Total NCR= Not Clery Reportable. The Clery Act determines reporting requirements based on whether the incidents meet the criteria of falling under a Clery Crime, a Violence Against Women Act (VAWA) offense and within certain geographic locations. Reported Incidents that occurred and fell within this category still underwent the same process. This means that ALL incident reports falling under Title IX are treated the same, regardless of how they are counted. All complainants and victims are sent an outreach letter offering support and services through the Title IX Coordinator.

Complainants/Victims are not obligated to respond to this outreach letter. If you look at the Breakdown of Findings totals, the "No Action Taken" can mean several things. No action taken

can mean we had no contact with the complainant/victim after an outreach letter was sent, we met and provided options and supportive measures to the student/employee or they chose not to pursue a formal conduct process through campus. The complainant/victim has the choice of whether or not to pursue a formal conduct process. They also have the choice to withdraw the formal complaint at any time and stop the formal conduct process/investigation. It is a student centered process so they decide what level of participation they want.

"Referred to Student Conduct" means that an investigation was completed and a formal conduct process occurred.
