commissioner of administration is advised by bond counsel to the state that such may violate federal tax law. The office of facility planning and control shall consult with bond counsel to the state relative to any federal tax issues.

Section 9. Notwithstanding any provisions contained herein or any other law to the contrary, the provisions of Chapter 16 of Subtitle III of Title 39 of the Louisiana Revised Statutes of 1950 as amended, shall not apply to architectural and engineering contracts, administered by the office of facility planning and control, division of administration pursuant to this or any other capital outlay act.

Section 10. All funds appropriated herein to agencies administering capital outlay projects, on behalf of non-state entities, by cooperative endeavor agreements pursuant to this Act shall be expended within two (2) years from the date of the issuance of the bonds. Agencies administering capital outlay projects pursuant to a cooperative endeavor agreement shall notify the non-state entity of the date the bonds are issued within three (3) months from the issuance thereof. If the funds appropriated herein and administered under cooperative endeavor agreements pursuant to this Act are not totally expended within two (2) years from the issuance of the bonds, the administering agency can close the project and recommend that the reallocation of any unexpended proceeds to any project contained in this Act or any previous Capital Outlay Acts.

Section 11. Notwithstanding any provisions contained herein or law to the contrary, the proceeds of revenue bonds to be utilized to fund certain projects authorized in Section 1. and Section 1.(A) hereof may, in accordance with Article VII, Section 9 of the Louisiana Constitution of 1974, be deposited in special accounts held outside the state treasury in accordance with the provisions of any bond resolution, indenture, reimbursement contract, or other bond or financing covenant which provides for the pledge of such funds in connection with the issuance of revenue bonds. For all projects administered by the office of facility planning and control, division of administration, authorized in Section 1. And Section 1.(A) hereof which are

Payable from the proceeds of revenue bonds, only the office of facility planning and control, division of administration, will be authorized to requisition funds from the special accounts described immediately above, at such time or times as may be deemed necessary by the office of facility planning and control, division of administration, in order to cover contract amounts or other project expenses.

Section 12. The governor shall have the power to veto any line-item in this Act.

Section 13. Except as otherwise provided herein, no funds shall be expended on any highway projects on highways within the state highway system as established in R.S. 48:191 under the jurisdiction of the Department

of Transportation and Development unless and until such project is in the Highway Program, R.S. 48:228 through 232, approved by the Joint Legislative Committee on Transportation, Highways and Public Works. Pursuant to R.S. 49:214.6.2(B), no integrated coastal protection construction project shall be undertaken with funds included in this bill except those included in an annual plan finally approved by the legislature in accordance with the provisions of R.S. 49:214.5.3. No funds appropriated to the Coastal Protection and Restoration Authority in this Act as a contribution for a project cost-share or otherwise, for the national economic development and national ecosystem restoration components of the Southwest Coastal Louisiana Study shall be used or provided for the expropriation of property or use of eminent domain, except where such funds are to be used to obtain property voluntarily offered for project purposes, where at least seventy- five percent of the owners have voluntarily offered the property, or where the record or apparent owners have voluntarily offered the property but do not have clear title. Section 14. The word "statewide" used in place of the specific parish

designation for projects contained in this Act indicates that the project or program is applicable to all sixty- four parishes in the state. The description of any project in this Act shall be deemed to include planning, design, master planning, studies, permits, surveys, testing, construction, land and/ or building/improvement acquisition, reconstruction, renovation, repair, right-of- way and utilities, site and other improvements, miscellaneous/ contingencies, lease hold improvements ultimately owned by the state or a political subdivision of the state, equipment and other acquisitions, and any other component of the project if such are included or indicated in the capital outlay request for such projects required by R. S. 39:101 subject to the provisions of Title 39 of the Louisiana Revised Statutes of 1950. For new construction or renovation projects, equipment or other acquisitions, which can reasonably be considered necessary for the facility to be functional, may be deemed to be included in the project, even if such equipment or other acquisitions are not included or indicated in the project name or the capital outlay request. When local or federal match is referenced in a project title, but only a portion of the state appropriation is granted a line of credit or otherwise funded, then the amount of local or federal match, required to be made available, may be prorated relative to the amount of state appropriation made available through lines of credit.

Section 15. The provisions, items, and projects contained in this Act are severable and if any provision, item, or project contained herein, or the application of any such provision, item, or project, is held invalid, such invalidity shall not affect other provisions, items, projects, or applications of the Act which can be given effect without the invalid provision, project, item, or application.

Section 16. Notwithstanding any other provisions of law to the contrary, the state shall not grant cash lines of credit, or authorize or issue general obligation bonds in a principal amount in excess of \$1,451,887,938 for Fiscal Year 2023-2024.

Section 17. Notwithstanding any contrary provision of this Act or any contrary provision of law, no funds appropriated by this Act shall be released or provided to any recipient of an appropriation made in this Act if, when, and for as long as, the recipient fails or refuses to comply with the provisions of R.S. 24:513. No recipient shall be considered to fail or refuse to comply with the provisions of R.S. 24:513 pursuant to this Section during any extension of time granted by the legislative auditor to the recipient to comply.

Section 18. This Act shall become effective upon signature by the governor or, if not signed by the governor, upon expiration of the time for bills to become law without signature by the governor, as provided in Article III, Section 18 of the Constitution of Louisiana. If vetoed by the governor and subsequently approved by the legislature, this Act shall become effective on the day following such approval.

ACT No. 466

HOUSE BILL NO. 648 (Substitute for House Bill No. 463 by Representative Firment) BY REPRESENTATIVES FIRMENT, AMEDEE, CREWS, GAROFALO, AND HORTON AN ACT

AN ACT To enact Part IX of Chapter 5-A of Title 40 of the Louisiana Revised Statutes of 1950, to be comprised of R.S. 40:1098.1 through 1098.6, relative to certain procedures for minor children; to provide for definitions; to exclude certain services, treatments, and procedures that alter the sex characteristics of a minor; to provide certain restrictions for healthcare professionals; to establish disciplinary procedures; to provide with respect to consent; to provide for legal remedies; and to provide for related matters. Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:

Section 1. Part IX of Chapter 5-A of Title 40 of the Louisiana Revised Statutes of 1950, comprised of R.S. 40:1098.1 through 1098.6, is hereby enacted to read as follows:

PART IX. THE STOP HARMING OUR KIDS ACT §1098.1. Definitions For the purposes of this Part, the following terms have the meaning ascribed

to them unless the context clearly indicates otherwise:

(1) "Healthcare professional" shall have the same meaning as the term is defined in R.S. 14:34.8.

(2) "Minor" means any natural person who has not reached the age of majority as provided in Civil Code Article 29 and who has not been emancipated pursuant to Title V of Book VII of the Code of Civil Procedure.

(3) "Sex" means the biological indication of male or female as evidenced by a medical examination of all of the following:

(a) Sex chromosomes.

(b) Naturally occurring sex hormones.

<u>(c) Gonads.</u>

(d) As well as nonambiguous internal and external genitalia present at birth.

§1098.2. Healthcare professionals; restrictions

A healthcare professional shall not knowingly engage in any of the following acts that attempt to alter a minor's appearance in an attempt to validate a minor's perception of the minor's sex, if the minor's perception is inconsistent with the minor's sex:

(1) The prescription or administration of gonadotropin-releasing hormone analogues or other synthetic drugs used to stop luteinizing hormone and follicle stimulating hormone secretion, synthetic antiandrogen drugs used to block the androgen receptor, or any drug to suppress or delay normal puberty.

The prescription or administration of testosterone, estrogen, or (2)progesterone, in amounts greater than would normally be produced endogenously in a healthy individual of the same age and sex

(3) The performance of any sterilizing surgery, including but not limited to castration, hysterectomy, oophorectomy, orchiectomy, penectomy, and vasectomy.

(4) The performance of any surgery that artificially constructs tissue having the appearance of genitalia differing from the minor's sex, including metoidioplasty, phalloplasty, and vaginoplasty.

(5) The removal of any healthy or non-diseased body part or tissue.

(6) The performance of augmentation mammoplasty, facial feminization surgery, liposuction, lipofilling, pectoral implants, voice surgery, thyroid cartilage reduction, gluteal augmentation, hair reconstruction, or any aesthetic surgical procedure.

B. The prohibited acts listed in Subsection A of this Section shall not be <u>considered healthcare services.</u> <u>C. The prohibitions listed in Subsection A of this Section shall not limit or</u>

restrict the provision of healthcare:

(1) A minor born with a medically verifiable disorder of sex development, including but not limited to external sex characteristics that are irresolvably ambiguous.

(2) A minor diagnosed with a disorder of sexual development, if a healthcare professional has determined, through genetic or biochemical testing, that the minor does not have a sex chromosome structure, sex steroid hormone production, or sex steroid hormone action, that is normal for a biological male or biological female.

(3) A minor needing treatment for an infection, injury, disease, or disorder that has been caused or exacerbated by any action or procedure prohibited by this Part.

(4) A minor suffering from a physical disorder, physical injury, or physical illness that is certified by a healthcare provider and that would place the individual in imminent danger of death or impairment of major bodily function unless surgery is performed.

D. If, prior to January 1, 2024, a healthcare professional has initiated a course of treatment, for a minor, which includes the prescription or administration of any drug or hormone prohibited by this Part, and if the healthcare professional determines and documents in the minor's medical record that immediately terminating the minor's use of the drug or hormone would cause harm to the minor, the healthcare professional may institute a period during which the minor's use of the drug or hormone is systematically reduced and discontinued. The period may not extend beyond December 31, 2024.

§1098.3. Healthcare professionals; disciplinary actions

If a professional or occupational licensing board finds, by a preponderance of the evidence, that a healthcare professional licensed or certified by the board has violated the provisions of this Part, the board shall revoke any professional or occupational license or certificate held by the healthcare professional for a minimum of two years.

<u>§1098.4. Minors' lack of consent</u>

A. Notwithstanding the provisions of R.S. 40:1079.1 and notwithstanding any other provision of law to the contrary, a minor may not consent to any procedures or services that are prohibited in R.S. 40:1098.2(A).

B. The provisions of this Section shall not apply to a minor who is subject to the provisions of R.S. 40:1098.2(D).

§1098.5. Civil actions; remedies

A. Notwithstanding any other provision of law to the contrary, a person who has been harmed as a result of acts which are prohibited by this Part or who has been subjected to acts which are prohibited by this Part with or without consent, shall have a cause of action for damages in a court of competent jurisdiction.

B. The cause of action for damages shall be commenced before the later of either of the following:

(1) The lapse of a twelve-year liberative prescription once the minor reaches the age of majority.

(2) Within three years from the time the person discovered or reasonably

should have discovered that the injury or damages were caused by the violation.

C. Venue pursuant to this Section may be brought pursuant to Code of Civil Procedure Article 42 or in the parish of domicile of the petitioner.

D.(1) If a court shall award damages, attorney fees, and all costs of the proceeding against the defendant for violation of this Part.

(2) Damages awarded by the court pursuant to this Section may include but is not to be limited to damages for infertility or sterility that is suffered by the minor as a result of the acts prohibited by this Part.

E. Consent shall not operate as defense to a petitioner's claim that is filed pursuant to this Section.

<u>§1098.6.</u> Attorney general; injunctive or declaratory relief

A. The attorney general may bring a civil action to enforce compliance with this Part in a court of competent jurisdiction.

B. The attorney general may seek injunctive or declaratory relief and any other appropriate remedy from in order to protect a minor from those harms resulting from conduct that is prohibited pursuant to this Part.

C. Venue pursuant to this Section shall be that same venue which is provided in R.S. 40:1098.5.

D. If the court grants relief pursuant to this Section, the court shall award attorney fees and all costs of the proceeding against the defendant for violation of this Part.

E. Nothing in this Part shall be construed to deny, impair, or otherwise affect any right or authority of the attorney general, the state, or any agency, officer, or employee of the state to institute or intervene in any proceeding.

Section 2. If any provision or item of this Act, or the application thereof, is held invalid, such invalidity shall not affect other provisions, items, or applications of the Act which can be given effect without the invalid provision, item, or application and to this end the provisions of this Act are hereby declared severable.

Section 3. This Act shall become effective on January 1, 2024; if vetoed by the governor and subsequently approved by the legislature, this Act shall become effective on the day following such approval by the legislature or January 1, 2024, whichever is later.
