2026 3rd Annual "I Voted" Sticker Design Contest

Teachers & School Staff: We hope you'll join us in giving our students a creative outlet for civic engagement and promoting election participation through the 3rd Annual "I Voted" sticker contest in Livingston County. The County's Board of Elections office will select the top five entries and put them online for a public vote. The winning entry will be featured on stickers distributed at polling sites during upcoming elections. The artwork will also appear on the Board of Elections' website and social media pages, and in digital graphics used to promote local elections.

"I Voted" Sticker Design Contest Rules

- All "I Voted" sticker design contest entrants must be in 5th-12th grades at the time of entry and enrolled in a Livingston County school district or homeschool program.
- All submitted artwork must be your original work. No stock or borrowed images permitted.
- Artwork with offensive language, violence, drugs, gangs, weaponry, etc. will not be considered.
- All entries must include the words **I Voted** and - in celebration of the country's 250 year anniversary - the numbers **250** or **1776-2026**.
- Artwork must be nonpartisan.
- Entries may be in digital or physical form and will be printed on circular two-inch stickers.
- Physical entries must either be scanned or photographed clearly for submission. All entries must be less than 1 GB in size and a PDF, JPG, JPEG, or PNG file.
- Entries will be used for social media and other marketing materials for the Livingston County Board of Elections and the winning design will be made into "I Voted" stickers to be used for the General Election.

All entries must be received by March 31, 2026, and can be mailed directly to Livingston County Board of Elections, 6 Court St. Room 104, Geneseo, NY 14454 or emailed in the file forms listed above to election@livingstoncountyny.gov.
