who rendered extraordinary services in connection with military operations against an armed enemy of the United States under the following circumstances:

For eight consecutive days the above named nurses were on duty with a Field Hospital Company operating a tent hospital in the open fields north of COHAN, France. Notwithstanding nightly enemy air raids upon the town and harassing shell fire during the daytime, they repeatedly refused to retire further to the rear and continued to administer to the needs of the wounded, exhibiting at all times a splendid spirit of self-sacrifice, courage and devotion to duty which largely contributed to the welfare and rapid convalescence of the wounded officers and soldiers entrusted to their care.
