



All Classes will follow the AQHA and VA 4-H Rulebooks with the exception of the Gaited Division which will be judged according to the USEF Rulebook.

SHOW RULES

- 1. All Riders UNDER 18 years of age are REQUIRED to wear an ASTM/SEI approved helmet with a fastened harness when MOUNTED, regardless of discipline.
- 2. Youth: Riders 17 years of age and younger
 - 3. Adult: Riders 18 years of age or older
- 4. Every Class offered herein, which is covered by the rules and specifications listed will be judged accordingly.
- 5. The Judge's decision is FINAL. DO NOT approach the Judge, except by way of show management.
- 6. All Horses/Ponies on the show grounds must present a current negative Coggins dated within 12 months of the date of the show, and MUST LEAVE A COPY with the show Secretary at check-in. We will not have a copy machine or printer!

BRING A COPY WE CAN KEEP, PLEASE.

- 7. Entries: \$12/class the day of the show *OR* \$10/class if Pre-entered by Friday, July 19th 11:59 p.m. Any entries received after that will be considered a "Day Of" entry and charged accordingly.
- 8. Payment must be made in CASH or CHECK ONLY! We cannot accept credit cards or electronic payment at this time.
 - 9. \$50 returned check fee
- 10. Entries will not be accepted without Release of Liability signed for every rider regardless of age. Youth must have Adult present to sign waiver. NO back numbers will be given out without a signed release.
- 11. Classes will be placed 1st through 6th place with Champion and Reserve Champion awarded to the top 2 high point scores for divisions of horsemanship, pleasure, and equitation only. High point overall Adult and Youth will be awarded and 1 SHOW CHAMPION will be awarded to the highest point total for the day.
 - 12. Classes designated with ** count

towards overall High Point scores

- 13. Points will be counted on a scale as follows: 1st place-6 points; 2nd place-5 points; 3rd place-4 points; 4th place-3 points; 5th place-2 points; 6th place-1 point. Division Champion-10 points; Division Reserve Champion-8 points.
- 14. Show Management reserves the right to refuse entries, and cancel or combine any class or division it deems necessary.
- 15. Exhibitors show at their own risk. In case of a fall, rider may NOT remount in the ring.
- 16. Schooling will be permitted in the show ring between 7:15AM and 8:15AM the day of the show and at designated times. Show management reserves the right to split or terminate schooling. Please see DAY OF schedule for schooling times.

There will be NO LUNGING in the ring at ANY time! Lunging must be done outside the ring and away from crowded areas.

17. Stallions must be marked with a

YELLOW TAIL RIBBON and are NOT PERMITTED to be handled, ridden, or exhibited by persons under 18 years of age.

18. All dogs must be on a leash at all times and under the direct control of a handler.

Louisa County Fair, Walton Park, Louisa FFA, Louisa 4-H, any officials, volunteers, and employees related to the foundation, and its board of directors, will not be held responsible for any accident or loss which may occur to any exhibitor, spectator, groom, property, or animal at the show. Participants and spectators alike understand that horses are inherently unpredictable and dangerous and that equipment and ground conditions are equally unpredictable; and knowingly choose to participate and/or spectate, taking full responsibility for this choice. Entry onto the grounds constitutes knowledge and agreement with this policy.

Saturday following the Livestock Show

Were you a member of the local 4-H or FFA Livestock program and remember the days you spent in the show ring? Well, here's a chance for you to live those days one more time. Sign up for the "Old Timers" classes at the Fair! Never shown an animal before? That's ok too! This class is designed for all of the adults who are still "young at heart" and want to try their hand at showing an animal. Participants will be judged on their showmanship skills while showing a goat, hog, cow, or sheep. The "Old Timers" classes will be held directly following the Livestock Show on Saturday. Proceeds from registration benefit the 4-H Livestock Club.

Rules for the "Old Timers" Classes:

- Must be at least 19 years of age prior to July 28, 2024.
- \$10 entry fee per class/species. (Entry fees are a donation to the Louisa 4-H Livestock Club)
- Entry fee must be paid at registration.
- Contestants must sign up at the livestock ring by 11:30 a.m. on July 28th.
- Contestants must designate which species they wish to show at the time of registration.
- Contestants must coordinate use of an animal with the youth owner of the animal.







Please read the following; signing the application acknowledges your agreement to these rules. The 2024 fair queens are also required to abide by these rules after receiving their title.

- 1. ALL contestants must reside in Louisa County
- 2. Contestants must be female who has always been female, single, never married, without children, and never having being pregnant.
- 3. Contestant must possess strong moral character, have never been convicted of a crime, have any pending criminal charges, or have committed an act or engaged in an activity which is or could be characterized as dishonest, immoral, indecent or in bad taste. These regulations also apply to improper images/actions on all social media outlets.
- 4. All Contestants must enter the division corresponding with their age as of pageant day. All winners may not win the same title/age division twice.
- 5. Contestant line-up will be determined by the order applications are received by the director (first in, last out).
- 6. The first runner-up in each age division must be willing to assume all duties in the event that the winner is unable or unwilling to fulfill her duties.
 - 7. The 2024 titleholders are required

to attend/participate/abide in the following:

- Fair Week July 25th-27th
- Other events as requested by the fair board, pageant committee and pageant director
- Miss may not participate in other pageants during reign prior to Miss VAF.
- 8. The 2024 Miss Louisa County Fair will compete at the Miss Virginia Association of Fairs Scholarship Pageant, to be held January at The Williamsburg Lodge in Williamsburg, VA. The queen will work strictly with the pageant directors and assigned resources. Additional information will be discussed with the queen. Should the queen choose not to compete it must be approved by the fair board and pageant director/committee.



2024 LOUISA COUNTY FAIR JUDGED EXHIBITS RULES AND REGULATIONS

- All exhibitors must be residents of, employed by, or active participants in the County of Louisa.
- Articles exhibited must be the work of the exhibitor and/or grown by the exhibitor and be amateur only. All items must have been made or grown within the past 12 calendar months and not previously entered in the Louisa County Fair.
- Exhibitors are responsible for placing entries in the proper class. Judges will not consider entries placed in the wrong class.
- An exhibitor may enter only one article in a class. (Exception: Adult Crops & Vegetables).
- An exhibitor may place an entry "FOR DISPLAY ONLY" if desired (this should be indicated on the entry tag); this entry will be exhibited but not judged.
- No cross-entering is permitted: Youth (ages 5-13) may not enter adult competitions and adults may not enter the youth competitions.
- Classes with only one entry will be awarded ribbons at the discretion of the judge.
- Ribbons are awarded for first, second, and third places. Eight Best of Show ribbons will be awarded for adult divisions and four for youth divisions (one for Div. A-N and R, one for Div. O, one for Div. P, one for Div. Q).
- All judges' decisions are final.
- Exhibits may be removed no earlier than 7 PM on Saturday, July 27. Ticket stubs may be used to enter the fairgrounds for the purpose of collecting exhibits. The Judged Exhibits building will close at 9 PM on Saturday, July 27th. Remaining entries may be picked up from 10 AM 2 PM on Sunday, July 28th.
- All items not claimed by Sunday afternoon will be considered abandoned and taken to the Extension Office at 200 E Main Street, Louisa Va.
- The exhibitor assumes all risks of damage or loss either to person or property for any cause. It is further expressly understood and agreed by the exhibitor that the Louisa County Fair Association and the Mineral Volunteer Fire Department that the said "fair" incurs no liability or obligation to the exhibitor other than to permit the exhibitor to use the grounds for exhibit.

- 7. Trash to Treasure Any useful or decorative article made by recycling disposal items. Judging will be based on recycling principles, workmanship, and creativity. Entries will be judged altogether.
- 8. Wood Carving Any wood carving or sculpture, realistic or stylized. Entries will be judged together.
- 9. Woodwork Entries may include bowls, tables, tools, toys, boxes, cabinets, musical instruments. All entries will be judged together.

E. ADULT - PRESERVED FOOD

All items must be made with recycled materials; list the recycled material used. The following items will be judged altogether: sculpture, jewelry, miscellaneous.

DIV. O - YOUTH - PHOTOGRAPHY

Photography Rules (apply to Black & White Photo and Color Photo Classes): Amateur photographers only. Only one print size per image. Prints may be made by commercial printers. Besides basic post-processing such as adjustment of brightness, contrast, color, and sharpness, digital manipulations are NOT allowed. All prints must be matted with a white mat with a minimum of 1-1/2" and a maximum of 3" or matted on photographic matt board. No framed photos. Entries will be judged in impact, composition, lighting and simplicity. All photos, whether 5"x7" or 8"x10" sizes will be judged together.
