AWONDERFUL ASTRONOMICAL SIGHT FOR OBSERVERS TOMORROW IF SKY IS CLEAR

Tomorrow morning at 9:07 o'clock — & the weather man permitting - Batavia will be given the opportunity to witness one of the greatest natural phenomena, a total

eclipse of the sun. At 8 o'clock the moon will first be observed starting to pass across the face of the the sun, encroaching more and more, until at 9:07 o'clock, the sun will entirely blot out the light of the sun for a little more than a minute and a half. Then the moon will continue its journey until at 10:26 o'clock it has passed completely across

11/2 minutes. It has been 119 years since the shadow caused by a total eclipse has passed over any part of New York State and it will not happen again in the United States until 1970 when the shadow will pass

over Georgia and Florida. Smoked glass or pieces of dense photographic negatives should be used to look through in watching the approach and departure of the total eclipse. When you are watching the solar eclipse tomorrow morning look

for these things The peculiar change in light and landscape when


the sun is almost covered. The little disks and crescents of light on the ground under trees, images of the sun.

The shadow bands, the wavy dancing columns of light and shade that flit over the ground or the sides of buildings about five minutes before the eclipse is total.

Bailey's Beads, round or oblong points of light, to be seen when the sun is a thin crescent. They are believed to be the sun's rays shining through the valleys between mountains of the moon.

The onrushing shadow of the moon, coming from the west at a thousand miles an hour a few seconds before totality.

The corona, when the sun is entirely obscured beautiful radiations of light flashing from the rim of the blackened circle.
