Dr. Melinda McCall

his year's fair honoree is no stranger to the county L fair or our agriculture community. We are proud to honor Dr. Melinda McCall as our 2025 Louisa County Fair Honoree.

Growing up on a dairy farm in Southwest Virginia, Dr. McCall's love for agriculture started at an early age. Her deep appreciation for agriculture can be seen in every aspect of her life, and remains a driving force in her accomplishments. Today Dr. McCall operates Louisa Veterinary Service, serving as one of the area's only large animal livestock veterinarians providing critical animal and herd health care to our region's farmers and animal enthusiasts.



She recently published two books. "Driving Home Naked: And Other Misadventures of a Country Veterinarian", gives readers a heart-felt front row seat to the unique and rewarding lifestyle of a large animal veterinarian. Her children's book "The Million Dollar Goat" recounts the story of a young client's four-legged friend with a few misadventures requiring the healing hands of Dr. McCall.

Dr. McCall served on the board for twelve years, three of

those as president from 2015-2018. In her tenure, she helped the fair reach new heights, while staying true to its agriculture and community mission. Today she continues to be heavily involved in the fair by supporting our local 4-H club with livestock health checks and is often under the game tent helping repair your most loved teddy bears.

She is a lifelong supporter of numerous organizations including but not limited to Louisa 4-H, Louisa FFA, The Virginia Polytechnic Institute and State University, and the Virginia-Maryland College of Veterinary Medicine.

Despite her many accolades, her most proud accomplishment is her daughter, Lucy. Dr. McCall resides in Louisa with her daughter and their beloved Border Collie, Cap.

PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE





- 7. Entries: \$12/class the day of the show *OR* \$10/class if Pre-entered by Friday, July 18th 11:59 p.m. Any entries received after that will be considered a "Day Of" entry and charged accordingly.

 - 9. \$50 returned check fee
- 10. Entries will not be accepted without Release of Liability signed for every rider regardless of age. Youth must have Adult present to sign waiver. NO back numbers will be given out without a signed release.

through 6th place with Champion and Reserve Champion awarded to the top 2 high point scores for divisions of horsemanship, pleasure, and equitation only. High point overall Adult and Youth will be awarded and 1 SHOW CHAMPION will be awarded to the highest point total for the day.

- 12. Classes designated with ** count towards overall High Point scores

2025 LOUISA COUNTY FAIR JUDGED EXHIBITS RULES AND REGULATIONS

- All exhibitors must be residents of, employed by, or active participants in the County of Louisa.
- Articles exhibited must be the work of the exhibitor and/or grown by the exhibitor and be amateur only. All items must have been made or grown within the past 12 calendar months and not previously entered in the Louisa County Fair.
- Exhibitors are responsible for placing entries in the proper class. Judges will not consider entries placed in the wrong class.
- An exhibitor may enter only one article in a class. (Exception: Adult Crops & Vegetables).
- An exhibitor may place an entry "FOR DIS-PLAY ONLY" if desired (this should be indicated on the entry tag); this entry will be exhibited but not judged.
- No cross-entering is permitted: Youth (ages 5-13) may not enter adult competitions and adults may not enter the youth competitions.
- Classes with only one entry will be awarded ribbons at the discretion of the judge.
- Ribbons are awarded for first, second, and third places. Eight Best of Show ribbons will be awarded for adult departments and four for youth departments.
 - All judges' decisions are final.
- Exhibits may be removed no earlier than 7 PM on Saturday, August 2nd and the exhibits building will close at 9 PM on Saturday, August 2nd. Remaining entries may be picked up from 10 AM 1 PM on Sunday, August 3rd.
- All items not claimed by Sunday afternoon will be collected and can be claimed by calling

All jewelry items (clay, macramé, metal, mixed media, or beads) will be judged together.

J. YOUTH - DRESSED DOLLS

All dolls (antique, handmade rag, marionette, hand-held puppet, or doll made with natural materials) will be judged together.

K. YOUTH - FLORAL ARRANGE-MENTS

All forms of floral arrangements will be judged together – dish garden, fresh, silk, terrarium, wall/door hangings, and hats.

L. YOUTH - MISCELLANEOUS

All of the following will be judged together – basketry, calligraphy, candle making, decoupage, egg craft, mosaics, stained glass, batik/tie die, ceramics, diamond art, models, Lego art.

M. YOUTH - YARD ART

Besides basic post-processing such as adjustment of brightness, contrast, color, and sharpness, digital manipulations are NOT allowed. All prints must be matted with a white mat, with a minimum of 1-1/2" and a maximum of 3" or matted on photographic matt board. No framed photos. Entries will be judged in impact, composition, lighting and simplicity. All photos, whether 5"x7" or 8"x10" sizes will be judged together.

Use handknitting yarn.

- 95. Natural Cellulose Fiber: cotton, flax, ramie, hemp. 1-2 oz. skein, dved or undyed, or blends of these fibers.

- 98. Hand Dyeing: 2 oz. skein of handspun natural fiber yarn (1-2 oz. cellulose or luxury fibers) indicate dye used and techniques.
- 99. Spinner's Workbasket: 8 oz. or more handspun yarn to complete a specific project with tools, findings etc., attractively arranged. Must include pattern, sketch, swatch, or directions for proposed project.

D. ADULT - CRAFTS

- 4. Decorative Painting Entries may include paper, paper mache, tin, wood, canvas, glass, porcelain, fabric, or ceramic. Judging will be based on overall effect, background ingenuity, color coordination, blending, strokes, and linework. All entries will be judged together.
- 5. Painted Furniture Entries will be judged together.
- 6. Holiday Crafts Entries may represent any holiday unless otherwise noted and may include table cloths, placemats, Christmas stocking, tree ornament, decorated miniature Christmas tree (3' and under), door arrangement, wall hanging, egg shell, Easter decoration, or Other). All entries will be judged together.
- 7. Trash to Treasure Any useful or decorative article made by recycling disposal items. Judging will be based on recycling principles, workmanship, and creativity. Entries will be judged altogether.
- 8. Wood Carving Any wood carving or sculpture, realistic or stylized. Entries will be judged together
- 9. Woodwork Entries may include bowls, tables, tools, toys, boxes, cabinets, musical instruments. All entries will be judged together.
