Populations represented:	Adults (people over the age of 18) in the United States. Generation Z (ages 18 – 29) in the United States.
Sample sizes:	1,000 adults in the United States. 800 Generation Z (ages 18 – 29) in the United States.
Mode of data collection:	Online interviews. All interviews conducted in English.
Type of samples:	Non-probability from Dynata’s online panels.
Dates of data collection:	May 22, 2024 – May 29, 2024
Credibility interval for total samples:	For the sample of 1000 adults it is approximately +/- 3.3 percentage points. This accounts for a standard margin of sampling error of 3.1 (as if it were a probability sample) and a design effect (1.1) caused by weighting. For the sample of 800 Generation Z (age 18 – 29) adults it is approximately +/- 3.6 percentage points. This accounts for a standard margin of sampling error of 3.5 (as if it were a probability sample) and a design effect (1.1) caused by weighting.
Data weighting:	The data is weighted toward population parameters for age, gender, education, race, and ethnicity published by the U.S. Census. The High Point University Survey Research Center (SRC) produces weights through an iterative procedure within SPSS.

Survey/Data collection supplier:	Interviews collected through the High Point University SRC, recording responses in Qualtrics. Dynata supplied online panel respondents.
