PROPOSITION #1: Shall the Board of

Education of the Alexander Central School District be authorized (1) to undertake certain capital improvements consisting of reconstruction of existing school buildings and facilities, site improvements and the acquisition of certain original furnishings, equipment, and apparatus and other incidental improvements required in connection therewith for such construction and school use, all at an estimated maximum aggregate cost of \$16,185,000; (2) to appropriate and expend from the existing 2021, 2022 and 2023 Capital Reserve Funds, \$3,090,000 for such costs; (3) to raise the balance of the costs, or so much thereof as may be necessary, by the levy of taxes to be collected in annual installments, to be offset by available state aid to the greatest extent possible; and (4) in anticipation of such tax to issue necessary debt obligations of the school district not to exceed \$13,095,000?

No early mail voter's ballot will be canvassed unless it has been received in the Office of the District Clerk of the School District no later than 5:00 PM on January 21, 2026. A list of all persons to whom early ballots have been issued will be available in the Office of the District Clerk's office during hours on and after January 7, 2026 until January 21, 2026, except Saturday, January 17, 2026, by prearranged appointment. A challenge to an early voting ballot may not be made on the basis that the voter should have applied for an absentee ballot.
