Some of the notable votes:

- Ryan voted for the Dems' previous tax-and-spend bill, which would [raise \\$1 trillion in revenue from taxes](#).
- Ryan voted AGAINST permanently extending the 2017 tax cuts, [a total of \\$1.1 trillion in cuts](#).
- Ryan voted AGAINST the 2017 tax reform bill, which included [\\$1.5 trillion in tax cuts](#).
- Ryan voted AGAINST opposing a carbon tax, which could generate [\\$1.87 trillion in revenue over 10 years](#).
- Ryan voted AGAINST the 2003 bush tax cuts, which included [\\$350 billion in tax breaks](#).

Statement from NRSC Spokeswoman Lizzie Litzow: "Wow. Voting for higher taxes 113 times is outrageous, especially for someone who claims he wants to cut taxes on the campaign trail. Ohioans deserve the truth and the truth is that Tim Ryan is a two-faced phony politician who says one thing and does the exact opposite."

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
