Q&A: Meet the 2022 DA Date Show spotlight single


DA: Was there anything specific that prompted you to apply for the show?

I did commercial acting for a couple of years, and I quit when I came to college. So obviously I kind of expected that life of mine to be in the rearview. So this is a really cool opportunity for me to combine like the dating scene and that kind of thing while also, you know, being in front of a

I miss that. DA: Is there anything you are nervous about or are not looking forward to with the DA Date Show experience?

Cullen: Actually, yeah, there's one thing. I was like, "Oh God, what happens if I already know someone that's on

the show — like someone that I've met before?" I feel like that could be super awkward. I was kind of scared about that, especially because I was wondering like, "Oh, they might pull people from the Reed College or people that work at the DA." You know, I know a couple of guys that are involved

in those areas, so I'm like, "Oh crap."

DA: What are you hoping to get out of your experience on the show?

Cullen: I'm not really looking for anything specific. Obviously, it would be really funny if a relationship came out of it. And I did talk to my mom. I know the things that I don't tell anyone if I had to tell my mom. And she was like, "It would be so funny if like you found your husband doing this." And I was like, "Okay, shut up." So obviously that would be super fun, but honestly, it's just getting a great experience and doing something that is way out of my comfort zone.

DA: Have you ever participated in anything similar to the DA Date Show?

Cullen: No, absolutely not, and that's what really intrigued me — doing something different, doing something pretty wild and out there. I think of myself as a spontaneous person, and this just kinda matches.

DA: Have you done anything to prepare for your experience on the DA Date Show?

Cullen: Yeah, I actually looked up past videos on Facebook, and I watched the one that was from last year just so I knew what I was getting myself into.

DA: What was your reaction to finding out you had been selected for the show?

Cullen: I freaked out. I live in my sorority house with my roommate who was also my little, and she was on the bunk below me. And I saw the email 'cause I was on my phone, and I went, "Oh my God. Oh my God. Oh my God." She was like, "What?" And I was like, "Okay, I can't tell you yet, but I promise that this is the coolest thing that ever happened to me."

DA: Okay these next two questions are relating to Valentine's Day. Have you ever had a Valentine, and what are your thoughts on Valentine's Day as a whole?

Cullen: No, I don't like this season at all. I've never had a relationship around Valentine's Day, which is why I was also kind of anxious to do this. I love pink hearts and girly stuff, so you'd think I would love Valentine's Day. But I really, really don't. So I'm hoping that this will change my mind about it.

Condom Caravan provides free condoms for students

Do you have plans for Valentine's day? Safer sex supplies will be offered by WELL-WVU's Condom Caravan program throughout the spring semester.

The service is free, packaged discreetly and can be conveniently picked up after placing an order through the form on their website by the deadline.

All you need to provide on the form is your name, MIX email address and the quantity of each supply.

Every other Thursday with the exception of spring break, students can request up to five of each type of external and internal condom, dental dams, and lube. It's a refreshing initiative to be inclusive for all folks by having more than just external condoms.

The Condom Caravan offers lube and a variety of flavored, ribbed, latex-free and multiple lengths of external condoms. The available lube is water-based which makes it easier to clean or less likely to stain or degrade condoms as much as oil-based products.

In addition, internal condoms and dental dams can be specially requested by emailing Chantelle Friend at cjf0016@ mix.wvu.edu.

While the best way to prevent an STI is abstaining from sexual activity, according to WELLWVU, the choice is personal.

The Condom Caravan is run

by Chantelle Friend, graduate assistant at WELLWVU, with the goal of educating and providing necessary materials for students to make informed decisions when it comes to safer sex, according to WELLWVU.

The service is also available for tablings at events, residence halls, and other campus locations by request.

To pick up your supplies, go to room 118 of the Health and Education building on Evansdale from 10am to 2pm on your pickup date. WELLWVU's next pickup date is on Feb. 17th, with orders due before noon on Feb. 15th.

123 to host 'Galentine's Day' event with five female-fronted bands, decor and drink special

123 Pleasant Street will host a Galentine's Day show on Thursday, Feb. 17, featuring five bands, all fronted by women.

Maleri Tustin, a senior public relations student. is hosting the show and plays in two of the bands, Blasfemme and Rot.

The Daily Athenaeum sat down with Tustin for a conversation this week about the show. This interview has been lightly edited for clarity and length.

DA: How did the idea for this show get started?

Maleri Tustin: I was talking with the booking guys at 123, just for some dates for one of my bands in February. Feb. 17 was one of the days they gave me, and I started thinking: what can we do to make this a little different?

I know that there definitely are going to be some Valentine's Day shows and I was like, "Oh, ladies show. Like we never have ladies' nights at 123." I'm in two bands, one of them being all females. I started thinking, "I have never seen an all-female lineup, or at least an all-female fronted lineup at 123 that wasn't for a Women's Day event." So, I just ran with that.

DA: What should people expect? What kind of music?

Tustin: Yeah, so we've got one band that's a two-piece drums and guitar. It's pretty indie style all the way to my band Rot which is closing out the night and they're pretty heavy. There's a few like indie bands as well as heavier grunge rock. Mostly just guitar heavy all night long. It should be a pretty cool spectrum.

DA: You're also releasing an EP soon for Rot, right?

Tustin: Yes, we're hoping to have it released by the show. It takes about a week to get things cleared copyright wise with Spotify and Apple Music and things like that, but we're finishing recording and Wednesday will be the day that we master it. So hopefully it'll be out by the show!

DA: For Rot, what's your musical inspiration? What other bands do vou look to and listen to and get inspiration from?

Tustin: I think that the thing that I love about Rot is that all of us have like an overlapping music taste, but we also are very into different things ourselves. I think together definitely some Black Sabbath. I would say even Tool or Alice in Chains as well. Kind of sludgy and then I love the band Fuzz. It's like a newer band, but they are one of my favorite bands of all time. And we all share the love for them. We take some of the things that they do as well. Our drummer Corey listens to a lot of really heavy stuff. I think that Max and I tend to stay pretty kind of lighthearted, guitar and bass and we like riffs and a lot of distortion pedals and then Corey is like, "I want to do with double bass and crazy drums on this song," and it tends to make it pretty heavy, but I really like it. DA: This is the first show for

Blasfemme, right?

Tustin: Yes. as a band. We're really excited about that because they're so much fun to play with and they're amazing musicians as well as just people in general. I think that as a woman in music, at least in the Morgantown/Pittsburgh music scene, it's hard to find other women in music that want to support you and are kind and encouraging of each other because there are so few. And those two girls, Megan and Taylor, are great musicians and they're great people and they just want to see other women do well.

DA: That's really cool. I'm looking forward to it. How did the idea for Blasfemme come together?

Tustin: I didn't really know Taylor very well but we both taught at PopShop at different times and knew all the same people. One of my coworkers had said that he knew this drummer that was a girl. She was really cool. She just graduated from WVU, was looking for a band and really wanted to play with other girls. And I

was like, "Wow, that sounds awesome. I never meet female drummers." I reached out to her about jamming and we had gotten together, and we both immediately hit it off. I'd known Meg for a long time. She's a great artist but she also is a great musician, plays the bass and guitar in a band called Ex Olympia. I reached out to her, and she was like, "Oh my gosh, I would love to be a part of that." And we just started playing music in my garage and it went really well. DA: Where did the Blas-

femme name come from? Tustin: When it came time

to pick a band name, we were thinking stuff and honestly, it's kind of hard. It doesn't seem like it'd be hard but then suddenly, every idea you have is a bad idea that's not very good. And Taylor was like, "Well, I have an idea for a band name, and I've been sitting on it until I found someone and bandmates that I really liked. And it makes sense because we're all girls." And so she said Blasfemme and after that it was like, "Oh, that's our name. There's no question. That's our name."

DA: If somebody is on the fence about coming out to the Galentine's Day show, what



would you say to them?

Tustin: I would say totally come out. I think that it doesn't matter what kind of music you like, live music is always fun and exciting to be around. It's going to be the first ladies' night at 123, and I've been playing there for about

six years now. There'll be red, pink, purple themes. There's a special drink of the night. I know the staff is really excited. And then all the bands, we're really excited to play and support each other and share some love for ladies.

Morgantown's history in Bachelor Nation

ABC's hit reality TV shows "The Bachelor" and "The Bachelorette" are popular nationwide, but the show has more relevance for Morgantown than you might think.

Since The Bachelor's beginning in 2002 and The Bachelorette's beginning in 2003 there have only been a handful of contestants from West Virginia. Most of those cast from West Virginia have been on the show in recent years. Many have garnered significant online followings from their appearances on the show.

Emily Maynard 2011-2012 Emily Maynard was among the first people from the Mountain State to appear on the show.

Maynard, who was born and raised in Morgantown, first competed in 2011 on season 15 of The Bachelor starring Brad Womack.

Maynard was the winner of the season, which ended in a proposal. The couple broke up several months later, according to a 2011 People Magazine article.

Later Maynard became the star of season eight of The Bachelorette in 2012. At the close of her season, Maynard chose Jeffrey Holm and the pair was engaged. ABC News reported the couple's split in 2012.

Two years later in 2014 Maynard married her husband Tyler Johnson. Today she has 636k followers on her Ins-


