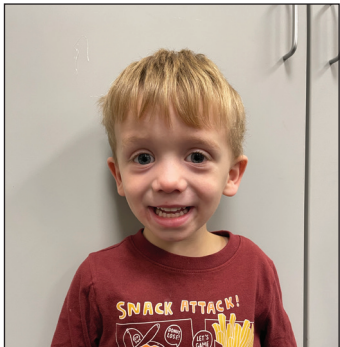
“Put a little spice on it, put salt and pepper on it. Let it cook in the oven for five minutes.”
