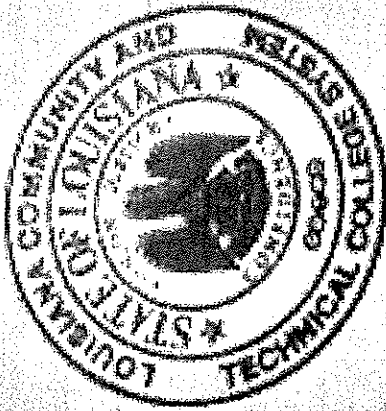

DIVISION 2. CHIEF OF POLICE

Sec. 16.5-51. Qualifications.

The chief of police shall be required to possess a Bachelor or Associate degree in criminal justice or a related field, with eight (8) years' experience, four (4) of which shall have been served in a supervisory capacity, or a High School diploma or Graduate Equivalency diploma (GED), with ten (10) years' experience, five (5) of which shall have been served in a supervisory capacity.

Sec. 16.5-52. Residency requirement.

The chief of police and his/her family shall be required, within six (6) months of hire, to reside (live) no more than one (1) mile from the corporate limit boundaries of St. Martinville.
