

Dispatcher:	Jackson County 911, what is the address of your emergency?
Caller:	Hi, uhm... My Dad came into my house, threatening me, we got in a fight, I told him to leave. He came back inside wanting to fight me again and I shot him.
Dispatcher:	Where are you at?
Caller:	I'm at _____.
Dispatcher:	_____?
Caller:	Yes, he's off over the bank bleeding right now.
Dispatcher:	Is he alive?
Caller:	Heeee (pause)... He's breathing. You might want to hurry though.
Dispatcher:	Where is the gun now?
Caller:	_____.
	PAUSE
Caller:	Hey, are you still there ma'am?
Dispatcher:	Yes, I'm talking to the officer. Yes, yes.
Caller:	Alright well, I mean he was fighting me first... I told him to leave and he....(Fading)
Dispatcher:	I didn't (fading) tell me, ....Listen to me, listen to me. I understand that. Tell me where the gun is.
Caller:	The gun is in my pocket. It's on my table right now.
Dispatcher:	It can't be in your pocket and on the table. Where's the gun?
Caller:	It's on the table. I thought I had it in my pocket, but it's on the table.
Dispatcher:	Okay, what I need for you to do.... For you, I need you to walk outside.
Caller:	Yes, ma'am.
Dispatcher:	Leave the gun where it is.
Caller:	Yes, ma'am.
Dispatcher:	We're sending an ambulance, but we're sending an Officer too. But you need to leave the gun where it is. Okay?
Caller:	Yes, ma'am.
Dispatcher:	Are you there by yourself other than your Dad?
Caller:	Yes, ma'am.
Dispatcher:	Okay, and when the Officer gets there, he's gonna tell you to show him your hands. Just go ahead and show him your hands. Okay?
Caller:	That's fine...
Dispatcher:	Show him your hands.
Caller:	He's still breathing, but it's not looking good, he's leaning over the bank.
Dispatcher:	Okay, we're sending an ambulance as fast as we can.
Caller:	Okay. It's not how I intended for things to go, but he had already got me down once and beat me to death once.
Dispatcher:	What part of the body did you shoot him in?
Caller:	Toward the middle of the body, just as soon as he started threatening me.
Dispatcher:	In the abdomen? In the abdomen area?
Caller:	Yes, ma'am
	(PAUSE)
Dispatcher:	Okay, I'm gonna talk to an Officer, Okay?
	(PAUSE)
Dispatcher:	Okay, where's your Dad now? What's he doing?
Caller:	He's laying on the floor.

Dispatcher:	Is he awake?
Caller:	I don't think so.
Dispatcher:	Can he talk?
Caller:	Can you talk? <i>(to the Dad)</i>
Dispatcher:	Who's there that you're talking to.
Caller:	My Dad, I'm trying to talk to him. He's barely breathing right now.
Dispatcher:	Are you standing there with him?
Caller:	Yeah, I'm standing right above him.
Dispatcher:	He is unconscious. He's unconscious now.
Caller:	Yeah, he's barely breathing.
Dispatcher:	He's barely breathing and unconscious.
Caller:	Lord, God <i>(mumbling)</i>
Dispatcher:	What's your name
Caller:	_____.
Dispatcher:	What is your Dad's name?
Caller:	_____.
	PAUSE
Dispatcher:	Okay, are you still there with him?
Caller:	Yes, ma'am.
Dispatcher:	Is he still breathing?
Caller:	Just barely ma'am.
	PAUSE
Dispatcher:	Keep me updated on what's going on with him okay.
Caller:	Okay. He's still laying there just barely breathing ma'am. But uh.... what should I do?
Dispatcher:	What?
Caller:	What should I do?
Dispatcher:	What should you do?
Caller:	He's laying on his stomach. Should I try to roll him over?
Dispatcher:	Laying on his stomach. Yeah, make sure he's laying on his side.
Caller:	Okay. <i>(pause)</i> Dad, I'm gonna roll you over.
Dispatcher:	Put him flat on his back and maintain his airway.
Caller:	I'm trying ma'am. What?
Dispatcher:	Put him flat on his back and open... and hold his head.
Caller:	He's tryin'... fallen over a bank. It's gonna be really hard for me to do that.
Dispatcher:	Well, you need to pull him towards flat ground.
	<i>(PAUSE)</i>
Dispatcher:	Are you there?
Caller:	Ma'am, I managed to get him on his side sorta cocked up the hill, but that's....
Dispatcher:	Try it again.
Caller:	That's about all I can get him to do.
Dispatcher:	Is his head upright?
Caller:	I can hold his head upright. Yes.
Dispatcher:	Is his head uphill?
Caller:	Yes.
Dispatcher:	Okay. It is... You need to see get him on his back though.
Caller:	On his back.

Dispatcher:	On his back.
Caller:	Okay.
Dispatcher:	Is he still breathing?
Caller:	Uhm.... I can't tell.
Dispatcher:	Put your face down next to his nose and mouth...
Caller:	If he has a heartbeat, it's very, very faint.
Dispatcher:	Put your face down next his nose and mouth and tell me if you feel anything or see his stomach rise at all.
Caller:	No ma'am.
Dispatcher:	Okay, we're gonna start....
Caller:	No ma'am, I don't hear any breathing.
Dispatcher:	Okay, we're gonna start doing CPR.
Caller:	Do what now?
Dispatcher:	We're gonna start doing CPR. Okay?
Caller:	Okay.
Dispatcher:	I need you to kneel next to him.
Caller:	Oh my God, Oh my God, Dad I'm so sorry. <i>(sobbing)</i> Why did you have to come back at me?
Dispatcher:	Listen to me. Listen to me. Okay?
Caller:	Yes ma'am..... Yes ma'am.
Dispatcher:	I need you to put your hands on his.... put one hand over the other and put it in between the nipple line right in the middle of his chest and press down on his chest.
Caller:	Okay..... Oh God, man....
Dispatcher:	What?
Caller:	It's so.... It's flattened. And it's.... I can....
Dispatcher:	I need you to press hard and fast and at least twice per second and 2 inches deep. I need you to do that about 600 times or until somebody gets there. Okay?
Caller:	All right, I believe somebody's here.
Dispatcher:	Keep doing it until they get right beside you.
Caller:	Yes ma'am.
Caller:	Okay.... Okay..... <i>(hear Caller breathing)</i>
Dispatcher:	Are you... keep counting for me. Count out loud.
Caller:	Alright, should I drop my phone?
