

FAIR WEEK GENERAL RULES

PLEASE READ AS RULES HAVE CHANGED

CAMPING RULES

- 1. All individuals staying on the fairgrounds must occupy an assigned campsite.
 - 2. Youth campers must have a responsible adult chaperone.
- 3. The fairgrounds close at 11 p.m. All non-campers must leave by this time. Campers must return to campsites by 11:30 p.m.
 - 4. Quiet hours are 10 p.m. to 7 a.m.
- 5. Campsites may not be changed without approval from the campground chairperson.
- 6. Campsite renters are responsible for mowing and general upkeep. Campsites must remain clean. If you bring it in, take it out.
- 7. Do not dump garbage, blackwater or graywater! Waste must not be disposed of in porta-potties or on the ground. Pumpout services may be arranged at the camper's expense.
- 8. Only one camping unit and one vehicle are allowed per site. Extra vehicles must park in the back row of parking lot. Car passes are provided with your site number.
- 9. NO ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES OR DRUGS ARE PER-MITTED ON THE FAIRGROUNDS! Violators will be removed from the fairgrounds.
- 10. For emergency purposes, a list of all campsite occupants must be posted on the trailer or tent.
 - 11. Air conditioners are NOT permitted.
- 12. Each campsite is assigned an electrical outlet for electricity. NO additional electric will be provided.
 - 13. All individuals entering and exiting MUST purchase a pass. 14. Campers must use the back gate between 7 a.m.-midnight.
- Guests are allowed on the Venango County Fairgrounds at their own risk. Venango County Fair cannot guarantee protection from COVID-19 or other communicable diseases. Entry onto the Venango County Fairgrounds constitutes your understanding and your willingness to undertake the risk
- Pets are permitted only with paid registration filed at the fair office. See pet rules for details.
- 17. Golf carts and UTVs are allowed with registration at the fair office. See golf cart/UTV rules below.
- Venango County Fair Inc. is not responsible for loss or damage to personal property.
- If there is servere weather in the area, the new siren will go off. Please watch for additional severe weather procedures with your camping info.

Golf Cart/UTV's are permitted on the grounds as long as they have properly registered with the Venango County Fair Office and have purchased a permit.

- 1. Registration is \$20 and must be completed at the fair office. 2. Required: driver's license, proof of insurance, and compli-
- ance with vehicle occupancy limits designated by manufacturer.
 - 3. Operators must be at least 16 and have a valid driver's license.
 - 4. Operational hours: 6-8 a.m. and 9-11 p.m.
 - 5. Vehicles are not allowed in barns, midway or congested areas.
- 6. Permits <u>must</u> be displayed, and the 5 mph speed limit must be obeyed.
- 7. The Venango County Fair Board reserves the right to revoke permits for inappropriate actions; purchasing a permit indicates an agreement to these rules.

Pets will be permitted at campsites.

- 1. Registration is \$20 per pet; forms available at the fair office.
- Dogs must be licensed and vaccinated against rabies.
- 3. Pets are **NOT** permitted in barns.
- 4. Owners are responsible for appropriate clean-up of pet.
- 5. Pets MUST be leashed and wearing ID tags issued by the
 - 6. Any pet causing a disturbance will be removed form the

fairgrounds without a refund.

GENERAL RULES

- 1. Open Class: Open to anyone, regardless of age. 4-H classes are open only to 4-H members currently enrolled in a Venango County 4-H Club.
- 2. Any misconduct on the fairgrounds during the Venango County Fair will result in the individual being asked to leave. This includes the use of alcohol, nonprescription drugs and controlled substances
- 3. The following wheeled items and their likenesses are NOT permitted on the grounds: skateboards, rollerblades, tricycles, bicycles, dirt bikes, hoverboards and similar machines.
- 4. No smoking or vaping on the fairgrounds, except in designated areas.
- 5. In the event of severe weather, the new siren will sound. Please watch the severe weather info around the fairgrounds.
- 6. Exhibitors staying overnight must use the camping area. Youth exhibitors/campers must have a responsible adult chaperone. There are no housing facilities provided. Please refer to the Camping Rules.
 - 7. Only exhibits for classes listed will be accepted.
 - 8. Fair Entry Registration Information

All entries must be registered ONLINE, and payment must be received by July 18. Entry fees should be mailed to: Venango County Fair, Inc., 867 Suite A, Mercer Road, Franklin, PA 16323, or paid by credit card.

*Late entries WILL NOT be accepted**

ALL ENTRIES MUST REGISTER ONLINE

All 4-H animal entries (except horses) MUST be registered in open class in order to register for 4-H classes.

9. Procedure to Enter Projects at the Fair

Exhibit numbers can be picked up beginning at noon on Saturday, August 2, at the Fair Office. Non-animal exhibits may be entered in the appropriate buildings from 12-3 p.m. on Saturday and noon-5 p.m. on Sunday. Please ensure the appropriate tags are attached to the correct project before entering

Floriculture: Runninger Hall (Flower Building)

Vegetables, Hay, Grains & Apiary: Foster Bullock (enter through the front door on the left)

Family Living, Youth, Home Products, Needlecraft, Art/ Photography/Handicraft: Center of Foster Bullock Building

4-H Exhibits: Foster Bullock (use the side door on the right of the building)

ALL LARGE ANIMALS MUST ENTER THROUGH THE BACK GATE.

All Livestock: Saturday 7 a.m.-noon; Sunday 7-10 a.m. Dairy Animal Entries: Saturday & Sunday 7 a.m.-3 p.m. Horses: Saturday 7 a.m.-3 p.m.; Sunday noon-3 p.m. Rabbits: Saturday 8 a.m.-3 p.m. (front gate) Saturday ONLY Poultry: Wednesday, August 6, 7-8 a.m. ONLY (front gate)

- 10. Exhibitors may enter only one exhibit per non-animal class. Animal exhibitors may enter up to two animals per class in dairy and breeding livestock. Market animals: one entry per species. Rabbit exhibitors may enter two breeding animals per class and one entry per exhibitor in market rabbit classes.
- 11. Entries not registered prior to the Fair can be exhibited, but will not be judged for premiums.

- 12. The Fair Board has the right to remove any entry they determine to be inappropriate from the fairgrounds.
- 13. Judges' decisions are final. If there is no competition in a class, a ribbon or premium may be awarded at the discretion of the judge.
- 14. Every precaution will be taken for the protection of exhibitors and exhibits, but Venango County Fair, Inc. assumes no responsibility for any loss or damage. Security will be in place on grounds.

Procedure for Entry Pick-Up and Project Release

15. All non-animal exhibits: Pick up between 8-11 a.m. on Sunday, August 10th. Please bring green tags to collect your projects. Items not picked up during designated times will be moved to Rainy Linn Hall for pick-up during office hours.

Animal Entries are dismissed on Sunday, August 10th, from 6-11 a.m. Packers may start loading animals after 11 p.m. on Saturday night.

Poultry exhibitors: Please note all poultry are terminal and will leave the fairgrounds between 3-5 p.m. August 7th.

16. Premium payments will depend on fair funds if and when they are released by the state.

ANIMAL RULES – OPEN & 4-H

Applies to ALL animals: Please read "all animal rules" and then "specific species rules" *Required paperwork WILL be checked

- 1. ALL animals (horses, dairy, sheep, beef, swine, goats, poultry and rabbits) MUST be registered online at www.venangofair.fairentry.com for classes, and entry fees must be received by the fair office by JULY 18th, Venango County Fair, Inc. 867 Suite A, Mercer Road, Franklin, Pa 16323. Payments may be made by check or credit card.
- 2. Animals are to be entered in OPEN and 4-H Classes. NOTE: class numbers are different! 4-H animals must be registered in an open class to participate in 4-H classes (except horses). Animals must be designated by June 1 with the Penn State Extension Office to be eligible for 4-H classes. Only designated animals may show in 4-H classes.
- 3. Animals will be accepted until all space is filled. Exhibitors must accept assigned stalls without dispute. After stalls are full, no open class registrations will be accepted. Stall space is for animals only; tack and supplies are not included.
- 4. If there is only one entry in a class, the class may be combined with another at the discretion of the superintendent or judge
- 5. No livestock, including horses, showing signs of infectious or contagious disease, or external parasitic disease will be allowed entrance to a show. Horses must have an approved Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (CVI) dated after May 1, 2025, with the fair's location listed, as well as a negative EIA within the 12 months prior to the fair, and a negative rabies test. All cattle, sheep and goats must have a CVI after May 1, 2025, that includes the location of the show and must include unique permanent identification. Registration papers and health certificates must be checked and approved to stay on the fairgrounds. SWINE: Must have an 840-series radio frequency identification (RFID) ear tag listed on the CVI, and a CVI within 30 days prior to the show that includes the location of the show.
- 6. A "Veterinarian-Client-Patient Relationship" (VCPR) form must be signed by the animal owner or caretaker and filed with your online registration.
- 7. The improper or illegal use of drugs for controlled behavior or antibiotics is prohibited. Venango County Fair, Inc. reserves the right to test for such substances.
- 8. All 4-H market animals should be shown clean and dry, as per Northwest Regional 4-H Livestock and Venango County 4-H Livestock Rules.
- 9. ALL LARGE ANIMALS MUST ENTER THROUGH THE BACK GATE. Please have health papers with them! **Animal Entries:**

All Livestock: Saturday 7 a.m. to noon; Sunday 7 to 10 a.m. Dairy: Saturday and Sunday 7 a.m. to 3 p.m. Horses: Saturday 7 a.m. to 3 p.m.; Sunday 12 to 3 p.m.

Rabbits: Saturday 8 a.m. to 3 p.m. (front gate)

Poultry: Wednesday, August 6, 7-8 a.m. ONLY (front gate)

**ALL Livestock Market animals will be weighed as they are coming off the trailers. Animals need to have CVI (Certificate of Veterinary Inspection) to be unloaded.

All LARGE ANIMALS MUST BE IN BY 3 p.m. Sunday

10. Animals must be removed from the fairgrounds on Sunday, August 10th, between 6-11 a.m. Packers are permitted to start loading animals after 11 p.m. on Saturday.

11. ALL MARKET HOGS ARE TERMINAL!

12. Livestock market animals will be weighed upon arrival as they are coming off the trailers. 4-H exhibitors must have submitted a project and record book prior to weighing in their animals. They will receive an exhibitor card and zip-ties for hanging. There are no re-weighs.

13. Exhibitors must provide feed, water, and bedding for all animals, including poultry, cavies and rabbits. Failure to do so will result in expulsion from the fair. Wash racks are provided for keeping animals clean. Animals must be fed and watered at least every 12 hours, and stalls must be kept clean at all times.

14. Tasteful decorations are encouraged, but no tape or adhesives are to be used on metal pens. No staples or nails are to be placed into the wood of the livestock barn. Dairy and beef exhibitors should use the provided wooden rail for decorations.

15. Show Dress Codes:

All animal exhibitors need to be wearing *closed-toed, hard-soled footwear* when exhibiting their animals.

All Exhibitors: No commercial logos. No bare midriffs. No hats.

Appropriate shoes must be worn for showing, which should be hard sole shoes, especially for steers and hogs. **No** sandals or crocs. 4-H members must follow specific dress guidelines as outlined in the rules. 4-H members approaching the show ring with inappropriate attire will be instructed by the ring crew to change. 4-H members will not be permitted in the show ring until properly dressed.

Open Dairy: White Pants & Collared Shirt.

4-H Dairy: White, sleeved shirt and white pants or skirt below the knees.

Open & 4-H Beef, dairy beef, sheep, hogs, market goats: Clean long pants or dress/skirt below the knee. Dress shirt with sleeves, buttoned appropriately.

Dairy Breeding Goats: Long sleeved white dress shirt, white pants, with matching shoes and belt in black, white or brown.

16. Exhibitors of Open animals must make arrangements for transporting animals off the fair-grounds at the end of the fair. All market hogs (4-H and Open) will be terminal. To arrange for hogs to be loaded onto a processor's trailer, please get on the list at the fair office during fair week.

17. Out-of-State animal exhibitors will need to check for animal health requirements here: www.pa.gov/content/dam/copapwp-pa-gov/en/pda/documents/animals/ahdservices/rules/documents/2025%20fair%20rules.pdf

18. Venango County and Northwest Regional 4-H Livestock Rules apply at all times, even if not printed in this book. Regional 4-H Livestock Rules and Venango County Livestock Rules can be found in ZSuites in the shared files.

19. **ALL POULTRY** are terminal and will leave the fairgrounds Thursday between 3 and 5 p.m.

SPECIES SPECIFIC RULES

* Required paperwork will be checked! HORSES

1. All horses must have an approved Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (CVI) dated after May 1, 2025. The CVI must include the address of the show and a negative Equine Infectious Anemia (EIA) test result within one year of the event. The report must include a description of the animal. A rabies vaccination is required at least one month, but no more than 12 months, prior to the show.

2. All animals entered must be stabled on the fairgrounds, must compete, and must show. Exhibitors must post a stall card. Animals are to remain in their stall at all times, except when exercising, grooming, or showing.

3. Exercise is allowed only in the rings, so long as they are not in use. Horses are never allowed in parking areas. Only driving and draft animals are permitted at trailers in the parking area while being harnessed or hitched.

4. Animal tending must be done before 11:15 p.m. At that time, all persons, other than barn watch personnel, must exit the barns.

5. Horses are eligible to compete in only one class for halter show.

6. All horses and minis must enter through the back gate on Saturday, August 2nd, from 7 a.m.-3 p.m. or Sunday, August 3, from 12-3 p.m. Papers will be checked at the gate.

7. There is a \$25 stall fee, which is being collected at the gate. This fee will be returned to you at the end of the fair once your stall has been cleaned. Checks only!

8. All 4-H'ers must have submitted a project and record book.

9. All riders under 18 (both open and 4-H) must wear a helmet.

10. DAIRY

1. An animal may show in only one type class and must participate in a type class to be eligible for a group class. Only animals with registration papers from a breed association are allowed to compete.

2. A Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (CVI) is required for all dairy animals, dated after May 1, 2025, and must include the show location.

3. Animals must have individual official animal identification. Acceptable forms include: A 15-digit Animal Identification Number (AIN) ear tag starting with 840 (RFID preferred); A USDA-issued National Uniform Eartagging System (not valid for interstate movement); Brands, if accompanied by

an official brand inspection certificate; Tattoos and other identification methods accepted by a breed association for registration, accompanied by a breed association registration certificate.

4. All 4-H members must submit a project and record book.

5. If there is an Influenza A case in Pennsylvania, additional biosecurity rules will be put into place and communicated to exhibitors.

6. The Milking Parlor is available for milking at designated times. The dairy superintendent reserves the right to test any animal using the facilities.

BEEF AND DAIRY BEEF

1. Animals must have individual official identification. Without registration papers (for animals with 3/4 blood or more) from a recognized breed, the animal will show as commercial.

2. A Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (CVI) is required for all beef and dairy beef animals, dated after May 1, 2025, and must include the show location.

3. Beef cattle must have a rope halter and neck collar with a tie on at all times.

4. All 4-H'ers must submit a project and record book.

5. 4-H Market Beef and Dairy Beef will be weighed upon unloading from the trailer. Animals must have a CVI and registration papers at the time of unloading. All 4-H members must have submitted a project and record book before weighing in their animals. Exhibitors will receive an exhibitor card and zip ties for hanging.

6. MARKET BEEF — These animals will not be judged by breed. Classes will be divided into weight classes of three or more animals. If a beef animal weighs less than 720 pounds, it will not be allowed to stay at the fair. Market weight is between 1,000 and 1,550 pounds.

7. A 4-H Market Home Bred & Born Beef class is available. The 4-H member must declare a homebred and born animal at tagging to be eligible.

8. All market beef must be shown clean and dry. They must be slicked from head to tail and from the knee and hock up, with no more than 1/4 inch of hair at the time of show.

9. If an exhibitor cannot handle their market beef, they will be disqualified from the show and asked to remove the animal from the fairgrounds.

10. 4-H members who do not adhere to these guidelines will not be allowed to show in 4-H market classes or sell their market beef in the Junior Livestock Auction at the Venango County Fair.

11. 4-H members must follow Venango County 4-H and Northwest Regional 4-H Livestock rules, even if not fully printed in the fair book.

DAIRY BFFF

(rules are in addition to Beef rules)

1. Dairy feeder calves must be 100% dairy breed. No beef breeds!

2. Dairy beef must be born before March 1 of the current year. These calves must be castrated by the tagging date of the first year of the project. They must be free of any testicular tissue and healed in order to show at the fair; otherwise, they will be disqualified.

3. All dairy feeder calves must be naturally polled or dehorned.

4. 4-H Dairy Beef must be declared at the spring tagging/weigh-ins with the Extension Office.

5. Dairy feeder steers must meet the following weight requirements: Year 1: Between 400#-700# at fair weigh-ins. Year 2: Between 1,000#-1,650#. Any steers under (or over) this weight will be sent home. NO RE-WEIGHS!

6. Dairy feeders must have a rope halter and

neck collar with tie on at all times.

7. If an exhibitor cannot handle their steer, they will be disqualified from the show and asked to remove the animal from the fairgrounds.

8. Dairy feeder calves will be shown in 4-H classes throughout the year, clean and dry, and will follow beef class rules. There will be separate Dairy Beef classes for Year 1 and Year 2 projects, and they will not compete against each other.

9. Dairy feeder calves must comply with all health regulations required by the Venango County Fair, Inc.

10. Year 2 Dairy Beef projects will be sold at the Junior Livestock Auction. Year 1 projects will not be sold and will return home for Year 2 of the project.

11. Dairy Beef projects are to follow Market Beef rules

12. Venango County and Northwest Regional 4-H Livestock rules will apply at all times, even if not printed in their entirety in the fair book. Regional 4-H Livestock Rules and Venango County Livestock Rules can be found in ZSuites in the shared files.

SHEEP

1. Purebreds must be identified by registry name and number; grade animals by farm flock number, corresponding to individual ear tag or tattoo. All sheep must have a scrapie tag or tattoo and bear an official USDA/APHIS ear tag at the show. Without registration papers from a recognized breed, animals will show as commercial.

2. A Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (CVI) is required for all sheep and lambs, dated after May 1, 2025, and must include the show location.

3. All 4-H members must submit a project and record book.

4. MARKET LAMBS: Lambs will be weighed when unloaded from the trailer and must have a CVI and registration papers with them at unloading. All 4-H members must have submitted a project and record book prior to weighing in their animals. They will receive an exhibitor card and zip ties for hanging. If a lamb weighs less than 64 pounds, it will not be permitted to stay on the fairgrounds. Market weight is between 80 and 170 pounds.

5. Market lambs will not be judged by breed. They must be dehorned. Classes will be divided into weight classes of three or more animals.

6. A 4-H Market Home Bred & Born Lamb class is available. The 4-H member must have declared a Home Bred & Born animal at tagging to be eligible.

7. Lambs must be shown clean and dry. Grooming products are permitted, but must be safe for meat animals.

8. Lambs must be shown with all four feet on the show ring floor.

9. No tampering of natural fleshing and muscle development is allowed.

10. 4-H members not adhering to these guidelines will not be permitted to show in 4-H market classes or sell their 4-H market lamb in the Junior Livestock Auction at the Venango County Fair.

11. 4-H members may ONLY sell one market lamb through the Junior Livestock Sale.

12. Venango County and Northwest Regional 4-H Livestock rules will apply at all times, even if not printed in this book. Regional 4-H Livestock Rules and Venango County Livestock Rules can be found in ZSuites in the shared files.

SWINE

- 1. Hogs must have an 840 RFID (series radio frequency identification) ear tag, and it must be listed on the CVI.
- 2. A Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (CVI) is required within 30 days prior to the show. Brucellosis testing is not required for Pennsylvania animals.
 - 3. All 4-H members must submit a project and record book.
- 4. Swine will not be judged by breed. Classes will be divided into weight classes of five or more animals. Market weight is between 210#-310#.
- 5. Swine will be weighed when unloaded from the trailer and must have CVI papers with them at unloading. All 4-H members must have submitted a project and record book prior to weighing in their animals. They will receive an exhibitor card and zip ties for hanging. Health papers (CVI) and registrations will be checked as they are unloaded. If an animal weighs less than 160 pounds, it will not be permitted to stay on the fairgrounds.
- 6. Some waterers are available for hog pens on a first-come, first-served basis, or exhibitors may provide their own. Exhibitors will need a bucket or jug to fill waterers.
 - 7. No individual fans are permitted in the hog barn.
- 8. Exhibitors may show pigs using canes, pig pipes, or pig whips. Boards may be used in the barns and to move animals.
- 9. Pigs must be shown clean and dry. Exhibitors have the option to body clip.
- 10. 4-H members not adhering to these guidelines will not be permitted to show in 4-H market classes or sell their 4-H market swine in the Junior Livestock Auction at the fair.
- 11.A 4-H Market Home Bred & Born Swine class is available. The 4-H member must have declared a Home Bred & Born animal at tagging to be eligible.
- 12. 4-H members may ONLY sell one market swine through the Junior Livestock Sale.
- 13. Venango County and Northwest Regional 4-H Livestock rules will apply at all times, even if not printed in this book. Regional 4-H Livestock Rules and Venango County Livestock Rules can be found in ZSuites in the shared files.

GOATS

- 1. Goats must have an individual official Scrapie ear tag or a legible breed registration tattoo.
- 2. A Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (CVI) dated after May 1, 2025, is required and must include the show location.
 - 3. All 4-H'ers must submit a project and record book.
- 4. Exhibitors are limited to two entries per breeding class. No intact male goats. Breed standards will be followed. For breed guidelines, see www.adga.org (dairy goats), www.abga.org (Boer goats), or www.npga-pygmy.com (Pygmy goats).
 - 5. Space will be provided for milking stands.
- 6. Market goats will be weighed when unloaded from the trailer and must have a CVI and registration papers with them at unloading. All 4-H members must have submitted a project and record book prior to weighing in their animals. They will receive an exhibitor card and zip ties for hanging. Health papers (CVI) and registrations (if applicable) will be checked as animals are unloaded from trailers.
- 7. Market classes will be divided into weight classes. Market weight is between 60 and 125 pounds. Animals shown in this class will be sold through the Junior Livestock Sale. If a goat weighs less than 48 pounds, it will not be permitted to stay on the fairgrounds.
- 8. 4-H market goats must be shown clean and dry. Grooming products are permitted but must be safe for meat animals.
- 9. Goats must be shown with all four feet on the show ring floor
- 10. 4-H members may ONLY sell one market goat through the Junior Livestock Sale.
- 11. 4-H members not adhering to these guidelines will not be permitted to show in 4-H market classes or sell their 4-H market qoat in the Junior Livestock Auction at the fair.
- 12. A 4-H Market Home Bred & Born Goat class is available. The 4-H member must have declared a Home Bred & Born animal at tagging to be eligible.
 - 13. Venango County and Northwest Regional 4-H Livestock

rules will apply at all times, even if not printed in this book. Regional 4-H Livestock Rules and Venango County Livestock Rules can be found in ZSuites in the shared files.

RABBITS

- 1. Rabbits will be screened on arrival for health and show conditions. No rabbits will be accepted if they have been out of the state in the past 30 days due to RHD risk.
- 2. Entries will be accepted on a first-come, first-served basis until the barn is full.
- 3. Rabbit exhibitors may enter two breeding animals per class and one entry per exhibitor in market rabbit classes.
- 4. Rabbits must be permanently and legibly tattooed in the left ear. This ID number MUST match the registration on the fair entry. Corrections and tattooing WILL NOT OCCUR at check-in.
- 5. Rabbits must meet current ARBA (American Rabbit Breeders Association) standards to show in Breeding Rabbit and Market Rabbit classes. All other rabbits should show in the Pet class.
- 6. Rabbits are to be entered in only one class, either Pet or Breeding, not both.
 - 7. Pens will be assigned by clubs.
- 8. No rabbits under 8 weeks of age will be accepted (except Doe with litter).
- 9. Sales may be conducted after animal check-out at the conclusion of the fair.
- 10. Classes may be combined at the discretion of the department superintendent.
- 11. Any disputes will be resolved by the department superintendent.

POULTRY

(Additional rules may be added as per the Department of Agriculture)

- 1. The show may be canceled at any time if the Pennsylvania Department of Agriculture deems it necessary to control the Highly Pathogenic Avian Influenza (HPAI).
 - 2. ALL PÖULTRY ARE TERMINAL!
- 3. All birds must bear an official Department of Agriculture-issued leg band.
- 4. A Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (CVI) or an Owner-Endorsed Avian Health Certificate and Biosecurity Statement are required.
- 5. All birds must have negative blood test results, collected by a certified poultry technician within 14 days of the exhibition.
- 6. Poultry will arrive Wednesday, August 7th, between 7-8 a.m. They must leave with the processor on Thursday, August 8 between 3-5 p.m.
- 7. This will be a closed show to comply with current regulations from the Pennsylvania Department of Agriculture.
- 8. 4-H members must submit a completed 4-H project/record book and register their project on ZSuites.

- 10. Showmanship opportunities are available without the use of live birds. Please check the showmanship class listings for details.

4-H RULES & REGULATIONS



- 1. According to Pennsylvania State 4-H Policy, 4-H membership is open to youth ages 5-18. Cloverbud 4-H members are those ages 5-7 as of January 1 of the current year. Youth ages 8-18 (must be 8 by January 1 and not have turned 19 as of January 1) are considered traditional 4-H members.
- 2. Procedure for 4-H Textile Science Members: Pick up your entry tags from the fair office. Bring the entry tag and 4-H textile science projects to the clothing judging area (Log Cabin) for judging on Monday of the fair, from 9 a.m. to 11 a.m. After judging, return all clothing and textile projects to Foster/Bullock Hall for display.
- 3. 4-H members exhibiting a 4-H project at the fair must bring their completed and judged 4-H project book (judged by a 4-H volunteer leader) to be exhibited alongside their 4-H project.
- 4. The Pennsylvania 4-H Code of Conduct will be followed by the Venango County Fair, Inc.

- 5. In regards to showing 4-H animals: 4-H members must show their own animal in 4-H showmanship, 4-H market and 4-H breeding classes. If a member has a health issue or a conflict with another show, they can substitute a Venango County 4-H member to show the animal, with the permission of an Extension Educator from Venango County. If the member is not present when the show is to begin or have not obtained permission from an Extension Educator, they will be disqualified from the show and sale.
- 6. To be eligible to show and sell a 4-H livestock market animal in 2025, 4-H members' project and record books must be judged by a 4-H club leader or another adult designated by the 4-H club by July 26. In addition, 4-H members must meet the requirements of their 4-H club, county and regional rules, including submitting a June 1st animal registration form (for breeding animals) to the extension office. Watch your email for additional information regarding project and record books.
- 7. When a 4-H member has two 4-H animals in a breeding class, they may receive help from another Venango County 4-H member to show one of the animals. However, youth must show their own animal in the 4-H showmanship class. Substitutes are not permitted for this class. (For example, if Sue cannot show her steer due to an injury, Joe from her club can show the steer in the market class but not in the showmanship class.)
- 8. 4-H youth who have completed a 4-H livestock project but could not bring an animal to the fair or could not raise an animal may still participate in the 4-H Showmanship class. They must make arrangements to borrow a 4-H animal for this class only. Additionally, they can enter a poster in the "4-H Animal Projects 4-H Animal Posters" category, which will be displayed in the Foster-Bullock Building.
- 9. All 4-H animals shown in 4-H market classes must be sold at the Venango County Junior Livestock Auction. Animals shown in the OPEN feeder classes (those not meeting minimum weight) are excluded from this rule. Underweight or overweight 4-H market animals will have the option to stay for the week and show in an underweight or overweight OPEN CLASS ONLY. Market animals not meeting minimum weight — pigs: 160#; beef: 720#; goats: 48#; lambs: 64# — will not be allowed to stay at the fair for exhibition. Arrangements will be made for their removal from the fairgrounds. PLEASE DO NOT BRING EXCESSVELY LIGHT OR HEAVY WEIGHT ANIMALS TO THE FAIR. 4-H members can borrow an animal for showmanship if their animal is removed from the fairgrounds. Those electing to keep their underweight or overweight animals may show them in a showmanship/fitting class and in the OPEN feeder market class. These animals will not be eligible for championship ribbons and will not be sold. 4-H members must inform the Extension office and the barn superintendent who will be hauling their animal off the fairgrounds. ALL HOGS ARE TERMINAL AND NEED TO BE GOING TO A PROCESSOR.
- 10. 4-H members are responsible for bringing their own market projects to and from the sale ring.
- 11. Venango County and Northwest Regional 4-H Livestock rules will be in effect at all times, even if not printed in this book. Regional 4-H rules and Venango County Livestock rules can be found in ZSuites in the shared files.

PA 4-H CODE OF CONDUCT



4-H members participating in or attending club, county, regional, district, state and national programs, activities, events, shows and contests sponsored for youth by the 4-H Youth Development program of Penn State Cooperative Extension are required to conduct themselves according to the Pennsylvania 4-H Code of Conduct. The code operates in conjunction with the Pennsylvania 4-H Youth Development Program Behavioral Expectations and rules and regulations of the specific activity.

As 4-H'ers and Leaders, you have agreed to the 4-H Code of Conduct which is in effect throughout the fair.
