Dear Commissioners Robinson and Petrie,

I'm writing to you to follow up on the letter I sent dated September 21, 2025, regarding the Formal Complaint filed under Record No. 17929. I still fully stand by my previous letter but since submitting it the Sheridan BOCC has apparently made an about face and is no longer supporting all its constituents who they spoke to in public formats. In this seemingly hurried letter, they sent to you on September 22, they completely backed away from seeking a way to help MDU bury the transmission line to the stance that relocating it would help "protect our core values". I and many others on the Upper Road take great exception to this letter as it has very little to do with core values and more about messaging MDU on where they would prefer to see the transmission line constructed.


This letter contains inaccuracies, contradictions and was accepted with a certain level of uncertainty by two of the Board members on a 4-1 vote. Please refer to my September 21<sup>st</sup> letter to see what the actual ROW conditions are on the Upper Road and MDU's acknowledgement of an inadequate transmission line ROW. To suggest that the line would interfere with pristine land and devalue innocent parties' residential properties is offensive to those of us who share the same basic view but live along the county road. Any action to move the line to the inadequate easements would have the cause and effect of MDU having to abandon private lands to get the required 50' easements and to construct an

overhead transmission line. By "granting permission" to MDU to install this line in an alternate route is telling them we will grant those permits that we previously denied and to heck with landowners along those routes. If this is a county core value , then I reject that. I do not give MDU permission to "take" or abandon private ownership and Sheridan BOCC should not be encouraging it.

With the submittal of their letter, the BOCC is attempting to take control of a situation that they have no control over. The BOCC admits in their letter they have no authority to regulate MDU's construction plans. They state, "Most landowners were not opposed to the entire project but specifically to the route through native, undisturbed land". The truth is none of the landowners were opposed to the route but to the designed overhead construction. As stated in the Formal Complaint in Record No. 17929, "Because they have chosen this route the only solution that the community would support is to bury the transmission line where it is slated to go off the current road path".

My hope is you will disregard the letter from the Sheridan BOCC and we all can return to the conversation of trying to help MDU find a way and the means to bury the transmission line along the western border of the Little Goose and Sandstone Subdivisions.
