A beloved classic reinvented

'A Christmas Carol' as if written by Dr. Seuss

What would happen if Charles Dickens and Dr. Seuss collaborated to write a play? This weekend, as it celebrates 60 years of offering high-quality stage musicals and dramas, Franklin Civic Operetta Association, presents just such a play.

"A Seussified Christmas Carol" is a whimsical reinvention of Dickens's beloved Christmas story, written in wacky rhymed couplets.

From zoot-fruited juices to binka-bird geese, from Bed-Headed Fred to Timmy Loo, from stockings and presents to a feast of roast beast — this imaginative reinvention of a beloved classic is designed to appeal to all the family. It is a tale of glorious holiday cheer such as Dr. Seuss might have come up with — if he ever had his way with the story. Under the direction of Caren Hearne and produced by Hannah McCarthy, "A Seussified Christmas Carol" is brought to life by a whimsical and colorful cast.

Two narrators, Ian Best and Becki Williams, guide the members of the audience as they follow Scrooge, played

by Hank Gent, on his journey of enlightenment toward finding the true meaning of Christmas.

The audience will meet numerous characters who have been Seussified and talk in rhymes. Most of the names will be familiar to those who know Dickens' story, but there will be a few that are unfamiliar.

The list includes Bob Cratchit (Kevin Fox), Jake Marley (Caleb McCarthy), the Ghost of Christmas Past (Alyssa Wright), the Ghost of Christmas Present (Jackie Higby) and the Ghost of Christmas Future/Sven (Ryan Beichner), Mr. and Mrs. Fezziwig (Mike Heise and Jenny Jack), Bed-Headed Fred (Christopher Bullard), Mrs. Cratchit (Angela Higby), and Timmy Loo (Rowan Master).

Other cast members include Belle (Genevieve Hoover), Little Fan (Darien Wenner), the Cratchit children, Ringo (Logan Welms), Sally (Carly Amon), Buff (Cameron Whitling), Tuley (Tristian Cornmesser), Jen (Ellie Heffernan), Nip (DJ Higby), and a mag-

ical caroler (Matt Brazell).

This heartwarming story, rated G, is suitable for all. The performances take place at the Barrow-Civic Theatre in Franklin, today and Saturday at 7:30 p.m., and Saturday and Sunday at 2 p.m.

The cost of tickets is \$20 for adults, \$18 for seniors and members of the mili-

tary, and \$14 for students and children. Discounts are available for groups, families and educators.

Emlenton train display

Holiday tour of homes

Eight homes in Franklin, selected for beauty and interest, will be on display during the Christmas season. Franklin Preservation is offering the event from 11 a.m. to 5 p.m. on Dec. 21, and from noon to 4 p.m. on Dec. 22. A shuttle will be available both days.

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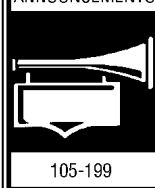

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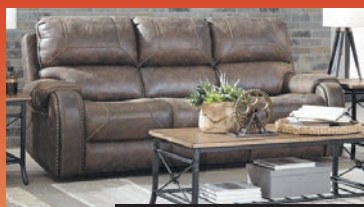
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
