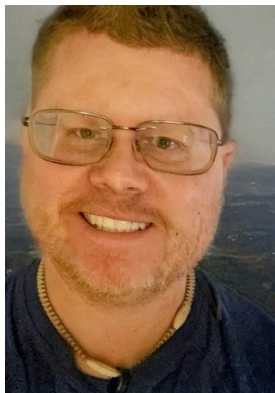


# Harley K. Sayles
