The Student Title IX Advisory Council is charged with providing ongoing input and recommendations to the Title IX Coordinator, assisting professional staff in implementing educational initiatives, acting as a liaison between the student body and Eckerd staff, specifically the Title IX Office and the Dean of Students, and offering a peer resource to reporting and responding parties in Title IX cases.

The Student Advisory Council responsibilities are as follows:

- strategize how to improve Title IX processes and procedures within federal guidelines and regulations, to make them more accessible to students and establish greater confidence in outcomes;
- provide regular feedback about campus culture to the Title IX Office and the Dean of Students;
- assist staff in providing educational initiatives and programs to the student population;
- support students and help with knowledge of process, when requested by students engaged in the process;
- offer a student perspective on the Title IX website, process and policies;
- act as a liaison group to the Title IX Office and the Dean of Students; and
- engage in training the better to understand campus processes and trauma-informed support so that members will be adequately prepared to provide input, offer support and make appropriate referrals.

The Faculty Title IX Advisory Council responsibilities are as follows:

- work closely with the Title IX Coordinator, Office of Human Resources, Dean of Faculty, Dean of Students, and the Student Title IX Advisory Council to build a campus culture of care, nonviolence, and advocacy services.
